Liberty Prime entered this draft with a functional strategy and somehow came out the other side holding a roster that reads like a cautionary tale. The reach count tells the story plainly: five major reaches, zero steals, zero values, a draft sheet so devoid of surplus that it looks like the board was raided before Liberty Prime ever showed up. The most damaging pattern was the obsessive early investment in quarterbacks, taking Bo Nix at 3.02 when his ADP sat at 6.03, then doubling back for Cam Ward at 7.02 when Ward was available well into the double-digit rounds. That is not building a stack, that is burning two premium picks on a position that cannot carry a team alone in a positionless format, and it left the roster's weakest projected starter as Dalton Schultz at TE22, himself a reach taken nearly three rounds ahead of schedule. A 17th-percentile scoring finish in 2025, a current standing of last in the Fallout: New Vegas division, and an 8th-percentile tournament projection all point the same direction. Puka Nacua at WR1 is genuinely good. The rest of this is a eulogy.

There is a specific kind of tired that comes from watching a draft unfold in slow motion and knowing, pick by pick, that the math isn't going to work out. Mr. House finished last season in the 33rd percentile and, after a 2026 draft that logged five major reaches against just one steal, the trajectory hasn't bent upward. The most damaging decisions came early, when Jared Goff was taken 2.6 rounds before his QB16 projection warranted and Sam Darnold was grabbed 3.4 rounds early to grade out as the projected weakest starter on the roster. Those are premium-round investments chasing middling quarterback production at a time when the rest of the field was accumulating skill-position equity. James Cook at RB5 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 are genuine anchors, and they keep this from being a total teardown conversation, but two stars and a roster sitting at 16th percentile tournament-wide is not a foundation problem you solve by hoping the middle holds. It usually doesn't.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes not from catastrophe but from running the numbers again and again and getting the same dispiriting answer. Platinum Chip sits 10th in the Fallout: New Vegas division and at the 30th percentile of the field, and the draft did not move those numbers in any meaningful direction: zero steals, five minor reaches, two major ones. The major reaches tell the story most clearly. Caleb Williams cost a pick nearly a full round early to land a QB6, which is fine production but not the kind of edge that reshapes a roster. Kimani Vidal was taken 3.2 rounds ahead of his ADP and projects as RB60, the sort of swing that needs to connect to justify the cost and almost certainly will not. The one genuine bright spot is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, a legitimate anchor. But Brian Thomas Jr., who might have been a secondary engine, carries real uncertainty after a 2025 interrupted by injury and a fraying connection with Trevor Lawrence. Gibbs alone cannot fix what ails this team, and there are no obvious levers left to pull.

Boomers drafted with the patience of a manager who had done the homework, collecting values up and down the board: Jeremiyah Love (RB13) fell a round and a half, Omarion Hampton (RB9) slid nearly a full round, and late-round finds like Jadarian Price (RB26) came two rounds past his ADP. Six values, one steal, barely a reach in sight. The problem is that patience and precision still produced a roster sitting ninth in the Fallout: New Vegas division and at the 45th percentile of the field, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether the market was right to discount these players in the first place. Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and Travis Kelce (TE10) anchor the lineup with genuine upside, but the projected starters thin out fast, and Jordan Addison (WR43) is holding down the weakest starting spot. Boomers did not outsmart the room. They got the prices they wanted and ended up with a roster that explains, somewhat uncomfortably, why those prices were available.

Happy Trails Caravaneer is a team that lives and dies in the margins, which is exactly why 2026 feels so hard to read. The core is real: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Nico Collins at WR9, and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give this roster a legitimate top end, and the draft value on Taylor, snagged past his ADP, is the kind of quiet win that separates competent managers from lucky ones. But the edges are where this gets complicated. Matthew Stafford was a significant reach, taken nearly a round and a half before his ADP warranted, and he projects as QB14 in a positionless format where weak quarterback play bleeds directly into the scoring floor. Then there is Oronde Gadsden, a projected TE16 starter who spent last season quietly building a case for himself, only to have the Chargers sign David Njoku in the offseason and muddy his role. None of this is catastrophic, none of it is comfortable. A 46th-percentile team with a 47-percent win rate last year does not need disaster to fall short; it just needs a few bad margins to go the wrong way.

Gary's 2026 campaign in the Fallout: New Vegas division looks less like a competitive roster and more like a slow leak nobody has gotten around to patching. The draft tells the story pretty efficiently: zero steals, two values, and two major reaches that anchor the whole operation. Reaching 1.2 rounds early for Justin Herbert, a QB8, and then doubling down by going 2.2 rounds early on C.J. Stroud, a QB22, means Gary spent real draft capital to acquire a position that doesn't even start in this format, and got middling results for the investment. The saving grace is a strong tight end group headlined by Brock Bowers at TE1, but Bowers is doing the heavy lifting while the rest of the projected starters grade out in the middle of the pack at best. Sitting eighth in the division and at just the 46th percentile of the field, there is no obvious lever left to pull, no late-round steal to point to, and no sleeper narrative to sell. This roster isn't broken, it just isn't good enough.

