There is a quiet desperation to Bully Ball's 2026 outlook, the kind that sets in when you realize the ceiling and the floor are closer together than you'd like. The anchor here is Justin Jefferson, a legitimate WR6 who gives this roster something to build around, but the draft process spent capital poorly, and the bill is coming due. Caleb Williams was pulled more than a round early at 2.04, and Josh Jacobs followed at 4.04, also a significant reach, meaning Bully Ball paid a premium for two players whose projections, QB6 and RB16 respectively, do not justify the positional sacrifice made to get them. The Williams and Rome Odunze stack offers some tournament-volatility upside, but Odunze grades out at WR30, which makes it a lever, not a lifeline. Sitting third in the division and near the bottom of the field overall, this team needed the draft to go right. It did not, and there is no obvious correction available now.

GQFootball finished 2025 as a 97th-percentile scoring machine, and the 2026 version is projected 9th percentile, which is the kind of sequel nobody asked for. The core problem is not subtle: where last year's roster could apparently do almost anything, this year's best players are a collection of tight ends and quarterbacks who are either injury-question-marks or ADP afterthoughts. Bo Nix, Tyler Shough, and C.J. Stroud were all drafted at least two rounds after their ADPs, which sounds like savvy shopping until you notice they project as QB15, QB20, and QB22, a depth chart of passable fallbacks rather than a foundation. The tight end group is legitimately impressive on paper, with Brock Bowers, Tyler Warren, Kyle Pitts, and others projecting as starters, and Pitts in particular showed last year that his Atlanta situation matters less than his own ability, which held up fine even with quarterback uncertainty swirling around him. But a collection of tight ends cannot carry a roster projected to finish

11th in the division when the players who theoretically fill the rest of the lineup top out at Jalen McMillan at WR59. GQFootball is not rebuilding. It is just hoping nobody notices the gap.

ShanePranno drafted with genuine discipline. Fifteen chalk picks, zero major reaches, and two legitimate values in George Pickens and Jauan Jennings, both taken after their ADPs expired. The problem is that discipline and results are not the same thing, and this roster sits 10th in the Link Division at the 19th percentile to prove it. The top of the lineup is legitimately good: Joe Burrow at QB4 anchors a Dak Prescott stack with Pickens and Jake Ferguson, and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 gives the team a true difference-maker. But Burrow's value comes with a disclaimer printed in bold, because he has turned three separate seasons into cautionary tales about what a healthy Burrow projection actually means versus what materializes. If Burrow misses time again, the QB room drops to Prescott at QB7 or Patrick Mahomes at QB12, and suddenly the whole structure softens. ShanePranno played the value game correctly and still landed in the bottom fifth of the field, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether the game was ever winnable in the first place.

Last year's 8-Bit Relics finished in the 93rd percentile, and the name still carries that weight entering 2026, which is exactly the problem. This roster projects 24th percentile, a collapse so steep it almost reads as performance art. The backbone of the decline is the receiver group, where the best option is Matthew Golden at WR52, backed by names like Jalen Nailor and Jaylin Noel who don't inspire much confidence at any percentile. The manager clearly sensed the weakness and tried to paper over it in the draft, reaching 5.4 rounds early for Tyquan Thornton, currently projected WR97, a gamble that looks less like a dart throw and more like a Hail Mary from midfield. Meanwhile, Josh Allen anchors a legitimate top-end core alongside James Cook and Kyren Williams, and the Allen-Dalton Kincaid stack adds a real ceiling game. But ceiling games require a floor to stand on, and right now this roster is projecting ninth in the division. The reputation is 2025. The roster is 2026.

DaveKluge enters 2026 sitting at the 25th percentile of the field and eighth in the Link Division, and the roster tells you exactly why. The receiver group is genuinely excellent: Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Drake London (WR7), Malik Nabers (WR12), and Rashee Rice (WR13) form as strong a top end as you will find anywhere in this tournament, and the depth behind them is real. The problem is that the rest of the roster does not come close to matching it. Daniel Jones (QB25) and Geno Smith (QB30) are projected as two of the weakest quarterbacks in the field, and the tight end group offers nothing to offset that, with Kenyon Sadiq (TE21) as the best available option. The draft chart reflects the bind: twelve chalk picks and five minor reaches, with Brandon Aiyuk landing at WR81 after a three-round reach in Round 15. DaveKluge is not short on upside at the top, but in a positionless format where every roster spot counts, dragging that kind of dead weight through a full season is a very heavy thing to carry.

There is no sugarcoating what bustachubs is looking at in 2026: a roster that grades out at the 26th percentile of the field and sits seventh in the Link division, with a draft that offered almost no upside to counterbalance the ceiling concerns. Fourteen chalk picks and three minor reaches is a perfectly fine draft if the chalk is good, but when Isiah Pacheco, projected RB52, costs you a two-plus round premium and Aaron Jones at RB38 goes a full round early, you are not building in margin for error, you are burning it. Lamar Jackson is a genuine asset at QB3, and the WR group has real contributors in Chris Olave and Tetairoa McMillan, but in a positionless format where everyone is fielding their best ten, those names need to carry further down the roster than they do here. Jakobi Meyers, the projected weakest starter at WR45, is the bottom of this lineup, and after a 2025 campaign that finished in the 30th percentile of scoring, bustachubs needed this draft to shift something. It mostly did not.

