Last year, JKeasy posted a 28-8 record and scored in the 91st percentile, the kind of season that makes a manager feel untouchable. This year's roster is a humbling correction. The team sits at a 9th percentile projection and ranks 12th in Donkey Kong Country, which is not the position of someone coasting on momentum. The backfield is genuinely excellent, with James Cook (RB5) and De'Von Achane (RB6) anchoring a group that any manager would envy, but that strength quietly masks what is happening everywhere else. Bo Nix (QB15) headlines a quarterback situation that grades out weak, and the receiving corps leans heavily on Chris Olave (WR11) and Jaylen Waddle (WR23) before fading fast toward Michael Pittman (WR44) as the projected weakest starter. JKeasy also reached two rounds early on Jayden Higgins (WR54), the draft's one major reach, which suggests the

back end of this roster was built with more hope than evidence. The gap between who JKeasy was and who this roster projects to be is not a slump. It looks like a rebuild wearing last year's trophy.

jcernicka sits 11th in Donkey Kong Country and in just the 26th percentile of the field, and the roster itself explains why there is no easy fix. The draft leaned heavily on chalk, 13 of the 17 picks landing right at market value, which means there are no hidden gems waiting to carry this team past its projections. The two moments where jcernicka went against the grain actually made things worse: Patrick Mahomes cost a third-round pick at a time when positionless formats punish that kind of early commitment to a QB12, and Jacoby Brissett, a QB28, was taken more than three rounds ahead of schedule. Two major reaches at quarterback in the same draft is a tough thing to recover from. The bright spots are real, Drake London at WR7 and Trey McBride at TE2 give this roster a legitimate floor, but a floor is all they provide when the surrounding cast grades out as thin as it does here. jcernicka is not without hope, just without leverage.

There is no polite way to say this: rcountryman is in trouble. Sitting 10th in the Donkey Kong Country division and projecting at just the 29th percentile of the field, this roster has the look of a team that drafted hard and landed soft. The RB group is genuinely interesting, with Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Kyren Williams at RB15 anchoring things, but the supporting cast fades fast, and David Montgomery, brought in to push for a lead role in Houston after losing his standing in Detroit, grades out at RB23 with real competition ahead of him in that backfield. The real damage shows at the top of the lineup, where Drake Maye projects as a QB2 but Cam Ward sits at QB23 as the projected second option, and the TE group offers nothing better than Greg Dulcich at TE25. A year after finishing at the 6th percentile in scoring, there is no breakout asset lurking here, no hidden steal to build a turnaround narrative around. This is a roster that has already shown its cards, and the hand is not good.

Last year, vanfalcons went 26-10 and scored in the 93rd percentile, the kind of season that makes a manager feel like they cracked the code. The 2026 roster suggests the code has been changed. Sitting at 29th percentile in tournament projections and ninth in Donkey Kong Country, this team is being asked to defend a penthouse reputation from a middle-floor address. The foundation looks solid enough: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give the team a genuinely elite backfield, and Rashee Rice at WR13 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 are legitimate contributors. But when the draft produced zero steals, fourteen chalk picks, and a major reach on Elijah Sarratt at WR98, it is hard to find the move that separates this roster from the crowd. Jordan Love as the QB1, taken a round early despite projecting as QB17, compounds the anxiety. The players at the top are real. The margin for error, though, is not what it was when vanfalcons was one of the best teams in the field.

Its Amon Like Donkey Kong drafted with genuine patience, and the ledger shows it: sixteen chalk picks, two values, and a steal in Brian Robinson, who fell nearly three rounds to Round 18. On paper, that process should produce a roster with an edge. Instead, the team sits eighth in Donkey Kong Country and at the 36th percentile of the field, which is the specific kind of outcome that makes a manager question whether the draft gods have a sense of humor. The core is real: Amon-Ra St. Brown projects as WR4, Jonathan Taylor as RB4, and Caleb Williams, a genuine value at QB6, gives the starting lineup a ceiling. But the depth fades fast, and Jadarian Price, projected RB26, is currently the weakest projected starter, which means the margin for injury is thin even before the season begins. The process was sound. The result is a team that looks better on a draft board than in a standings projection, and those two things have a way of never reconciling by season's end.

FantasyALarm is the kind of team that makes you nod when you see the roster and then immediately forget about them, which is exactly the problem. Sitting 7th in Donkey Kong Country at the 53rd percentile, this is a squad built on a legitimate running back foundation, with Omarion Hampton (RB9), Jeremiyah Love (RB13), Breece Hall (RB14), and Josh Jacobs (RB16) all projecting as starters, and the margins of a positionless format reward that kind of depth. Jacobs was the one genuine value on a draft sheet that otherwise leaned heavily chalk, 16 picks at or near ADP with zero steals, meaning this roster reflects the market almost exactly. That's not a sin, but it leaves no hidden equity to cash in when the inevitable injury or underperformance hits. The receiver group is soft, Courtland Sutton (WR37) leading a projected starting corps that includes Jakobi Meyers (WR45), and Josh Allen (QB1) and Jayden Daniels (QB5) at quarterback provide real upside. Win the close weeks and this team contends. Lose them and the field moves on without a second glance.

