GurleyAlly enters 2026 ranked last in the Mortal Kombat division and in just the 19th percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to inspire optimism about a turnaround. The foundation is real enough: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Jalen Hurts at QB9 give this roster a legitimate ceiling, and Breece Hall at RB14 keeps the top end respectable. But GurleyAlly spent capital recklessly on the way down the board, reaching over two rounds early for Rhamondre Stevenson, over three rounds for James Conner, and an almost comical five-plus rounds ahead of consensus for Tory Horton, a player the market had pegged as a late flier. Those picks compressed the roster's depth at exactly the moment a manager needs flexibility. The team is not without hope, the way most teams are not without hope in August, but hope is not a plan. With Daniel Jones projected as a QB25 sitting in the starting lineup and the draft burns already spent, GurleyAlly is betting on Chase and Hurts to carry weight that two players rarely survive carrying.

There is no polite way to say this: DopplerDot is sitting at the 22nd percentile heading into 2026, and the roster does not offer an obvious escape hatch. The foundation is there in spots, Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Joe Burrow at QB4 give this team a genuine ceiling, and the Burrow-Tee Higgins stack adds a nice correlation bonus on big weeks. But the floor is alarmingly low. The projected starters beyond that top cluster thin out quickly, with Josh Downs projected as the WR46 anchoring the weakest starting slot. The draft did not help matters much either. Two major reaches, Germie Bernard at WR79 and Malachi Fields at WR90, consumed mid-to-late capital on players projected well outside the fantasy conversation, while the one true steal, Cam Ward at QB23, lands as a distant third option at a position where DopplerDot already has Burrow and Dak Prescott. That is not depth-building, that is draft capital disappearing into a fog. Division rank of 11 says the rest of Mortal Kombat already sees the problem clearly.

The Tulsa Superguys enter 2026 sitting 10th in the Mortal Kombat division and in just the 26th percentile of the field, and nothing about this roster suggests a dramatic reversal is coming. The receiver group is genuinely strong, with Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and CeeDee Lamb (WR5) forming as good a top-two as anyone could ask for, but that ceiling gets undercut badly by the quarterback situation. C.J. Stroud projects as QB22, and the manager actually reached more than two rounds early to get him, burning draft capital on a player who grades out as one of the weakest projected starters in the tournament. Meanwhile, the supporting quarterbacks, Malik Willis and Jacoby Brissett, clock in at QB24 and QB28, meaning there is no cavalry waiting. Even the tight end depth has a quiet rain cloud over it: Oronde Gadsden showed real receiving ability last season, but the Chargers signing David Njoku this

offseason dims his outlook. When your most critical position has no viable path upward, all those pretty receiver ranks are just decoration on a sinking ship.

TonyLeding enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Mortal Kombat division and at just the 32nd percentile of the field, and the roster offers little reason for optimism. The foundation looks promising on paper: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this team genuine top-end talent, and Malik Nabers at WR12 adds a credible third pillar. But the draft process suggests a manager who kept reaching rather than letting value come to him, logging five minor reaches and a major one in Jaylen Wright, taken more than six rounds ahead of his ADP only to grade out as RB68. That kind of draft inefficiency rarely announces itself loudly, but it quietly poisons a roster, and here it shows up in the margins where titles are won. The quarterback situation compounds the concern: Jaxson Dart at QB11 is the clear starter, but this is a positionless format and QB11 is simply not an asset that pulls weight. Last year's 76th-percentile scoring finish feels distant from where this roster is projected to land now.

Cityzen drafted with genuine patience, posting twelve chalk picks and three values against zero major reaches, and the process was mostly sound. The cruelest evidence of that soundness is the destination it reached. Jonathan Taylor at RB4, De'Von Achane at RB6, Derrick Henry at RB12, and Brock Purdy scooped as a major value at 7.11 when his ADP sat at 5.09, these are the kinds of picks that belong in a highlight reel. And yet Cityzen sits 8th in the Mortal Kombat division and at just the 46th percentile of the field. The Mike Evans situation captures something essential about why: Evans arrives in San Francisco after injuries held him to eight games in 2025, breaking an eleven-year streak of 1,000-yard seasons, and his WR27 projection now asks this roster to trust a player whose last campaign was mostly a medical log. Taylor and Achane are real. Purdy was a bargain. But the floor beneath those wins kept giving way, and no amount of draft discipline could paper over what the projections are saying.

Zero RB Student Driver sits at exactly the 50th percentile, which sounds like a consolation prize until you realize that in a field this competitive, the middle is where seasons actually get decided. The foundation is legitimate: Josh Allen at QB1 is the kind of asset that makes a roster quietly dangerous, and the Allen/D.J. Moore stack gives this team a ceiling that most 50th-percentile rosters cannot claim. George Pickens at WR10, Ladd McConkey at WR20, and Terry McLaurin at WR24 round out a starting group that can hang with anyone on a good week. The margins, though, cut both ways. Jayden Reed projects as the weakest projected starter at WR48, meaning this team is one injury away from leaning on Khalil Shakir or Rashid Shaheed in meaningful spots. The draft offered no steals and no values, just 18 chalk picks and a major reach on Dontayvion Wicks taken more than four rounds early. Nothing broke wrong, nothing broke right. When the difference between advancing and going home is one Reed performance in October, chalk does not buy you insurance.

