There is not much rope left to grab here. canes1996 sits 12th in the Donkey Kong 64 division and in the 14th percentile of the field, and the draft did essentially nothing to improve that outlook, producing zero steals against four major reaches. The most damaging of those reaches came at quarterback, where the manager burned a seventh-round pick on Cam Ward, a QB23 projection that simply does not justify that cost, then doubled down by taking Tua Tagovailoa three-plus rounds early in round 11 and Carson Beck a staggering nine rounds ahead of consensus in round 15. In a positionless format where you start your ten best players, quarterback matters only when you have a good one, and Ward is the projected starter. The saving graces, Trey McBride at TE2, Malik Nabers at WR12, and Joe Burrow at QB4, give the roster a real ceiling, but Burrow carries an injury asterisk and the depth behind those three names grades out near the bottom of the field. canes1996 is not rebuilding. They are already here, and here is not a good place to be.

There is not much juice left to squeeze here. Herrlibomber sits 11th in the Donkey Kong 64 division and projects in just the 19th percentile of the field, and the roster explains both numbers honestly. The top end is real enough, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and James Cook at RB5 give the team a legitimate foundation, but the draft sheet shows three major reaches and zero steals, which means the manager paid early-round prices for late-round players rather than building depth on favorable terms. Fernando Mendoza, taken seven rounds before his QB27 projection warranted, is the clearest symptom of that problem. Kimani Vidal, reached six rounds early and projecting as RB60, compounds it. Those are not the kinds of bets that age well when the studs get nicked up, and with Daniel Jones as the projected starting quarterback, the margin for error is already thin before a single week is played. The foundation exists, the construction around it does not.

There is not much juice left to squeeze here. OldManMcLennan lands at 10th in the Donkey Kong 64 division and sits in just the 20th percentile of the field, and the draft did not generate the kind of surplus value that could paper over a thin overall roster grade. The headline name is Justin Jefferson, projected at WR6, but even that comes with a footnote: Jefferson spent last season misfiring with a quarterback he never connected with, and his WR6 projection leans heavily on Kyler Murray winning the Minnesota starting job and actually unlocking what Jefferson can do. That is a real bet, not a sure thing. Meanwhile, the Lamar Jackson and Mark Andrews stack is a legitimate strength, Jackson grading out as a QB3 and the pairing offering the kind of weekly floor that keeps a team competitive. But below those two anchors the roster thins out in a hurry, and the one glaring draft mistake, taking MarShawn Lloyd nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP, burned a late pick that could have shored things up. OldManMcLennan is not without weapons, but the margin for error is essentially gone before the season even starts.

There is no elegant way to spin a 29th-percentile projection and a ninth-place divisional standing, so jerryj22, let's just be honest with each other. The foundation here is genuinely solid: Josh Allen at QB1 is the kind of anchor most managers would mortgage future picks to own, and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 gives this roster a second pillar worth building around. The problem is that everything below those two drops off at an uncomfortable pace, and the draft offered no relief. Sixteen chalk picks, zero steals, zero values, just a manager faithfully paying full price for a roster that graded out near the bottom anyway. Josh Jacobs at RB16 looked like a stabilizing piece until an offseason arrest clouded his availability entirely, and that uncertainty alone is the kind of shadow that turns a borderline playoff roster into a lottery ticket. Allen and Jeanty are real. The margin for error around them is not. In the Donkey Kong 64 division, jerryj22 is going to need a lot to go right, and the draft gave them no reason to expect that it will.

There is no flattering angle here. The 5YR Offseason Champion sits eighth in the Donkey Kong 64 division and projects out at just the 31st percentile of the field, and the roster construction does not suggest a hidden gear waiting to be found. The TE group is genuinely elite, with Colston Loveland, Tucker Kraft, Sam LaPorta, and Travis Kelce all projecting as starters, but Kraft is coming off a November ACL tear and asking a recovering pass-catcher to anchor your best positional group is a bet, not a plan. Everywhere else, the outlook dims quickly. Jahmyr Gibbs is a legitimate RB1, but the supporting cast falls off hard, with Kyle Monangai projecting as the weakest starter at RB33. The QB room is a mess of reaches, Bo Nix pulled two rounds early and Kyler Murray a full round ahead of market, and neither projects better than QB15. The draft logged zero steals and two major reaches, which means this team did not build cheap depth, it overpaid for players who still grade out as liabilities. That is a difficult math problem with no obvious solution.

Gotham Rogues TCP enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Donkey Kong 64 division and at just the 38th tournament percentile, and the draft did nothing to change the trajectory. Sixteen chalk picks, zero steals, and a pair of major reaches define a board that played it safe and still came up short. The biggest reach was Caleb Williams, taken nearly a full round before his ADP despite projecting as QB6, a gamble that makes more sense when you notice the Williams to Luther Burden stack baked into the lineup. But a stack is a multiplier, not a foundation, and the foundation here is shaky. Bijan Robinson grading out at RB2 is a genuine anchor, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 gives the team real depth at the top, but the projected starters thin out quickly after that, with the weakest projected starter slotting in at RB28 in RJ Harvey. The 2025 campaign ended at the 42nd percentile in scoring, and nothing about this offseason suggests 2026 will look meaningfully different.

