There is not much to celebrate in the Fallout division's basement, where Rookie86 sits at 12th and projects in just the 8th percentile of the entire field. The roster has some genuine talent at the top, Justin Jefferson leading a wide receiver group that grades average and Colston Loveland projecting as a TE3, but the draft process kept giving with one hand and taking with the other. The team logged zero steals, leaned heavily on chalk, and burned premium draft capital on two major reaches, including Tucker Kraft at TE5 taken more than a round ahead of his market price. The hope at the top of the lineup rests partly on Jefferson, whose 2025 struggles looked more like a quarterback problem than a Jefferson problem, and Kyler Murray's arrival in Minnesota offers at least a plausible path back to relevance for him. But plausible paths are not the same as probable outcomes, and when your floor is a projected WR50 in KC Concepcion and there are no obvious moves left to make, hope is doing an awful lot of heavy lifting.

SuperDoughnut enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Fallout division and in just the 8th percentile of the field, which is a polite way of saying the roster is quietly terrible despite not looking it at first glance. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and James Cook at RB5 form a genuinely elite top end, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 and Ladd McConkey at WR20 keep the floor from collapsing entirely. But this is a positionless format, and once you scroll past those four names the drop-off is steep enough to induce vertigo, with Jayden Reed projected as the weakest starter at WR48 and the quarterback room offering Bo Nix at QB15 and Sam Darnold at QB21, neither of whom anyone is circling on their calendar. What makes the situation genuinely grim is that the draft offered no path to salvation: zero steals, zero values, and seven minor reaches suggest a manager who paid slightly over market for everything and got nothing back in return. When your best hope is that McCaffrey stays healthy for an entire season, you are not hoping, you are praying.

The New Vegas Radroaches finished last season at the 8th percentile in scoring, and the 2026 projections suggest the elevator is still heading down, with the team sitting 10th in the Fallout division and in just the 16th percentile of the field. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Drake London at WR7 are genuinely elite anchors, and the receiver group as a whole grades out strong, but this is a positionless format and the rest of the projected starters quietly cancel out that advantage. Jordan Love projects as QB17, Baker Mayfield as QB18, and the tight end situation leans on Kenyon Sadiq at TE21 and T.J. Hockenson at TE23, a pairing that offers little upside and cost real capital: Hockenson was the draft's single major reach, taken more than two rounds ahead of his ADP. The draft sheet also shows zero steals and six combined reaches, which means the Radroaches paid a premium for a roster that still grades out near the bottom. Lamb is a genuine weapon, but one star cannot drag a leaky ship to shore.

Mr. Handy went 29-7 last year and scored in the 86th percentile, which is the kind of resume that earns goodwill heading into a draft. The 2026 roster has spent most of that goodwill already. The team lands in the 27th percentile and sits ninth in the Fallout division, and the gap between those numbers and last year's performance is genuinely uncomfortable to stare at. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 are legitimate pillars, and the Jackson-Mark Andrews stack adds a layer of upside that could carry a week. But the draft log tells a quieter, wearier story: no steals, two values, and a pair of major reaches headlined by Christian Kirk, taken more than four rounds before his ADP and currently projected WR100. Harold Fannin was grabbed two rounds early and projects TE6, so that one might work out, but Kirk is the kind of selection that makes a manager stare at the ceiling. The talent at the top is real. The distance between that talent and what surrounds it is what defines this team's ceiling.

Last year marcobortolotto went 30-6 and finished in the 97th percentile, which is the kind of season that makes everyone assume you know something the rest of the field doesn't. The 2026 roster suggests otherwise. The receiver group is legitimately elite, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), Nico Collins (WR9), Rashee Rice (WR13), and Zay Flowers (WR16) all projected starters, and that depth is real. But in a positionless format, the ceiling of your roster is only as high as your weakest projected contributors, and this team has some concerning ones. Matthew Stafford (QB14) and C.J. Stroud (QB22) are both injury-question-mark starters, Aaron Rodgers (QB29) is Aaron Rodgers, and Rachaad White (RB39) is the lone projected starter at running back. The draft offered no steals and no major bargains, just 14 chalk picks and a few minor reaches. marcobortolotto lands 8th in the Fallout division

and in the 39th tournament percentile, a long fall from last year's throne that has less to do with bad luck and more to do with a roster that simply isn't that team anymore.

reneemiller01 sits at 48th percentile and seventh in the Fallout Division, which is exactly the kind of standing that demands precision rather than hope. The core is genuinely good: Puka Nacua at WR1 and Jalen Hurts at QB9 give this team a ceiling most rosters in the middle of the field cannot claim, and the Jaxson Dart and Malik Nabers stack adds a high-variance overlay that could either blow the roof off or quietly underperform. Nabers is the margin question that defines reneemiller01's season. His ACL recovery drew real concern through the offseason, but he avoided the PUP list and flashed his usual explosiveness in camp, meaning his WR12 projection is live if he is a full-go in Week 1 alongside Dart. That is a meaningful if. Hurts was also a genuine value, landing at pick 5.01 against an ADP of 3.12. This roster does not need luck exactly, but it needs Nabers healthy and Dart functional, and right now both of those are questions dressed up as answers.

