footballinsights lands 9th percentile in the field, and the draft tells you exactly why. The reach count here is damning: four major reaches against zero steals, a draft profile that reads less like a strategy and more like a series of panicked overcorrections. Jayden Daniels was taken at 2.01 despite an ADP of 2.12, which is fine in isolation, but Hunter Henry at TE18 cost a full 2.5 rounds of premium capital for a tight end who barely qualifies as a starter. Keon Coleman, reached four full rounds early, projects as WR91. Four rounds. For WR91. The one moment the board actually cooperated, Tee Higgins sliding a full round and a half past his ADP, was received with the enthusiasm of someone who also just drafted Darnell Mooney nearly three rounds ahead of schedule. Chris Olave and Malik Nabers are legitimate weapons and the Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack has real upside, but this roster is propped up by a ceiling that the draft process spent ten rounds quietly undermining.

JacobHaislip sits 11th in the Ezio Audatore division and in the 13th percentile of the field, and the roster makes it pretty easy to understand why. The backfield is legitimately impressive, anchored by Bijan Robinson at RB2 and a string of competent contributors behind him, but this is a positionless format and impressive depth only matters if the rest of the roster can hold its weight. It cannot. The receiver group tops out at Jakobi Meyers at WR45, a projected starter who ranks closer to replacement level than to relevance. The quarterback situation is where the draft really went sideways: Patrick Mahomes cost a third-round pick, a full 2.5 rounds before his ADP, and projects as QB12, meaning Haislip paid a premium price for a middling return. A bad value on a mediocre player is survivable; a bad value on a player who is supposed to anchor your roster is the kind of mistake that echoes all

season. There is no obvious fix available from here, and the 2025 record of 17-19 suggests this operation was already operating near its ceiling.

There is a particular kind of fantasy exhaustion that sets in when you look at a roster and realize the ceiling and the floor are basically the same room. PhinsUp lands at 24th percentile in the field and dead last in the Ezio Audatore division, and the draft did not do much to change the trajectory. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 are genuinely elite, and Lamb arriving at 2.03 when his ADP sat at 1.11 is the kind of draft-day fortune that should matter. It just does not matter enough. The quarterback situation is where hope quietly exits the building: Jordan Love projects as QB17 and Baker Mayfield as QB18, and the manager paid early for both, reaching on Mayfield by nearly two rounds and on Love by over a round. In a positionless format, quarterback drag bleeds directly into your weekly score, and no amount of wide receiver shine fully compensates when the signal-callers are this pedestrian. PhinsUp has its bright spots. It also has no obvious lever left to pull.

Last year Schweinot went 26-10 and scored in the 93rd percentile, which is the kind of résumé that makes a manager look like a genius heading into a new draft. The 2026 version of this roster is being asked to carry that reputation on considerably shakier shoulders, sitting 9th in the Ezio Audatore division and projecting to just the 25th percentile in scoring. The drafting did not help matters. Justin Herbert at QB8 and Travis Etienne at RB18 were both reached for, Herbert by nearly a round and Etienne by more than a round and a half, meaning Schweinot paid early-round prices for players the market valued later. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 is a genuine anchor, and Christian Watson falling two full rounds past his ADP to land at WR28 is the kind of late-draft luck that can quietly reshape a season. But the projected starters around them, including Michael Wilson at WR39 and Oronde Gadsden at TE16, are competent rather than commanding. The 2025 team earned its percentile. This one is borrowing it.

The Substation Warriors enter 2026 ranked eighth in the Ezio Audatore division and sitting at just the 32nd percentile tournament-wide, and nothing about how they got here inspires much confidence in a turnaround. The top of the roster is genuinely impressive: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a foundation most managers would envy, and Travis Kelce at TE10 was a reasonable late value at 8.09. But the pyramid gets shaky fast, and the draft process did this team no favors. Two major reaches, including Mac Jones at QB39 burned nearly nine rounds of capital on a quarterback who projects as a non-factor, and that kind of draft currency is hard to recover from in a single season. The receiver group grades out weak, with Mike Evans at WR27 leading a group that fades quickly into WR76 and beyond. After a 2025 that landed in the 42nd scoring percentile, the Warriors needed an aggressive offseason to close the gap. Instead, they mostly stayed chalk and reached twice. There is no obvious lever left to pull.

GiantsAreBig sits at 47th percentile and seventh in the Ezio Audatore division, which means every week is a negotiation with variance rather than a coronation or a concession. The foundation is genuinely good: Joe Burrow at QB4 and Trey McBride at TE2 give this roster a high-end ceiling that most teams in this range cannot match, and Derrick Henry and Jeremiyah Love project as capable contributors behind them. The problem is what happens at the edges, where the margins that define a middling team get decided. The projected weakest starter is Michael Pittman at WR44, a fine player in a vacuum but the kind of number that separates a team that goes 7-6 from one that goes 9-4. The draft offered no steals and no values, just 17 chalk picks and three minor reaches, meaning GiantsAreBig arrives exactly as built with no discovered upside baked in. Burrow stays healthy, McBride keeps producing at TE2, and this team climbs. One slips, and the margin closes fast.

