DynastyDealer's 2026 roster reads like a draft recap nobody wants to write, and the numbers back that up entirely. The defining sin here is Jared Goff at Round 3.05, nearly three full rounds ahead of his ADP, for a quarterback projected at QB16. That is the kind of reach that poisons a draft at its core, surrendering premium capital on a mid-tier quarterback while the board was presumably loaded with better options. Then Courtland Sutton arrives 2.2 rounds early at WR37, and suddenly DynastyDealer has burned two of its most valuable picks on players who project as marginal starters at best. The lone bright spot, Trey McBride at TE2, cannot carry a roster this structurally compromised. George Pickens at WR10 offers some hope, but this team sits 12th in the GoldenEye 007 division and in the 4th percentile of the field, figures that feel honest rather than harsh. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the 15th percentile of scoring, DynastyDealer had no margin for draft error and used every bit of it anyway.

Last year's Slappers Only! finished in the 81st percentile, a genuine tournament performer. This year's version is projected at the 18th percentile, sitting 11th in the GoldenEye 007 division, and that distance between where this team was and where it is projected to go is the whole story. The foundation looks fine on paper: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Caleb Williams at QB6 are legitimate anchors. But the supporting cast is where the reputation starts to fray. Malik Nabers fell to WR12 and Brian Thomas Jr. slipped to WR31, the latter carrying real questions about whether his 2025 struggles with injuries and a fading connection with Trevor Lawrence represent a correction or a collapse. The draft process did not help matters, with two major reaches, including Cam Skattebo taken 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP at a time when that capital could have shored up real depth. Slappers Only! is not a bad team, it just no longer looks like the one that earned its reputation, and in this field, that gap is punishing.

The Horadic Hustlers enter 2026 sitting 10th in the GoldenEye 007 division and at the 22nd percentile of the field, and the draft history explains exactly how they got there. This roster logged zero steals, zero values, and seven major reaches, which is less a draft strategy than a prolonged act of self-sabotage. The most damning single pick is Michael Mayer, a TE39 projection grabbed a stunning 7.1 rounds ahead of his ADP, which is the kind of move that echoes across an entire draft by robbing every pick that follows it of oxygen. Even the Oronde Gadsden situation, where Gadsden projects as a TE16 but now shares a tight end room with a newly signed David Njoku, offers little relief. The receiver group projects weak across the board, with Christian Watson at WR28 leading a corps that bottoms out at Keon Coleman at WR91. After going 26-10 and scoring at the 77th percentile in 2025, the Hustlers had real equity to protect. They spent it early, spent it often, and have very little to show for it.

Gigem3082 sits ninth in the GoldenEye 007 division and in just the 35th percentile of the field, and the roster grades out as a team that drafted mostly chalk with little room to argue it paid off. The top of the lineup is genuinely interesting: Dak Prescott and CeeDee Lamb running as a stack gives the team a real anchor, and De'Von Achane at RB6 and Kyle Pitts and George Kittle projecting as starters at tight end adds real punch to the upper tier. But the floor drops off quickly, and the draft did almost nothing to create upside below that tier, logging zero steals and reaching on five players including Jaydon Blue a staggering 8.2 rounds early for a player projecting at RB70. Jaylen Waddle moving to Denver is the most credible wild card here, as Bo Nix's pass-heavy offense offers a dramatically better environment than where Waddle spent last season. Still, one bounce-back candidate does not fix a roster that is already asking its fourth and fifth options to carry real weight, and at 35th percentile there is no obvious lever left to pull.

Frased drafted with genuine discipline. Five good values, a major steal in Adonai Mitchell falling nearly three rounds to pick 18.06, and a hit rate that most managers in this field would envy. The cruelty is that the draft board cooperated and the roster still projects eighth in the GoldenEye 007 division, landing in just the 41st percentile of the tournament. The receiver group is legitimately elite, with Ja'Marr Chase, Drake London, and A.J. Brown all projecting as starters, and Travis Kelce returning after an uncertain offseason adds a genuine TE10 upside play. But the value accumulation was so concentrated at receiver and tight end that Bryce Young, a QB26, is the best quarterback on the roster, taken at a discount and still not worth much at that number. Frased did not make the mistake of overpaying. Frased made the quieter, sadder mistake of collecting excellent prices on a menu that never included the entree.

Jaws finished at 53rd percentile last season and is projected right back there in 2026, which is either reassuring continuity or a warning that this roster has found its ceiling. The quarterback situation is genuinely strong, with Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Joe Burrow at QB4 both projected starters, and that firepower keeps the floor elevated. But the margins that decide a borderline team's fate tend to show up at the edges, and the edges here are soft. Josh Jacobs is projected at RB16, a valuable piece on paper, but his status carries real uncertainty after an offseason arrest that remains unresolved, which is the kind of cloud that can turn a projected asset into a weekly question mark before a single snap is played. Meanwhile, Wan'Dale Robinson projects as the weakest starter on the roster at WR47. Against strong division opposition, those are the spots opponents will exploit. The draft was almost entirely chalk, with just two genuine values and nothing transformative. Jaws will compete, probably. Whether that is enough depends on things that have nothing to do with projections.

