Spleen Acres sits at 7th percentile in the tournament, and nothing about this roster suggests the tide is about to turn. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, anchored by Justin Jefferson (WR6), Nico Collins (WR9), Rashee Rice (WR13), and DeVonta Smith (WR14) all projecting as starters, but that firepower gets quietly strangled by what surrounds it. The quarterback situation is grim: Bo Nix (QB15) and C.J. Stroud (QB22) offer some upside, but the manager paid a steep price to get there, reaching 2.1 rounds early on Stroud at pick 7.07. That kind of currency spent early is currency that couldn't go elsewhere, and elsewhere needed it badly. With Juwan Johnson (TE20) projecting as the weakest starter on the roster and Demond Claiborne (RB63) as the lone backfield option, Spleen Acres looks like a team that drafted its ceiling in the first two rounds and then ran out of road. Bottom of the division, 12th place projected, and not a lot of imagination left about how this one turns around.

Patrick McDermott had himself a 2025, posting a 79% win rate and finishing in the 77th percentile of scoring, which makes what happened in the draft room this spring all the more puzzling. The foundation is real: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, George Pickens at WR10, and Malik Nabers at WR12 give McDermott a genuinely elite top end, and when those three are cooking, the lineup can compete with anyone in the Frogger division. But that's where the good news stops. The quarterback situation is grim, headlined by Sam Darnold at QB21, a player McDermott reached for two full rounds ahead of his ADP in Round 7, mortgaging draft capital to secure a liability. With zero steals and two major reaches across the board, the draft offered almost nothing to compensate for the roster's thin margins elsewhere. Sitting 11th in the division and in just the 12th percentile of the field, McDermott is in the uncomfortable position of owning a spectacular ceiling and a basement floor, with no obvious lever left to close the gap between them.

David Pierce's draft reads like a fever dream of misplaced confidence, and the standings are already prepared to punish him for it. The headliner is fine, Josh Allen at QB1 lands comfortably enough, but from there the board tells a story of a manager who simply could not wait. Kyren Williams, projected RB15, got pulled two full rounds ahead of his ADP, and Chigoziem Okonkwo, a TE19, cost a third-round premium that the team will feel all season. Then there is Skyler Bell, hauled in nearly nine rounds early to land at WR103, a number that does not suggest hidden upside so much as wishful thinking with a pick attached. Pierce finished with zero steals, four major reaches, and a receiver corps anchored by Matthew Golden as the projected weakest starter at WR52. The Jordan Love and Tucker Kraft stack is a reasonable consolation, but a stack does not fix a foundation. The Frogger division has Pierce sitting tenth, projecting out at just the 13th percentile of the field, and nothing on this roster suggests that math is wrong.

Carla Gruse did almost everything right on draft day, and the standings are going to punish her for it anyway. She found four genuine values, grabbing Michael Pittman at WR44 nearly two rounds after his ADP and Khalil Shakir at WR51 a full two rounds late, the kind of patient discipline most managers never manage. The problem is that discipline bought her a roster that projects 15th percentile in the field, sitting ninth in the Frogger division, because patience only pays when the players cash. Gruse's projected starters include Joe Burrow at QB4 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5, genuine top-shelf pieces, but the floor drops sharply and Jadarian Price at RB26 profiles as her weakest projected starter, a player she reached nearly two rounds early, which makes him both a mistake and the fulcrum the whole construction rests on. Coming off a 2025 season in which she finished seventh percentile in scoring, Gruse needed the value game to produce upside. She played it correctly and got chalk in return.

Aaron Van Buskirk's 2026 roster is the fantasy equivalent of a steady 7-iron: not the club anyone brags about, but dangerous when struck cleanly. The foundation is real. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 gives this team a weekly ceiling anchor, and Chase Brown at RB11 keeps the floor from caving in on a bad week. The trouble is that everything below that top tier lives in the margins, and margins are exactly where Van Buskirk's season gets decided. Drake London projects at WR7 and carries genuine upside, but the supporting cast thins out fast, with Romeo Doubs at WR53 representing the kind of depth that wins close weeks and loses close weeks in equal measure. The draft was almost entirely chalk, 15 of 18 picks landing right on ADP, which reads less as discipline and more as a missed chance to build an edge. Coming off a 14th-percentile scoring year, Van Buskirk needs those marginal pieces to outperform their projections. In the Frogger Division, sitting 7th, there is no margin left to waste.

Zack Shindledecker lands at 8th in the Frogger Division and sits right at the 47th percentile, which is the fantasy equivalent of showing up to a knife fight with a decent knife and a broken wrist. The roster's core is legitimately strong, Kenneth Walker III (RB10), Derrick Henry (RB12), Travis Etienne (RB18), and Trey McBride (TE2) give Zack genuine weekly upside, but the draft decisions that built around that core are what doom him. Four major reaches in a single draft is a quiet catastrophe, and the most damaging two are at quarterback, where Zack burned real capital on Jacoby Brissett (QB28) three rounds early and then doubled down on Shedeur Sanders (QB32) nearly four rounds ahead of consensus. Patrick Mahomes (QB12) is on the roster but is not a projected starter, meaning Zack's actual QB situation grades out as genuinely weak. When your skill-position foundation is this solid and your record still projects near the bottom of the division, the problem isn't bad luck. It's the draft, and there's no fixing that now.

