JenPolvogt came into this draft with a 2025 résumé worth respecting, a 90th-percentile scoring season that should have bought some confidence and patience. Instead, it apparently bought recklessness. Six major reaches across the board tell the whole story, and the two worst ones happened before the draft was barely underway: T.J. Hockenson, a TE23 projection, went off the board in the third round at a cost of 8.3 rounds over ADP, and J.K. Dobbins, the team's weakest projected starter at RB36, got grabbed in the fifth when the field wouldn't have touched him until round twelve. That is not aggressive drafting, that is panic in slow motion. Jalen Hurts lands as QB9 and Justin Jefferson as WR6, so the floor is not zero, but the price paid to secure them left the rest of the roster thin on upside and loaded with dart throws. The math resolves at the bottom of the division and the 1st percentile of the tournament, which is about as definitive a verdict as a draft can produce.

There is no kind way to read RumboyzRobbie's 2026 outlook, so let's not try. Coming off a 3-33 record that landed in the 3rd percentile of scoring, this roster needed a draft that fixed things, and instead it mostly compounded the damage. Five major reaches across the board are a brutal way to build, and the two that sting most are Matthew Stafford at QB14 and Bo Nix at QB15, both grabbed well ahead of market in the early rounds when that capital could have bought something closer to a sure thing. The weak receiver group, headlined by Terry McLaurin at WR24 and Davante Adams at WR25, is being asked to carry more weight than its projections suggest it can bear, and a Stafford-Adams stack is a fine consolation prize but not a lifeline. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 is the one undeniable asset here, a genuine ceiling-raiser, but even he cannot drag an 11th-place division ranking back to respectability on his own. RumboyzRobbie is not rebuilding. It is just waiting.

bigbadbull did almost everything right on draft day. Fourteen chalk picks, only one major reach, and two genuine steals in Cam Ward falling more than two rounds past his ADP and Eli Stowers sliding a full three rounds late. Josh Allen anchors the top of the roster as a projected QB1, Tyler Warren grades out as TE4, and Rashee Rice at WR13 gives this team a legitimate high-end receiver. On paper, those are the building blocks of a competitive squad. And yet here sits bigbadbull at tenth in the Mario division, projecting out at just the 32nd percentile of the field, which is the part that stings. The value was found. The process was mostly sound. The roster just does not produce enough across the bottom, where Tony Pollard grades as a projected RB30 and the Isaiah Likely upside, however real given his move to a light tight end room in New York, is still the upside of a TE13. bigbadbull played a disciplined draft and got a mediocre team anyway, and there is almost nothing more demoralizing than that.

There is no gentle way to say this: broy33 is staring at a 2026 season that grades out ninth in the Mario division and sits right at the tournament median, which is a polite way of saying the floor and the ceiling are basically the same room. The roster's best hope is that Brock Bowers at TE1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 are genuinely elite anchors, but the draft surrounding them was not kind, featuring three major reaches and zero steals. Dak Prescott was taken nearly a full round ahead of his ADP at QB7, a luxury price for a quarterback projected outside the top five. Meanwhile, the one real bright spot is DeVonta Smith, a WR14 projection who finally steps out of AJ Brown's shadow in Philadelphia with a clear path to targets, and who fell into broy33's lap a half-round past his ADP. That is a pleasant find. It is just not enough of one. Last season ended at 36 percent wins, and with no obvious lever left to pull, the projections suggest 2026 will look familiar.

NatePolvogt enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Mario division and hovering just above the tournament's median, which sounds more encouraging than it is when you remember this roster went 0-36 last year and landed in the second percentile in scoring. The building blocks exist: Drake Maye projects as a QB2, CeeDee Lamb checks in at WR5, and A.J. Brown at WR8 gives Nate a legitimate Maye stack worth something. The problem is that the roster thins out quickly after those names, and the draft didn't help matters the way it needed to. Four major reaches, including Chuba Hubbard pulled three rounds ahead of his ADP and Demond Claiborne grabbed nearly five rounds early, suggests Nate was hunting upside that the market had already priced out. Hubbard projects as the weakest starter on the roster at RB29, which tells you something about the gap between the top of this lineup and the bottom. Lamb and Brown are real. Everything underneath them is a prayer dressed up as a plan.

rubixcube81 sits at the 51st percentile, which is the fantasy equivalent of a perfectly adequate handshake: nobody is impressed, nobody is offended. The foundation is genuinely strong, Bijan Robinson at RB2, James Cook at RB5, and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this roster a backfield core that most managers would take without blinking, and Cook arriving as a value after falling nearly a full round past his ADP is the kind of quiet win that separates careful drafters from lucky ones. Kyle Pitts at TE7 was a similar find, slipping a round and a half before rubixcube81 grabbed him. The problem is that those advantages get eaten up fast when you scroll to the receiver group, where Jordan Addison checks in at WR43 and the depth behind him thins out quickly toward names like Zachariah Branch and Malachi Fields. Three major reaches did not help matters either, with Colby Parkinson and Jordan Love each costing nearly two and a half rounds of draft capital above market. This team wins if its top tier carries and loses if it needs the margins to break right.

