There is a particular exhaustion that comes with defending a reputation your roster may no longer deserve. RotoZdroik won 67 percent of its matchups last season and scored in the 85th percentile, and now sits projected 12th in the FIFA Series division and in the 9th percentile of the field. The roster is not barren, Josh Allen anchors the QB group and Jonathan Taylor offers genuine RB4 upside, but the draft tells a quiet story of a manager chasing last year's feeling rather than building toward a new one. Three major reaches, including Jameson Williams at nearly a round and a half early and D.J. Moore at over two rounds early, suggest someone drafting on hope and memory rather than cold market value. The stacks with Allen and Jared Goff give the team a ceiling, but ceilings only matter if the floor holds, and a projected starter at RB33 in Kyle Monangai is a shaky thing to lean on when the margin for error this year is already this thin.

There is no charitable read available on jlcon07's 2026 roster, and the draft log does not offer one either. The headliner is CeeDee Lamb at WR5, a genuinely elite anchor, but surrounding him required the kind of decision-making that gets managers laughed out of draft rooms. Nico Collins came off the board at 2.03 despite an ADP of 2.11, a reach so minor it barely registers except that it signals a draft philosophy built on impatience rather than value. Then that philosophy metastasized: Mac Jones, projected QB39, was taken 5.4 rounds ahead of his market price at 17.10, a selection so aggressively wrong it borders on performance art. The team finished with zero steals, zero values, and three major reaches against a field where every position was available to draft smarter. Lamb and Tyler Warren at TE4 keep this from being a complete write-off, but with a division rank of 11th and a tournament percentile of 10th, the draft tells you exactly where jlcon07 is headed, and the projections agree.

jshep9 sits 10th in the FIFA Series and in the bottom 14 percent of the entire field, and the draft sheet does not offer much hope for a turnaround. The receiver corps looks genuinely impressive on paper, with Justin Jefferson at WR6, Drake London at WR7, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 all projected to start, but that surface-level shine obscures a roster built on soft clay underneath. The draft featured zero steals, two values, and six combined reaches, including the most damaging one: Jaylen Wright taken nearly eight full rounds before his ADP, a price that would be hard to justify for a player projecting at RB68. The quarterback situation offers Trevor Lawrence at QB10 with upside, but Lawrence costs jshep9 almost nothing since he fell past his ADP by over a round, meaning the one place the team caught a break it was already playing from behind everywhere else. When your weakest projected starter is KC Concepcion at WR50 and your most aggressive draft investment is a player ranked RB68, the math is not cooperating.

megsok enters 2026 sitting ninth in the FIFA Series division and in just the 19th percentile of the field, and the roster grades suggest that number is not an injustice. The foundation is genuinely decent: Amon-Ra St. Brown projects as WR4, and Kyren Williams and Josh Jacobs both grade as viable starters. But the drop-off is steep and the draft did not help matters. The two major reaches of the offseason were both quarterbacks, Daniel Jones pulled three full rounds before his ADP and J.J. McCarthy nearly three more, and neither projects as anything better than a low-end starter. That is a lot of draft capital sunk into a position where the returns are, charitably, modest. Malik Willis, the projected starter, brings some dual-threat intrigue in Miami but ranks QB24, which is where hope goes to retire. megsok had a winning record a year ago and finished in the 58th percentile in scoring, so the bones exist somewhere. Right now, though, they are buried under a draft chart that bent toward quarterbacks and a ceiling that keeps coming up short.

DNickels7 finished last season at 13-23 and in the 29th percentile of scoring, and the 2026 projections are not exactly a redemption arc, with the team sitting eighth in the FIFA Series division and in just the 24th tournament percentile. The backfield is genuinely excellent, headlined by Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and supported by Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13, but those studs are propping up a receiver group that grades out weak, with Malik Nabers the only real upside play in the group and even he comes with an asterisk, and not the good kind. Nabers is recovering from what his own coach called a "not simple" torn ACL, and while he reportedly looked like himself in training camp, whether he is a full-go for Week 1 remains an open question. The rest of the starting receiver corps bottoms out at Michael Pittman at WR44. A draft that produced zero steals and zero values gives DNickels7 no hidden edge to lean on, and when Gibbs and Walker are already doing the heavy lifting, there is no obvious lever left to pull.

mjh7357 enters the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting seventh in the FIFA Series division and projecting at just the 39th percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to suggest a turnaround is coming. Sixteen chalk picks and two major reaches define a board that offered almost no upside, with Kyle Pitts taken 1.5 rounds early and Geno Smith burned at pick 12.01 despite projecting as QB30, a move that looks less like a plan and more like a panic. The foundation is real, Christian McCaffrey at RB3, George Kittle at TE9, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 give this team a legitimate core, and the tight end group as a whole grades out strong. But after McCaffrey, the backfield falls off a cliff to Jonathon Brooks at RB37, and by the time you reach the bottom of the projected starters, Quentin Johnston is sitting at WR41. There is no obvious lever left to pull, no late steal to build a comeback narrative around, and the ceiling feels stubbornly close to the floor.

