As we look ahead to the 2025 season for NiqueyMuum, the outlook is far from promising. Saddled with an uninspired roster, the team finds itself languishing at the bottom of both their division and overall competition standings. Despite possessing a solid trio of quarterbacks led by Josh Allen, the glaring weaknesses elsewhere on the roster are likely insurmountable. The team's running back situation is anemic at best, with Isaac Guerendo struggling as the lone notable presence in the backfield. Even their impressive wide receiver corps, featuring standout performances from Nico Collins and Garrett Wilson, may not be enough to offset the deficiencies elsewhere. The tight end position remains a persistent Achilles' heel, with no noteworthy talents to speak of, and other lineup decisions raise further concerns. For a team desperately needing every ounce of value, reaching early in the draft for Tua Tagovailoa, Nico Collins, and Marvin Harrison Jr. might haunt them

throughout the season. With Darnell Mooney reluctantly holding a starting position, it's clear that NiqueyMuum faces an uphill battle, so much so that even their strongest assets might not prevent another disappointing finish.

The decision to reach significantly for Jordan Love, who was taken far earlier than his ADP suggested, could hinder their chances of making a significant impact. Meanwhile, their division rank of 10 and tournament placement in the 21st percentile reflect

a team struggling to make meaningful improvements from last year's performance. As they attempt to claw their way out of the shadows of past disappointments, the road ahead appears steep and fraught with challenges.

Though they've fished some great value late in the draft with the likes of Stafford, they've also taken Anthony Richardson significantly earlier than anticipated, which might be a double-edged sword. Meanwhile, Ollie Gordon was snatched up slightly ahead of his time, ensuring that Joe Somerville's strategy remains as unpredictable as a squirrel at a bird feeder. With each week promising a new flavor of chaos, this team is set to entertain, bewilder, and maybe, just maybe, surprise us all.
