Shane Swager enters 2026 sitting near the bottom of the Doubledragon division and in just the 6th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much cause for optimism. The good news is that Jonathan Taylor (RB4) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) give him a legitimate foundation, and a Murray-Jefferson stack adds at least a theoretical ceiling. The bad news is that nearly everything else on this roster was built on questionable draft decisions. Swager reached four full rounds early for Keon Coleman (WR91) and 3.6 rounds early for C.J. Stroud (QB22), and the capital spent on those two alone represents a significant portion of what could have been competitive depth. Stroud grades out as QB22, a profile that costs a premium pick and then quietly undermines every week. Meanwhile, the TE position is effectively a non-factor with David Njoku at TE29. Coming off a 6-22 campaign that ranked in the 10th percentile in scoring, there is no obvious lever left to pull here, just a manager hoping Taylor and Jefferson carry him somewhere the rest of the roster does not deserve to go.

Dave Tapling's draft reads like a case study in how to undermine a genuinely strong foundation. The RB group is real, De'Von Achane, Ashton Jeanty, Derrick Henry, and Breece Hall projecting as four of the top 14 at the position, and that alone should keep Tapling competitive. But somewhere around pick 10, the wheels came off and never went back on. Tapling burned three picks across rounds 10, 11, and 15 on Jacoby Brissett, Geno Smith, and Deshaun Watson, a trio of QB reaches totaling more than eight rounds of early capital for players projecting QB28, QB30, and QB34. That is not a QB room, that is a waiting room, and it cost Tapling any chance to reinforce his receiving corps before Malik Nabers and Brian Thomas Jr. ran out of competent company. The board had value available. The data says so, RJ Harvey fell nearly two rounds before Tapling finally grabbed him. But by then the picks that mattered were already gone, spent on quarterbacks no reasonable projection has starting anywhere meaningful. Division rank 11, 10th percentile. It checks out.

Adam Drake's 2026 Scott Fish Bowl entry sits at 11th percentile in the field and dead last in the Doubledragon division, and nothing about the draft explains how it got better from there. The defining feature of this roster is not bad luck but bad process: Drake posted zero steals, zero values, and eight reaches across the board, including three that qualify as major. Jaylen Warren, projected RB27, was taken 3.5 rounds ahead of his ADP. Skyler Bell, projected WR103, was taken 7.5 rounds early, a breathtaking overpayment for a player who projects as one of the weakest options on the entire board. The floor of this lineup is Chuba Hubbard, the projected weakest starter at RB29, which tells you something about the ceiling. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Tyler Warren at TE4 are genuine cornerstones, and without them this conversation would be even grimmer, but a draft that found zero value and consistently paid premium prices for middling players is one that squandered every advantage those stars could have built.

Gregg Chabot's 2026 Doubledragon campaign looks less like a rebuild and more like a slow leak with no patch kit in sight. Last year's 10th-percentile scoring output was not a fluke, and nothing in this roster construction suggests a meaningful correction is coming. The QB room is genuinely strong, with Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Joe Burrow at QB4, but that advantage evaporates quickly when you realize the projected starters bottom out at Jayden Higgins, a WR54 who should be competing for a roster spot in most leagues, not anchoring a lineup. The draft did not help matters: Chabot paid early for Jackson despite his ADP sitting nearly a full round later, then doubled down with minor reaches on Xavier Worthy, Higgins, and Jerry Jeudy, all taken well ahead of consensus. Six minor reaches and a major reach across one draft suggests a manager chasing a vision the market did not share. Currently sitting ninth in the division and in the 20th percentile of the field, Chabot is not running out of time so much as he has already run out of answers.

Jeff Mans arrives in the Doubledragon division sitting eighth and projecting at just the 38th percentile of the field, and there is not much in the draft ledger to suggest he found a hidden edge. Eleven chalk picks and two major reaches define a board that rarely swung for the fences and connected even less. The biggest swing, Aaron Rodgers at QB29, was taken nearly three rounds early and projects as the clear third option behind Josh Allen and Jared Goff, which means Mans essentially burned a mid-round pick on a quarterback he may never need. The receiver group is genuinely strong, with Nico Collins, DeVonta Smith, Garrett Wilson, D.J. Moore, and Rome Odunze all projecting as starters, and Allen stacks with Moore and Dalton Kincaid offer some ceiling. But ceiling moments cannot paper over a backfield where the projected starter is Rico Dowdle at RB32. When your clearest path to contention runs through a WR2 leaderboard and a running back who grades out in the low thirties, you are hoping for the best and planning for very little.

Robert Hom's 2026 Scott Fish Bowl squad exists in a permanent state of almost, the kind of team that finishes every week one swing play short of the win column and one disaster short of the loss column. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is a genuine difference-maker, and Drake London at WR7 was a legitimate draft-day value at 2.11 against an ADP of 2.06, giving Hom real upside at the top of his lineup. The problem is that the margins he lives in can cut both ways. Bo Nix was yanked off the board at 3.02 against an ADP of 6.03, a three-round reach that represents the kind of aggressive overcorrection that looks prescient or catastrophic depending entirely on whether Nix justifies a QB15 projection. The Nix and Jaylen Waddle stack gives Hom a ceiling game he can point to, but ceiling games require everything to go right, and sitting at the 45th percentile of the field means right now, the tournament thinks everything probably won't.

