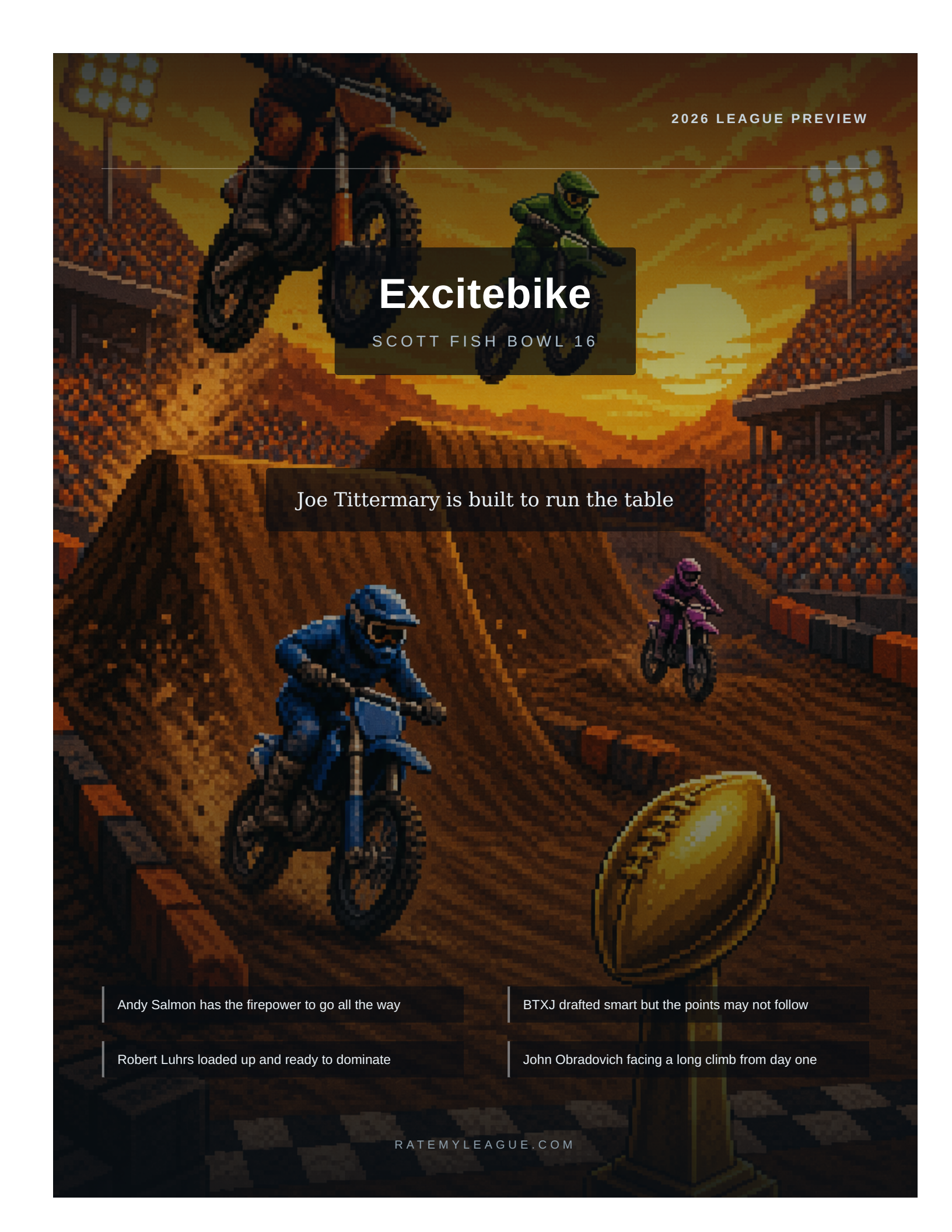

Seven major reaches in a single draft is not a strategy, it is a confession, and Dominick Petrillo's 2026 roster reads like one long apology. The damage starts early: spending a second-round pick on Jalen Hurts, a QB9, is the kind of move that poisons a draft before it ever finds its footing, and then Petrillo doubled back in round ten to grab Geno Smith at QB30, a player who had no business leaving the board before round fourteen. That is two picks surrendered to the quarterback position before most managers had finished building their actual rosters. Quinshon Judkins at RB22 cost a fourth-round selection on a seventh-round player, and T.J. Hockenson, the projected weakest starter on the team, required a round-nine investment for TE23 value. The lone mercy is Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Chris Olave at WR11 giving the top of this roster real teeth, but after a 6-22 finish that landed in the ninth scoring percentile a year ago, Petrillo needed a clean draft and did not come close to delivering one. The Excitebike Division has him ranked twelfth, and nothing here disputes it.

