Boloncones sits near the bottom of the Ellie division, and the draft board explains exactly why. The most damning evidence is the quarterback haul: Jayden Daniels went in the first round at pick 1.12, a full round ahead of his ADP, which is a steep price even for a QB5. That might be forgivable in isolation, but Boloncones then circled back for Fernando Mendoza at 4.01, a QB27 taken nearly nine rounds before the market said to. Then Michael Penix Jr. at 12.01, a QB33 grabbed five rounds early. Then J.J. McCarthy at 15.12, a QB37, five rounds early again. Four quarterbacks, all reached, none of them elite, consuming real estate that could have addressed depth elsewhere. The one moment the board offered a gift, Rome Odunze falling a full round past his ADP, Boloncones cashed it. One value in twenty picks, surrounded by four major reaches and four minor ones, is not a draft strategy. It is a confession. The Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack has upside, but this roster was built around hope rather than value, and it projects to finish accordingly.

numba1punna sits 11th in the Ellie division and in the bottom quarter of the entire field, and the draft record doesn't offer much of a rebuttal. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 is a genuine anchor and Nico Collins at WR9 gives the roster a legitimate top-end piece, but the supporting cast frays quickly, and the draft process made things harder than they needed to be. Ladd McConkey, taken at 3.03 against an ADP of 4.10, cost a premium that a bottom-tier roster simply cannot afford to spend on a WR20. C.J. Stroud, projected WR22 and the weakest projected starter on the board, was pulled three rounds early at 7.03 when the market said 9.08. Those aren't aggressive swings, they're compounding errors on a team with no margin for error, and the 2025 season, a 28-percent win rate and 30th-percentile scoring, suggests the pattern isn't new. Gibbs and Collins can carry water, but they can't carry the whole river.

There is a particular kind of draft exhaustion that comes not from making mistakes but from doing everything right and watching it not matter anyway. To infinity and Bijan! drafted Justin Jefferson at 2.08 when his ADP was 1.12, a genuine steal that should have set the tone. The roster is loaded with chalk and features Bijan Robinson projecting as RB2 alongside Jefferson at WR6, a foundation most managers would trade half their bench to own. And yet the team sits 10th in the Ellie division and at just the 24th percentile of the field, which is the answer you get when the back end refuses to hold up its end. The projected weakest starter is Jayden Reed at WR48, and Travis Kelce, taken 2.8 rounds before his ADP, currently projects as only TE10, making that reach feel particularly costly in hindsight. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the 8th percentile of scoring, the front of this roster demands a better result. The rest of it offers no guarantees.

timlunsford sits ninth in the Ellie division and inside the bottom quarter of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The receiver group is the central problem: Carnell Tate at WR29 is the top option and was actually a value grab, taken a round and a half after his ADP, but Khalil Shakir at WR51 is the projected weakest starter on the entire squad, and the drop-off after those two is steep. The running back group is genuinely strong, led by James Cook at RB5 and Chase Brown at RB11, but that depth can only carry so much weight in a positionless format when the other contributors are this thin. The quarterback situation adds another wrinkle: Jaxson Dart, taken 1.7 rounds ahead of his ADP, projects as QB11 but carries the kind of profile that has burned managers before, a tantalizing athlete whose passing production has been inconsistent and whose durability has already been questioned. timlunsford went 18-18 last season. Nothing in this construction suggests 2026 breaks that pattern favorably.

cdharrelliii enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Ellie division and in the bottom third of the entire field, and the draft history explains exactly how things got here. Four major reaches litter this roster, and the most damaging ones fall at the same position: Keaton Mitchell at RB49 was grabbed nearly four rounds early, and Rashod Bateman at WR92 and Tyquan Thornton at WR97 followed the same pattern deep in the draft, rounds where finding value is the whole job. The team is not without genuine talent, Lamar Jackson is a QB3, and the Jackson / Zay Flowers stack adds a real bonus, but even that upside gets blunted when the supporting cast was assembled by paying premium prices for discount goods. De'Von Achane at RB6 was reached on in round one, meaning cdharrelliii front-loaded the cost and then overpaid again in the middle and late rounds before the draft was finished. There is no obvious correction available now, no undervalued depth piece quietly waiting to emerge, just a roster that asked too much of too many players who are unlikely to deliver it.

briccette sits at the 48th percentile and seventh in the Ellie Division, which tells you everything about the team's predicament: good enough to beat the bottom, not good enough to scare the top. The foundation is genuinely impressive, Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Saquon Barkley at RB8, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 giving briccette a tier of talent that most managers would envy, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 alongside Harold Fannin at TE6 rounds out a starting core with real upside. The problem is that beyond those names, the cupboard gets thin fast, with Jordyn Tyson at WR34 as the best pass-catcher on the board and a collection of WR52-through-WR99 options that offer depth without much ceiling. Walker, pulled a round early as the draft's one major reach, has to deliver on that investment or the math gets uncomfortable. Chuba Hubbard projects as the weakest starter at RB29, a reminder that the margin between briccette's floor and ceiling is not as wide as the backfield headliners suggest. Wins and losses here will be settled in the single digits.