Texas Red w/the Big Iron finished 2025 at the 96th percentile in scoring, which means the bar this manager set for themselves is genuinely high, and a projected 49th percentile in 2026 is a real step back worth examining. The roster is built wide rather than deep at the top: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Drake London at WR7 give this team legitimate weapons, but Quentin Johnston sitting as the projected weakest starter at WR41 is exactly the kind of soft underbelly that costs points in close weeks. The draft board tells a similar middle-of-the-road story, 13 chalk picks against zero steals, with the one genuine win being Luther Burden falling a full round past his ADP to land here at WR22. The major reaches on Pat Bryant and Tory Horton are the gambles that define the ceiling and the floor: if either pays off, this team climbs the standings; if both miss, Johnston starts more than anyone would like. Sixth in the division is not a death sentence. It is a margin call, and this roster has just enough talent to make those margins interesting.

The Riften Shades finished this draft sitting at 52nd percentile and fifth in the Fallout: New Vegas division, which sounds modest until you look at what they actually built. Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Trey McBride at TE2 give this roster a genuine top-end foundation, and both arrived as values, Jefferson slipping more than a round past his ADP. That is where the story gets complicated, because the manager also burned a fifth-round pick on Baker Mayfield at QB18 and reached nearly six full rounds early to grab Darnell Washington at TE38. Those are aggressive calls, and the board would have raised an eyebrow. But Rashee Rice at WR13 is sitting right there in the projected lineup, and if Rice can actually get on the field, this team has real teeth. That is a significant if, given his knee procedure, his probation violation, and a history of availability issues that would test anyone's patience. The Riften Shades bet on upside over consensus throughout this draft. Whether that reads as conviction or wishful thinking probably depends entirely on how often Rice suits up.

The Burning Man didn't win the draft on one spectacular swing. They won it pick by pick, round by round, in the way that actually holds up over a long season. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster a genuine elite foundation, and the manager kept adding to it quietly, landing Josh Jacobs at RB16 roughly a round and a half after his market price and David Montgomery at RB23 a full three rounds after his. That is not luck, that is patience being rewarded. Tucker Kraft at TE5 anchors the tight end group and runs alongside the Jordan Love stack, which gives the manager two connected pieces to ride if Love heats up. Isaiah Likely, now moving to the Giants under John Harbaugh, slots in at TE13 with genuine upside in a light tight end room. The wide receiver group is the quietest part of this roster, but in a positionless format, a top-heavy backfield and two legitimate tight ends can carry you a long way. The 56th percentile projection feels about right, and a push into the top third of the field is absolutely within reach.

Courier Six didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it by consistently getting more than they paid for, and the numbers back that up. Zach Charbonnet fell nearly four rounds past his ADP before landing at 18.01, giving this roster a projected RB42 essentially for free at that cost. Javonte Williams, D'Andre Swift, and Chuba Hubbard all came in at least a round late relative to expectations, and Mark Andrews slid more than a round to fill out a tight end group that already includes Kyle Pitts at TE7. Pair that value accumulation with genuine upside at the top, where Drake Maye projects as a QB2 and Derrick Henry and Breece Hall both project as top-15 backs, and the roster has both floor and ceiling. Yes, reaching for Jayden Daniels at 2.01 when his ADP sat at 2.12 is the kind of move that raises an eyebrow, but it barely moves the needle against a draft that produced five players who fell well past their market price. Third in the division and in the 64th percentile overall, Courier Six looks positioned to climb.

The Atomic Wranglers didn't build this roster by swinging for the fences on one marquee move. They just kept winning the exchange, pick after pick. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a top-end foundation that most managers in the Fallout: New Vegas division can't match, and Colston Loveland at TE3 was taken as a value, not a luxury, falling past his ADP into the second round. Patrick Mahomes carries some uncertainty after his late-2025 knee injury, but the recovery reports have been consistently positive, and Brock Purdy at QB13 is a legitimate fallback rather than a panic option, especially stacked with Mike Evans at WR27. The draft chart shows thirteen picks at chalk, three values, and only one major reach, which is about as clean a process as this format allows. Sitting second in the division and in the 67th percentile of the field, the Wranglers aren't the loudest team in the room. They may end up being the most correct one.

The Kings sit first in the Fallout: New Vegas division and in the 99th percentile of the entire field, and looking at this draft, the placement makes complete sense. The foundation is spotless: Josh Allen at QB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 were both taken with value to spare, with Barkley sliding nearly a full round past his ADP before the Kings scooped him up. Then the draft really started cooking. Chase Brown, a projected RB11, fell more than two rounds before landing at pick 5.10, and Quinshon Judkins at RB22 slid a similar distance into the 9th round, both arriving as outright steals. What makes this roster so clean is the absence of any real mistakes: 14 chalk picks, 4 additional values, 2 steals, and not a single reach anywhere on the board. Harold Fannin and Jake Ferguson both project as starters at tight end, and Travis Etienne adds another starting-caliber piece taken well after his ADP. This is patient, disciplined drafting, and the standings are already reflecting it.
