DynastyPlumb lands in the 2nd percentile of the Scott Fish Bowl field and 12th in the Elder Scrolls division, and the draft record explains exactly how they got there: five major reaches against a single steal. The most damning entry is Jaxson Dart, pulled 1.7 rounds ahead of his ADP at pick 3.10 and now projecting as a QB11, which is a fine ceiling but a brutal cost for a player whose entire profile comes with an asterisk. The scouting on Dart is essentially a warning label, a mobile quarterback who crossed 250 passing yards once in 12 starts and kept interrupting his season with trips to the medical tent. Spending a third-round pick on that volatility was a swing, and it left DynastyPlumb scrambling to fill out the roster with late-round reaches like Dylan Sampson, taken 3.4 rounds early, and Jack Bech, hauled in nearly five rounds before his ADP. Tyler Warren gives this team a genuine TE4 anchor, but one elite tight end cannot paper over a draft that reads less like a strategy and more like a series of educated guesses that kept coming up wrong.

Last year CubbyStrickland went 28-8 and scored in the 97th percentile, which is the kind of season that buys a manager a lot of goodwill heading into a new year. The problem is that goodwill does not start players, and what CubbyStrickland is actually putting on the field in 2026 projects 19th percentile, good for 11th in the Elder Scrolls division. The receiver group is genuinely excellent, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba, Drake London, Garrett Wilson, Ladd McConkey, and Terry McLaurin all projected as starters and ranked WR3, WR7, WR17, WR20, and WR24 respectively. But this is a positionless format, and the rest of the roster is not carrying its weight. Cam Skattebo is the top backfield option at RB20, and the quarterback situation is Tyler Shough at QB20 and Malik Willis at QB24, the latter taken four-plus rounds before his ADP in what might be the draft's most confusing act of aggression. CubbyStrickland's 2025 trophy is real. The 2026 roster is a separate conversation, and right now that conversation is uncomfortable.

There is no sugarcoating the situation for jbbroido13 in the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl: sitting 10th in the Elder Scrolls division and projected in just the 20th percentile of the field, this roster is staring at a long season with very few reasons for optimism. The foundation is not without merit, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 give the team genuine top-end punch, but Walker came at a cost, taken 1.2 rounds ahead of his ADP at pick 2.02, which is the kind of draft capital overpayment that haunts a team all season. Beyond Taylor and Walker, the drop-off is steep, with Chuba Hubbard projecting as the weakest projected starter at RB29, and the receiver group headlined by Chris Olave at WR11 but thinning out fast after that. The draft yielded zero steals and absorbed two major reaches, which means jbbroido13 never found the leverage moments that separate a middle-of-the-pack roster from a contender. There is no obvious fix, no buried asset waiting to emerge, just a team that graded out near the bottom and drafted accordingly.

There is no polite way to say this: cwdynastyjunkie is sitting at the 24th percentile and ninth in the Elder Scrolls division, and the path back to relevance is genuinely hard to see. The receiver group is legitimately good, with Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), CeeDee Lamb (WR5), and DeVonta Smith (WR14) all projecting as starters, and the tight end depth behind Harold Fannin (TE6) is real. But the quarterback situation is a slow leak that no amount of receiver talent can seal. Geno Smith (QB30) and Shedeur Sanders (QB32) are the options, and neither one inspires confidence in a field this competitive. Then there is the drafting, where two major reaches, including Jake Ferguson at TE12 taken a full 2.3 rounds early, suggest the kind of aggressive maneuvering that does not always age well. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the first scoring percentile, cwdynastyjunkie needed a reset draft and mostly got chalk instead. The margin for error here is essentially zero, and the roster does not look like one that punishes mistakes.

The uphill climb is real for jpetererson6208 in 2026, and the draft board is not doing them any favors. Sitting eighth in the Elder Scrolls division and projected at just the 32nd percentile of the field, this roster's ceiling is largely defined by its top end, and that top end is genuinely mixed. Puka Nacua at WR1 and Malik Nabers at WR12 give the lineup legitimate star power, but beyond those two the production drops off fast, and KC Concepcion projects as the weakest starter at WR50. The draft process made things harder. Four major reaches mean capital was spent at a premium on players the market undervalued for a reason, and the Fernando Mendoza situation is the most glaring: a QB27 taken more than six rounds ahead of his ADP. In a positionless format where your best players simply play, spending a sixth-round pick on a fringe quarterback is the kind of decision that quietly poisons a roster. Nacua is good. Nabers is good. But good isn't enough when the depth behind them is priced at more than it's worth.

moore7778 sits at 45th percentile in the Scott Fish Bowl field, which is exactly as precarious as it sounds: good enough to believe, not good enough to coast. The quarterback room is genuinely elite, with Josh Allen (QB1) and Jayden Daniels (QB5) doing the heavy lifting at the top of the roster, and the running back group is serviceable if unspectacular, anchored by Omarion Hampton (RB9) and Kyren Williams (RB15). What could quietly tilt the season in moore7778's favor is Jaylen Waddle (WR23). The Dolphins passing game was a functional disaster, and Waddle survived it anyway. Now he lands in Denver behind Bo Nix, who threw more passes than anyone in the league last year, which is the kind of context upgrade that turns a WR23 projection into something that looks cheap by October. The draft was mostly chalk with a reach on Kimani Vidal (RB60) that will need to pay off late to justify it. This roster does not scare anyone. It does not have to. It just needs Waddle to validate the move and the margins to fall right.

