There is no elegant way to spin a team sitting at the bottom of the Mortal Kombat division and in the 12th percentile of the entire field, so let's not try. BigBabyFetus built this roster on chalk and minor reaches, with seven players taken before their ADP and just three values recovered across the whole draft, and the finished product reflects that margin for error. The receiving group is the soft underbelly, projected weak as a unit, with Michael Pittman grading out as the weakest projected starter at WR44. The team's best hope for an upside scenario runs through Jalen Hurts, taken as a major reach in round two, but Hurts enters 2026 without A.J. Brown for the first time in years, and if the Philadelphia passing game sputters, the rushing touchdown volume that has fueled five consecutive top-10 finishes could quietly erode. Josh Allen at QB1 provides a floor, and the Hurts/Dallas Goedert stack offers a ceiling, but ceilings require everything to break right, and nothing about this roster suggests that is the likely outcome.

Fatality drafted like someone who had a plan, panicked halfway through, and then just started grabbing names they recognized. The signature move was taking Jameson Williams at WR21 a full 2.6 rounds before his ADP, which is the kind of reach that sets the tone for an entire draft and, sure enough, it did. From there the board became a graveyard of early pulls: Alec Pierce hauled in 2.2 rounds early, Keon Coleman snatched 4.5 rounds ahead of schedule, Skyler Bell somehow reaching 6.4 rounds before his number was called. Five major reaches in one draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and that philosophy landed Fatality at 13th percentile in the tournament. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Caleb Williams at QB6 are genuine assets, but this format rewards depth and volume of quality, and Fatality spent too many early picks buying upside at discount prices that were not actually discounts. The 2025 record was 36 percent wins. Nothing about this roster suggests the math changes.

MonkFish sits 10th in the Mortal Kombat division and inside the bottom quarter of the entire field, and the draft chart does not offer much comfort: no steals, one value, and a trail of reaches that suggests a manager who was drafting a little too confidently against the market. The receiver group is genuinely strong, with A.J. Brown (WR8), DeVonta Smith (WR14), Jaylen Waddle (WR23), Davante Adams (WR25), and D.J. Moore (WR26) all projecting as starters, so the top of the roster has real teeth. But the quarterback situation is quietly devastating. Kyler Murray (QB19) and Tyler Shough (QB20) are the best options, and in a positionless format where starter slots are precious, cycling in a QB19 or QB20 means you are almost certainly leaving points on the table every week. Bijan Robinson (RB2) is a thunderbolt at the top, but one elite player cannot carry a roster projected this close to the basement. There is no obvious lever left to pull, and the standings already seem to know it.

Raiden The End Zone did almost everything right on draft day and still landed at 29th percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question the whole enterprise. The value was real: Dak Prescott at QB7 fell more than two full rounds past his ADP, Baker Mayfield at QB18 fell a similar distance, and the Mayfield and Emeka Egbuka stack gives the team at least one live synergy to root for. But draft capital spent on three QBs is draft capital not spent elsewhere, and the rest of the roster reflects that math. Kyle Pitts cost a round and a half of early equity as the one significant reach, and the projected starters thin out fast at the bottom, bottoming at Jayden Higgins as a WR54 anchor. Eleven chalk picks and genuine values at the positions that mattered least, a ninth-place division standing, a Mortal Kombat bracket that will not be kind. Raiden The End Zone played the percentages and the percentages played them right back.

Your soul is mine enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Mortal Kombat division and right at the tournament median, and the roster grade suggests there is not much momentum hiding underneath those numbers. The foundation looks promising on paper: James Cook projects as RB5, De'Von Achane as RB6, and Trey McBride checks in as TE2, giving this team genuine upside at the top of the lineup. The problem is that the production drops off fast everywhere else, and the quarterback situation is where the floor gets uncomfortably low. Jordan Love, projected QB17, is the kind of player who wins football games without really winning fantasy weeks, and the receiving room in Green Bay still lacks an alpha option with Tucker Kraft's status uncertain. Love was a significant draft value, taken well past his ADP, but value only matters if the production follows, and his track record suggests it probably will not. With Cook, Achane, and McBride doing the heavy lifting and little proven firepower behind them, Your soul is mine looks like a team that needed one more difference-maker and simply does not have one.

Noob Saibot sits at 52nd percentile in a tournament where the difference between advancing and watching from the couch is almost never one brilliant decision, it is usually ten small ones compounding in the wrong direction. The margins are already working against this team in a couple of places. Five major reaches in the draft, including AJ Barner at TE24 taken more than four rounds early and Elic Ayomanor at WR95 taken nearly four rounds before his market price, means the back of this roster was built at a premium, and the players collected at those price points are projected to be fringe contributors at best. Meanwhile, Bryce Young projects as QB26, which is a real cost in a format where managers can field almost any combination of their best players. The optimistic read is that Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Ashton Jeanty at RB7, and a genuinely strong tight end group anchored by Tucker Kraft at TE5 and Harold Fannin at TE6 give this team a legitimate ceiling. The pessimistic read is that last year's 19th-percentile finish already told you what happens when the margins break the wrong way.

