Dominic Senska finished last year at the 64th percentile and somehow found a way to draft downward from there. The defining feature of this roster is not bad luck but bad process: zero steals, zero values, and three major reaches across a 20-round draft. Breece Hall landing at RB14 after Senska pulled him 1.3 rounds early hurts, but the real indictment is Kyle Pitts, taken 1.3 rounds ahead of his ADP and projecting as only TE7, a position where the format's flexibility means a reach has to at least net you a clear difference-maker. Pitts is not that. Then the back end of the draft compounds the damage, with Wan'Dale Robinson projecting as the WR47 and the weakest projected starter on the entire roster, a distinction she earned after Senska spent his mid-round capital on a third tight end in Mike Gesicki rather than shoring up the spots that needed it. There is no sleeper hiding in the weeds

here, no late-round reclamation project to root for. This is a 4th-percentile team that drafts like it knew exactly where it was headed.

Tom Sturdevant enters 2026 sitting 11th in the DuckHunt division and in the 17th percentile of the field, which are the kinds of numbers that suggest a draft went sideways before the ink dried. The fingerprints are all over the board: five major reaches, zero steals, zero values, thirteen chalk picks. The most damaging stretch came at the back end, where Sturdevant reached 7.1 rounds early for Ray Davis and then, apparently undeterred by that miscalculation, followed it up by grabbing Kaelon Black 8.6 rounds ahead of his ADP. Two late-round gambles burning early capital is not a strategy, it is a pattern. The foundation is not without merit, Brock Bowers at TE1 and a Jalen Hurts and DeVonta Smith stack give this roster a real ceiling, and Dak Prescott at QB7 provides genuine depth at the position. But the back half of this roster reads like a series of hunches that the rest of the field did not share, and Sturdevant's 2025 campaign, a 32 percent win rate and 13th percentile in scoring, suggests the hunches have been wrong before.

Dan Meylor won 68 percent of his matchups in 2025 and scored in the 69th percentile, so the talent is clearly there somewhere, which makes the 27th-percentile projection for 2026 feel like a slow leak nobody can find. The roster is anchored by Christian McCaffrey (RB3), and that foundation is real, but the draft surrounding him was mostly chalk with a few concerning wrinkles: Matthew Stafford was reached for by a round and a half at pick 4.08 and now sits as a QB14 projection, a middling return on a premium investment. The Stafford / Davante Adams stack offers some upside, and Adams checks in at WR25, but the supporting cast fades fast, with Michael Pittman projected as the weakest projected starter at WR44 and the backend of the roster offering little to dream on. Meylor finished last in the DuckHunt division in 2026 projections, and unlike managers who have a clear high-variance piece to bet on, there is no obvious lever left to pull here, just a well-meaning roster quietly running out of room.

Steven Treble drafted an efficient, disciplined draft, finishing with 17 chalk picks, one value, and zero major reaches, which is the kind of clean sheet that should translate into a functional roster. It did not. Sitting at ninth in the DuckHunt division and projecting out at the 35th percentile, this team is the proof that process and outcome can split apart at the worst possible moment. The top of the roster is genuinely good: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 form as strong a pair as anyone in the field can point to, and Jefferson's pairing with Kyler Murray in Minnesota offers real upside if the quarterback competition resolves the right way. But the value never cascades downward the way it needs to. Derrick Henry projects as RB12, which sounds fine until you notice that the next reliable piece is D'Andre Swift at RB24, and depth after that is largely projection and hope. Treble played the draft correctly. The roster just shrugs and asks so what.

Brian Harr sits eighth in the DuckHunt division and around the 40th percentile of the field, and the roster breakdown does not offer much reason for optimism. The foundation looks fine on paper: Josh Allen is a genuine QB1 anchor, Colston Loveland projects as TE3, and Kyren Williams and Cam Skattebo give the backfield some teeth. But the receiver group is where this team quietly bleeds out, with Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 and Chris Godwin at WR38 representing the best of a thin starting corps. The draft process did not help matters much either. Harr did find Drake Maye at QB2 later than expected, a legitimate win, but he offset that by reaching three-plus rounds early for Zach Charbonnet, who projects only as RB42, and burning a late pick on Skyler Bell a full eight rounds ahead of consensus. Those misses matter in a deep field where every pick compounds. There is no obvious fix on the horizon, just the slow math of a roster that probably needs everything to go right and has priced in very little margin for error.

John Byrne's 2026 campaign in the DuckHunt division looks like a team trying to win a drag race with the parking brake on. The floor here is Puka Nacua at WR1 and George Pickens at WR10, both projected starters, and there is genuine upside in that pairing, but the roster grades out at the 42nd tournament percentile and sits seventh in the division for a reason. Beyond that receiver talent, the quarterback situation tops out at Brock Purdy as a QB13 and Jared Goff at QB16, which is serviceable but not a difference-maker, and the backfield anchor is Omarion Hampton at RB9 with Jordan Mason projected as the weakest starter at RB41. The draft did not do Byrne any favors either, producing zero steals and two major reaches, including Rashid Shaheed taken more than two rounds before his ADP and Dontayvion Wicks nearly three rounds early. Those are gambles on upside that the rest of the roster cannot afford. Byrne went 71 percent wins a season ago and scored at the 74th percentile. This year, the math is considerably less friendly.