Rich Maletto opened his draft by taking Justin Herbert at 2.01, a full 1.7 rounds before anyone else was ready to pay that price, then doubled down on the quarterback position with Joe Burrow at 1.12 and Kyle Pitts at 4.01, locking in a TE7 prospect more than a round early while the rest of the board was still flush with value. That is not aggressive drafting. That is a man bidding against himself. The results speak accordingly: 11th in the Excitebike division, 4th percentile in the field, coming off a 2025 campaign that landed in the 7th percentile in scoring. There are four values scattered across this roster, but they are buried under seven minor reaches and three major ones, and the cumulative effect is a team that never quite recovered from paying premium prices at the top. Pitts genuinely looks like a player now, and that matters, but one legitimate anchor does not undo a draft that read, from start to finish, like a man who came in with a plan and refused to abandon it even as the board made the plan obsolete.

Gregory Skora's draft reads like a cautionary tale someone should have handed him before the clock started ticking. The foundation is legitimate: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster a genuinely elite core, and Nico Collins at WR9 and George Kittle at TE9 keep the top end respectable. But somewhere around the middle rounds, Skora apparently decided the draft board was a suggestion. Brenton Strange, pulled 5.2 rounds ahead of his ADP at a position where a newly drafted blocker in Jacksonville now clouds his receiving role, is the clearest evidence of a drafter chasing certainty that did not exist. Then came Zach Charbonnet three-and-a-half rounds early and Jonah Coleman three rounds early, both RBs taken well before the market agreed they were worth it, both now projected outside the top 40 at their position. The result is a team sitting 10th in the Excitebike division and in just the 15th percentile of the field, where Robinson and Achane deserve better company than the decisions made around them.

Sean Tenerelli finished in the 80th percentile last season, and that number is doing a lot of heavy lifting right now, because the 2026 roster is sitting at the 16th percentile and ranked ninth in the Excitebike division. The foundation looks fine on paper: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Kyren Williams at RB15 give him genuine upside in the top ten. But this is a positionless format, and what you field beyond your best players matters, and that's where the seams start to show. Tenerelli reached four full rounds early for Bryce Young, who projects as QB26, making Young the weakest projected starter on the roster by a considerable margin. He also burned a pick on Cooper Kupp four rounds before the market did, landing a WR88. Those two decisions didn't just cost draft capital, they defined the roster's ceiling. Tenerelli isn't bad at this game, he's just running on reputation while his roster runs on fumes.

BTXJ built this roster the right way, waiting patiently and letting value come to them, landing four players past their ADP including Jalen Nailor two full rounds late and Isiah Pacheco a round and a half after the field moved on. The problem is that discipline in the draft room is only as good as the players it produces, and the players it produced are a roster sitting in the 19th percentile. Drake Maye and Lamar Jackson give the QB situation genuine upside, and the Lamar Jackson / Zay Flowers stack adds a nice ceiling to the whole operation. But Flowers is the only receiver projected inside WR60, and below her the WR group dissolves into names like Rashod Bateman and De'Zhaun Stribling. David Montgomery, who ceded carries steadily in Detroit before leaving for Houston, now finds himself in a competition with Woody Marks rather than an upgrade situation. BTXJ did everything the process asks of a drafter and still finished with a roster that sits eighth in the Excitebike division, which is the draft's cruelest joke told patiently, across eighteen rounds.

John Obradovich drafted with conviction, and the results are starting to look like a cautionary tale. He reached 1.2 rounds early on Caleb Williams (QB6) and nearly a full round early on Ashton Jeanty (RB7), betting big on upside at the top of his board, but those aggressive swings left him scrambling in the middle rounds, where the roster thins out in a hurry. Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31) was supposed to be a stabilizing force on the back end, but two injury-interrupted seasons and a reportedly fraying connection with Trevor Lawrence have turned him into a question mark rather than an answer. The lone bright spot in the drafting process, Jeanty projecting as RB7, gives Obradovich something to hang his hat on, but one elite anchor does not paper over a depth chart that grades out in the 23rd percentile of the field and seventh in the Excitebike division. There is no obvious trade chip to flip, no breakout candidate hiding in the weeds. This roster is what it is, and what it is looks like a long season.

