There is no sugarcoating what BenjaminSolak is walking into here. The team sits 12th in the Garrus Vakarian division and in just the 21st percentile of the field, and nothing about the roster construction suggests a correction is coming. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, anchored by Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Drake London at WR7, with Tee Higgins, Luther Burden, Jaylen Waddle, and Brian Thomas Jr. all projecting as starters behind them. That is real. The problem is that the depth underneath those receivers falls off a cliff, and the rest of the roster compounds it: Rhamondre Stevenson grades out as the weakest projected starter at RB31, and the lone tight end is Terrance Ferguson at TE28. Mahomes keeps the floor from caving in entirely, but when four of Solak's draft picks landed before their ADP and two of those qualify as major reaches, Mike Washington Jr. and Elijah Sarratt among them, it signals a team that bought premium and ran out of answers before the draft ended. Coming off an 8-28 record in 2025, this is a roster that needed a dramatic offseason. It did not get one.

Egcowboy has made a bet, and the terms are not subtle. The entire architecture here runs through Dallas, with Dak Prescott stacked to both George Pickens at WR10 and Jake Ferguson at TE12, meaning when Prescott has a big day, this roster is designed to feel it twice. That is a high-wire act dressed up as a strategy, and at 22nd percentile and 11th in the Garrus Vakarian division, the current projections suggest the wire is already swaying. The supporting cast does not inspire much confidence either. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is a genuine anchor, but Blake Corum at RB35 is the projected weakest starter on the roster, and the depth beyond the Dallas stack thins out quickly into names like Tre Tucker at WR65 and Tory Horton at WR93. Egcowboy did not just lean into correlation, they staked the whole enterprise on it. If Prescott, Pickens, and Ferguson all have their weeks at the same time, this team can hurt someone. If they do not, there is not much underneath to catch the fall.

JBS513 sits 10th in the Garrus Vakarian division and at the 32nd percentile of the field, and the draft log explains exactly why. The headline number is five major reaches across the roster, a figure that suggests not bad luck but bad process. The most damaging of those reaches is Mason Taylor at TE35, taken 6.6 rounds ahead of his average draft position, an asset ranked outside the top 30 at his position collected as though the market had it wrong. Hunter Henry at TE18 went nearly four rounds early for similar production upside, meaning JBS513 spent serious draft capital chasing a position tier that simply does not justify the price. Those reaches crowded out any room for error elsewhere, and there was no room to spare: the team produced zero steals and just two values across the entire draft, one of which was De'Von Achane sliding to a spot JBS513 merely needed to not panic at. Puka Nacua at WR1 is a legitimate anchor, but one bright spot does not rehabilitate a draft philosophy that consistently paid tomorrow's prices for today's doubts.

dsands7 drafted with patience, finding Stefon Diggs nearly two rounds past his ADP, Jauan Jennings almost two rounds late, and Tank Dell a round and a half after his market. On paper, that is how you build a winner. In practice, it produced a team sitting ninth in the Garrus Vakarian division and in the 32nd percentile of the field, which is the part nobody puts in the draft recap. The backfield anchors are genuinely impressive: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, James Cook at RB5, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 form the kind of top-end foundation most managers would envy. But the rest of the roster never catches up to that ceiling. DeVonta Smith at WR14 is a capable projected starter, yet the receiver group fades quickly toward Jayden Reed at WR48 as the projected weakest starter, and Max Klare at tight end is unranked entirely. dsands7 played the draft correctly, bought value, avoided catastrophe, and assembled a team that still projects to lose more often than not. Discipline without firepower is just a tidy loss.

Kitnw22 sits eighth in the Garrus Vakarian division and checks in at just the 44th percentile of the field, and the roster does not exactly inspire confidence that those numbers are about to improve. The foundation is genuinely appealing: Josh Allen at QB1, A.J. Brown at WR8, and Colston Loveland at TE3 give this team a legitimate top-end core that many managers would envy. The problem is that everything below that tier starts dropping off in a hurry, and the draft did not do much to change the math. Fourteen chalk picks and three minor reaches suggest a manager who was mostly reactive rather than opportunistic, and spending five full rounds of draft capital early on Emanuel Wilson, a projected RB69, is the kind of bet that needs to hit on a long shot to justify itself. Wan'Dale Robinson, the projected weakest starter at WR47, is the player this roster is leaning on to bridge the gap between the stars and the depth, and that is a bridge that looks shakier by the week. Allen and Brown can carry a bad week but they cannot carry a season.