SMVincent11 didn't need a single lightning-bolt moment to build one of the more quietly dangerous rosters in the Donkey Kong 64 division. The draft reads almost boringly competent: 17 chalk picks, one steal, and a total of two picks that came in ahead of schedule. But chalk is only boring if the players aren't any good, and these are. Drake Maye at QB2 and Justin Herbert at QB8 give this team a legitimate top-end advantage at the position, and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 anchors a starting group that also includes Harold Fannin at TE6. The real story, though, is the margins. Jordyn Tyson, a projected WR34, slid nearly two rounds past his ADP and landed here. Brian Robinson fell even further. Neither pick required a dramatic gamble, just patience and a willingness to take what the board offered. Coming off a 75-percent win rate and a 93rd-percentile scoring season in 2025, SMVincent11 enters 2026 sitting sixth in the division, with a roster that got there the old-fashioned way.

Last year was genuinely ugly: gniusthemc finished with a 2-34 record and landed in the 5th percentile of scoring, the kind of season that makes a manager question every life choice. The 2026 roster reads like a direct response to that misery. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give this team a top-end foundation that most of the field simply cannot match, and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 and Bhayshul Tuten at RB25 keep the quality from falling off a cliff once you get past the headliners. Jameson Williams arriving at WR21 after sliding a full round past his ADP is the kind of quiet win that pays out over a long season. The quarterback situation requires some faith, Jalen Hurts projects as a QB9 and carries real upside, while Jordan Love's fantasy value has persistently lagged behind his NFL reputation, and there's no guarantee Green Bay's receiver room gives him the tools to close that gap this year. Still, this team sits at the 62nd percentile and is projecting a genuine climb. The floor is dramatically higher than 2025, and the ceiling is worth watching.

Banana Chasers landed at the 65th percentile and fourth in the Donkey Kong 64 division, which sounds modest until you look at what they actually built. The foundation is legitimately elite: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this roster a top end that most managers in this tournament would envy, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Zay Flowers at WR16 are not depth filler, they are genuine contributors. Here is where the conviction versus luck question gets interesting, though. McMillan was taken a full 1.2 rounds early, and the manager burned their first pick of round 17 on Malachi Fields at WR90 and closed out the draft by reaching nearly three rounds for Tyquan Thornton at WR97. Those last two picks are the kind of moves that make draft analysts wince. But the Chase and Brown picks are the kind of picks that make analysts forget everything else. If the top of this roster performs to projection, the reaches at the bottom are a footnote. If it does not, those reaches will look like the whole story.

There was no single eureka moment in this draft, no home run swing that either paid off or blew up in the manager's face. Jaxon Smith-Njigbowl just kept winning small, and that is how you build something worth talking about. The foundation is real: De'Von Achane at RB6 and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 give this roster two genuinely elite projected starters, the kind of names that anchor lineups while managers elsewhere are hoping their third-best option has a breakout week. But the deeper story is the draft discipline. Three players came in as values, none as reaches, and Alec Pierce landing at WR32 nearly two rounds after his ADP is exactly the kind of quiet coup that separates thoughtful drafters from lucky ones. A 78th-percentile tournament projection and a third-place divisional standing reflect a team built without drama, which is precisely the point. This roster did not need a heist. It just needed a manager who did not blink.

Jbrix didn't swing for the fences and miss. They just kept hitting singles that turned into doubles, round after round, and now they're sitting at 86th percentile in the field with a roster that earned its way there. The foundation is a receiving corps that would make any manager envious: Puka Nacua at WR1 anchors everything, George Pickens and Chris Olave follow as projected starters, and Olave himself is one of the cleaner value stories on this roster, sliding a full round past his ADP into the fourth round. Derrick Henry at RB12 fell a similar distance, slipping past his 4.01 ADP all the way to 5.03 while Jbrix waited patiently. George Kittle dropping a round and a half to land at 8.10 only adds to the picture. None of those moves required genius or luck, just discipline and a willingness to let the board come to them. Six values and zero major reaches across an entire draft is a quiet kind of excellence, and it has Jbrix firmly in the division title conversation.

Last year, Wontu take me2 Chunkytown finished in the bottom 14 percent of the field in scoring, a miserable campaign that now reads like the low point before a genuine turnaround. The 2026 roster looks like a completely different animal. Brock Bowers checks in as the TE1, Kyle Pitts sits at TE7, and Isaiah Likely lands at TE13, a tier of top-end production that tilts the lineup's ceiling upward before you even get to the receivers. Drake London at WR7, Rashee Rice at WR13, and Ladd McConkey at WR20 give the team three projected starters who all crack the position's top 20. The draft process backed the talent up: Matthew Stafford fell nearly one and a half rounds past his ADP before this manager grabbed him at QB14, and Parker Washington slipped almost two full rounds before landing at WR35. Sitting first in the Donkey Kong 64 division and at the 91st percentile of the field, Chunkytown is not just rebounding from 2025, it is making a credible run at something much bigger.