nipsy69 finished 2026's draft right where they finished 2025's season: squarely in the middle of the field, never threatening the top, never embarrassing themselves. The core is genuinely good. Brock Bowers at TE1 is a weekly difference-maker, and A.J. Brown at WR8 and George Pickens at WR10 give the lineup a high floor on any given week. That is a strong enough foundation to compete. But the margins are where this team gets interesting, and not always in a good way. The draft was almost entirely chalk, fifteen times paying market price with zero steals to show for it. When you never beat the house, you need your chalk to perform, which brings up Dalton Kincaid at TE11, a projected starter whose knee has been a lingering question since late 2024, with Buffalo's front office offering the kind of non-answer that makes fantasy managers nervous. Kincaid healthy is a bonus. Kincaid limping through another season is the margin between nipsy69 grinding into the money or grinding home early.

meeseeksbox did not win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it by not losing it anywhere. The foundation is Josh Allen at QB1, a projected starter who slipped slightly past his ADP and landed at 1.10 without meeseeksbox having to reach. Below him, the backfield reads like a roll call of legitimate contributors: De'Von Achane at RB6, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Chase Brown at RB11 are all projected starters, giving this team genuine depth at a position where depth translates directly into weekly scoring flexibility. The wide receiver group is the weakest section of the roster, with Carnell Tate at WR29 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 leading a group that projects closer to serviceable than dominant. The one blemish in an otherwise disciplined draft is Cam Ward, taken more than two rounds ahead of his ADP and projected only as QB23. In a positionless format, Ward is unlikely to crack the starting lineup often enough to matter. But in a draft this steady across the board, one overpay is easy to absorb. At 59th percentile, meeseeksbox sits comfortably in the field, not chasing anyone, and not being chased either.

There was no lottery ticket moment in this draft, no swing for the fences on a dart throw that happened to land. dkaufma106 just kept coming out ahead, round after round, and the ledger reflects it: four good values, one outright steal, and zero major reaches across the entire board. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 slipping to pick 2.06 when his ADP was 2.01 is the kind of small edge that compounds, and Trevor Lawrence dropping a round and a half to become a QB10 on a sixth-round price tag gives the team genuine quarterback upside without sacrificing early capital. The real crown jewel, though, is Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 anchoring a receiving corps where Luther Burden, projected WR22, is generating the kind of training camp noise that makes that number look conservative. Ben Johnson is openly comparing Burden to St. Brown, and the second half of 2025 gave real statistical backing to that hype. This is a 71st-percentile roster built the boring way, which is usually the right way.

Last year was a rough one for KyaKona, finishing in the bottom 9 percent of the field in scoring, and the 2026 roster reads like a direct response to that misery. The foundation is genuinely strong: Drake Maye projects as QB2, and the addition of AJ Brown in New England gives Maye a true alpha receiver for the first time, which makes an already compelling situation even easier to trust. Behind him, Trey McBride at TE2 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this team an embarrassment of riches at the tight end position, and in a positionless format that kind of elite concentration translates directly into weekly scoring floors that were nowhere to be found in 2025. The backfield adds depth with Josh Jacobs at RB16 and Bucky Irving at RB21 anchoring the group, while the draft surfaced real value late, landing RJ Harvey and Kyle Monangai well past their ADPs. Third in the Fallout division and sitting at the 73rd percentile tournament-wide, KyaKona looks less like a team hoping to rebound and more like one that has already done the work to make it happen.

DirtyPirates did not win this draft on one flashy pick. They won it the way a good poker player wins a session, not by hitting one enormous pot but by consistently getting their money in right. The backbone of this roster is a projected starting group headlined by Jahmyr Gibbs (RB1), Saquon Barkley (RB8), Derrick Henry (RB12), Breece Hall (RB14), and Kyren Williams (RB15), a collection of backfield contributors that most managers would start building a contender around in any format. Beyond the studs, the value hunting was quiet but effective: Dallas Goedert slid a full 1.3 rounds past his ADP and landed as a TE15 starter, and Rico Dowdle fell nearly two rounds before DirtyPirates scooped him up late. Three values against one minor reach across the whole board is the kind of draft efficiency that does not make highlight reels but absolutely shows up in the standings. Sitting second in the Fallout Division and in the 91st tournament percentile, this team earned its spot in the conversation the honest way.

AaronS_EDGE didn't build this roster by swinging for the fences and missing. They built it by consistently getting more than they paid for, and the standings reflect it: first in the Fallout division and sitting in the 92nd percentile of the field. The clearest example is Kenneth Walker III, a projected RB10 starter who fell a full round and a half past his ADP before AaronS scooped him up in the fourth. That kind of surplus value compounds. Pair Walker with Ashton Jeanty (RB7) and Javonte Williams (RB17) in the same lineup and the top of this roster is genuinely difficult to beat. Jayden Daniels (QB5) gives this team a legitimate edge at the most leveraged position on the board, and Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) is exactly the kind of receiver who wins weeks by himself. The two minor reaches, Romeo Doubs and De'Zhaun Stribling, are late-round bets that barely register against a draft that otherwise stayed ahead of the market at nearly every turn. This is what a disciplined, methodical draft looks like when it actually works.
