There is no gentle way to say this about dgillis100: sitting dead last in the Man division and in the 4th percentile of the entire field, this roster is in genuine trouble, and the draft decisions that built it offer little comfort. The headlining problem is at quarterback, where Jayden Daniels was taken at pick 2.01, nearly a full round ahead of his ADP, making him the most expensive asset on a team that can least afford to overpay. Daniels projects as QB5, which is a fine outcome, but spending that capital at pick 2 in a positionless format means something valuable was left on the table elsewhere. The rest of the roster has real pieces, James Cook at RB5 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 give dgillis100 a legitimate foundation, but the projected starters thin out quickly, bottoming out with Wan'Dale Robinson as the weakest projected starter at WR47. When your floor is Robinson and your draft capital was spent chasing upside that projected averages won't fully deliver, the math on a deep run simply does not work.

Last year, Trevillionaire scored in the 98th percentile and went 27-9, which is the kind of season that makes a manager believe they've figured something out. They have not figured out 2026. The team now sits 10th in the division and projects to the 10th percentile of the field, a collapse so complete it reads less like regression and more like a different franchise wearing the same jersey. The core problem is that the draft leaned hard on reputation over value: Matthew Stafford cost a pick two full rounds before his QB14 projection warranted, and Kyle Pitts was taken 2.1 rounds early for a TE7 finish that sounds fine until you remember Brock Bowers is TE1 and was presumably available later. Speaking of Bowers, he is genuinely excellent, and the receiver group around A.J. Brown has real pieces, but the surrounding roster is thin enough on proven contributors that the margin for error is nearly gone. The 2025 trophy stays on the shelf. The 2026 projection is a warning.

There is no charitable read on davissmith11's 2026 campaign, and the draft sheet does not ask for one. The top of the roster has real bones, Justin Jefferson at WR6 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a legitimate foundation, but the draft decisions surrounding them are genuinely hard to defend. davissmith11 burned a sixth-round pick on Juwan Johnson, a TE20 projection whose average draft position sits in round 11, a nearly five-round overpayment for a player who still projects as the weakest starter on the roster. Then, as if one lesson were not enough, the same pattern repeated in the late rounds with Chimere Dike, Ja'Kobi Lane, and Elijah Sarratt each taken roughly four rounds ahead of their ADP, turning the back end of the draft into a monument to misplaced conviction. The team finished zero steals and zero values against four major reaches, which is not bad luck, that is a system. Sitting 11th in the division and in the bottom 10 percent of the field, davissmith11 drafted like a manager who confused urgency with instinct, and the standings will likely confirm the difference.

BrittFlinn arrives in the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting ninth in the Man division and in just the 24th tournament percentile, and the roster grades out as a team that is already playing with a short hand. The foundation is real: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as the overall RB1, and Luther Burden is one of the most electric upside plays in the field, a receiver who averaged a 53 percent snap share over the final eight weeks of 2025 and now has Ben Johnson comparing him to Amon-Ra St. Brown heading into camp. That is a genuine one-two punch. The problem is that everything behind that pair gets thin fast, and the draft did not help matters. Two major reaches, including Isaac TeSlaa at WR68 taken more than five rounds ahead of consensus, suggest a manager who was already panicking to find answers and did not find them. With Romeo Doubs projecting as the WR53 and the weakest projected starter on the roster, BrittFlinn is left hoping Burden lives up to every syllable of his hype, because there is no backup plan if he does not.

CHEV enters 2026 sitting at the 25th percentile of the field, and the draft log does not offer much comfort. The most glaring issue is a pattern of aggressive, early spending on players who did not demand it: Derrick Henry at RB12 was taken 1.6 rounds ahead of his ADP, Jameson Williams at WR21 came off the board 1.5 rounds early, and Jalen Coker, projected as a WR55, was reached for 2.2 rounds before the market would have delivered him. That is three significant rounds of surplus value surrendered across three picks, capital that could have fortified the back end of a roster that now bottoms out at Coker as the projected weakest starter. Jaxson Dart at QB11 is the one genuine steal, arriving 2.1 rounds late, and Christian McCaffrey at RB3 gives this team a legitimate anchor. But a star at the top and a bargain quarterback cannot paper over a roster grading out near divisional bottom, and at this point there is no obvious lever left to pull.