Killy landed in a peculiar spot: a roster that looks genuinely good despite a draft sheet that looks like someone kept jumping the line. Four major reaches, three minor ones, zero steals. And yet here we are, staring at Puka Nacua at WR1, Ashton Jeanty at RB7, and Rashee Rice at WR13 as projected starters, all on the same team. The Nacua and Jeanty picks actually came to Killy as values, each slipping past their ADP, which is the quiet part of this story. The loud part is all the reaching, and not all of it paid off equally. Cam Ward at QB23 is a three-round early grab on a backend quarterback, and the late-round RB depth in Trey Benson and Emanuel Wilson cost real draft capital to secure. But the core here is legitimately strong, Dallas Goedert brings useful upside at TE15 after a quietly excellent Eagles stretch last season, and this roster sits at the 65th percentile for a reason. Killy overreached repeatedly and still built something worth watching. Call it conviction. The standings will call it something else.

Bumpin Uglies finished last season in the 42nd percentile and came back swinging, landing at 72nd this year, so something clearly went right in this draft. The question is whether it was genius or stubbornness, because the answer is probably both. The foundation is genuinely hard to argue with: Josh Allen at QB1 paired with Colston Loveland at TE3 gives this roster a ceiling that most managers in the Ellie division would trade for on the spot. The reaches are where it gets interesting. Michael Mayer came off the board 5.4 rounds before his ADP, Darnell Washington another 3.2 rounds early, and neither projects better than TE38 or TE39. That is conviction expressed in the late rounds, where it costs the least. Meanwhile, Alec Pierce, scooped as a value at WR32, carries real upside as one of the game's premier big-play threats but also a recovering ankle and potential PUP complications that could cost him the first four weeks. Bumpin Uglies built a good roster by knowing what they wanted and taking it. Whether the late reaches haunt them or quietly disappear into the lineup depth is the last thing left to prove.

Bing Bong didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't gamble on upside at the expense of the floor. They just kept winning the pick. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the whole operation, and Drake London at WR7 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in the Ellie division would envy. What makes the draft impressive isn't one signature move but the accumulation of sensible decisions: Jalen Hurts fell nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at QB9, a player who has posted five consecutive top-ten fantasy finishes and brings a rushing floor that most quarterbacks simply cannot match, even as the offseason departure of AJ Brown adds real uncertainty to Philadelphia's passing game. Michael Pittman slipped more than a round and added WR44 depth without costing anything extra. The result is a roster sitting at the 73rd percentile of the field, and it got there the quiet way, by being right more often than wrong and letting the draft come to it.

HurlBruce sits third in the Ellie Division and in the 75th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The value column is where this team separates itself: Patrick Mahomes at QB12 fell 1.3 rounds past his ADP, DeVonta Smith at WR14 slid nearly a full round, and Aaron Rodgers at QB29 was still on the board three rounds later than he had any right to be. That is disciplined patience at the turn, not luck. The receiver group backs it up, with A.J. Brown at WR8, George Pickens at WR10, and Smith forming a projected starting core that would make most managers envious. Brock Bowers at TE1 is the one place HurlBruce blinked first, taken about half a round early, but when the player is the top projected tight end, you stamp the card and move on. One minor reach, four values, and one steal across the whole board is about as clean a draft ledger as you will find in 2026.

Chinox did not come to the Scott Fish Bowl to negotiate. Sitting at 84th percentile and second in the Ellie division, this roster reads like a masterclass in patience and precision, built on value captured rather than luck stumbled into. CeeDee Lamb fell nearly a full round past his ADP and landed here at WR5. Malik Nabers, whose redraft stock cratered from a top-10 receiver down to WR21 after a complicated ACL recovery, slid 1.7 rounds and is now projected as a starter on a roster that can absorb any early-season caution with Trey McBride projected TE2 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 providing insurance that most managers would kill for. Travis Etienne came at a round of discount, too. The one blemish, a minor reach on Jeremiyah Love at RB13, is so inconsequential it barely qualifies as a conversation. Six values, thirteen chalk picks, zero major reaches: that is not a draft strategy, that is a standard. Chinox set one.

cvbattag sits atop the Ellie division and in the 98th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The receiver group alone is a statement: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 headline a starting corps that includes Jaylen Waddle, Marvin Harrison Jr., and Josh Downs, and St. Brown arriving at pick 2.04 when his ADP was 1.10 is the kind of quiet efficiency that separates good drafters from great ones. Then there is Quinshon Judkins, a RB22 projection scooped up two full rounds after his ADP suggested he would go, which is not luck so much as patience and board awareness. Five additional values and zero reaches across the rest of the draft round out a haul that reads like a clinic. After an 8th-percentile finish in 2025, cvbattag clearly went back to the drawing board and came away with something worth admiring. This roster has the top-end talent to compete and a draft process too clean to dismiss.