Heels23 didn't need a single flashy moment to build something worth watching in the Excitebike division. The foundation is legitimate: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the whole operation, and the draft added real value around him without forcing the issue. Malik Nabers fell a full round past his ADP before Heels23 scooped him at WR12, and Jaxson Dart slid nearly a round and a half to become a QB11 at a bargain, with the Dart-Nabers stack offering the kind of multiplier effect that can separate close weeks. Saquon Barkley at RB8 and Breece Hall at RB14 give this roster genuine top-end punch across the board. The draft wasn't perfect, Patrick Mahomes going nearly three rounds early at 2.12 is the kind of thing that keeps a manager up at night, but with four documented values and a starting group this strong, one overpay doesn't define the picture. After a rough 2025 that landed in the 21st percentile of scoring, Heels23 looks like a team that finally did its homework.

Dane Hiatt's draft didn't have a signature moment so much as a signature pattern: he kept coming out ahead. The clearest example is Justin Jefferson, a WR6 who slipped nearly a full round past his ADP before Hiatt scooped him at 2.11, then paired him with Kyler Murray for a stack that gives this roster a weekly ceiling most managers would envy. Brock Bowers at TE1 was a minor reach by the numbers, but reaching for the best tight end in the pool is a different kind of crime than reaching for a dart throw, and the payoff is a starter who projects to win that position outright. Terry McLaurin fell a full round before Hiatt took him at 6.11, landing a WR24 at a discount. Against that backdrop, the 12 chalk picks start to look less like passivity and more like a manager who knew when to be patient and when to pounce. Sitting 65th percentile heading into the season, Dane Hiatt has built a team that belongs in the conversation in the Excitebike division.

Christopher Ricci didn't win his draft on one big swing, he won it on accumulation, and the receiver group is the clearest proof. Landing CeeDee Lamb at 2.07 when his ADP sat at 1.11 was the kind of quiet coup that looks obvious only in hindsight, and Ricci built outward from there, adding George Pickens (WR10), Garrett Wilson (WR17), and Jameson Williams (WR21) to form a top end that would make most managers jealous. The rest of the draft followed the same pattern: four good values, only three minor reaches, zero major ones. That consistency is why Ricci sits at 88th percentile in the field despite nothing on the board screaming lottery ticket. The one genuine question mark is Dalton Kincaid, who brings obvious upside as a TE11 projection paired with Josh Allen but has been nagged by a knee injury that Bills GM Brandon Beane described as "too early to tell" heading into 2026. If Kincaid gets right, this roster doesn't just belong in the conversation, it commands it.

Robert Luhrs didn't stumble into a 95th-percentile roster, he built one with the quiet confidence of someone who had done the homework before the bell rang. The foundation is immovable: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give this team an upper tier that most managers in this field would trade their entire draft for, and Taylor himself was a value, slipping to 2.08 against an ADP of 2.01. Drake London, falling nearly a full round past his number, arrives as a projected WR7 starter and the kind of addition that makes a good draft look great in hindsight. Then there are the late-round receipts: Omar Cooper Jr. taken at 16.08 against an ADP of 14.01, Rachaad White scooped 1.4 rounds past his number, Rico Dowdle another 1.8 rounds late. Seven values across the roster, zero major reaches, and a starting lineup that projects starters at every meaningful tier. Third in the Excitebike division is where Luhrs sits now. It will not stay that way long.

Andy Salmon has constructed something that belongs in a textbook. Sitting at 98th percentile tournament-wide and second in the Excitebike Division, this roster is the product of a manager who never panicked, never reached, and let the board do the work. The foundation is staggering: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, A.J. Brown as WR8, and James Cook as RB5, all locked into the starting lineup. But the draft craft is what elevates this from good to authoritative. Cook fell half a round past his ADP, Derrick Henry slid nearly a full round to land at RB12, and Tee Higgins, projected WR19, came at a discount too. Then Salmon kept his composure in the late rounds and pocketed RJ Harvey at RB28 nearly two and a half rounds after the market said he should have been gone. Zero major reaches across the entire draft. The weakest projected starter is Jayden Reed at WR48, which, on a roster this loaded, reads less like a concern and more like a signature.

Joe Tittermary did not come to the Scott Fish Bowl to mess around. Sitting at the top of the Excitebike division and in the 99th percentile of the entire field, this roster reads like a masterclass in disciplined drafting: no major reaches anywhere on the board, five legitimate values, and two steals that would make any room full of fantasy managers wince. The steals tell the story best. Jordyn Tyson at WR34 fell more than two full rounds past his ADP, and Michael Pittman at WR44 did the same, meaning Tittermary essentially collected two viable starters for the price of backups. That kind of efficiency compounds when you already have Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Trey McBride at TE2, and Tyler Warren at TE4 anchoring the lineup. Even if Pittman, the projected weakest starter, stumbles, this team has enough ceiling across its starters to absorb it without panic. Clean draft, elite ceiling, nothing to explain away. That is the whole review.
