There is no kind way to say this about pedrowyatt: sitting 12th in the Fallout 4 division and in just the 14th percentile of the field, this roster is in genuine trouble, and the draft did not help matters. The core is not without merit, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Chase Brown at RB11 give the team real production to build around, but the supporting cast thins out quickly, and the receiver group is a liability at the top, with Garrett Wilson projecting as a WR17 and Carnell Tate as a WR29. What stings most is how pedrowyatt spent his draft capital. Joe Burrow cost a first-round pick and grades out as only QB4, a position that carries diminishing returns in a positionless format, and Tory Horton was taken nearly three full rounds before his ADP and projects at WR93. That is the profile of a team that drafted its preferences rather than its value, and when the dust settles, there are no obvious moves left to close the gap. The ceiling here is hoping everything breaks right. The floor is a long, quiet autumn.

Ragmann isn't gambling on upside here, they're engineering it. Three stacks anchor this roster: Justin Herbert paired with Ladd McConkey (WR20), Jared Goff feeding Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), and Jordan Love connected to Christian Watson (WR28). When those pairings fire together, the ceiling on this team is genuinely frightening. But correlation cuts both ways, and that's the quiet anxiety running through every projection. The floor isn't just low, it's structural, because the same game scripts that unlock Herbert or Goff also determine whether McConkey and St. Brown eat or disappear. Parker Washington adds a layer of intrigue as a projected starter, but as the player context makes clear, whether Jacksonville actually wants him leading their receiving corps is a legitimate question, which puts a ceiling on whatever Ragmann gets from that slot. Last year's 34th-percentile finish suggests this

roster has underperformed its talent before. The stacks are the plan. They always were. The only question is whether the plan shows up on the same week.

ConmanVG ran a disciplined draft, picking up Dak Prescott four picks after his ADP, landing RJ Harvey more than a round late, and finding Ryan Flourney and Geno Smith in the back half at genuine discounts. Four values, zero major reaches, thirteen chalk selections. That is textbook patience, and it produced a roster sitting in the 29th percentile, last in the Fallout 4 division. The cruelest part is not the outcome but the process, because the value was real and the ceiling still did not materialize. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Nico Collins at WR9 give the team a legitimate top tier, and Chris Olave at WR11 keeps the quality there. But the floor collapses fast. Harvey, the projected weakest starter, heads into Denver facing a backfield that already preferred JK Dobbins last season and then added another competitor in the 2026 draft. Getting Harvey late was the right call. Getting a useful season out of him may require a level of luck that no amount of draft discipline can manufacture.

The math is just not cooperating for jmazzola in 2026. Sitting ninth in the Fallout 4 division and projecting out at just the 35th percentile of the field, there is no single broken thing to fix here, which is almost worse than having one obvious problem. The roster has genuine anchors: Drake Maye is a QB2 coming off a near-MVP campaign, and adding A.J. Brown gives him a true alpha target that New England has lacked for years. Trey McBride grades out as a TE2, and Sam LaPorta and Dalton Kincaid are legitimate contributors behind him. The trouble is that when jmazzola needed the draft to do some work, it mostly didn't. Fourteen chalk picks, zero steals, and two major reaches in Kenneth Gainwell and Braelon Allen tell the story. The receiver corps is the softest part of the projection, with Wan'Dale Robinson leading the group at WR47. Maye and McBride give this team a pulse, but a pulse is not a plan.

The Rabid Gophers did almost everything right in the draft and still landed at 42nd percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question the entire enterprise. Caleb Williams fell nearly two and a half rounds past his ADP before this team grabbed him at 5.12, and Baker Mayfield dropped just as far before getting scooped at 10.01. Those are real wins, and the top of the roster reflects them: CeeDee Lamb (WR5), Drake London (WR7), and Rashee Rice (WR13) form a legitimate core, and Jeremiyah Love (RB13) and Travis Etienne (RB18) add punch underneath. But the floor matters too, and Rico Dowdle (RB32) is the weakest projected starter, a player who hit 1,000 yards in Carolina and promptly got released, now competing for touches behind Jaylen Warren in Pittsburgh with no guarantee of a viable fantasy role. The values at the top are real. The erosion at the bottom is just as real. Getting the price right on your groceries does not help when a few of them spoil before game day.

tylerald is the kind of team that makes playoff seeding committees sweat in mid-November, not because anyone fears them, but because they keep showing up. The backbone here is real: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Derrick Henry at RB12 give this roster a top-end floor that most of the Fallout 4 division cannot match, and the Jalen Hurts and Dallas Goedert stack adds a connective tissue that quietly punishes opponents during the weeks it clicks. Goedert, who stayed in Philadelphia after an offseason that looked like a parting of ways, gives Hurts a security blanket that showed up as a four-touchdown stretch in three weeks last season, and that kind of upside in a stack is exactly the margin-tilting variable a middle-tier roster needs. The concern is the back end, where Makai Lemon projects as the WR40 and is the weakest projected starter on the board. Nothing here screams contender, and nothing screams rebuild. In a format where margins decide seasons, tylerald has just enough ceiling to make it interesting and just enough fragility to keep it honest.

