JamesMaguire21 had a genuinely strong 2025, finishing in the 73rd percentile in scoring with a 69 percent win rate, which makes the 2026 outlook all the more deflating. The receiver corps is legitimately elite, anchored by Justin Jefferson (WR6), Nico Collins (WR9), and DeVonta Smith (WR14), and that group alone could carry lesser rosters to respectability. But the draft hammered the ceiling down anyway. C.J. Stroud was taken 3.8 rounds ahead of his ADP at pick 5.11, a reach of the sort that tends to haunt a manager all season, and Stroud projects as the weakest projected starter on the entire roster at QB22. The quarterback situation as a whole grades out weak, with Kyler Murray (QB19) and Aaron Rodgers (QB29) rounding out a group that offers little comfort. The receiver talent is real, the projected finish is third in the division, and there is no obvious lever left to pull. Sometimes the pieces just do not add up, and right now this team is staring directly at that math.

There is no gentle way to say this: clankiest is projected 11th in the Halo division and sits in just the 6th percentile of the entire field, and the draft offers almost no argument against that verdict. Fourteen chalk picks, zero steals, zero values, and two major reaches define a board that never generated surplus. Those reaches are worth naming. Matthew Stafford was taken 2.4 rounds ahead of his ADP and projects as QB14, a spot so far outside the top tier that it poisons ten starts a week before the lineup card is even set. Ashton Jeanty is the one genuine anchor, a projected RB7 surrounded by a real starting corps headlined by Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, but that core was largely assembled at chalk prices, meaning clankiest paid full freight for the good news and then overpaid for the bad. When your weakest projected starter is Khalil Shakir at WR51 and there is no late-round dart that beat the market, the math is unkind. There is no lever left to pull here, only a long autumn of hoping the projections are wrong.

dansheerin did almost everything right on draft day and still wound up here, 10th in the Halo Division and sitting at the 30th percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether effort matters at all. The draft was a monument to patience: 16 chalk picks, just two minor reaches, and Zay Flowers sliding a full round and a half past his ADP to land at 5.12. Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Jeremiyah Love at RB13, Garrett Wilson at WR17, a Lamar Jackson and Flowers stack for the bonus upside. On paper, each individual decision holds up. The problem is that the roster assembled by those decisions projects to finish near the bottom of the division anyway, because value accumulation and team quality are not the same thing, and the gulf between them is where dansheerin currently lives. After a 2025 that produced a 25 percent win rate and 22nd-percentile scoring, this manager drafted carefully, waited on prices, and got rewarded with more of the same outlook. The draft did not fail them. It just did not save them either.

Elvisn lands at 9th in the Halo Division and the 35th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little comfort: three major reaches against zero steals is about the worst trade you can make in a positionless format where capital is everything. The Jaxson Dart reach at 3.10, taken nearly two full rounds before his ADP, is the wound that keeps bleeding, because that early-round investment produced a QB11 projection when the same pick could have reinforced the top of a lineup that genuinely needed it. De'Von Achane and Omarion Hampton give the team a real foundation, and Trey McBride at TE2 is legitimately elite, but the projected starter list bottoms out at Matthew Golden as a WR52, and with no steals anywhere on the board, there is no late-round lottery ticket quietly earning its keep. The pieces to compete are not missing so much as misallocated, and in a charity tournament full of sharp drafters, misallocation tends to compound quietly until the standings make it undeniable.

Champ1820 sits eighth in the Halo Division and barely inside the top half of the field at the 46th percentile, and the path forward is genuinely hard to see. The receiver corps is the one legitimate bright spot, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba, CeeDee Lamb, and Drake London projecting as WR3, WR5, and WR7 respectively, and Lamb arriving as the draft's one real steal after sliding to pick 2.12. But that strength gets undermined quickly by the draft capital spent to get here. Jordan Love, projecting as a QB17, was taken 2.4 rounds before his ADP, and Dalton Schultz, projecting as a TE22, was grabbed nearly three rounds early. You don't build a contender by burning mid-round picks on a backup-caliber quarterback and a fringe tight end. With the weakest projected starter being RJ Harvey at RB28 and three major reaches dotting the draft board, Champ1820 looks less like a team waiting to peak and more like one that already used its leverage getting here.

deeritch81 lands in that uncomfortable middle ground where the roster is good enough to beat anyone on a given week and beatable enough that no one loses sleep before facing them. The clearest edge here comes at quarterback, where Drake Maye at QB2 and Jayden Daniels at QB5 give this team a genuine top-end advantage that most rosters cannot match. The problem is how deeritch81 got there: Maye was taken 1.04 with an ADP sitting nearly a full round later, a price tag that compressed the flexibility that separates comfortable rosters from anxious ones. That draft anxiety shows up downstream, most visibly in three major reaches including Michael Mayer and Evan Engram at tight end positions that rank TE39 and TE36 respectively. The values at Chris Olave and Rome Odunze help balance the ledger somewhat, but a 47th-percentile projection placed seventh in the Halo division is not a foundation, it is a warning. In a season where margins decide everything, deeritch81 has enough upside to make a run and just enough fragility to flame out quietly.

