Jay Bowerson's draft reads like a case study in wishful thinking, and the standings projection confirms it: dead last in the Doubledribble division and sitting in the 4th percentile of the entire field. The reach count tells the story cleanly, five major reaches against zero steals, zero values. Kyren Williams coming off the board at 3.04 when his ADP sat at 5.10 is the kind of move you make when you're convinced you've spotted something the room missed. Bowerson was not right. Bryce Young at 8.09, nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP, gives this team a QB26 when Bo Nix, the QB15, is already a back-end option at the position. Nix led the league in pass attempts last season and Denver added Jaylen Waddle to a receiving corps that already had Courtland Sutton, so there is a real floor here, but a floor is not a ceiling, and a team sitting this deep in the percentile rankings needs ceilings. Instead, Bowerson stacked the late rounds with Troy Franklin and Keon Coleman, two more reaches on players who aren't projected to start. There is no charitable read available.

Brian Dold's 2026 campaign in the Doubledribble division looks grim before the first snap. Sitting 11th in divisional rank and in just the 5th percentile of the entire field, the roster grades out as one of the worst in the tournament, and the draft log offers little comfort. Dold reached 3.5 rounds early for Cam Skattebo (RB20), a price that would be painful even for a sure thing, and pulled the same trick on Brock Purdy (QB13) nearly a full round and a half before the market caught up. Those early premiums left Dold with almost no surplus equity, just 2 values across the whole draft and zero steals. The one genuine weapon here is A.J. Brown (WR8), a legitimate difference-maker, but even Brown needs teammates to work with. George Kittle (TE9) offers upside when healthy, and the key phrase is when healthy, given the Achilles tear that ended his 2025 season casts a long shadow over any optimism Dold might be nursing heading into the fall.

Jonathan Sale's 2026 campaign looks like a team that peaked a year too late. A 75% win rate and a 68th-percentile scoring season in 2025 would suggest a contender, but the 2026 projections have Sale sitting 10th in the Doubledribble division and in just the 13th percentile of the field, and the roster explains why. The headliners are real: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give Sale two of the most dangerous weapons in the tournament, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and Breece Hall at RB14 provide a credible ground game. The problem is everything behind that top tier, and especially the quarterback situation. Jordan Love, the projected QB17, is the kind of signal-caller who wins football games without actually producing fantasy points, and the Packers are still short an alpha receiver and waiting on Tucker Kraft to come back healthy. Sale reached two and a half rounds early for Kyler Murray at QB19 and got a QB19 for his trouble. When your path to contention runs through a QB corps projected to rank 17th and 19th, there is no obvious lever left to pull.

Eric Balkman's 2026 campaign has the look of a team that ran out of runway before it ever got airborne. Sitting ninth in the Doubledribble division and checking in at just the 38th percentile of the field, the roster lacks the kind of high-end anchor that separates contenders from also-rans. The draft board tells a damning story: four major reaches against a single steal, including a baffling double-down on quarterback with Deshaun Watson taken four full rounds ahead of his ADP and Aaron Rodgers grabbed more than two rounds early. Those are late-round slots that could have reinforced the top of the lineup instead of chasing depth at a position that already had Joe Burrow. Speaking of Burrow, taking a QB4 at the 1.09 means Balkman paid first-round equity for a signal-caller in a positionless format where that capital almost always buys more on the open market. Drake London and Rashee Rice give the roster a credible core, but the projected weakness at the bottom of the starting group and a draft that

leaned reach-heavy rather than value-driven leaves Balkman with very little margin for error and even fewer levers left to pull.

Pierre Wilson's 2026 squad checks in at just 43rd percentile and eighth in the Doubledribble division, and there is not much in the draft ledger to suggest a turnaround is coming. The roster carries two major reaches, with Sam Darnold pulled two full rounds ahead of his ADP and Deebo Samuel grabbed more than three rounds early, which means Wilson burned capital on players projecting at QB21 and WR70 respectively. Those slots represent real dead weight at the margins. Josh Allen is legitimately elite and Nico Collins grades out as a WR9 starter, so Wilson is not completely without weapons, but the floor underneath them drops off quickly. David Montgomery and Jordan Addison represent the only real draft value on the board, and Addison currently projects as the weakest starter on the team at WR43. When your draft's best moves are also your safety net, there is nowhere left to fall back to. This roster looks like a ship that left port already listing to one side.

Bob Gilchrist's 2026 squad sits at the 60th percentile of the field, which is exactly as comfortable as it sounds: good enough to stay interested in October, not good enough to stop checking the waiver wire. The foundation is genuinely strong, De'Von Achane at RB6 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 giving this roster a backfield that can carry a quiet week from anyone else, and the Matthew Stafford and Puka Nacua stack adds a ceiling that turns up when you need it most. The trouble is that the margins elsewhere are thin. Stafford was taken a round and a half before his ADP suggested, Jared Goff went in the same neighborhood, and Jerry Jeudy was the most alarming early pull, drafted nearly two and a half rounds ahead of his ADP and projecting out at WR66. That kind of draft capital spent on a projected WR66 is the exact coin flip that separates a 7th-place finish in the Doubledribble division from something better. Achane and Barkley give Gilchrist a reason to believe. The question is whether the rest of the roster gives him a reason to celebrate.

