Cranky Kong enters 2026 sitting at the 10th percentile of the field, and nothing in the draft log suggests a turnaround is coming. The roster's saving grace is Christian McCaffrey at RB3, a genuinely elite anchor, but after him the drop-off is real and the depth chart fills out with names like Tony Pollard at RB30, who projects as the weakest starter on the board. The draft itself offered few moments of inspiration: twelve chalk picks, six minor reaches, and a major reach on Carson Beck at QB40 that cost roughly eight rounds of draft capital for a QB40. Drake Maye grades out as a QB2 and gives this team a credible quarterback situation, but Maye's ceiling can't compensate for a receiver corps that tops out at Garrett Wilson and Emeka Egbuka in the WR17-WR18 range, fine starters who don't move the needle against elite competition. Cranky Kong limped to a 4-32 record and 9th

percentile scoring in 2025, and the 2026 construction, mostly conservative picks with one costly overpay, doesn't give much reason to expect anything different.

The 2026 Scott Fish Bowl bracket is a charitable enterprise by design, but GabsMafra's draft offers nothing to be charitable about. Five major reaches across the board, zero steals, and a finished roster that lands at 15th percentile in the field tells the story before a single game is played. The headline injury is buried in the depth chart: Quinshon Judkins, recovering from a fractured fibula, is reportedly on track for training camp but remains a question mark, and this team cannot afford question marks at the positions that matter. What makes it worse is the shape of the damage. Tyler Warren, a legitimate TE4, was taken nearly a full round early, which is defensible in isolation, but Ty Simpson was hauled off the board six-plus rounds before his ADP at a QB36 projection, a reach so aggressive it almost loops back around to being interesting. Almost. GabsMafra went 2-34 last season, scored in the first percentile, and then drafted like a team that learned nothing from the experience.

Diddy Kong FC sits 10th in the Donkey Kong division and down in the 20th percentile of the field, and the roster anatomy explains why there is not much reason for optimism. The receiver group is legitimately strong, anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and George Pickens at WR10, and the Jared Goff stack connecting both of them is a clever construction. The problem is that Goff himself grades out as a QB16, and the fallback is C.J. Stroud at QB22, which means the engine powering those weapons is the weakest projected starter on the entire roster. Derrick Henry at RB12 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 are fine, but neither changes the ceiling meaningfully. The draft did not help matters, with two major reaches on the board including Chris Brazzell II taken more than five rounds ahead of his ADP, buying upside that projects nowhere near the top of the field. This roster is a sports car with a lawnmower engine, and there is no obvious move left to fix it.

Hong Kong Phooey enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Donkey Kong division and at just the 27th percentile of the field, and the roster does not make a compelling case for optimism. The building blocks are there at the top: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and James Cook at RB5 give this team genuine star power, and Harold Fannin at TE6 is a legitimate weapon. But the supporting cast falls off a cliff fast, with Khalil Shakir projected as the weakest starter at WR51, and a draft that produced zero steals against fifteen chalk selections is not the profile of a team that found hidden upside. The one move that stings most is the Fernando Mendoza reach, taken nearly three full rounds ahead of his ADP at QB27, a pick that locked up capital on a fringe starter while better value sat on the board. Taylor and Cook can carry a week, but in a format this deep, needing two players to be perfect every single time is less a strategy than a prayer.

CalmB4TheScore has one genuine weapon, and unfortunately the rest of the roster is busy reminding you why the name "calm" might be the most appropriate thing about this team. Josh Allen at QB1 is legitimately elite, but in a positionless format where everyone fields their best players, a single stud at quarterback only carries you so far when the supporting cast grades out this thin. The rest of the projected starters are functional at best, with Rico Dowdle projecting as the weakest link at RB32, and the tight end group is an embarrassing collection of fringe options headlined by Colby Parkinson at TE31, a player the manager reached nearly three rounds early to acquire. Theo Johnson, taken 3.5 rounds ahead of his ADP, isn't a solution either. Two major reaches at a weak position, a 28th-percentile scoring season in 2025, and a current division rank of eighth adds up to a roster without an obvious lever to pull. The storm isn't coming for CalmB4TheScore. It's already here.

Big Truss didn't make any splashy moves in the Donkey Kong division, but quiet competence has a way of adding up. The foundation is real: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Colston Loveland at TE3 are projected starters you build around, and the Caleb Williams/Loveland stack gives this roster a structural edge that pays dividends every week Williams has a big game. The draft itself was mostly chalk, but the two values the manager did find were meaningful ones. Williams falling nearly a full round past his ADP at pick 4.03 meant landing a QB6 at a discount, and Wan'Dale Robinson slipping to 11.10 was the kind of quiet win that separates a good draft from a great one. Chris Olave at WR11 and Jaylen Waddle at WR23 round out a projected starting group with genuine upside. This team sits at 52nd percentile entering the season, which feels like an undercount. Big Truss didn't swing for the fences, it just kept hitting doubles, and that is often exactly enough.