Luis Escalante did not win his draft with one flashy pick. He won it by not losing it anywhere. The anchor is a starting core built around Jonathan Taylor (RB4) and Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), two players who project at the top of their positions and give this roster a floor most managers in the DuckHunt division cannot match. From there, Escalante layered in Rashee Rice (WR13) and Tucker Kraft (TE5), the latter arriving as a genuine value after sliding a full round past his ADP. The draft grades out at 14 chalk picks against zero major reaches, which sounds boring until you remember that boring drafts tend to age well. The one spot worth watching is Rhamondre Stevenson (RB31), the projected weakest starter, reached for slightly early at 9.12 against an ADP closer to round 11. He does not need to be a star, but he needs to hold. A 57th-percentile projection and a 50 percent win rate in 2025 suggest a team that has consistently been fine. In 2026, fine might actually be enough.

Wells Engledow didn't make headlines on draft day, and that's kind of the point. Eighteen chalk picks and one minor reach in Kyler Murray, taken barely a round ahead of his ADP, tells you everything about how this roster came together: no swings, no panic, just a manager who kept doing the right thing over and over. The payoff is a receiving corps that quietly became one of the more dangerous in the DuckHunt division, anchored by Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Nico Collins at WR9, with Tee Higgins and Ladd McConkey rounding out a projected starting group that has legitimate upside at every spot. Add Tyler Warren at TE4 and Mark Andrews at TE14 as projected contributors, and this team has the kind of week-to-week floor that wins games without requiring anyone to go nuclear. The 58th percentile projection and fifth-place division standing suggest the field sees this as a middle-of-the-pack outfit, and maybe it is, but rosters built this cleanly tend to outperform their projections. Engledow didn't try to be clever. He just kept being right.

Nathan Powell didn't swing for the fences in the Scott Fish Bowl's DuckHunt division, and that's exactly why this roster deserves attention. The foundation is unimpeachable: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give Powell two of the most reliable projected performers in the entire player pool, and Jayden Daniels at QB5 keeps the offense humming at a position where mediocrity is the norm. What separates a good draft from a great one, though, is what happens in the middle rounds, and Powell consistently came out ahead. Zay Flowers fell a full round past his ADP into Powell's lap at WR16, and Khalil Shakir arrived 1.6 rounds late at WR51, the kind of quiet accumulation that compounds over a season. The one blemish is Jerry Jeudy, reached nearly three rounds early, but one mistimed pick doesn't undo a draft built on patience and discipline. Powell finished in the 80th percentile in scoring last season and sits at the 70th percentile in projected strength this year. The process is sound, and the results tend to follow.

Brian McLeish did not come to the Scott Fish Bowl to mess around. Sitting at 85th percentile in the field and third in the DuckHunt Division, this roster reads like a masterclass in patience and board awareness, built on five genuine values and zero reaches from top to bottom. The foundation is staggering: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors everything, flanked by Saquon Barkley at RB8, though the smart money notes that Philadelphia's evolving approach to managing Barkley's workload introduces real variance into his WR8-level upside from 2024. What gives this roster its finishing-school polish is how McLeish found value in the draft's quieter corners, landing Malik Nabers at WR12 a full round after his ADP suggested he'd be gone and snagging C.J. Stroud at QB22 more than a round late. The projected starter group, anchored by A.J. Brown at WR8 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 alongside Gibbs, is as clean as it gets. The weakest projected starter is RJ Harvey at RB28. That is not a problem, that is a luxury.

Matt Donnelly's 2026 roster reads like a draft that just kept winning small battles. There was no headline-grabbing moment, no single pick that defined the room, just round after round of sensible accumulation that adds up to something real. The foundation is hard to argue with: Trey McBride at TE2 and James Cook at RB5 give Donnelly two legitimate cornerstones, and Caleb Williams at QB6 runs a stack with Luther Burden that compounds the value of both. Burden himself is one of the better stories on the board, a projected WR22 starter who slipped past his ADP by more than a round. The roster sits at 89th percentile in the field and second in the DuckHunt division, numbers that reflect a 2025 campaign that went 24-4 with 97th-percentile scoring. Donnelly did reach for Keenan Allen nearly five rounds early, which is the kind of thing that gets circled in hindsight reviews, but one swing like that barely dents a draft built on thirteen chalk picks and five genuine values. This team did not get lucky. It just got built correctly.

Thomas Brolley's 2026 roster reads like a masterclass in patience and positioning. The headliners are genuinely scary: De'Von Achane at RB6, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 form a core that most managers would trade a draft class to own. But what quietly separates this team from the pretenders is the discipline that built the depth around them. Brolley walked away from the draft with five value picks and zero reaches, a combination that sounds simple and is almost never executed. Harold Fannin fell more than a round past his ADP and landed as a projected TE6 starter. Dallas Goedert slipped similarly and projects at TE15. These are not consolation prizes, they are what happens when a drafter holds the line. The 89th percentile tournament ranking and a division-leading finish are the predictable conclusions of that kind of restraint. There is very little to argue with here, and that, frankly, is the point.
