There is no charitable read on what MTKloset put together in the Diddy Kong division. The draft tells the whole story: zero steals, zero values, fourteen chalk picks, and three major reaches that would make a reasonable person wince. Matthew Stafford, a QB14, was taken nearly three and a half rounds early. Quentin Johnston, a WR41, got yanked off the board two rounds before the market said to. And somehow, after all that, MTKloset still found room for a late-round reach on Darnell Washington, a TE38 who cost three rounds of premium. The cruelest part is that none of these reaches even addressed a real need, they just accelerated mediocrity. Bijan Robinson and Saquon Barkley anchor the roster with genuine star power, but the supporting cast is headlined by projected starters like Johnston and Wan'Dale Robinson, a WR47, who is currently the weakest projected contributor on the team. Sitting sixth percentile in the field, MTKloset spent capital like it had none to spare and arrived exactly where that logic leads.

The Flying Squirrels drafted like someone who had one great idea and then panicked for seventeen rounds. That one great idea was pairing Ashton Jeanty and Omarion Hampton near the top, but even there the execution was sloppy: Jeanty at RB7 was taken nearly a full round early, and Hampton at RB9 went a full round before his ADP. So the team paid a premium to build around two players it could have had for less, then spent the middle and late rounds digging deeper into the same position, reaching three to four rounds early on Kaytron Allen and Demond Claiborne, neither of whom projects inside RB60. The receiver group that resulted from all this tunnel vision is headlined by Carnell Tate at WR29 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33, neither one a needle-mover at their projected rank. This team sits 11th in the Diddy Kong division and in the 8th percentile of the field. There is no flattering angle here. The draft confirmed the placement.

HelenEkeler69 enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Diddy Kong division and in just the 14th percentile of the field, and the roster offers precious little reason for optimism. The one genuine star, Puka Nacua at WR1, is real, but after him the talent drops off fast, with the projected starters grading out at RB31, RB32, and WR16 in a format where mediocre depth at every position adds up to mediocre scores every week. The draft did nothing to change the trajectory, producing zero steals, twelve chalk picks, and six reaches, including a major early commitment to Justin Herbert at QB8 when Herbert's own situation demands skepticism: Mike McDaniel's arrival in Los Angeles is encouraging, but if the Chargers keep winning and grinding the clock, Herbert's ceiling stays capped, and his 15 career rushing scores offer almost no floor as a runner. Dak Prescott stacks with Jake Ferguson for a modest bonus, but when your best draft move is Stefon Diggs falling two rounds past his ADP at WR56, the lever-pulling phase of this team's construction is simply over.

Last year's pafbg finished in the 80th percentile, and that reputation is now doing a lot of heavy lifting for a roster that no longer looks the part. The foundation is genuinely elite: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, and Chase Brown at RB11 form a top tier that few managers can match, and Breece Hall, Josh Jacobs, and Javonte Williams extend that depth well past most rosters. But in a positionless format, ceiling belongs to whoever rounds out the starting ten, and that is where the gap becomes uncomfortable. The receiver group tops out at D.J. Moore at WR26, then drops sharply to Xavier Worthy at WR49 and Travis Hunter at WR62, while the quarterback situation features Baker Mayfield at QB18 and Tyler Shough at QB20 as the best realistic options. Jacobs, meanwhile, carries real off-field uncertainty that remains unresolved. Sitting ninth in the Diddy Kong division and projected at just the 32nd percentile, pafbg has the bones of last year's team buried somewhere under this roster, but the flesh looks considerably thinner.

JC and the Sunshine Gang sits 8th in the Diddy Kong Division and projects in just the 34th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet does not offer much reason for optimism. The manager landed four values, most notably Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Travis Etienne at RB18, but offset nearly all of that goodwill with two major reaches in the late rounds on Mike Washington Jr. and Sean Tucker, a pair of RB59 and RB65 projections who were taken three-plus rounds ahead of where the market valued them. The team's ceiling leans on its projected starters, particularly Malik Nabers at WR12 and Taylor anchoring the backfield, but the floor keeps dropping when you get to the quarterback situation. Sam Darnold profiles as the weakest projected starter on the roster, sitting at QB21, and his path to better numbers requires him to fully command a Seattle passing game that leaned heavily on Jaxon Smith-Njigba last season while Kenneth Walker handled the ground work. Walker is gone now, but whether that translates into more fantasy production for Darnold is far from guaranteed. There is no obvious lever left to pull here.