lapasaurus sits at 53rd percentile and sixth in the FIFA Series division, which tells you everything you need to know about the margins this roster is operating in. The upside is real: Brock Bowers at TE1 was taken first overall, a half-round ahead of ADP, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 gives the lineup a genuine weekly anchor. The question is whether the supporting cast holds up when it matters. Chuba Hubbard, the projected weakest starter at RB29, was reached two full rounds early, which means lapasaurus paid a premium for a player who only delivers if circumstances break right. Meanwhile, Patrick Mahomes, sitting at QB12 with a torn ACL and LCL behind him, is reportedly ahead of schedule but his Week 1 availability is still genuinely uncertain, and that uncertainty lands differently on a team with no margin for error. Jalen Hurts at QB9 was a legitimate value at 4.12, so the floor is survivable. But surviving and advancing are different things, and this roster needs the breaks to go its way.

LaxativesMurray didn't make any splashy moves that will get replayed on draft recap highlight reels, but this roster was built the way good ones usually are: pick after pick that quietly came out ahead. James Cook at RB5 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this team a top-end foundation that most managers would envy, and pairing them with Trey McBride at TE2 and Harold Fannin at TE6 means LaxativesMurray is consistently winning the positional advantage game at two spots where the field thins out fast. Chris Olave slid nearly a full round past his ADP before landing here at WR11, and Josh Downs fell over a round to give the roster another projected starter at real value. The draft chart shows three genuine values against just one minor reach and one major one, which is the kind of quiet efficiency that adds up over a full season. A 60th-percentile projection and fifth in the FIFA Series division feels like a floor, not a ceiling, for a team this consistently assembled.

alexherediar didn't build this roster with one flashy move. They built it by simply being right, over and over again. The headliner is Ja'Marr Chase, a WR2 projection who needs no introduction and no explanation. Around him, the supporting cast is quietly excellent: George Pickens at WR10, Rashee Rice at WR13, and Zay Flowers at WR16 give this team a starter group that most managers in the field would trade for without hesitation. The draft process backed up the results. Dak Prescott fell nearly two rounds past his ADP and landed as the QB7, which is the kind of quiet win that separates good drafters from lucky ones. Yes, Rice was taken 1.3 rounds ahead of his ADP, but at WR13 the price is defensible. Two stacks in Prescott paired with Pickens and Matthew Stafford paired with Davante Adams add bonus ceiling to a floor that was already sitting at 79th percentile in the tournament. This is a team that earned its spot in the conversation the boring way, which is the best way.

JoJ lands at third in the division and the 84th percentile of the field, and the draft tells you exactly why: this roster was built pick by pick, without a single flashy swing that blew up the board in either direction. The foundation is genuinely strong, anchored by Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Jayden Daniels at QB5, and the Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack gives the team a connected scoring upside that flat numbers don't fully capture. Justin Herbert slid a full round past his ADP and lands as the QB8, which means JoJ walked away with a borderline starter at a discount while everyone else moved on. The depth behind Robinson runs deep enough that the projected starters are almost all legitimate contributors. Theo Johnson was the one notable overpay at nearly three rounds early, but at TE37 he's a late-round dart and the cost is absorbed easily by a roster this steady. There's nothing here that shouts, and that might be exactly the point.

There was no single moment where jborzello won this draft, which is exactly the point. The picks just kept coming out ahead. Lamar Jackson fell nearly a full round past his ADP, landing at QB3 for a team that didn't have to overpay to get him. De'Von Achane slipped similarly, arriving at RB6 as if the board forgot about him for a few picks. TreVeyon Henderson dropped nearly two rounds before jborzello quietly took him at RB19. Add Jadarian Price and Jaylen Warren, both collected past their ADPs in the double-digit rounds, and you have a draft built less on boldness than on sustained discipline. Five values across the roster, zero steals only because the board never truly panicked, and a team that now sits second in the FIFA Series division and in the 96th percentile of the entire field. The 2025 season landed in the 53rd percentile. The 2026 roster looks considerably harder to hold down.

The SunKings are sitting at the top of the FIFA Series division and it is not hard to see why. This roster was built with the kind of patience and board awareness that most managers only pretend to have. Caleb Williams fell more than two full rounds past his ADP before SunKings scooped him at WR6 quality depth behind a receiver-heavy starting core, and Jake Ferguson slid a similar distance before landing at pick 10.06 despite projecting as a TE12 starter. Those two steals alone would make most rosters feel complete, but the discipline held across the entire draft, with Travis Kelce coming in a round late and Chase Brown arriving as a WR-adjacent value at RB11. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a top-shelf receiving foundation, and even the weakest projected starter, Courtland Sutton at WR37, is the kind of floor other managers would envy. Ninety-seventh percentile. First in division. This one was earned pick by pick.