Steve2187 sits at the 51st percentile, and that number tells you almost everything: this is a team that will win the games it is supposed to win and lose the ones it is supposed to lose, with the whole season hinging on the handful of weeks where the margin is a coin flip. The foundation is genuinely strong, with Puka Nacua at WR1 and Nico Collins at WR9 anchoring a starting group that few teams can match at the top end, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 paired with Sam LaPorta at TE8 giving Steve real upside through the Jared Goff stack. The concern is not the ceiling, it is the draft capital spent getting there. Goff was taken 1.8 rounds before his ADP, and Caleb Williams went nearly a full round early as well, which means Steve paid a premium for depth insurance he may never need. When the close weeks arrive, and they will, the roster has enough talent to go either way. That is both the promise and the problem.

jayygriff did not win the draft with one thunderclap pick. The approach was quieter and more durable than that: round after round, the board came up favorable. The clearest example is Brock Bowers, a TE1 projection secured before the draft moved on, followed almost immediately by Tyler Warren at TE4, who slipped a full round past his ADP and landed at 4.05. That is not luck so much as it is patience rewarded. Chris Godwin tells a similar story, falling more than a round past his ADP to 10.05 and sliding into a projected starting role at WR38. Add George Pickens projecting at WR10 and James Cook at RB5, and the top of this roster has genuine teeth. The draft sheet reads 16 chalk and just two minor reaches against two solid values, which is the profile of a manager who stayed disciplined when others were panic-reaching. The 64th-percentile tournament projection and fifth-place divisional standing suggest there is real work left to do, but the foundation here was quietly, methodically built.

TheSvoboda didn't chase the highlight-reel move. They just kept winning the pick. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Drake London at WR7 give this roster a top-end receiving foundation that most managers in the Ezio Audatore division can't match, and the supporting cast of Ladd McConkey at WR20 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 means the quality doesn't fall off a cliff after the headliners. The real quiet win was landing Ashton Jeanty at RB7 after he slipped nearly a full round past his ADP, a reprieve that let TheSvoboda add genuine backfield value without sacrificing position elsewhere. Kyle Pitts at TE7 and Isaiah Likely at TE13 round out a starting group that projects to produce at almost every spot on the field. The quarterback situation is thin, and the reach on Tyreek Hill in the fourteenth round is the one moment where discipline slipped, but neither issue derails a team sitting at the 70th percentile of the field. This is a roster built on the unglamorous virtue of not making mistakes.

MasonAydelotte didn't build this roster on one flashy swing. He built it pick by pick, round by round, consistently coming out ahead of the board. The clearest example is Garrett Wilson, a WR17 projection taken a full 1.8 rounds after his ADP, slotted into a starting lineup already anchored by Justin Jefferson at WR6. That's not luck, that's patience, and it compounds. David Montgomery, a projected RB23, fell more than two rounds past his ADP before Aydelotte scooped him up in the tenth. Pair that with Jonathan Taylor at RB4 leading the backfield corps, and the foundation here is legitimately difficult to attack. The draft logged four values and a steal against zero major reaches, and the resulting roster projects third in the division and into the 74th percentile of the field. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the 42nd percentile of scoring, this looks like a team that corrected its construction, filled its depth quietly, and is now positioned to convert talent into results.

maschofield drafted like someone who trusted their board more than the board trusted itself, and the results are hard to argue with. The most telling move is Saquon Barkley, a minor reach at RB8 who looks like exactly the kind of controlled aggression that separates conviction from recklessness. Then there are the major reaches, and this is where the story gets interesting: Emmett Johnson pulled four full rounds before his ADP, Dalton Schultz pulled nearly three, and yet the roster still lands at 78th percentile tournament-wide and second in the Ezio Audatore division. The top of this roster is genuinely excellent, with Josh Allen anchoring the quarterback group, A.J. Brown and DeVonta Smith projecting as WR8 and WR14 respectively, and Tetairoa McMillan and Luther Burden both sitting comfortably inside WR22. That foundation is strong enough to carry some late-round speculation. Whether maschofield was seeing something the consensus missed on those reaches or simply got lucky that the rest of the roster held up, the 2026 version of this team arrives with something most rosters do not: real ammunition at the top.

DJCheerios sits first in the Ezio Audatore Division and in the 98th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The foundation is immaculate: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 give this team a ceiling that most managers spend their whole draft chasing, and both arrived at or near fair market value. Then the precision picks start stacking up. Colston Loveland landed at TE3 nearly a full round after his ADP, Harold Fannin followed at TE6 for similar savings, and Davante Adams at WR25 slid a full round past where he should have been taken. Five values and a steal, against a single minor reach in Cam Ward, the kind of draft ledger that looks less like luck and more like a manager who did the homework and held the line. Jayden Reed projects as the weakest starter at WR48, and even that complaint is a stretch. DJCheerios built this roster the right way, and the standings reflect it.
