There is no charitable read on S.P.E.C.I.A.L's draft, and the numbers don't offer one. The lone bright spot is Caleb Williams sliding to Round 4 and landing nearly a full round past his ADP, but the rest of the board tells a grimmer story. Jaylen Waddle, projected WR23, was grabbed 1.5 rounds early at a price that assumes a level of production he has not recently justified, and Brandon Aiyuk, a WR81 projection, was hauled off the board nearly five rounds before the market agreed, in Round 13, which is the kind of move that ends post-draft press conferences early. Pile on three additional minor reaches, zero steals, and a tournament percentile sitting at seventh, and the shape of this roster becomes clear. Jonathan Taylor and James Cook give the team a legitimate foundation at RB4 and RB5 respectively, but the rest of the projected starters barely hold weight, with Hunter Henry, the team's weakest projected starter at TE18, serving as a quiet summary of how this draft went. Twelfth in the Fallout 3 division feels about right.

The Vault Boys enter 2026 sitting 11th in the Fallout 3 division and in just the 27th percentile of the field, and the draft did not offer much evidence that the gap is closing. Thirteen chalk picks and four reaches against zero steals is the draft sheet of a manager who paid market rate for everything and got punished for going early on a few. The projected starting core is fine on paper, George Pickens at WR10, Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, and Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 give this team a pulse, but the floor collapses quickly. Matthew Stafford grades out as a QB14, which in a positionless format means his production has to be replaced by someone else on the roster, and that someone is probably Wan'Dale Robinson, the projected weakest starter at WR47. Last season's 9th-percentile scoring finish was not a fluke of bad luck to overcome; it was a signal about the underlying talent. This roster needed a transformative offseason and instead got a largely chalk draft with a few reaches sprinkled in for good measure.

There is no sugarcoating the situation in Fallout 3 for notJDaigle: this roster grades out at the 29th tournament percentile, and the draft did not generate the kind of surplus value that might paper over that gap. Thirteen chalk picks and three major reaches tell the story plainly. The most damaging of those reaches is Fernando Mendoza, a QB27 projection taken more than five rounds ahead of his ADP, occupying a starting roster spot with what amounts to a late-round flier's production. Lamar Jackson is a legitimate anchor as a projected QB3, and Brock Bowers at TE1 gives the team a real foundation, but below that tier the drop-off is steep. Omarion Hampton projects as RB9 and DeVonta Smith as WR14, which is a functional supporting cast, yet the 2025 season ended at the 10th scoring percentile, and nothing in how this draft unfolded suggests the arithmetic improves dramatically in 2026. The lever has been pulled. This is what the roster is.

The Buffout Bingers are sitting ninth in the Fallout 3 division and in the bottom third of the field, and the roster makes it easy to understand why. The foundation is genuinely appealing: Josh Allen at QB1 was a quiet value at 1.09, and De'Von Achane at RB6 gives the lineup a true difference-maker. But the supporting cast grades out as merely average across the board, and the draft decisions that were supposed to build depth around those anchors did more harm than help. The two major reaches tell the story: J.J. McCarthy, a QB37 taken nearly five rounds early, and Jaylin Noel, a WR83 taken over three rounds ahead of his price, consumed late capital that could have added real value. Meanwhile, Michael Pittman projects as the weakest starter at WR44, which means the floor on any given week is lower than it needs to be. Allen and Achane are worth believing in. Everything else is a prayer that the projections are wrong.

R0t0Wan finished 31st percentile in scoring last season and sits 8th in the Fallout 3 division heading into 2026, and nothing about this roster suggests the trajectory is about to bend upward. The receiver group is where the floor caves in: Mike Evans projects as WR27 and Courtland Sutton as WR37, and after that the names get thin fast, with Jauan Jennings, Calvin Ridley, and Christian Kirk rounding out the depth. That Kirk selection, taken 4.6 rounds ahead of his ADP, is the draft's loudest mistake, burning late capital on a WR100 projection when the team already needed upside at the position. The backfield looks better on paper, with Saquon Barkley and Kenneth Walker III both projecting as starters, and Trey McBride at TE2 is a genuine anchor. But this format rewards managers who can project points from the top of their roster down, and a receiving corps topped by Evans and Sutton is not going to carry a team past the middle of the field. At 41st percentile tournament-wide, R0t0Wan is not in free fall, just quietly stuck.

numberonemarcus is the team that earns a quiet nod of respect and then gets promptly forgotten in the conversation, sitting 7th in Fallout 3 and right at the 45th percentile of the field. The foundation is real: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 is a weekly anchor, and the tight end group featuring Colston Loveland (TE3), Harold Fannin (TE6), and Travis Kelce (TE10) is genuinely elite. Fannin in particular carries upside, having outplayed his veteran predecessor in Cleveland last year, though the Browns' quarterback situation remains a fog and heavy target competition from newly drafted receivers could cap his ceiling. The draft math creates some tension: Kyren Williams and C.J. Stroud were legitimate steals, falling multiple rounds past their ADPs, but Skyler Bell was taken 8.5 rounds ahead of his ADP and Germie Bernard nearly 3 rounds early, which is a real cost in a deep draft. This roster does not win ugly and it does not lose ugly. It inches, and in the Scott Fish Bowl, inching is either everything or nothing.

