As the 2025 fantasy football season looms on the horizon, the prospects for Solan8r look bleak. Having ended 2024 with a dismal showing, their current position near the bottom of both their division and the overall rankings suggests another challenging year ahead. Despite boasting a formidable lineup of wide receivers, including standout stars like Justin Jefferson and Travis Hunter, the team's glaring weaknesses in key positions, especially at tight end with Mike Gesicki and a running back committee that ranks poorly in the division, cast a long shadow over their ambitions. The decision to reach for Darnell Mooney early in the draft, paired with their questionable choice to grab Travis Hunter significantly ahead of his expected selection, underscores a pattern of strategic missteps. While there is some solace in their savvy acquisition of Stefon Diggs at a bargain, it's

overshadowed by the broader inadequacies in Solan8r's lineup. With Darnell Mooney troublingly positioned as a starter and little depth to compensate for potential setbacks, hope for improving on last year's low win percentage and meager scoring seems faint. As they brace for the season, Solan8r appears destined to languish in the lower echelons, struggling to claw their way out of the basement of the division standings.


