There is not much to celebrate in the Dig Dug division's basement, where QB3 sits at the bottom of the standings and in roughly the second percentile of the entire field. The draft tells the story as clearly as anything: three major reaches on Caleb Williams (QB6), Jayden Daniels (QB5), and Jayden Higgins (WR54) cost this roster dearly in draft capital, with Williams alone going a full round and a half ahead of his ADP. That kind of aggressive early spending on quarterbacks might make sense if it unlocked elite production everywhere else, but the receiver group grades out weak, and the projected starter floor bottoms out at Blake Corum, who projects as RB35. Saquon Barkley (RB8) is a genuine asset and keeps this roster from being a total write-off, but one elite player does not move the needle enough when the rest of the lineup is grinding on uphill projections. This team needed everything to break right in the draft, and it mostly did not. The season ahead looks long.

Fygar-nell Tate sits 11th in the Dig Dug Division and in just the 14th percentile of the field, and the uncomfortable truth is that the roster construction explains both numbers without much mystery. CeeDee Lamb and Justin Jefferson are genuine stars, and the receiving corps behind them is deep enough to keep the lineup humming, but this is a format that rewards elite players at every level, not just one position group. The problem is that the players asked to fill out the rest of those 10 starting slots are projected as RB40, RB41, TE16, and, most painfully, a quarterback situation headlined by Kyler Murray at QB19 and Cam Ward at QB23. Ward is the particular soft spot: Tennessee has genuinely upgraded the talent around him, adding Carnell Tate and reshaping the passing game, so the ceiling exists, but banking on a developmental quarterback breaking out is a prayer, not a plan. Three major reaches in the draft suggest the manager sensed the gaps and swung, but when Jalen Tolbert at WR102 is among the targets, the swings did not connect.

Pierce Burden's Skattebo7 finished in the 86th percentile last season, and the 2026 version of this roster is currently projected 15th percentile, which is the kind of gap that demands an explanation rather than a shrug. The receiver group is legitimately excellent, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, A.J. Brown at WR8 fresh off a move to New England where Drake Maye's arm should unlock everything Brown does best, Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, and Luther Burden at WR22 giving this team four starters most managers would envy. But a format that lets you start your ten best players means that receiver depth only carries you so far when the players outside the top receivers are projected this modestly. Cam Skattebo at RB20 was drafted nearly two rounds early, and the QB group, led by Sam Darnold at QB21 and C.J. Stroud at QB22, is where the roster goes from thin to genuinely worrying. Burden built a winner once. The question is whether last year's blueprint still exists, or if this team is riding a reputation that the current roster cannot cash.

sincityheat enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Dig Dug division and in the bottom third of the field, and the roster does not make a compelling case for optimism. The foundation looks decent enough on paper, Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and James Cook at RB5 give this team a strong backfield core, but the draft board tells a harder story. Four major reaches across the roster signal a manager who paid premium prices at the wrong windows, most notably Malik Nabers at WR12 taken more than a round early and Jordan Addison at WR43 taken nearly three rounds ahead of his value. That kind of draft leaves you without the surplus equity to recover when projections disappoint, and projections here are already middling. Baker Mayfield arrives as a QB18 with real questions attached, his supporting cast in Tampa has thinned after losing Mike Evans in free agency, and the consensus is not convinced he can recapture his 2024 form. This team is a 53 percent squad from a year ago that drafted itself into a corner with no obvious lever left to pull.

Rowdy357 arrives in the Dig Dug division sitting eighth and at just the 36th percentile of the field, and the draft did not do much to improve the outlook. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, with Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Nico Collins (WR9), Chris Olave (WR11), and Rashee Rice (WR13) projecting as starters and giving this roster a ceiling worth respecting. The problem is everything else. The quarterback situation is a liability Rowdy357 essentially chose not to address, with Jared Goff (QB16) leading a group that bottoms out at Jacoby Brissett (QB28) and J.J. McCarthy (QB37). The backfield is similarly thin, projecting starters Chuba Hubbard (RB29) and Rhamondre Stevenson (RB31) well outside any useful range, and Stevenson was already reached on by nearly two rounds. Two major reaches, Kaelon Black and Jack Bech, occupied late picks that could have shored up real weaknesses. The receivers will keep this team competitive on paper, but a WR-heavy roster built around a QB16

and a backfield full of RB29-and-worse options is a blueprint for finishing right about where Rowdy357 is currently projected: middle of nowhere.

troybbb drafted with the patience of someone who actually read the research, logging 16 chalk selections and one genuine value in Chigoziem Okonkwo, who fell more than a round past his ADP. The result is a roster that looks impressive on the surface and lands at just the 39th percentile of the field, which is the kind of outcome that makes a manager stare at their screen wondering what went wrong. Christian McCaffrey and Jonathan Taylor headline the group, and projected starters like Derrick Henry and Chase Brown add legitimate depth, but the floor drops off sharply once you get past that core. David Montgomery is technically in the mix, though his move to Houston comes with real uncertainty as he pushes Woody Marks for carries after his lowest-volume season yet. Tony Pollard, the one minor reach on the board, projects as the weakest starter at RB30. troybbb did almost everything

right at the draft table and still assembled a team that projects 7th in the Dig Dug division. Doing things correctly and finishing average is its own special kind of frustrating.