Peter Harriott built something genuinely good here, and the draft log makes it look more chaotic than the roster actually is. Three major reaches across the draft should leave a manager apologizing to the room, but the evidence keeps getting in the way. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, De'Von Achane at RB6, and Harold Fannin at TE6 give this team a core that most managers in the field would take right now, no questions asked. Yes, Harriott burned a round and a half on Daniel Jones at QB25 when he could have waited, and late-round love for Rashod Bateman and Dontayvion Wicks suggests a manager who trusts his own board more than the consensus. That confidence either looks prescient by October or embarrassing by November. What keeps this preview optimistic is that the foundation does not require those bets to pay off. St. Brown, Achane, and Fannin are not reach-dependent upside plays, they are the kind of players who just produce, which means Harriott's gambles get to ride alongside a lineup that does not need saving.

Kyle Smith sits at 63rd percentile in the field and fifth in the Frogger division, numbers that look modest until you examine how this roster was actually assembled. Smith reached on four players the board flagged as minor reaches and three more it flagged as major, yet the results are hard to argue with: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Colston Loveland at TE3, and a receiving corps that projects as legitimately strong. The clearest case study is Smith-Njigba, taken at 1.02 when consensus had him sliding to 1.06, a reach the average drafter flinches at and Smith did not. The Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack adds a bonus layer, pairing a QB5 with a WR24 who fell a full round past his ADP, meaning Smith reached in some spots and caught genuine value in others. Whether the conviction was always earned or sometimes just fortunate is a fair question, but the roster sitting in front of you does not particularly care how it got built.

Jennifer Eakins did not manufacture this roster with one flashy gamble. She just kept coming out ahead, round after round. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give her a pair of projected starters that most managers would kill to field one of, and she has both. The draft tendencies reinforce the same story: Ladd McConkey fell 1.2 rounds past his ADP before Eakins grabbed him at WR20, Jake Ferguson slid 1.6 rounds before she took him at TE12, and Blake Corum dropped a similar gap before landing at RB35. None of those moves look like genius in isolation, but added together they represent a draft that consistently collected value rather than chasing it. The Herbert-McConkey stack gives her a built-in upside lever on big passing weeks. The floor is real too, with five projected starters ranking in the top 25 at their respective positions. After a 32nd-percentile finish in 2025, Eakins arrives in the Frogger Division at 71st percentile and has the receipts to back it up.

Evan Ashley's 2026 campaign looks like the product of a manager who did the boring thing correctly, over and over again. The centerpiece is a receiver room that is genuinely difficult to argue with: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, A.J. Brown sits at WR8, Tee Higgins at WR19, and Mike Evans at WR27, all projected starters, all accumulated without a single dramatic reach. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 anchors the backfield and gives the roster a credible floor no matter how the rest of the lineup shakes out. The draft tendencies reinforce the story: three values, fourteen chalk picks, and only a handful of reaches scattered across eighteen rounds. The one notable splurge, Carson Beck at QB40, arrived in the final round and costs almost nothing in opportunity. Ashley finished at the 81st percentile in scoring in 2025 and now sits third in the Frogger division at the 87th tournament percentile. That is what disciplined drafting looks like when it compounds.

Stephen Courtney spent 2025 marooned at the 14th percentile, and the 2026 version of this roster reads like a man who took notes. The foundation is genuinely elite: Brock Bowers (TE1) and Tyler Warren (TE4) give Courtney two of the four best tight ends in the field, and Drake Maye (QB2) sits behind only one quarterback in the tournament. That trio alone would have been unthinkable on last year's disaster of a squad. The draft discipline reinforces the case for a rebound: Warren came at pick 4.04 despite an ADP a full round earlier, and Harvey slid past his number as well, both rewarding patience rather than panic. The one blemish worth noting is Kyle Monangai (RB33), taken nearly two and a half rounds ahead of consensus, a reach that could haunt Courtney if the projection doesn't hold. But one aggressive misfire is a footnote on an otherwise ascending roster. Division rank second, tournament percentile 90th, and a manager who clearly has something to prove. The redemption arc is built.

Eric Dickens did not win the Scott Fish Bowl draft with one thunderous swing. He won it pick by pick, quietly coming out ahead so many times that the advantages stacked into something formidable. Lamar Jackson at QB3 slid half a round past his ADP. Dak Prescott fell more than a round. Travis Kelce dropped a round and a third before Dickens plucked him at TE10. Jordyn Tyson, projected at WR34, came nearly a round late. Six values across the roster, zero steals, which actually tells you something more interesting: this was not a lucky draft, it was a disciplined one, the kind where preparation meets a room full of managers who blinked. Anchoring the whole thing is a backfield headlined by Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8, though Barkley's situation carries real uncertainty as he turns 29 with Philly reportedly looking to manage his workload after a 2025 regression. Dickens still sits first in the Frogger division and in the 95th percentile of the field. That is not an accident.
