There is talent at the top of this roster, and that makes what surrounds it all the more painful to look at. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 are legitimate cornerstones, and the stacks with Caleb Williams and Jordan Love add real upside on the right weeks. But this roster is built like a house with a beautiful roof and no walls. The running back group grades out weak across the board, with Brian Robinson projecting as the best of the bunch at RB45, followed by a cascade of late-round names that blur together by the time you reach MarShawn Lloyd at RB66, who was drafted nearly four rounds early and still grades out there. The draft offered no steals and no values, just fourteen chalk selections and six reaches, including Lloyd and Terrance Ferguson, whose RB66 and TE28 projections do not justify the capital spent. Sitting 12th in the Gauntlet and in just the 14th percentile of the field, Merlin Olsen is going to need an awful lot to go right, and right now there is no obvious lever left to pull.

Last year, DrewKaufman3 was the kind of team that made you quietly resent your own roster, finishing in the 91st percentile with 5,003 points and a 75% win rate. This year's version is projected 15th percentile and 11th in the Gauntlet, and the draft record helps explain why. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 form a genuinely elite foundation, but Barkley was one of only two values on the entire board, and the rest of the draft leaned heavily on chalk and reaches. Chris Godwin, projected WR38, was taken nearly three full rounds early. The quarterback room, anchored by Jared Goff at QB16 and Baker Mayfield at QB18, is quietly a drag on a positionless format where QB production matters more than it looks. Tucker Kraft at TE5 is a legitimate asset, but Juwan Johnson at TE20 is the projected weakest starter, and that gap is real. McCaffrey and Barkley are still worth envying. The rest of this roster is worth pitying.

There is no diplomatic way to frame extrabitter's situation: sitting 10th in the Gauntlet division and projecting out at just the 19th percentile of the field, the math is already unkind before the season kicks off. The roster has one genuine pillar in Lamar Jackson, who projects as QB3, but the supporting cast grades out as merely average at every other position, and the draft process did little to change that trajectory. The two major reaches, Josh Jacobs pulled 1.4 rounds early and Harold Fannin grabbed 1.8 rounds ahead of consensus, ate premium capital without delivering elite-tier value, and the four minor reaches piled further pressure on a draft that produced zero steals. Jacobs projects at RB16 and Fannin at TE6, solid contributors but not the kind of upside swings that justify early investment. Jaxon Smith-Njigba flashes at WR3, but after him the depth fades fast, with Stefon Diggs grading as the projected weakest starter at WR56. Jackson is real, Smith-Njigba is real, and the rest is a prayer.

There is something almost poetic about how thoroughly The Roppen Empire did everything right and still ended up here, sitting ninth in the Gauntlet and in the 27th percentile of the field. The draft process was disciplined: Jalen Hurts fell nearly two full rounds before this team grabbed him, Tyrone Tracy and Blake Corum both came well past their ADPs, and the patience was real. And yet the roster lands with a thud. The receiver group is genuinely strong, with Drake London, Tetairoa McMillan, and Garrett Wilson all projected starters, but the backfield behind them is a collection of RB32s and RB33s, players projected to contribute without any of them projected to carry a week. The cruelest detail is that none of this is traceable to recklessness. The Roppen Empire played the value game correctly and got value-priced players in return. Jack Bech at WR94 is the one reach worth mentioning, and even that was only three rounds early. Sometimes the draft just hands you a beautiful-looking puzzle that does not quite resolve into a picture.

The Last Quarter Valkyries enter 2026 sitting eighth in the Gauntlet division and projected at just the 30th percentile of the field, and the roster itself offers little reason to argue with that verdict. The QB room is legitimately strong, with Joe Burrow projecting as QB4 and Justin Herbert as QB8, and the Herbert/Ladd McConkey stack adds a layer of upside that should keep this team competitive on good weeks. But beyond that, the floor drops fast. The weakest projected starter, Zach Charbonnet, is a RB42 who tore his ACL in the playoffs and faces a murky timeline back to the field, with Seattle having already added competition for carries, so what looked like roster depth on paper reads more like a waiting room with no guaranteed appointments. Worse, the draft leaned hard on tight ends, producing four major reaches at the position, including Brenton Strange, Mike Gesicki, Darnell Washington, and Elijah Arroyo, none of whom rank better than TE9 on this sheet. Burrow and McConkey are real. The rest of this roster is the problem, and there is no obvious move left to fix it.

jamriver sits seventh in the Gauntlet Division and checks in at just the 36th percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The quarterback situation is a quiet disaster, with Tua Tagovailoa projecting as QB31 and Shedeur Sanders as QB32, meaning jamriver is essentially starting two players who rank among the worst signal-callers in the tournament. Trey McBride at TE2 and Colston Loveland at TE3 are genuine assets, but strength at one position only goes so far in a format where you field your best ten regardless of position, and the top of the board is simply not deep enough to compensate for the drag at quarterback. Malik Nabers at WR12 is the clearest bright spot, and Zay Flowers at WR16 and Terry McLaurin at WR24 give the lineup some substance, but the projected weakest starter is Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47, which tells you how thin the margin is. The draft offered no steals and no values against ADP, just chalk with a handful of minor reaches. There is no hidden upside waiting to be unlocked here, just a team hoping the projections are wrong.

