jpauley walked into the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft and left having constructed what might be the most lopsided roster in the Doom Guy division, sitting 12th in division and in the 11th percentile of the field with a collection that reads like someone bet their entire bankroll on one number. The story is in the reaches: four major ones, including Harold Fannin pulled nearly two full rounds early and Michael Mayer grabbed almost five rounds ahead of schedule, all of them tight ends. The result is a projected starting group that includes Brock Bowers, Tyler Warren, Tucker Kraft, Fannin, Kyle Pitts, George Kittle, and Travis Kelce, which would be genuinely impressive if the format rewarded having seven elite players at one position in ways it simply does not. Meanwhile, the projected weakest starter is Malik Willis at QB24, a player jpauley reached a round early to acquire. Last year's 90th-percentile scoring output now feels like a cruel joke: the talent was there once, and whoever this manager is drafting for in 2026 apparently is not that team anymore.

There is a particular kind of fantasy exhaustion that sets in when you look at a roster and realize the ceiling and the floor are basically the same room. Istan sits 11th in the Doom Guy division and in just the 20th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet does not offer much of an alibi: 12 chalk picks, five minor reaches, one major reach in Rachaad White (RB39), and zero steals across the whole board. The foundation is real enough, Trey McBride (TE2) and Saquon Barkley (RB8) are legitimate building blocks, and A.J. Brown (WR8) is as talented a receiver as any manager in this tournament can claim, now paired with Drake Maye in New England in a combination that looks genuinely dangerous on paper. But Brown has missed games in five of seven seasons, and a team this thin on upside cannot afford to absorb that kind of absence. When your weakest projected starter is J.K. Dobbins (RB36) and your draft log reads like a transcript of conventional wisdom, you are not a team with problems to solve. You are a team waiting to see which ones arrive first.

wnooj drafted almost flawlessly by the numbers: 18 chalk picks, one minor reach, zero steals required because the prices were already right. And yet here they sit, 10th in the Doom Guy division and in the 23rd percentile of the field, which is the kind of outcome that should come with a warning label about the limits of process. The top of the roster is genuinely good, CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Drake Maye at QB2 give this team a real foundation, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Zay Flowers at WR16 keep the quality coming. The problem is the floor. After those projected starters the talent grades fall quickly, and the weakest projected starter is Kenyon Sadiq at TE21, a rank that does not inspire confidence when the rest of the lineup needs him to contribute. wnooj bought at fair market value across the board, avoided the reaches that sink most drafts, and produced a team that is merely average. Efficient drafting without upside is just paying full price for a product that never quite works.

djg23 sits ninth in the Doom Guy division and in the 27th percentile of the field, and the roster offers very little reason to argue with either number. The receiver group is legitimately strong, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), Malik Nabers (WR12), Garrett Wilson (WR17), and Jaylen Waddle (WR23) forming a top line that most managers would envy. The problem is that the floor drops fast after that. Wan'Dale Robinson, the projected weakest starter at WR47, now faces a legitimate target battle in Tennessee after the Titans used a fourth overall pick on Carnell Tate, which is not exactly the situation you want from a player penciled into your lineup. The draft board compounds the concern: three major reaches, including Michael Penix Jr. taken more than four rounds early, suggest a manager who was chasing upside and came away holding a lot of faith. Joe Burrow landing at QB4 is a genuine asset, but when the supporting cast grades out this far down the field, one good quarterback is not enough rope to climb back up.

KyleDvorchak did everything right by the numbers. Omarion Hampton slipped nearly a full round past ADP, RJ Harvey fell even further, and the draft sheet reads like a lesson in patience and process. The problem is that patience and process produced a team sitting at division rank 8 and the 35th percentile of the field, which is the fantasy equivalent of following a recipe exactly and still burning dinner. The backfield talent is genuine, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Derrick Henry at RB12 anchoring a group with real depth. But the receiver corps is thin where it counts, Davante Adams at WR25 is the best of a group that drops quickly toward Jayden Reed at WR48 and then falls off a cliff, and Max Klare is essentially an unknown quantity at tight end. That 2025 finish, 3-33 and second percentile in scoring, is the kind of scar tissue that changes how you draft, except the draft here was disciplined. The floor held. The ceiling just never appeared.

EvanRingler did almost everything right in the draft room. Seventeen chalk picks, one genuine value in Jaylen Warren falling a round and a half past his ADP, and a grand total of zero major reaches across the entire board. That kind of discipline usually earns a reward. Instead, it produced a 38th-percentile roster sitting seventh in the Doom division, which is the draft equivalent of following every recipe instruction perfectly and still burning dinner. The receiver group is genuinely strong, Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Luther Burden at WR22 leading a starting corps that holds real weekly upside, and the Caleb Williams/Burden stack gives the ceiling a reasonable nudge. But the projected starters thin out quickly beyond that top layer, and when Warren, a RB27, is your weakest projected contributor, you are relying on depth that the rankings simply do not validate. After a 2025 season that landed in the fourth percentile, Ringler needed the value game to produce something transformative. It produced something competent. In a tournament this deep, competent is just a slower way to lose.