CSpring didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't mortgage the middle of the draft for one transcendent name. They just kept coming out ahead, pick after pick, and the cumulative effect is a roster that sits comfortably in the 68th percentile of the field. The foundation is genuinely strong: Drake Maye at QB2 and Trey McBride at TE2 give CSpring two of the most valuable assets a manager can hold in a positionless format, and pairing McBride with Travis Kelce (TE10) and Isaiah Likely (TE13) means the position stays productive even on a rough week. The backfield group is where the draft really showed its consistency. Jeremiyah Love (RB13), Breece Hall (RB14), and TreVeyon Henderson (RB19) form a tier that most managers would happily build around, and David Montgomery adds a compelling storyline: after losing ground in Detroit, he landed in Houston with a real path back to featured work. There were no dramatic steals here, but there didn't need to be. Eighteen picks at chalk value is not a failure of imagination, it is a draft that refused to beat itself.

mrsmith55 didn't build this roster by swinging for the fences and missing. They built it by simply not losing trades with the draft board. Eighteen chalk picks sounds boring until you look at what the chalk was: Bijan Robinson at RB2, Patrick Mahomes at QB12, A.J. Brown at WR8, George Pickens at WR10, and Sam LaPorta and George Kittle combining to anchor the tight end spots. That's a starting core that projects to win a lot of weeks outright. The Mahomes and Rashee Rice stack adds a ceiling layer, though Rice arrives carrying enough baggage that counting on him feels optimistic. Between the jail stint tied to his probation violation, a knee procedure keeping him sidelined into the season, and a concussion history that already cost him games in 2025, Rice is less a pillar and more a bonus if things break right. The floor here doesn't need him, which is exactly why this draft holds up. A 68th percentile projection with that much proven talent at the top is a quiet endorsement that mrsmith55 consistently came out ahead.

Stevecpp lands at 78th percentile in the tournament and fourth in the Elder Scrolls division, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why: six values, thirteen chalk, one minor reach, and nothing that should keep a manager up at night. The foundation is genuinely elite, with Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 anchoring a lineup that would make most managers in this field quietly envious. What makes this roster stand out, though, is the discipline layered underneath those headliners. Derrick Henry at RB12 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 are both projected starters who were drafted right, and then Stevecpp kept finding value in the middle and late rounds, snagging D.J. Moore, DK Metcalf, Jaylen Warren, and Tony Pollard each at least a round after their ADP suggested they would be available. The one eyebrow-raiser is Eli Stowers, taken nearly two rounds ahead of schedule, but one minor reach on a roster this clean is closer to rounding error than red flag. This is a well-built team that looks like it was drafted with a plan and the patience to execute it.

CrazyCanuck16 sits at 82nd percentile in the field and third in the division, which is the kind of outcome that politely refuses to explain itself. The draft log shows five minor reaches and a major one, and yet the roster stares back at you looking genuinely good. Start with the foundation: Brock Bowers at TE1 was taken before his ADP, yes, but reaching for the best player at his position in a positionless format is not a mistake, it is a philosophy. Caleb Williams came as a legitimate value, falling nearly two rounds past his ADP before CrazyCanuck16 scooped him at QB6. James Cook arrived as another value. So the picture that emerges is a manager who overpaid in some spots and got paid back in others, which is either a coherent drafting style or a wash that happened to come out ahead. Kyle Monangai, the team's weakest projected starter at RB33, was the biggest reach of the draft at nearly three rounds early, and he is the one player who still has to prove the conviction was real.

ChrisBudge landed in the 84th percentile of the field and sits second in the Elder Scrolls division, and the draft record tells you exactly why: 4 values, 12 chalk, and zero major reaches. That is not a flashy line, but it is a winning one. The foundation is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, taken at 1.06 when his ADP sat at 1.02, a minor positional gain that nonetheless confirms ChrisBudge was not sleeping at the podium. Nico Collins at WR9 and Tee Higgins at WR19 project alongside Chase as starters, giving this roster a top end at receiver that most managers in this field would envy. The tight end group is just as impressive, with Colston Loveland at TE3 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 both projecting as starters. Where ChrisBudge quietly separated from the pack was in the back half of the draft, picking up Javonte Williams at RB17 a full round after his ADP and Chris Rodriguez at RB48 nearly two rounds

late. The steal column reads zero, but the value column reads four, and that steady accumulation of small edges is exactly what second-in-division rosters are built on.

BGWhitefield sits first in the Elder Scrolls division and at the 86th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. The headliner is Jahmyr Gibbs, the RB1, paired with Saquon Barkley, the RB8, giving this roster a backfield foundation that most managers would trade their entire bench to own. Barkley carries a legitimate question mark after a down 2025 and reports of a reduced workload ahead, but at RB8 the market has already priced in the skepticism, which means the upside is still very much alive. Beyond those two, the real story is the discipline: four good values on the board, including Lamar Jackson at QB3 taken nearly a full round past his ADP, and Jalen Hurts at QB9 taken a full round late. That kind of patience at the top of the draft does not happen by accident. Fourteen chalk picks and zero major reaches round out a roster that looks like someone followed a plan, stuck to it, and let the board come to them.