AJPfish didn't hunt for the highlight-reel pick. They just kept coming out ahead on value, round after round, and the cumulative effect is a roster that deserves respect heading into 2026. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 slid past his ADP, and then Derrick Henry at RB12 did the same, falling a round and a half before AJPfish scooped him up. Kenneth Walker III at RB10 arrived a full round late to everyone else's party and right on time for this team. Six values against zero steals tells you the story: no single lottery-ticket moment, just a manager who stayed patient, let the board come to them, and repeatedly paid a discount for players the field slightly undervalued. The two major reaches on Joe Burrow and Patrick Mahomes are real, particularly Mahomes, who landed two rounds early, but in a positionless format the damage is context-dependent, and Burrow at QB4 gives the investment real upside. Sitting sixth in the Mario Division at the 59th percentile, AJPfish isn't yet a favorite, but this is a roster built the right way.

BigMcK18 didn't win the draft on one big swing. They won it pick by pick, round by round, quietly coming out ahead on enough selections to land at the 75th percentile before a single game is played. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Drake London at WR7 give this roster a legitimate top-end foundation, and then Malik Nabers at WR12 is the kind of dart throw that looks obvious in hindsight. Nabers spent most of the offseason generating concern, his redraft value sliding from a top-10 receiver in May all the way to WR21 in July, but he cleared the PUP list and looked fully himself in training camp. BigMcK18 bought in at a discount. Tetairoa McMillan falling 1.1 rounds past his ADP and Breece Hall slipping 1.5 rounds are the quieter examples of the same pattern: a manager who let the board come to them. The two major reaches on C.J. Stroud and Skyler Bell are real, but they're the footnotes on a draft that otherwise made more right calls than wrong ones.

Llewd didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't gamble on upside and pray. This roster was built the quiet way, by simply getting more than was given. Puka Nacua at WR1 landed at pick 1.11 when the board had him going nearly a full round earlier, a genuine steal hiding in plain sight. Saquon Barkley and Zay Flowers both slid past their ADPs by a round or more, and by the time Llewd was done, the team sat at the 92nd percentile of the entire field. The reaches exist, Jayden Daniels and Harold Fannin both cost a round or more of early capital, but Daniels projects as a QB5 and Fannin as a TE6, so the price of conviction wasn't wasted. What stands out is less any single move and more the cumulative ledger: three values, one steal, twelve picks at chalk. That's not luck, that's a manager who knew where the market was wrong and collected the discount every time it appeared.

Laneo285 sits third in the Mario division and projects into the 93rd percentile of the field, and the draft explains exactly why. This was not a roster built on one splashy pick that paid off. It was built on a quiet, relentless accumulation of value, the kind of draft where the wins come in the middle rounds and compound. Chris Olave fell nearly two rounds past his ADP before Laneo285 scooped him at WR11. Javonte Williams slid almost two rounds before landing at RB17. Jake Ferguson drifted a round and change before getting taken at TE12, joining a tight end group that also includes Trey McBride at TE2 and Tucker Kraft at TE5. That is seven players acquired at a discount against just two reaches on the entire board, and the one reach worth noting, Christian Kirk, came in round 18, where the cost of being wrong is almost nothing. The result is a starting lineup anchored by Lamar Jackson, McBride, and Olave that was earned pick by pick, not gambled into existence.

eyyimwalkinhere arrives in the Mario Division like a team that did its homework twice and still showed up early. This is what disciplined drafting looks like: a roster sitting at the 98th tournament percentile, built almost entirely on patience and positional awareness. The foundation is immovable, with Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 anchoring a starting core that does not ask much of the rest of the roster. But where eyyimwalkinhere really separates itself is in the middle rounds, where Nico Collins fell a full 1.5 rounds past his ADP to land at WR9, and Emeka Egbuka slid nearly two rounds to become a WR18 at a discount. Three steals, five values, eleven chalk picks, and not a single major reach across the entire draft. Coming off an 81 percent win rate and a 97th-percentile scoring season in 2025, there is a track record to go with the talent. The process was clean, the roster reflects it, and this team has very little to apologize for.

jtgole93 sits atop the Mario division and at the 100th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The receiver corps alone reads like someone hacked the system: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, George Pickens at WR10 landed a round and a half after his ADP, Tee Higgins at WR19 fell nearly three full rounds before jtgole93 scooped him, and Jameson Williams at WR21 came in under market too. That is four projected starters acquired with genuine draft-day discipline, not luck. Stack Caleb Williams with Colston Loveland at TE3 and you have a high-upside connection built into the core of the lineup. The steals-to-reaches ratio seals it: three steals, four values, eleven chalk picks, and one reach on Nicholas Singleton that barely registers against the volume of surplus value everywhere else. The weakest projected starter is Brenton Strange at TE17, which is the kind of "concern" most managers would trade their entire late-round haul to have. This roster was built with intention, and it shows.