Ben Bromberg didn't swing for the fences and miss, he just kept connecting. The secret is in the values: Ladd McConkey at WR20 fell nearly a round and a half past his ADP before Bromberg grabbed him, Mark Andrews slipped a full round to WR14 territory before landing at pick 10.02, and Kenneth Gainwell quietly became a late-round asset by falling a round and a half himself. Stack in Justin Herbert to complement McConkey and suddenly the offense has a built-in multiplier. The headlining names hold up too, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 give Bromberg a foundation that most managers would draw up on a whiteboard and never actually land. Yes, Tyler Shough was taken nearly three rounds early, and that is a real cost, but one reach does not unravel a draft this consistently efficient. Sitting at 63rd percentile and sixth in the Doubledribble division, Bromberg has the kind of roster that wins rounds quietly and makes noise in the back half of the season.

Brian Steinhouse built something real here, and the draft board will tell you he had no business doing it this way. Two major reaches, one minor reach, and zero steals in a draft where most managers were hunting bargains. And yet here we are: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and James Cook at RB5 anchoring the starting core, with Tetairoa McMillan projected as a WR15 and Carnell Tate, the first receiver off the board in the NFL draft and now linked with Cam Ward in Tennessee, sitting behind him as a credible threat to climb that ranking. The reach on Tony Pollard, grabbed 2.5 rounds ahead of his ADP, looks aggressive on paper, but Pollard slides into a starting role as RB30, which means Steinhouse essentially paid early-round currency for a player who is actually contributing. That is either sharp conviction or fortunate timing, and the honest answer is it does not matter which. The roster lands at the 73rd percentile of the field, and this team earned it the stubborn way.

Marc Hava did not win this draft on one big swing. He won it the way a good card player wins, by consistently getting slightly better value than the person across the table. Emeka Egbuka at WR18 fell nearly a round and a half past his ADP, landing in Hava's lap at pick 6.03. Jakobi Meyers arrived two full rounds late in round twelve. Neither pick is a headline, but that quiet accumulation is exactly the point. The foundation underneath all of it is legitimately elite: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Caleb Williams at QB6 give Hava a ceiling that most managers in the Doubledribble division cannot match. The one genuine question mark is Brian Thomas Jr., a projected starter at WR31 who has yet to recapture the chemistry that made his first season so promising, with injuries and an inconsistent connection with Trevor Lawrence clouding his outlook. If Thomas bounces back, this roster looks like a genuine contender. If he does not, Hava still has enough depth to absorb it and compete at the 76th percentile level this team earned on paper.

Jeff Schneider's 2026 roster reads like the work of someone who simply kept coming out ahead at the table. The foundation is elite: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 give this team a ceiling that most managers in the Doubledribble division cannot match, and both arrived at or below their expected draft cost. Then the middle rounds did their job. Chris Olave slipped a full round past his ADP, landing Schneider a projected WR11 starter at a discount. Tucker Kraft, coming off a November ACL tear that interrupted what looked like a breakout season, carries real risk, but a TE4 projection on a Packers offense that lost more receivers than it added suggests the opportunity is still very much there if Kraft returns to form. The draft was not flashy, just disciplined: four values, mostly chalk, and a pair of late reaches in the back end where variance is cheap. The result is a team sitting 78th percentile in the field and third in the division, built the quiet way.

Last year Mike Braude finished 4-24 with a 6th-percentile scoring total, the kind of season that makes a manager question every decision they've ever made. The 2026 version looks like a different roster entirely. Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3, and DeVonta Smith, finally free from splitting targets with A.J. Brown in Philadelphia, steps into a true alpha role that could make WR14 look like a floor rather than a ceiling. Colston Loveland at TE3 and Jayden Daniels at QB5 give Braude a pair of premium anchors at positions where the gap between the elite and the average is enormous. Add Zay Flowers (WR16), who slipped a full round past his ADP before Braude scooped him, and this roster has the kind of upside that lands teams in the bracket conversation rather than the scoring cellar. Division rank of second and a 90th-percentile tournament projection suggest the rest of the field has noticed. After what 2025 put him through, Braude has earned every bit of it.

Anthony Maggio's draft reads like a masterclass in patience rewarded. Sitting first in the Doubledribble division and in the 95th percentile of the field, this roster got there the right way, with seven values and a steal spread across the board and zero reaches to regret. The headliners are legitimate: Drake Maye projects as QB2, Brock Bowers as TE1, and Malik Nabers as WR12, a trio of projected starters who give this team a ceiling most managers are still dreaming about. But the real signature of this draft is the discipline in the middle and late rounds. Luther Burden fell 1.2 rounds to land as a projected WR22 starter, Jake Ferguson slipped 1.2 rounds to complement Bowers at TE12, and Denzel Boston arrived nearly three rounds late at WR58. Maggio did not force anything, did not panic, and did not overpay. The board gave him gifts and he cashed every one of them. That is not luck. That is a drafter who knew exactly what he was doing.