RyanHallam sits at the 43rd percentile and sixth in the Dig Dug division, which tells you everything about where this team lives: not dangerous enough to headline, not flawed enough to dismiss. The foundation is genuinely good. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 are projected starters you build around, and George Pickens at WR10 gives the lineup a legitimate top-end receiver. The problem is that the margin between a winning week and a losing one is razor thin, because the supporting cast is exactly average. Trevor Lawrence projects as QB10 but rides the bench behind nobody worth starting, and Hunter Henry at TE18 is the weakest projected starter on the roster. The draft itself was almost entirely chalk, with no steals and no values to brag about, and a two-round reach on Dontayvion Wicks at WR96 in round 18 suggests RyanHallam was filling the back of the roster on hope rather than conviction. Robinson and Jeanty can carry weeks. Whether the depth behind them does the same is the only question that matters.

King2Icon didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it round by round, quietly coming out ahead on value enough times that it added up to something real. Josh Jacobs at RB16 slid a full round past his ADP before King2Icon scooped him up in the sixth. Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 did the same thing a couple rounds later. These aren't the kinds of wins that make highlight reels, but they're the kind that separate competent managers from lucky ones. The foundation is genuinely strong: Omarion Hampton (RB9), Kenneth Walker III (RB10), Breece Hall (RB14), and Jacobs give this roster a top-tier core, and Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) is the sort of anchor that makes the rest of the lineup easier to build around. The Chris Bell reach in the fifteenth is the one draft decision that raises an eyebrow, but one questionable flier at the back end of a draft doesn't undo what King2Icon built ahead of it. Sitting at 58th percentile with upside to climb, this team belongs in the conversation.

huskerlover didn't build this roster on one flashy gamble. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 60th percentile with a realistic case for climbing higher in the Dig Dug division. The foundation is legitimately elite: Brock Bowers at TE1 and Travis Kelce at TE10 give this lineup a top-end advantage that most managers will never match, and pairing Lamar Jackson at QB3 with Zay Flowers at WR16 as a stack adds a layer of correlation that pays dividends when things click. Tucker Kraft landing at TE5 when his ADP suggested he should have been gone nearly two rounds earlier is exactly the kind of quiet win that separates a good draft from a great one. The one blemish is Tank Dell, reached four-plus rounds before his ADP, but one overpay on a 20-round board is a rounding error when the rest of the sheet reads this clean. This is a draft built on discipline, and discipline has a way of showing up in the standings.

villatwin didn't manufacture this roster through one inspired gamble or a single late-round lightning strike. They built it the way you build a winning hand in poker: card by card, edge by edge, until the table belongs to you. The tight end group alone tells the story. Trey McBride at TE2, Tyler Warren at TE4, and Harold Fannin at TE6, with Fannin arriving as a legitimate value after sliding a full round past his ADP, gives this team a top-of-the-position advantage most managers would trade their third-best skill player to match. Pair that with Drake London projecting as WR7 at the top of the receiver group, add the quietly intriguing Parker Washington, a WR35 projection who somehow outpaced Travis Hunter and Brian Thomas Jr. for targets in Jacksonville last year, and villatwin is sitting at 75th percentile in this field without a single moment where everything had to go right. Third in the Dig Dug division is a floor that undersells what this roster can do when the projections cash.

There are teams that win their drafts with one splashy move, and then there is 1GridironGoddess, who simply kept coming out ahead pick after pick until the damage was done. The foundation is formidable: Josh Allen at QB1 and Joe Burrow at QB4 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in the Dig Dug division cannot match. But the real story is the accumulation of value below the top rounds. De'Von Achane landed at RB6 nearly a full round after his ADP suggested he would be gone, and Davante Adams slipped more than a round to land at WR25, both of them now projected starters. Add D'Andre Swift falling 1.3 rounds and Makai Lemon sliding past his number, and you have a roster built not on luck but on a manager who knew what things were worth and waited. Five values, thirteen chalk picks, and zero major reaches is not a headline, it is a methodology. Sitting at 90th percentile in the field after a 26-10 campaign in 2025, 1GridironGoddess arrives in 2026 looking less like a contender and more like the standard everyone else is chasing.

Pooka Nacua sat at the top of the Dig Dug division and the 99th percentile of the field entering 2026, and the draft record tells you exactly why: 20 picks, zero reaches. That kind of discipline compounds fast. The foundation is legitimate, with Puka Nacua projecting as WR1 and Drake Maye as QB2, but the real craftsmanship shows up in how this roster was assembled around them. Bucky Irving fell nearly two full rounds past his ADP and landed here as a projected RB21 starter. RJ Harvey slipped almost three rounds and gives this team another projected contributor at RB28. Colston Loveland, a projected TE3, came off the board nearly a round late. Sam LaPorta, projected TE8, fell over a round. Every single one of those players was taken at value or better, and not a single pick on the entire roster cost more than it should have. The floor here is already high. The ceiling depends on how many of those values hit, and with this many of them, at least a few will.