Netherrealm Nightmares are not built to survive a bad week, they are built to detonate on a good one, and whether that detonation happens depends almost entirely on two stacks. Jaxson Dart and Malik Nabers form the first, Patrick Mahomes and Rashee Rice the second, and together they define the team's ceiling more than any individual ranking does. Dart is a projected QB11, Nabers a WR12, and if they share a big game, the points compound in ways a diversified roster simply cannot match. The Mahomes-Rice pairing layers in a safer floor, since Mahomes lands at QB12 and Rice at WR13, meaning neither stack is a desperation bet. The problem is that correlation cuts both ways. A quiet afternoon from Dart, a Nabers injury scare, a Rice coverage shadow, any of those scenarios collapses not one asset but two at once. This team finished in the 71st scoring percentile in 2025 and sits at the 53rd now, a slide that suggests the margin for a cold week from these pairings is thinner than the ceiling makes it look.

Last year's Immortal Wombat squad was a quiet disaster, finishing in the 18th percentile and going 11-25, the kind of season you delete from your memory before the confetti hits the floor. The 2026 version looks considerably more dangerous. Joe Burrow at QB4 and Justin Herbert at QB8 give this roster a pair of high-ceiling starters, and Herbert was arguably the draft's best quarterback value, sliding all the way to 7.02 against an ADP of 3.09. At the skill positions, Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1 and Nico Collins comes in at WR9, giving the team a genuine top-tier anchor at each spot. Mike Evans adds intrigue after a rough final season in Tampa, where injuries held him to eight games and snapped his legendary 1,000-yard streak; a fresh start with San Francisco makes his WR27 projection feel like a floor rather than a ceiling. The roster sits at the 57th percentile tournament-wide, a meaningful climb from the basement, and everything here points toward a legitimate rebound season in the Mortal Kombat division.

First Round Grade didn't walk away from this draft with one signature moment, just round after round of sensible, grinding execution, which turns out to be exactly how you build a team worth watching. Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Omarion Hampton at RB9, Derrick Henry at RB12, Travis Etienne at RB18, and Bucky Irving at RB21 form a projected starting group that would make most managers in the Mortal Kombat division quietly nervous. Layer in Lamar Jackson at QB3 stacking with Mark Andrews at TE14, and the team carries a structural advantage every week those two share the field. The draft was mostly chalk, which is only a criticism if the chalk was wrong, and here it largely wasn't. RJ Harvey fell nearly two rounds past his ADP and landed at 12.04, a clean, low-drama value that fits the whole philosophy of this roster. The 57th percentile tournament standing says this team has climbed the hill but hasn't crested it, which feels about right for a group built to be quietly better than advertised.

Sunglasses and Touchdowns did not build this roster by swinging for the fences and hoping. They built it by being right, repeatedly, in the quieter moments of the draft. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is the kind of foundational piece that makes a team dangerous before you even look at the rest of the board, and when you do look at the rest of the board, you find Sam LaPorta at TE8 and Travis Kelce at TE10 sitting right there waiting to be started in any given week. Jonathan Taylor slipped just enough past his ADP to qualify as genuine value at RB4, and the Goff-LaPorta stack gives this team a structural bonus that compounds quietly over a long season. The one genuine question mark is Wan'Dale Robinson, projected at WR47, who now faces a target battle in Tennessee after the Titans spent a fourth overall pick on Carnell Tate. Robinson crossed 1,000 yards last season, so the talent is real, but the situation got more complicated. That single uncertainty, though, sits at the margins of a roster that otherwise earned its 58th-percentile projection the honest way.

FF3Putt drafted like someone who had done the homework twice and still showed up early. The headliner is Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, a genuinely elite anchor, but the real craftsmanship shows in how the rest of the board fell. Brock Purdy slid nearly two and a half rounds past his ADP before FF3Putt scooped him at 8.03, landing a QB13 projection at a price that would embarrass most managers. Then Colston Loveland at TE3 in the second round looks like the one place the team paid a slight premium, but when the player ranks that high at his position, reaching two spots early is not a flaw, it is just competitiveness. Breece Hall adding a quiet RB14 projection at value and Chase Brown sitting at RB11 among the starters gives this lineup genuine week-to-week muscle. Two steals, two values, zero major reaches across the whole draft, and a second-place division standing entering 2026, this is a team built with patience and executed with precision.

Sonya Blade sits first in the Mortal Kombat division and in the 98th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains why: three steals, three values, and zero reaches of any kind. That kind of discipline is rare, and it shows up in the roster. Jayden Daniels, a QB5 projection, landed at pick 5.03 against an ADP of 2.12, a steal of more than two rounds that would have been the highlight of most drafts. Then Puka Nacua came in as the WR1 overall at his position, stacked with Matthew Stafford, who himself fell three rounds past his ADP to become a QB14 value. The supporting cast is just as tidy: George Pickens at WR10, Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31, Tyler Warren at TE4, and Jeremiyah Love projecting as RB13, all projected starters built on a foundation of patience and board awareness. If the weakest projected starter is Courtland Sutton at WR37, grabbed two rounds late, that is not a problem. That is the point.