James Sisson's 2026 roster didn't get built on one flashy moment. It got built on a draft that kept coming out ahead on the back half. Kenneth Walker III at RB10 fell more than a full round past his ADP before Sisson scooped him up in the fourth, and Davante Adams at WR25 slipped more than two rounds before landing in the eighth. Neither pick required brilliance, just patience and a board that rewarded it. Up front, Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors a starting group that has real teeth, and the Patrick Mahomes and Travis Kelce stack adds a correlation bonus to a team that already projects well. Kelce's return was uncertain for a while, but he's back and chasing top-12 TE relevance, which matters if that stack hits on the same week. The 61st percentile projection and sixth-place division standing are not the ceiling, they are the floor for a roster this consistently assembled. After a rough 2025, Sisson didn't rebuild. He just drafted better.

Ryan Livergood's draft looks like a series of mistakes until you look at the roster and realize it mostly isn't. Four major reaches in a single draft is a lot, and the board punished him for them on paper, but the players he landed through conviction rather than patience, Jonah Coleman at RB51 and Ray Davis at RB62, give him real late-round upside that most managers at this stage of the draft are scraping for. Meanwhile, the foundation he built the conventional way is genuinely impressive: Brock Bowers at TE1, Colston Loveland at TE3, and George Kittle at TE9 give him a tier of pass-catchers that most of the field cannot match, and the Jalen Hurts and Dallas Goedert stack adds a layer of ceiling that becomes meaningful in elimination formats. Makai Lemon projects as the weakest projected starter at WR40, and the receiver group overall is the one place the roster feels thin by comparison. But 67th percentile is a real number, and Livergood got there by being right more often than the board said he had any right to be.

Paul Theoret did not win this draft with a single thunderclap moment. He won it pick by pick, round by round, in the quiet and relentless way that actually builds championship rosters. The clearest evidence sits at the top of the lineup: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 fell to pick 2.04 against an ADP of 1.11, and A.J. Brown at WR8 slid nearly a full round before Theoret grabbed him at 3.09. Those are not lottery tickets, they are consensus stars who simply became available later than they should have, and Theoret was positioned to take them. Terry McLaurin, projected WR24, fell nearly two rounds before landing at 7.09, adding another layer of real value to a group that already had Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 anchoring the top. Seven values across the entire draft against a single major reach, Brock Purdy taken a round and a half ahead of his ADP, is a ledger that reads clean. The 2025 campaign backed the process up with a 75th-percentile finish in scoring. The 2026 version looks like more of the same, and in the Scott Fish Bowl, more of the same means contention.

Abobo's Big Adventure sits third in the division and in the 87th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster was built with patience and precision, not a single reach anywhere across the board, and the value picks were real ones. James Cook at RB5 slid almost a full round past his ADP and landed at pick 3.03. Mark Andrews fell nearly two rounds before this team scooped him at 10.10. Oronde Gadsden, the steal of the bunch, dropped more than three full rounds before Abobo's Big Adventure claimed him at 12.10, giving the roster a TE16 at a price that should have embarrassed the rest of the room. Layer in a Puka Nacua and Matthew Stafford stack, with Nacua projecting as WR1, and the lineup has a genuine ceiling-raiser baked into it from the jump. Fifteen chalk picks and four values with zero reaches is not an accident. That is a manager who knew their board and worked it.

After a 2025 season that left the BeanTown Drunks scraping the bottom of the barrel at the 13th percentile in scoring, manager has come back with something that looks unmistakably like a plan. The foundation is legitimately elite: Trey McBride at TE2 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 give this roster a top-end advantage at the position that most managers are begging to fill, and Kraft arriving three rounds past his ADP makes that pairing feel almost unfair. Saquon Barkley at RB8 anchors the backfield, also slipping a bit past his draft number, and the receiving corps runs four projected starters deep with Emeka Egbuka at WR18, Luther Burden at WR22, Carnell Tate at WR29, and Michael Pittman at WR44, Tate himself a value at 1.3 rounds below his ADP. The one genuine soft spot is Cam Ward at QB23, a reach of nearly three rounds that has the potential to suppress ceilings in a tight week. But sitting at the 89th percentile and second in the Doubledragon division, the BeanTown Drunks have constructed the kind of roster that makes last year's misery feel like ancient, distant history.

Mike Taylor did not come to the Scott Fish Bowl to guess. Sitting first in the Doubledragon division and in the 97th percentile of the entire field, this roster reads like a clinic in disciplined drafting, built on value acquisition and capped by genuine star power. Christian McCaffrey, projected RB3, slid nearly a full round past his ADP and Taylor was right there to collect him at 2.05, the kind of moment that separates composed managers from reactive ones. The rest of the board reflects the same patience: Harold Fannin at TE6, Brenton Strange at TE17, and Jayden Reed at WR48 all came later than consensus suggested they should. On the premium talent side, Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3 and Chris Olave as WR11, giving this lineup a receiver core that can carry a bad week without flinching. Two steals, three additional values, and not a single major reach across the entire draft. Mike Taylor did not just fill a roster. He constructed one.