LittleMissBrady sits at the 52nd percentile and sixth in the Halo division, which is precisely where this roster looks like it belongs. The foundation is genuinely good: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Caleb Williams at QB6 give this team a ceiling that most middle-of-the-pack rosters cannot claim, and the draft produced four values, including Rashee Rice falling a full round past his ADP and Brian Thomas Jr. sliding 1.3 rounds. That is real draft capital converted into real projected production. The concern is the reach for Jalen Hurts at 2.11 when his ADP sat a full round later at 3.12, a premium price for a QB9 that could have bought something more useful in a positionless format. The weakest projected starter is Jordan Addison at WR43, and in a tournament where the margins between advancing and going home are razor-thin, that bottom-of-lineup output matters. Gibbs can carry a week, but this team's season probably hinges on whether the values at the top hold and Addison outperforms his projection when it counts.

The headliner is George Pickens, snagged more than a round and a half after his ADP despite projecting as a WR10, which is the kind of gift that sets a draft apart. Bijan Robinson at RB2 anchors the backfield, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 was grabbed just half a round before his ADP, meaning JamNasty paid a fair price for a second elite runner without overpaying. Luther Burden at WR22 and Quentin Johnston at WR41 both fell past their ADPs as well, giving this team a consistent pattern of getting more than it spent. Justin Herbert brings quarterback upside, and Mike McDaniel's arrival in Los Angeles adds genuine intrigue to that ceiling. The one question mark is whether that cumulative edge translates in a competitive Halo division, but at the 58th percentile of the field, JamNasty has drafted like a team that intends to find out.

Supergibbs89 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick, they won it by consistently landing players at or below their market price, round after round. The headliner is Puka Nacua, projected WR1 and snagged five spots below his ADP, a quiet discount on the best receiver in the field. Jonathan Taylor, projected RB4, followed a similar path, slipping just half a round past his number to Supergibbs89's waiting hands. Together those two anchors give this roster a ceiling that most managers in the Halo division can only project onto. The supporting cast holds up, too. Emeka Egbuka at WR18 and Terry McLaurin at WR24 are both projected starters, and the Baker Mayfield and Egbuka stack adds a correlation bonus that can spike a week's total when things click. Trevor Lawrence came at a cost, drafted nearly one and a half rounds ahead of his WR10 projection, but that's one blemish on an otherwise disciplined board. Sitting fourth in the division and at the 71st percentile, Supergibbs89 looks built to climb.

MugsNFL finished 33rd percentile last year and came back swinging, and the draft log is going to confuse people. Three major reaches, one minor reach, and zero steals sounds like a manager who kept jumping the gun and never got rewarded for it. Then you look at the roster and wonder what draft those critics were watching. Pulling Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 even half a round late is the kind of thing that looks like a reach until it doesn't, and pairing him with Joe Burrow in the same stack is the kind of conviction that either looks brilliant or catastrophic depending entirely on Burrow's availability on any given Sunday. That injury history is real and it is ugly, but when Burrow plays, he projects as QB4, and this offense around him is intact. Then there is Mason Taylor at TE35, grabbed nearly four rounds before his ADP, and Dontayvion Wicks six rounds early. Reaches, sure. But third in the division and 71st percentile tournament-wide does not come from timid drafting, and MugsNFL does not appear to do timid.

Overtimelreland did not win the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with one seismic pick. They won it by just being right, over and over again. The clearest example is the tight end group, where Brock Bowers (TE1), Colston Loveland (TE3), Tucker Kraft (TE5), and Harold Fannin (TE6) give this team a projected ceiling at the position that most managers cannot touch, and Fannin himself arrived a round and a half after his ADP suggested he would. Jared Goff (QB16) fell a similar distance before Overtimelreland picked him up, a quiet win that compounds across a long season. Alec Pierce (WR32) carries some real-world uncertainty after offseason ankle surgery and a PUP list designation that could cost him the first four games, but even accounting for that, this roster sits at the 91st percentile of the field and second in the Halo division. Fifteen chalk picks and three genuine values with zero major reaches is not a flashy headline. It is, however, a winning draft.

There are drafts, and then there are statements, and 5YardRushMurf made a statement. Sitting first in the Halo Division and landing in the 98th percentile of the entire field, this roster was not built on luck or bold gambles, it was built on patience and precision. The board kept delivering, and Murf kept cashing in: Chase Brown at RB11 slid nearly two full rounds past his ADP, Travis Hunter at WR62 fell two and a half rounds into Murf's lap, and Oronde Gadsden at TE16 arrived almost two rounds late to his own party. Eight values across the roster with zero reaches, major or minor, is not a hot streak, it is a philosophy made manifest. At the top of the lineup, Josh Allen at QB1 and James Cook at RB5 give this team a foundation that most managers would mortgage their futures to own. The 2025 campaign already showed what Murf can do, a 75th percentile scoring season with a 67 percent win rate, and 2026 looks like the next chapter of the same disciplined, quietly dominant story.