SlimeSlay enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Diddy Kong division and at just the 36th tournament percentile, which is a polite way of saying the math is already working against them. The roster is not without its names: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give the team a legitimate ceiling, and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is a genuine difference-maker. The problem is what happens after those stars, because the supporting cast drops off fast and the draft did not paper over the cracks. Thirteen chalk selections out of nineteen picks tells you this manager mostly paid market price, and the one swing that mattered most, Tyler Allgeier at RB46, was taken 2.5 rounds early to produce a projected bottom-of-the-barrel starter. A 14-22 record last season and a 39 percent win rate already tell a story, and there is no obvious lever left to pull. Jackson and Achane will have big weeks, and SlimeSlay will still find a way to lose.

pjl126 sits at the 49th percentile, sixth in the Diddy Kong division, and that placement feels less like a verdict and more like a shrug. The foundation is genuinely strong: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Colston Loveland at TE3, and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this roster a ceiling worth respecting. But the margins that will decide this season are already showing cracks in the draft record. Three major reaches, including Josh Downs taken 2.3 rounds ahead of schedule at WR46 and Geno Smith pulled 2.2 rounds early at QB30, suggest a manager who fell in love with players before the market agreed. Those decisions matter when the season comes down to a point or two in a swing week. McConkey and Jameson Williams arriving as genuine values helps offset some of the reach damage, but pjl126 is not built with enough surplus to absorb bad luck gracefully. The roster can win, it can also quietly disappear, and right now there is no clean way to know which.

DanielTKelley did not light the draft board on fire with one splashy move. The work was quieter and more methodical than that, and the result lands this roster comfortably at the 69th percentile heading into 2026. The foundation is legitimate: Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Trey McBride at TE2 are the kind of projected starters that make a lineup competitive before it even gets creative, and pairing McBride with Kyle Pitts at TE7, Dalton Kincaid at TE11, and Brenton Strange at TE17 means DanielTKelley can deploy genuine positional talent at almost every slot. The steal of the draft is Jadarian Price, a projected RB26 who tumbled more than two full rounds past his ADP and landed at 11.11 while Derrick Henry at RB12 anchors the backfield. Chalk made up most of the board, which is not a criticism so much as a description of someone who trusted the process and mostly got it right. In a positionless format that rewards depth and flexibility, DanielTKelley built both without ever swinging for the fences.

casoles22 didn't make a lot of noise in the draft room, and that's kind of the point. The roster was built on a quiet accumulation of edges: Jayden Daniels at QB5 slid almost a full round past his ADP, CeeDee Lamb at WR5 fell even further, and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 arrived more than a round late as well. Three values in a single draft isn't luck, it's positioning. The result is a starting group headlined by Lamb, Daniels, and Brock Bowers at TE1, with Rashee Rice at WR13 and Egbuka at WR18 giving this team genuine upside at nearly every lineup spot. The Bowers and Dallas Goedert pairing at TE1 and TE15 adds another layer, and Goedert's context matters here: he stayed in Philadelphia on a one-year deal, arrives as arguably the most reliable piece of that passing game, and could be a difference-maker deep into the fantasy calendar. Sitting 73rd percentile overall and fourth in the Diddy Kong division, casoles22 has the kind of floor-to-ceiling range that makes them a legitimate threat to climb both standings before this is over.

DmacFF lands at 78th percentile in the field and third in the Diddy Kong division, and the draft tells you exactly why: almost nothing went wrong. Eighteen chalk picks and just one minor reach across the entire roster is the fingerprint of a manager who knew their board and stuck to it. The payoff shows up at the top of the lineup. Josh Allen at QB1 is the kind of anchor that makes every week winnable, and pairing Joe Burrow with Tee Higgins as a stack means those two are working in concert, not just coexisting on the roster. George Pickens at WR10 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 round out a group of projected starters that would look comfortable on most contenders. The 2025 résumé backs the optimism too: a 69 percent win rate and 85th percentile scoring are not flukes, they are evidence of a manager who builds correctly and competes consistently. DmacFF did not swing for fences and miss. They just kept hitting the ball hard.

Trotta23 sits at 93rd percentile in the field heading into 2026, and the draft log tells you exactly why: this is what consistent execution looks like. No lottery tickets cashed, just a manager who repeatedly let the board come to them. James Cook lands at RB5 and was taken right at his ADP, while RJ Harvey fell more than two full rounds before Trotta23 scooped him up at RB28, which is the kind of late-round patience that quietly separates good drafts from great ones. The receiver corps is where the depth gets genuinely interesting, with Nico Collins at WR9 and DeVonta Smith at WR14 anchoring a group that includes Luther Burden, who enters 2026 with Ben Johnson comparing him to Amon-Ra St. Brown after a dominant second half of last season. Burden is not a sure thing, but he is projecting at WR22 for a reason, and if he delivers on that hype this roster gets very hard to beat. Trotta23 did not need a single dramatic swing to build something this complete.

CaloFF didn't need a miracle pick to build one of the Diddy Kong division's most dangerous rosters, just a draft that kept finding the right player at the right time. Six values across the board tell the story: George Kittle fell nearly two rounds to pick 9.03, Bucky Irving slid past his ADP to land at 8.10, and Chuba Hubbard dropped almost two full rounds before CaloFF scooped him at 12.10. None of those moments were flashy, but they compound. Pair that discipline with a receiver group anchored by Ja'Marr Chase (WR2), Drake London (WR7), and A.J. Brown (WR8), all projected starters, and you have a team built less on fortune than on execution. The result is a 97th-percentile tournament projection and a division-leading rank that feel earned rather than lucky. CaloFF improved on a 58th-percentile scoring campaign in 2025, and if the values hold, this is a team that will be difficult to outlast when it matters.