JPeazy81 sits at the 54th percentile, which is exactly as uncomfortable as it sounds, close enough to contention to matter and far enough from the top to feel the pressure of every bad week. The roster has genuine upside at the top, Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Malik Nabers at WR12 give this team a ceiling that most managers in Fallout 4 can't match, and the Jaxson Dart and Nabers stack adds a correlation bonus that could spike a big score on the right Sunday. But the margins are where seasons like this get decided, and the margins here are thin. Matthew Golden projects at WR52 and carries real uncertainty heading into 2026, with the Packers' receiving room somewhat thinned but not cleared enough to guarantee him a featured role, and a second straight underwhelming season would quietly deflate what this roster can put on the board. JPeazy81 drafts sensibly, landing Dart nearly four rounds past his ADP, but sensible drafting gets you to the middle of the field. Getting out of it requires Golden and the back end of this roster to overperform, and that is not a comfortable place to hang a season.

JMax09 built something genuinely worth watching in the Fallout 4 division, and the most interesting part is how they did it. The draft sheet reads like a series of small gambles, with three minor reaches and one major one in Kaytron Allen, grabbed 3.5 rounds before his ADP at pick 16.08. That is the kind of move that looks impulsive on paper and prescient in October. But here is the thing: the core that surrounds those reaches is legitimately strong. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, De'Von Achane at RB6, and Tyler Warren at TE4 give JMax09 a projected starting lineup that can compete with nearly anyone in this field, and Zay Flowers at WR16 and Josh Jacobs at RB16 are exactly the kind of depth that turns a good week into a great one. The question is not whether the foundation is real, because it is. The question is whether the reaches, Allen chief among them, deliver on the conviction JMax09 clearly placed in them. At 56th percentile, the ceiling is higher than the projection suggests, and that gap is where this season gets decided.

katsourisff didn't win the draft with one flashy swing. They won it by consistently coming out ahead, and the receiving corps is where that shows most clearly. Puka Nacua at WR1 anchors the group, with George Pickens at WR10 and DeVonta Smith at WR14 providing genuine depth rather than filler. The minor reach on Smith, taken about a round early, looks like the kind of calculated impatience that tends to age well. Bo Nix lands as QB15, which is admittedly the soft underbelly of this roster, but he arrived two and a half rounds past his ADP and stacks with Jaylen Waddle, which softens the concern. George Kittle at TE9 would be a stabilizing force at the position if healthy, though the Achilles' tear that ended his 2025 postseason keeps his Week 1 status genuinely uncertain rather than a formality. Still, with a 67 percent win rate last season and a roster built on patient, repeatable value rather than one high-variance gamble, katsourisff enters 2026 as a team that belongs in the conversation.

cdodgson81 didn't need a heist to build this roster, just steady, accumulative competence round after round. The foundation is genuinely elite: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this team a top-end punch that most managers in the field would trade their best pick to acquire, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 arriving less than a round early is the kind of minor imposition that looks awfully reasonable when the projection lands. Harold Fannin at TE6 and Isaiah Likely at TE13 extend that quality into a second position. Fifteen chalk picks out of a full draft sounds pedestrian until you realize chalk means the manager kept getting players at fair value in a format where plenty of others were reaching six rounds early, as cdodgson81 did once for Jack Bech, or leaving points on the board entirely. A 90th-percentile scoring season in 2025 is the receipts. Third in the division and 71st percentile tournament-wide are reasonable floors for a team built this quietly and this well.

ChaBoyJrich drafted like someone who had already decided what they wanted and was not going to let the board talk them out of it. Xavier Worthy gone 2.2 rounds before consensus, Jordyn Tyson nearly as early, a cluster of late-round receivers grabbed a round or two ahead of schedule every time the pick came around. The rest of the field was zigging and ChaBoyJrich was paying a premium. And yet the roster came out looking genuinely good, sitting second in the Fallout 4 division and at the 79th percentile of the field. The core of Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and A.J. Brown at WR8 gives this team a ceiling most managers would trade a clean draft board to have, and Brown's move to New England alongside Drake Maye adds an upside wrinkle that could push that WR8 projection higher. Lamar Jackson stacking with Mark Andrews is the kind of bonus that turns a good week into a great one. ChaBoyJrich did not draft cleanly. They drafted correctly.

Aaron Schatz enters 2026 sitting first in the Fallout 4 division and in the 80th percentile of the field, and the roster explains why in about three seconds of examination. Josh Allen at QB1 and James Cook at RB5 give this team a top-end foundation that most managers would trade their entire draft for, and the quality doesn't stop there. Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and Kyren Williams at RB15 are also projected starters, meaning Schatz can field multiple elite backfields and still have Jadarian Price at RB26 waiting in reserve. Then there's the tight end situation, where Tucker Kraft at TE5 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 form the kind of pairing that wins weeks by itself. Pitts in particular is worth dwelling on: after years of unfulfilled promise, he finished as a top-five TE in 2025, and his performance last season suggests the quarterback situation in Atlanta matters far less than it once did to his production. In a positionless format, concentrated elite talent is the whole argument, and Schatz brought that in abundance.