Jabufu sits at 52nd percentile in a tournament where the margins between advancing and going home are razor thin, and the roster reflects exactly that position: good enough to beat most teams on a given week, not good enough to scare the elite. The top of the lineup is genuinely impressive, Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a ceiling that can compete with anyone, and Chris Olave at WR11 and Tee Higgins at WR19 keep the production from falling off a cliff. The problem is that everything else asks questions without offering clean answers. The draft featured four values, including Bucky Irving and David Montgomery both slipping more than a round past their ADPs, but the manager also reached nearly two rounds early for DK Metcalf and burned a late pick four rounds ahead of schedule on Keenan Allen at WR99. Those late-round decisions compress the margins

further. Jabufu last season went 25-11 and scored in the 75th percentile, so the track record is real. Whether the 2026 roster can replicate that output depends almost entirely on Chase and Brown delivering, because there is not much cushion if they do not.

FFBuddyBall.com didn't build this roster with one flashy move. They built it the way a good team is supposed to be built, pick after pick coming out on the right side of the ledger. Jaxson Smith-Njigba at WR3 anchors a starting group that quietly stacks up, with Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 giving this team genuine upside at multiple spots. The Baker Mayfield and Emeka Egbuka stack is a nice bonus, a connected pair that can pop on the same night and push the weekly ceiling higher. Jaxson Dart was the clearest draft-day win, falling a full round past his ADP before FFBuddyBall.com stepped in at 6.06. Seventeen chalk picks out of nineteen total might sound unexciting, but in a positionless format where starting quality is everything, consistently landing players near their market value means you didn't overpay anywhere. The result is a team sitting at 53rd percentile that feels like it has more room to run than that number suggests.

Galaxy News Radio Raiders sit at 56th percentile in the field and fourth in the Fallout 3 division, which sounds modest until you look at how they got there. The draft log reads like a conviction play: three major reaches in the final rounds on Ted Hurst, Keon Coleman, and Tyquan Thornton, plus a minor reach on D.J. Moore at pick 5.04 when the board said wait. But the foundation underneath all that late-round aggression is genuinely hard to argue with. Bijan Robinson projects as RB2, Tyler Warren as TE4, and Joe Burrow as QB4, all projected starters, and Burrow slipped just enough past his ADP to qualify as good value. The Jared Goff and Jameson Williams stack adds a second gear on weeks when it connects. The real question is whether those late reaches on depth receivers pay off or simply reveal a manager who liked his guys a little too much. The top of this roster earned the optimism. The bottom is where the faith comes in.

hoopadrivestheboat didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it by consistently coming out ahead, and the numbers back that up. Drake Maye lands as QB2 in this format and was taken nearly two full rounds after his ADP suggested he'd go, a quiet steal that anchors the whole operation. The receiver group is where this roster separates itself from the middle of the pack: Justin Jefferson at WR6, Drake London at WR7, and Malik Nabers at WR12 give this team a projected starting core that most managers in the Fallout 3 division simply cannot match. Jefferson is the one worth watching most closely, a player whose 2025 struggles tracked suspiciously well with a quarterback who never fit him, and now that Kyler Murray is in Minnesota, the expectation is that Jefferson returns closer to his ceiling. Sitting third in the division and at the 63rd percentile tournament-wide after a 39th percentile scoring season in 2025, hoopadrivestheboat has built something that looks less like a gamble and more like a quietly confident bet placed twelve times over.

Twoston didn't reshape this draft around one splashy move. They just kept winning small, and those margins add up. The foundation is a receiving group that would turn heads in any league room: Puka Nacua at WR1, Nico Collins at WR9, Rashee Rice at WR13, and Luther Burden at WR22 all project as starters, and Twoston got Rice a full round ahead of his ADP without sacrificing value elsewhere. At quarterback, the story is similarly quiet and similarly effective. Justin Herbert lands as QB8 after slipping 1.3 rounds past his ADP, and Brock Purdy comes in at QB13 after a comparable fall, giving Twoston two legitimate weekly options without burning premium capital on either. The draft wasn't without blemishes, Keaton Mitchell and Kaytron Allen both came off the board meaningfully before the market agreed, but those are manageable bets on upside rather than structural miscalculations. The result is a roster sitting second in the Fallout 3 division and in the 71st percentile of the field, built not on luck but on a consistent pattern of getting slightly more than fair value, round after round.

FantasyBR sits at the top of the Fallout 3 division and in the 96th percentile of the field, and neither figure feels like a surprise once you look at how this roster was built. The draft is almost surgically clean: 15 chalk picks anchored by genuine value at every turn, including Dak Prescott landing as a QB7 in round five when his ADP had him going nearly two and a half rounds earlier, and Jayden Daniels falling a full round past his price to open round four. Those two quarterbacks also happen to stack with CeeDee Lamb, which means FantasyBR is collecting free points from a Cowboys passing game every time it fires. Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Derrick Henry at RB12, and Josh Jacobs at RB16 give this team a backfield foundation that most managers would not dare dream about, and the Prescott-Lamb stack only layers on top of it. One minor reach on Tony Pollard, who projects as the weakest starter, is essentially the only thing to quibble about. One blemish across an entire draft is not a flaw. It is a flex.