HEY! LISTEN!!! didn't build this roster by swinging for the fences and missing. They built it by consistently coming out ahead on deal after deal, and the cumulative effect is a squad sitting at the 57th percentile with real room to climb. The foundation is Josh Allen, a QB1 who needs no further introduction, paired with Drake Maye, who followed up his remarkable second season by earning MVP votes despite a supporting cast that was, diplomatically speaking, not overwhelming. That changes now. The addition of A.J. Brown gives Maye an alpha wideout for the first time, and if the results follow, this team gets considerably more dangerous at the top of the lineup. Below that, Rashee Rice at WR13 and DeVonta Smith at WR14 give the roster legitimate starter-quality depth that compounds the value of having two productive quarterbacks feeding it. Thirteen chalk picks might sound uninspiring, but chalk at the right spots is just good drafting. This team listened, and it drafted accordingly.

ajball4 didn't go hunting for the miracle pick that reshapes a draft board. Instead, this roster was built the old-fashioned way: round after round of sensible, defensible decisions that quietly added up to something real. The crown jewel is a tight end group headlined by Brock Bowers at TE1, Colston Loveland at TE3, and Tyler Warren at TE4, a collection that gives ajball4 a meaningful positional edge every single week. The receiver corps is no afterthought either, with Garrett Wilson at WR17, Tee Higgins at WR19, and Carnell Tate at WR29 all projected as starters. The one genuine blemish is Khalil Shakir, reached 2.6 rounds early at WR51, a selection that sticks out on an otherwise tidy sheet. With 15 chalk picks and only one major reach on the board, this is a draft that prioritized not beating yourself over swinging for the fences. Sitting 58th percentile heading in, ajball4 has the kind of quiet, well-constructed core that tends to look smarter as the season progresses.

Reez1 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by consistently getting more than they paid for. Davante Adams at WR25 slid more than a round past his ADP and landed in a starting spot. Sam Darnold at QB21 and Aaron Rodgers at QB29 both fell into late picks that would have been reasonable mid-round acquisitions. None of these are lottery tickets, they're steady margins that compound across a roster. The foundation underneath all of it is legitimately strong: James Cook at RB5, Derrick Henry at RB12, and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 give this team genuine upside at the top of the lineup. Jadarian Price at RB26 is the weakest projected starter and came at a slight cost in draft capital, but one minor reach in an otherwise disciplined draft is a rounding error. The 2025 season landed in the 53rd percentile, which is a fine floor to build from. Sitting fourth in the GoldenEye 007 division and at the 59th tournament percentile, Reez1 looks like a team that quietly positioned itself to climb.

Oddjob w/ the Golden Gun didn't need a lottery ticket to build this roster, just steady aim. The foundation is genuinely impressive: Justin Herbert at QB8 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 give this team two top-shelf anchors, and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 means the manager walked away from the early rounds with real value at the top. What separates this draft from a merely competent one is the discipline shown in the middle and late rounds, where the team collected four values against ADP without ever overreaching in meaningful ways. Tucker Kraft landing at TE5 while falling more than a round past his average draft position is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a season. Trevor Lawrence coming slightly early is the one wrinkle, though QB10 is hardly a reason to panic. The result is a team sitting third in the division but scoring at the 76th percentile of the field, built not on one brilliant gamble but on a draft that simply kept winning the small moments.

The Janus Syndicate did not win the draft in one thunderclap moment. They won it in installments. Puka Nacua at WR1 anchors a receiving corps that reaches all the way down to Nico Collins at WR9 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, giving this roster a tier of wideouts that most managers in the GoldenEye 007 division simply cannot match. The quarterback situation leans on Jayden Daniels at QB5, which is more than serviceable, and the Matthew Stafford/Nacua stack adds a ceiling multiplier that turns a good week into a great one. The back end of the draft is where the Syndicate separated themselves from the merely competent: Dallas Goedert fell nearly two full rounds past his ADP to land at TE15, and he arrives with legitimate momentum after a four-touchdown stretch during last season's fantasy playoffs. That is not a flier, that is value on a player who was already producing. Sixteen chalk picks and two good values with zero major reaches is a draft that respects the field and still comes out ahead. The 85th percentile projection is not a ceiling for this team. It might be the floor.

Last year, WillisIsAwesome finished in the bottom 13 percent of the field in scoring, and the 9-27 record made for a genuinely rough season. The 2026 roster reads like a direct answer to that misery. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 anchor a group of projected starters that also includes Chase Brown at RB11 and Travis Etienne at RB18, the latter a quiet draft-day win after falling more than a round past his ADP. At the top of the lineup, Justin Jefferson comes in at WR6, and his stack with Kyler Murray adds the kind of correlated upside that separates good weeks from great ones. The quarterback room leans heavily on Jordan Love, a major value after sliding nearly two and a half rounds below his ADP before landing here at pick 9.10. The division-leading projection and a spot in the 95th percentile of the field tell the story plainly: this is not the same team that suffered through 2025, and the rebound looks very real.