yoshi0151 built something real here, and the fingerprints of conviction are all over it. The backbone of this roster is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, a legitimate anchor, but the draft decisions around him are where the story gets interesting. Kenneth Walker III, projected RB10 and a real starter, cost yoshi0151 nearly a full round of premium over his ADP. That is the kind of move that gets laughed at in draft recap threads and quietly forgotten when it works. Then there is Emanuel Wilson, taken at RB69 and grabbed nearly seven rounds before anyone else thought to look his way, and Jaylen Wright, hauled in more than five rounds early. Neither move looks like an accident, which is what makes this roster feel like a product of a plan rather than a lucky bounce. The receiving corps is projected below average, and Hunter Henry at TE18 is a genuine soft spot, but in a positionless format, that backfield depth has real weight. Sitting 56th percentile feels like a floor, not a ceiling, if those reaches hit.

JaredWackerlyFF didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't reach for upside and pay for it. They just drafted well, repeatedly. The foundation is Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and James Cook at RB5, two projected starters who give this roster a ceiling most managers in the Doom division can't match. From there, Wackerly threaded picks like Jeremiyah Love, grabbed a round and a half after consensus at RB13, and Jayden Daniels, who fell nearly a full round past his RB2 neighborhood ADP to land as a QB5. Those aren't lucky accidents, they're the product of a draft that consistently came out ahead of the board without gambling on it. Carnell Tate adds an interesting wrinkle at WR29, a receiver pairing with Cam Ward in Tennessee that has real upside if that connection develops the way both franchises need it to. The result is a team sitting at 62nd percentile, which undersells the quality at the top of this roster. After a rough 2025, Wackerly looks rebuilt and ready.

There are teams built for positional balance, and then there is domklee's 2026 roster, which looks less like a balanced portfolio and more like someone kept hitting on the same three asset classes until the market ran dry. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Colston Loveland at TE3 are projected top-five players at their positions, and the floor barely drops from there: Kyren Williams projects as RB15, Dallas Goedert as TE15, and both Justin Herbert and Jalen Hurts landed as QB8 and QB9, respectively, each slipping a full round or more past their ADPs. In a positionless format where a manager simply fields their best players in almost any combination, that kind of concentrated elite talent is not a draft quirk, it is the entire strategy. The Hurts and Goedert stack adds a correlation bonus on top of all of it. Sitting at the 70th tournament percentile, domklee is not the division favorite, but this roster has the ceiling of a team that simply overwhelms opponents with quality before they can find a weakness to exploit.

Menobrown did not try to be clever. There was no moonshot pick, no elaborate gamble on upside, just round after round of coming out ahead on value, and the roster reflects it. The clearest example sits at the top: Josh Allen, the QB1, landed at 1.10 when his ADP was 1.05, a small gap that quietly set the tone for everything that followed. Amon-Ra St. Brown, projected WR4, fell even further, slipping to 2.03 against an ADP of 1.10, and Menobrown was simply there to collect him. Pair those two anchors with a starting corps that also includes Chris Olave at WR11 and DeVonta Smith at WR14, and the team's floor is almost annoyingly high. Isaiah Likely adds another dimension, stepping into John Harbaugh's new offense in New York with a light tight end room ahead of him and a genuine path to target volume as a TE13. Third in the division and 73rd percentile overall, Menobrown quietly built one of the more dependable rosters in the field.

robertjennings8 didn't need a heist to build this roster, just patience and positioning. The foundation is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, a genuinely elite anchor, and the draft only got smarter from there. Drake London fell more than four spots past his ADP and landed at pick 2.10, giving this team a WR7 at a discount before the third round even started. Michael Wilson slipped another round and a half, quietly turning a double-digit pick into a WR39 with legitimate starter upside. On the ground, Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Breece Hall at RB14 give this squad a top-tier foundation that few rosters in the field can match, and Quinshon Judkins at RB22 arrived below his ADP as well. Four values against zero steals and just a handful of reaches is the mark of a manager who let the board come to him rather than forcing it. robertjennings8 sits second in the Doom division and in the 87th percentile of the tournament, and the draft grade explains exactly why.

markcdodd did not stumble into a 91st-percentile roster. This is a draft built with intention, and the receiver corps alone makes the case: Puka Nacua at WR1, Nico Collins at WR9, George Pickens at WR10, and Jameson Williams at WR21 are all projected starters, and the stack with Matthew Stafford gives Nacua a direct pipeline to extra volume. That is not luck, that is architecture. The discipline shows up in the margins, too, where Isaac TeSlaa fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP and markcdodd was simply awake enough to take him. Fifteen chalk picks and zero reaches means this manager never panicked, never overreached for a name, and never talked himself into paying a premium the board had not yet demanded. The 2025 résumé, 89 percent wins and a 100th-percentile scoring season, suggests this is not a first rodeo. Division rank one, top 10 percent of the field, and a roster that is genuinely difficult to find fault with. markcdodd came to work.