MyronKittle sits at 52nd percentile and sixth in the Donkey Kong Division, which is the fantasy equivalent of a perfectly average Tuesday. Nothing to fear, nothing to celebrate, just margins. The case for optimism starts with Puka Nacua, a WR1 taken at 1.05 while the field was still reaching for coffee, and De'Von Achane at RB6 anchoring a backfield group that also includes Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Kyren Williams at RB15. That is a legitimate top of roster, the kind that keeps a manager in contention even when the dice roll cold. The case for anxiety lives at the other end: the weakest projected starter is Kenyon Sadiq at TE21, a number that signals replacement-level production in the spot that could quietly bleed this team to death over a full season. The draft was mostly chalk, with Skyler Bell arriving six-plus rounds early as the one swing that raises an eyebrow. Nacua and Achane are real. Sadiq is not. Whether that gap is bridgeable is exactly the question this season will answer.

Kong Express sits at the 52nd percentile, which is another way of saying this is a team that will beat the rosters it should beat and lose to the ones it should lose to, unless the margins break right. The case for optimism lives in the receivers: Malik Nabers (WR12), Rashee Rice (WR13), and Zay Flowers (WR16) form a projected-starter core that most teams at this tournament percentile simply cannot match, and the manager landed Nabers nearly two full rounds after his ADP, which is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a season. Joe Burrow (QB4) provides elite support at the position when healthy, with Jordan Love (QB17) as a credible fallback. What tempers the outlook is the drafting variance on the back end: reaching nearly four rounds early on Deshaun Watson (QB34) and over two rounds early on Dalton Schultz (TE22) cost real capital that could have reinforced the depth. Jayden Reed (WR48) projects as the weakest starter on the board. This team has a ceiling, but it needs its top names to perform, because the cushion underneath is thin.

FullMoonWS built something real here, and the draft log is going to confuse people. Three major reaches, zero steals, and yet the roster that came out the other side sits at the 56th percentile with a starting core that is genuinely hard to argue with. The foundation is Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7, two projected starters acquired at chalk prices, and they anchor everything. But the reaches are the real story. J.K. Dobbins at RB36 came off the board nearly four rounds early, Matthew Golden at WR52 nearly three rounds early, Brandon Aiyuk at WR81 nearly four rounds early. On draft day, those picks look like a manager falling in love with their own board. On the roster sheet, they look like conviction. Justin Herbert, a legitimate QB8 who somehow fell past his ADP by more than a round, gives the quarterback situation real credibility. Whether FullMoonWS saw something the field missed or simply got lucky that their reaches held up, the result is the same: a team that could move well past fourth in the Donkey Kong division, if the dart throws land.

Lizzle6 did not win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it the way a good poker player wins a session: quietly, hand after hand, never overplaying. Justin Jefferson slipping to pick 2.07 despite an ADP closer to the first round is the kind of moment that looks lucky in the moment and obvious in hindsight, and Bucky Irving falling a full round past his ADP gave the roster WR3 and RB21 as cornerstones before the middle rounds even started. From there, the draft was mostly chalk, which is not a criticism when the chalk produces a starting group that includes Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Mike Evans at WR27, and Travis Kelce at TE10. The Brock Purdy situation carries genuine uncertainty, with injuries thinning out his supporting cast in San Francisco, but Evans landing there as a free agent signing addresses at least part of that concern. Finishing 77th percentile in the tournament and third in the Donkey Kong division, Lizzle6 built a team that did not need a lottery ticket to get here.

The King of Kong didn't win the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it pick by pick, round by round, quietly accumulating an edge that adds up to a second-place division finish and a 77th percentile tournament projection. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 is the headliner, but the supporting architecture is what makes this roster genuinely dangerous. Jayden Daniels, projected QB5, slipped nearly two full rounds past his ADP before the King of Kong scooped him up, and Drake London at WR7 came in four picks later than the market expected. Those aren't lucky accidents, they're evidence of a manager who knew what things were worth and waited. The one variable worth watching is Josh Jacobs, a projected RB16 whose off-field situation remains unresolved and could reshape the roster's floor in ways no draft board can account for. If Jacobs stays available, this team has legitimate top-quartile upside. If not, the depth behind him will be tested sooner than anyone planned.

smithbk sits atop the Donkey Kong division at the 96th tournament percentile, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster was not built on luck, it was built on patience and board awareness, with nine players taken at or beyond their ADP and zero major reaches across the entire draft. The pillars are hard to argue with: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 give this team two of the most dangerous weapons in the format, both secured as projected starters, both representing genuine value against where they were expected to go. The tight end group is quietly the engine of the whole thing, with Kyle Pitts, Sam LaPorta, Isaiah Likely, and Dallas Goedert all projected starters, all taken after their ADPs, and Likely now following John Harbaugh to New York where a light room gives him a real path to involvement. When Jordan Addison at WR43 is your weakest projected starter, you have not made mistakes. You have made a roster.