FoodShooting Wizards finished 2025 at 92 percent wins and 100th percentile in scoring, which makes the 37th percentile projection for 2026 feel like a cold shower nobody ordered. The roster is not broken, just balanced on a knife's edge. Josh Allen at QB1 stacking with D.J. Moore at WR26 gives the Wizards a genuine ceiling play, and the receiver group behind Moore, Nico Collins at WR9, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Tee Higgins at WR19, is the kind of depth that wins weeks when everything clicks. The problem is that clicking is doing a lot of work in that sentence. David Montgomery projects at RB23 and the backfield drops off sharply from there, meaning the Wizards need their elite starters to score, not just play. KC Concepcion at WR50 is the projected weakest starter, a fine player in a vacuum but thin margin territory when opponents are posting big numbers. Sixth in the Gauntlet Division is not a death sentence, but this team has almost no room to absorb bad luck before the math turns ugly.

Ernest Runs The Gauntlet finished 91st percentile in scoring last season and the 2026 roster suggests that was no fluke. The clearest thread running through this draft is the ability to let the board come to the manager rather than forcing it. Kyren Williams fell nearly two rounds past his ADP before being scooped up as a projected starter at RB15, Chris Olave slid to RB11 while the room looked elsewhere, and Bucky Irving arrived at RB21 more than a round late. None of these were lottery tickets or dart throws, they were simply players the field overvalued on the clock and undervalued by the time their names came around. Stack six moves like that across a draft and the cumulative edge becomes real. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 anchor a genuinely strong group, and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 gives the team a legitimate top-end receiver. The quarterback situation is thin, but in a positionless format the rest of the roster has more than enough room to carry the weight.

After finishing in the bottom 13 percent of the field in 2026 scoring, Moneyball99 spent the offseason doing what the name implies, and the result is a roster that looks nothing like last year's disaster. The anchor is a backfield built to dominate: Jonathan Taylor comes in at RB4, Derrick Henry at RB12, and both are projected starters. That is not depth as a consolation prize, that is a genuine engine. Add Brock Bowers at TE1 and Patrick Mahomes landing at QB12 two full rounds after his ADP, and Moneyball99 has the kind of core that turns an 8-28 wreck into a legitimate contender. The draft was mostly chalk, but the steals that landed were meaningful: Mahomes at 7.08 is the kind of quiet slide that separates managers who pay attention from managers who react. Sitting fourth in the Gauntlet division and at the 65th percentile tournament-wide, Moneyball99 is not yet an elite threat, but the floor has been raised dramatically, and the rebound arc here is hard to argue with.

Koogzz enters 2026 sitting third in the Gauntlet division and at the 80th tournament percentile, and the draft is a big reason why. The headliner is Jayden Daniels, a projected QB5 snagged two-plus rounds after his ADP, and that kind of patience is the signature of someone who understood the board rather than chasing names. The wide receiver group is the engine here: Puka Nacua at WR1, George Pickens at WR10, Rashee Rice at WR13, and Luther Burden at WR22 are all projected starters, giving this roster a ceiling that most managers in the field simply cannot match. Rice carries real baggage, between the off-field incidents and a knee procedure that will keep him out early, but a healthy Rice is still a WR13-caliber weapon, and koogzz got him knowing full well what they were buying. The draft log shows three steals, two values, and only one major reach in seventeen rounds. That is a disciplined, efficient draft, and it shows up in a roster with almost no soft spots in the projected starting lineup.

SeanPSims did not win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it by consistently getting players after the field had already moved on. TreVeyon Henderson landing at 9.01 when his ADP sat at 7.01 is the headliner, a two-round freeroll that delivered an RB19 projection at a significant discount, but the quieter wins stack up just as impressively. Quinshon Judkins at RB22, Khalil Shakir at WR51, Tyler Allgeier at RB46, all came in at prices below what the market was charging a round or two earlier. Add Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchoring the receiving corps and Tyler Warren at TE4 paired with Kyle Pitts at TE7 giving the squad genuine upside at tight end, and the foundation here is legitimately deep. The 2025 campaign already confirmed this manager knows how to convert a well-built roster into results, a 64 percent win rate and a 71st percentile scoring finish. The 2026 version looks sharper. Division rank 2 and 89th percentile tournament placement did not happen by accident.

Questors Jesters sit atop the Gauntlet Division and in the 95th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly why: more values than reaches, and the values hit harder. Kenneth Walker III landing at RB10 after falling nearly a round and a half past his ADP is the kind of windfall that quietly tilts a roster, and James Cook at RB5 arriving half a round late only adds to a backfield corps that gives this team a genuine floor no matter how the lineup shakes out. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the whole operation without needing a single favorable circumstance to justify his spot. The one cloud worth watching is Brock Purdy, a projected starter at QB13 whose supporting cast enters 2026 looking more like a medical chart than a depth chart, with questions surrounding multiple receivers and George Kittle's early availability. Jaxson Dart at QB11 provides a credible alternative if Purdy stumbles again. This team did not win the draft on one flashy swing. It just kept coming out ahead, pick after pick.