GET OVER HERE!!! did not win their draft in one splashy moment, they won it in the margins, round after round, and the ledger shows it. The clearest example is the quarterback room: Justin Herbert landed at pick 5.08 despite an ADP of 3.09, Jared Goff fell more than two full rounds to 8.05, and Tyler Shough materialized at 11.08 when the market had him priced nearly three rounds earlier. None of those picks required genius, just patience while other managers moved on. The rest of the roster reflects the same discipline: Trey McBride at TE2 and George Kittle at TE9 give this team a starter-quality answer at that position on almost any given week, and Saquon Barkley anchors a backfield group that runs four projected starters deep. The weakest projected starter on the board is KC Concepcion at WR50, which is a genuine soft spot, but a team sitting 58th percentile in the field with that kind of foundational depth has more room to breathe than that rank suggests.

Grimsellers didn't land here by accident. The defining move was letting Caleb Williams, a QB6, fall all the way to pick 4.10 when his ADP sat at 3.06, then circling back in round eight to scoop Bo Nix at QB15 while the board dozed through a gap of nearly three rounds past his expected price. That's not luck, that's a manager reading the room and cashing in twice at the same position. The foundation underneath those quarterbacks is legitimately good: Brock Bowers at TE1, Tyler Warren at TE4, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 form a top-end group that most managers would trade a pick to access, and the backfield core of Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and Javonte Williams at RB17 gives grimsellers a reliable floor to build from. The WR group projects weak and Jordan Mason slots in as the projected weakest starter at RB41, so this isn't a perfect roster. But sitting at the 58th percentile with a 2025 that finished 34th in scoring, the arrow is pointing up, and this draft looks like the reason why.

Raiden the Red Zone didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick, they won it by consistently being in the right place. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 came off the board at 1.10 while his ADP sat at 1.06, a modest slip that still handed this team a borderline elite receiver near the top. The running back group is where the quiet competence really accumulates: Chase Brown (RB11), Kyren Williams (RB15), and Josh Jacobs (RB16) are all projected starters, and even if the Jacobs situation, an unresolved legal matter that has already clouded his fantasy value heading into the season, forces a pivot, the depth behind him barely flinches. Sam Darnold fell more than a round past his ADP, landing the team a QB21 projection at a discount. None of these moves individually screams genius, but the cumulative effect is a starting lineup that projects well above average, good enough to explain a 63rd percentile tournament standing and real expectations of building on a 78th percentile scoring finish in 2025.

Bicycle Kick Brigade didn't need a miracle pick to build something worth respecting in the Mortal Kombat division, just a draft that kept winning small. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and James Cook at RB5 anchor a backfield that would make most managers envious, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 quietly adds another projected starter who wins his matchup more nights than not. What makes this roster interesting isn't one splashy move but the accumulation of sensible decisions: Zach Charbonnet and Brian Robinson both fell more than two rounds past their ADPs, arriving as late-round values that deepen an already capable group. The minor reach on Patrick Mahomes at QB12 is the one place the team paid a slight premium, but landing Jayden Daniels at QB5 as a projected starter softens that entirely. Michael Pittman at WR44 projects as the weakest starter, and a 63rd percentile tournament ranking reflects a team with a real ceiling that hasn't quite punched through it yet. The floor here is legitimate, and in the Scott Fish Bowl, that matters.

The Frozen Tundra didn't win the draft on one big swing. They won it on accumulation. Drake Maye at QB2 slipping to pick 2.12 when his ADP sat at 2.02 is the kind of quiet win that doesn't make highlight reels but absolutely shows up in the standings, and pairing him with Puka Nacua, the WR1 in the field, as a confirmed stack gives this roster a ceiling that most managers would trade their entire bench to access. Then there's Kyler Murray, a projected QB19 who fell nearly two and a half rounds past his ADP before the Frozen Tundra scooped him up in the tenth. That's not luck, that's a manager paying attention. The receiver group around those quarterbacks is deep and legitimately ranked, with Emeka Egbuka at WR18 and Jameson Williams at WR21 both projected starters alongside Nacua. The Dalton Schultz reach at nine rounds before his ADP is the one move worth second-guessing, but when your floor is this high, one questionable pick is a footnote, not a flaw. Second in the Mortal Kombat division and sitting at the 76th percentile feels about right, maybe even modest.

FoolofaNoobSaibot did not build this roster by swinging for the fences and hoping. They built it by quietly coming out ahead, pick after pick, until the cumulative advantage became impossible to ignore. The receiver group is the clearest evidence: Drake London at WR7, A.J. Brown at WR8, and Rashee Rice at WR13 are all projected starters, and the manager landed all three without consistently overpaying for any of them. Jordan Love is the tidiest single example of the approach, a QB17 projection taken at pick 10.08 when his ADP sat at 7.06, meaning three full rounds of patience turned into a starter-caliber quarterback at a discount. Thirteen chalk picks tell you this team was not built on luck or heroic late-round scores, just a draft that kept finding the right side of the ledger. Division-leading standing, 77th percentile tournament-wide, and a 2025 season that went 28-8 with scoring in the 81st percentile, this is a franchise that has figured out how to not beat itself.