Withsports17 sits at 48th percentile, 7th in the Man division, and that is exactly what the roster looks like up close: good enough to beat anyone on a given week, not quite good enough to scare the division's best into game-planning. The foundation is genuinely strong, Trey McBride at TE2 and Joe Burrow at QB4 give this team a ceiling most managers in the field would envy, and the Patrick Mahomes and Rashee Rice stack adds a high-variance weekly upside that can swing a matchup in a hurry. The problem is that five major reaches in one draft introduce a lot of dead weight into the back half of the roster, and when your projected weakest starter is Tony Pollard at RB30, the margin for error tightens fast. McBride was a legitimate steal, sliding nearly a full round past his ADP, and Rice came at a discount too. This roster can absolutely go on a run. It can also lose three straight to teams it should beat. The margins decide everything.

jjonesey16 came out of this draft looking like someone who ignored the board and trusted their eyes, and the frustrating part is it seems to have worked. The reach on Malik Nabers at WR12 stands out immediately, taken more than a round before anyone else was willing to move, and the finished product is a receiver room that also includes Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, George Pickens at WR10, and Tee Higgins at WR19 as projected starters. That is not lucky construction, that is conviction paying off in the most visible way possible. The 2025 résumé backs the confidence too, a 93rd-percentile scoring season suggests this manager knows how to translate a roster into points. The real question hanging over 2026 is whether the formula holds at WR97 Tyquan Thornton, a three-round reach in the late rounds who adds upside but also exposes how far jjonesey16 is willing to go on a hunch. At 62nd percentile and sixth in the division, this team is not a lock, but the core is good enough that optimism is not misplaced.

Mdmoney13 didn't swing for the fences and whiff, and didn't play it so safe the roster has no upside either. This is a team that just kept winning exchanges. Christian Watson came off the board 1.4 rounds after his ADP, and Deebo Samuel slid a similar distance into the late rounds, and those are exactly the kinds of quiet wins that separate good drafts from forgettable ones. The foundation is genuinely impressive: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 give the team a pair of top-shelf starters, and the tight end group is almost unfair, with Tyler Warren (TE4), Sam LaPorta (TE8), and Travis Kelce (TE10) all projected to start. Brenton Strange rounds out that group at TE17, and while the Jaguars drafted a new tight end this offseason, Strange remains the more likely receiving option there, so he holds real value. Zero major reaches across the entire draft, three values, and top-shelf talent at the positions that matter. Mdmoney13 sits fifth in the Man division and in the 67th percentile of the field, but this roster has the ceiling to climb.

Last year, jhughes711 finished in the 3rd percentile in scoring, a number so bleak it barely registers as participation. The 2026 roster reads like a direct response to that misery. Ashton Jeanty at RB7, Breece Hall at RB14, and Quinshon Judkins at RB22 form a backfield core that should produce consistently, and Judkins arriving two full rounds past his ADP is the kind of quiet win that separates good drafts from great ones. Caleb Williams at QB6 anchors the passing game, and his connection with Colston Loveland, a TE3 projection snagged more than a round late, gives this team a genuine stack that can carry weeks on its own. The one legitimate variable is Josh Jacobs, a RB16 projection currently clouded by an unresolved off-field situation, and how that plays out will shape just how much firepower this team can deploy. A 78th percentile projection and a fourth-place divisional standing suggest the rebound is already well underway. Wherever jhughes711 lands, it will not look anything like 2025.

DanielLea didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. The board just kept coming up short and DanielLea kept cashing in. The clearest example is Drake Maye, a QB2 projection snagged nearly a full round after the market said he'd be gone, a quietly enormous win that sets the floor for this entire roster. Meanwhile, the running back group is the engine here: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 are both projected starters, and RJ Harvey at RB28 rounds out a backfield tier that most managers in the field would envy. Terry McLaurin, a projected WR24 starter, arrived more than a round late as well, adding yet another data point to the same pattern. The draft chart shows 1 steal, 3 values, and 11 chalk picks against only 2 major reaches, which is about as clean a ledger as you'll find. DanielLea landed in the 84th percentile of the tournament and third in the division, and the draft record explains exactly why neither number feels like a surprise.

ScottSmith did not win the draft with one flashy move. He won it by staying ahead of the room, round after round. Jalen Hurts falling nearly a full round and a half past his ADP at 5.02 was exactly the kind of quiet heist that separates a good draft from a great one, and ScottSmith found that same edge again when Bucky Irving slipped almost two rounds to 9.02. Pile in Puka Nacua at WR1, Nico Collins at WR9, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 anchoring the top of the roster, and you have a team built on depth of quality rather than a single star propping everything up. The Xavier Worthy reach at WR49, taken 2.3 rounds early, is a real cost and worth noting, but it is a minor bruise on an otherwise clean draft sheet. ScottSmith enters 2026 sitting second in the Man division and in the 85th percentile of the field, and neither number feels like a surprise.

gregthawk sits atop the Man division and at the 100th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The headliner is Josh Allen, a QB1 snagged at 2.08 when his average draft position sat at 1.05, a full round of free value before anyone else flinched. Lamar Jackson came right behind at 3.05, another round of savings on a QB3, and together they form the kind of quarterback room that wins championships before Week 1 kicks off. The receiver corps is where this team really hums, though: Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3, DeVonta Smith as WR14, and Zay Flowers as WR16, with a Jackson-Flowers stack layered on top for ceiling-chasing upside. The weakest projected starter is Jayden Reed at WR48, which tells you everything about the floor here. This was a disciplined draft in every measurable way: one steal, three values, sixteen chalk, zero reaches. Clean process, elite result.