Theace18 walked out of this draft looking like someone who lost every argument and still won the fight. The major reaches tell the story clearly: Tony Pollard at RB30 taken 2.2 rounds early, Aaron Jones at RB38 grabbed a staggering 4.1 rounds ahead of consensus, Cooper Kupp pulled in nearly three rounds before his ADP. By the board's logic, this team should be underwater. By the roster's logic, it is sitting at the 57th percentile with a starting lineup that includes Puka Nacua at WR1, Saquon Barkley at RB8, Joe Burrow at QB4, and two tight ends in Tucker Kraft and Kyle Pitts ranked TE5 and TE7 respectively. Burrow was actually a value, slipping almost a full round past his ADP. That tension, reaching badly in some spots and collecting value in others, is what makes Theace18 interesting. The roster works because the top of it is legitimately excellent. Whether the conviction on Jones and Pollard looks smart or stubborn by season's end is the only real question left to answer.

Dalton Kincaid Country didn't need a lottery ticket to build something worth watching in Donkey Kong Country. This roster was assembled the quiet way, four values against ADP and almost no reaches, a draft that just kept coming out ahead pick after pick. The foundation is real: Brock Bowers at TE1 was technically taken a few spots early at 1.03, but paying a modest premium for the top tight end in the field is hardly a crime. From there the value started flowing, Justin Herbert landing at QB8 four picks after his ADP, and Travis Hunter sliding more than two full rounds past his number to land at WR62 as a depth piece with upside. The wide receiver group does the heavy lifting in the starting lineup, with Nico Collins at WR9, George Pickens at WR10, Jameson Williams at WR21, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 all projected to start. No single flashy moment defined this draft. It just won small, repeatedly, and those quiet wins have a way of adding up by Week 14.

Gronky Kong Country didn't build this roster on one thunderbolt moment. They built it by consistently coming out ahead on the deal, and the clearest example is Jalen Hurts, a QB9 projection snagged two full rounds past his ADP. That kind of patience compounds. Trevor Lawrence, projecting as QB10, fell into their lap a round and change late as well, meaning the team carries two legitimately startable quarterbacks acquired at a discount before most managers noticed the shelf was emptying. Up front, the wideout corps is quietly dangerous: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 project as two of the better receivers in the field, with Malik Nabers at WR12 providing real depth behind them. Travis Kelce, who had some question marks about returning in 2026 before officially committing to another season, lands at TE10 and gives the roster another player capable of winning a week outright. Sitting at 65th percentile entering the season, this is a team built less on one marquee swing than on the cumulative edge of a draft that simply kept winning the small moments.

TGarrettFF didn't win the draft in one flashy moment, they won it in the accumulation. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this roster a top-end that most managers in Donkey Kong Country simply cannot match, and the depth behind them, Tee Higgins at WR19, Ladd McConkey at WR20, keeps the quality from dropping off a cliff the moment someone misses a week. Dak Prescott slots in as a QB7 projection with Jaxson Dart, taken a full round after his ADP, waiting as a QB11 in reserve, which means TGarrettFF picked up real quarterback value while the room was looking elsewhere. There were no earth-shaking steals here, but three legitimate values against zero steals and thirteen chalk picks tells you something: this manager knew the board, trusted it, and mostly let the draft come to them. After a 22nd-percentile scoring finish in 2025, that kind of disciplined, systematic building is exactly what a bounce-back looks like in its blueprint stage. Third in the division and 67th percentile tournament-wide feels like a floor, not a ceiling.

Jahmyr's Jungle Hijinx didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by refusing to lose any individual exchange. Jahmyr Gibbs lands at RB1, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, and Travis Etienne at RB18, a trio of projected starters who give this team a backfield foundation most managers would trade a round of picks to acquire. Then consider that Lamar Jackson, a QB3 projection, came off the board at pick 2.11 when his ADP sat at 2.03, meaning the field essentially handed him over. Harold Fannin is the wildcard worth monitoring: the TE6 projection is built on legitimate production after he outplayed David Njoku in Cleveland last year, and Njoku's departure only clears more runway, though how much of that runway gets used depends heavily on whoever lines up under center for the Browns. None of these were dramatic reaches or lottery tickets. The draft chart shows 14 chalk picks, two values, and one steal, which is the profile of a manager who did their homework and executed without

gambling. Sitting second in Donkey Kong Country at the 77th tournament percentile, Hijinx earned their standing the quiet way.

rotoballs didn't win Donkey Kong Country by accident. Sitting at 86th percentile in the field and first in the division, this roster was built the way a good team usually is: round after round of getting slightly more than they paid for. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 came off the board four spots later than his ADP suggested he should, and the quiet find of the draft was Jake Ferguson slipping more than two full rounds past his ADP to land at 10.07 as a TE12 projected starter. Pair Ferguson with Colston Loveland at TE3 and Tyler Warren at TE4, and the top of this roster has genuine tournament-winning upside. Matthew Stafford at QB14 adds another layer of value, a 37-year-old who won MVP last season and is apparently unbothered by the Rams grooming his replacement. The cumulative effect is a team that didn't need one transcendent swing to get here. It just kept winning the smaller battles, and those add up.