Azy sits at 51st percentile, the kind of team that wins the weeks it should and drops the ones it shouldn't, and the margin between those two outcomes is razor thin. The receiver group is the genuine strength here: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Emeka Egbuka at WR18, Luther Burden at WR22, and Mike Evans at WR27 form a top line that can carry weeks on its own. But the draft decisions at the edges of the roster raise real questions. Three major reaches, including Michael Mayer at TE39 taken nearly five rounds early and Keenan Allen at WR99 taken more than four rounds early, suggest Azy burned late capital on speculative upside rather than letting the board come to them. That inefficiency matters when the difference between sixth in the division and fourth lives in a handful of swing weeks. The receivers can mask a lot. Whether they can mask enough is the whole season.

kjmye8 went into this draft and apparently decided the board was a suggestion. Carson Beck landed five and a half rounds ahead of his ADP, Tory Horton went nearly three and a half rounds early, and the consensus crowd would have you believe both moves were mistakes. The roster, sitting at the 75th percentile of the field, is not cooperating with that verdict. The engine here is a backfield that would make most managers envious, with Bijan Robinson at RB2, Ashton Jeanty at RB7, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 all projected as starters, and the receiver group layers in Ladd McConkey, Jameson Williams, and Davante Adams to keep the scoring floor high. The Matthew Stafford and Adams stack adds a little connective tissue. The real question is whether those early Beck and Horton triggers reflect a manager who saw something the algorithms missed, or one who simply got away with it. Coming off a 33 percent win rate in 2025, kjmye8 has clearly retooled, and this time the conviction actually has talent behind it.

benkgonzales lands at 88th percentile in the field, and the path there was not built on one flashy swing but on a draft that kept coming out ahead in the small margins. Drake Maye at QB2 and Jalen Hurts at QB9 were both acquired a round later than their ADPs suggested they would last, which is exactly the kind of quiet patience that separates a good draft from a lucky one. The receiving corps does the heavy lifting at the top, with Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Nico Collins at WR9 giving this roster a ceiling that most managers in the Link division simply cannot match. Tee Higgins at WR19 and Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 round out a starting group that benkgonzales did not have to overpay for. The one legitimate concern is that last year's 49th-percentile scoring finish suggests the lineup has underdelivered before, and Jaylen Warren, the projected weakest starter at RB27, will need to hold up his end. But the bones here are sound, the draft was disciplined, and benkgonzales enters 2026 with a legitimate case.

Ocarina of Primetime didn't win the draft with a single thunderclap moment. They won it the way good teams usually do, by being right more often than wrong. The headline steals were both at quarterback: Justin Herbert, projected QB8, slid all the way to 6.06 despite an ADP closer to round four, and Jordan Love, projected QB17, fell more than two rounds past where he was expected to go. Neither pick required a gamble. The board simply handed them value and the manager took it. CeeDee Lamb landing at 2.06 when his ADP sat nearly a round earlier added another quiet win to the ledger. Pair Love with his top target Christian Watson in a stack, add a projected starter lineup that runs through Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Trey McBride at TE2, and the floor here is genuinely high. At 89th percentile in the field and third in the division, Ocarina of Primetime looks like a team that drafted without drama and arrived somewhere worth being.

Holva didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it the way a good poker player wins a session, by consistently getting slightly more than they paid for. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the whole operation, and the value plays layered underneath him are what push this roster into genuine contention. Jeremiyah Love came off the board a full round after his ADP suggested he should, landing Holva an RB13 projection at a discount. Tyler Allgeier fell two rounds past his number and slots in as depth that most managers would envy. Meanwhile, Colston Loveland at TE3 gives the team a legitimate positional edge at a spot where the field routinely settles. The one real conversation piece is Marvin Harrison Jr., a projected WR33 who has spent two seasons underperforming enormous expectations while dealing with injuries and quarterback instability in Arizona. Whether he finally breaks through matters here. But even if Harrison stays frustrating, this roster has enough proven production above him

that it doesn't need a leap of faith to make noise. Division rank second, tournament percentile 90th, these numbers reflect a draft built quietly and correctly.

Dkarley sits atop the Link Division and in the 94th percentile of the field, and if you spend five minutes with this roster you understand exactly why. The foundation is elite: Puka Nacua at WR1, Jayden Daniels at QB5, and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a ceiling that most managers in this tournament would trade for without blinking. What separates Dkarley from other talented rosters, though, is the discipline that built it. Zero reaches across the entire draft. Not one. Carnell Tate landed as a projected WR29 starter, and Jaxson Dart came in at QB11 while falling nearly two rounds past his ADP. Cam Ward slipped all the way to pick 12.09 despite an ADP of 10.06, and Dkarley was right there to collect him. This is a team assembled by someone who set a price and refused to budge, and the board rewarded that patience. The weakest projected starter is Josh Downs at WR46. That is the complaint. It is not much of one.