JoshBendyk is the team that wins 55 percent of its games and makes you wonder how it keeps doing it. The floor here is real: Trey McBride at TE2 and Joe Burrow at QB4 are the kind of projected starters that quietly carry a roster through the weeks when everything else is average, and last season's 88th-percentile scoring output suggests this manager knows how to deploy what he has. The ceiling, though, is where the margins tighten. Emeka Egbuka at WR18 is a fine receiver, but Quentin Johnston at WR41 and Khalil Shakir at WR51 are the kinds of names that show up in box scores without dominating them. Derrick Henry at RB12 anchors the backfield, and Javonte Williams at RB17 was a genuine late value, taken more than a round after his ADP. That kind of drafting patience keeps a roster competitive. But in the Garrus Vakarian division, sitting seventh means the margins are not going to be kind. This team does not scare anyone. It also does not lose easily. That tension is the whole season.

tjackson706 sits at the 52nd percentile, division rank six, the kind of roster that wins the weeks it should and loses the ones it shouldn't, never quite doing either convincingly enough to matter. The margins here are real. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 give this team a legitimate ceiling, and the Jordan Love / Tucker Kraft stack adds a weekly bonus that compounds quietly over a long season. But draft decisions cut both ways. David Montgomery sliding to RB23 and Tucker Kraft to TE5 were genuine finds, capital recouped through patience. Sean Tucker reached 3.7 rounds early and Zachariah Branch 2.9 rounds early, picks that bet on upside that almost certainly will not arrive at the volume those slots demand. When your weakest projected starter is Jordan Addison at WR43, you are not built to survive many weeks where Taylor or Jackson underperforms. tjackson706 has the pieces to finish well above sixth. Whether the draft mistakes come due before the playoffs is the only question that actually matters.

BoMcBigTime didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by being right, over and over, in the spots where most managers settle. Drake Maye landing at QB2 while slipping nearly a full round past his ADP is the clearest example: a top-tier quarterback acquired at a discount, the kind of transaction that quietly tilts a roster's ceiling upward before the season even begins. Harold Fannin, Kyle Pitts, and Mark Andrews project as TE6, TE7, and TE14 respectively, meaning BoMcBigTime holds genuine starter-caliber options at a position where most of the field is hoping one guy works out. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the receiving group and needs no further explanation. The concern, if you're looking for one, is that the reach for Chigoziem Okonkwo at TE19 cost two-plus rounds of draft capital, and Okonkwo projects as the weakest starter on the board. A 57th-percentile tournament ranking says the field sees a good team here, not a great one. That gap might be exactly what the season decides.

Just Some Calibrations didn't try to be clever. They just kept winning the pick. The backbone of this roster is a backfield group that reads like a draft class highlight reel, anchored by Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10, with Kyren Williams (RB15) and Josh Jacobs (RB16) right behind them. The manager didn't stumble into that depth either. Williams came off the board a round and a half late, and Bhayshul Tuten, projected RB25, slid a full two rounds past his ADP before this team scooped him up in the tenth round. The Tuten situation is genuinely interesting: Travis Etienne is gone to New Orleans, the Jacksonville backfield is unsettled, and the athletic profile is real. That kind of upside acquired at a discount is exactly the thread that runs through this entire roster. Five values against one major reach is not luck, it is a manager who knew what things were worth. Sitting at 61st percentile and fourth in the Garrus Vakarian division, this team is closer to the top than the bottom, and the draft got them there the unglamorous way.

Dutts13 landed in the 68th percentile of the field and sits third in the Garrus Vakarian division, and the draft record explains exactly why: seven values, one minor reach, zero major reaches. That is not luck, that is process. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Nico Collins at WR9 give this roster a top-end foundation most managers would trade a round pick for, and the value haul reinforces it at every layer. Travis Hunter came off the board at 16.08 against an ADP of 14.05, a two-round gift. Rashee Rice arrived at WR13 more than a round early. Jalen Hurts, projected QB9, fell nearly a full round past his ADP and arrives paired with Dallas Goedert in a stack that adds a connector between two of the lineup's best assets. The one blemish is Tetairoa McMillan taken just under a round early, but a WR15 projection makes that critique almost embarrassing to type. Dutts13 did not get lucky. Dutts13 did the work, and the roster reflects it.

UncleWayne's draft reads like a poker player who just kept winning small pots until suddenly they had all the chips. There was no moonshot pick, no moment where the room gasped, just a consistent pattern of coming out ahead. The headliner is Caleb Williams, a projected QB6 taken at pick 5.07 when his ADP sat a full two rounds earlier at 3.06, the kind of slide that makes you wonder what the rest of the room was thinking. Pair that with a starting corps anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Ashton Jeanty (RB7), and Omarion Hampton (RB9), and UncleWayne was already building something before the draft even got interesting. Sam LaPorta (TE8) and Dalton Kincaid (TE11) give the lineup strong options at a position that routinely separates good teams from great ones. The weakest projected starter on this roster is Michael Pittman at WR44, which tells you a great deal about the floor here. UncleWayne sits second in the Garrus Vakarian division and in the 70th percentile of the field, and frankly, neither number looks wrong.

BToldy23 did not win the Garrus Vakarian division on luck or a single inspired swing. This roster was built pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at 88th percentile entering 2026. The anchor is Brock Bowers, a TE1 projection landed at 2.03 when the field let him slip almost a full round past his ADP, and pairing him with Tyler Warren at TE4 means the tight end group alone could win weeks. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 gives the roster a genuine top-shelf wideout, and Trevor Lawrence and Brock Purdy at QB10 and QB13 respectively offer real starting-caliber options without a clear liability at the position. What stands out in the draft chart is the discipline: 17 chalk picks, one steal, one value, and barely a reach in sight. That is not a glamorous headline, but it reflects a manager who understood what things were worth and paid accordingly. Coming off a 69-percent win rate and a top-15-percent scoring season in 2025, BToldy23 arrives in 2026 looking very much like the division frontrunner.
