There is something quietly deflating about watching a 95th-percentile season fail to translate into a roster that inspires much confidence. avgjoesff went 28-8 last year, scored 5134 points, and now sits third in the Ghostbusters division with projections that land in the bottom 10 percent of the field. The draft tells a big part of the story: three major reaches, including Bucky Irving pulled 2.6 rounds ahead of his ADP to land as a projected RB21, and two quarterback slots burned in the first two rounds on Drake Maye and Caleb Williams before either position even scores in this format. The receiver group is the quietest alarm, with Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 as the clear anchor but the depth falling off quickly toward Troy Franklin and Malachi Fields in the WR78-to-WR90 range. Last year's version of this team earned its reputation. This year's version is coasting on it, and the gap between what avgjoesff was and what the projections suggest it is now is the whole season in a sentence.

There is no polite way to dress this up: VineyardRemedy sits 11th in the Ghostbusters division and projects in just the 19th percentile of the field, and the roster largely earns those marks. The draft did not help matters, producing zero steals, two major reaches, and a sheet full of chalk that left no margin for error. Lamar Jackson and Jayden Daniels give the team genuine upside at the top, but a positionless format rewards depth, and once you get past the headliners the names start losing wattage fast. Tucker Kraft, a legitimate TE5, is the kind of piece that could anchor a contender, but he is coming off an ACL injury and asking him to carry heavy water while still rounding back into form is a lot to put on one recovering knee. The 2025 season ended at the 52nd percentile in scoring, which at least signals the underlying talent can produce, but 19th percentile projections suggest that floor may already be in the rearview mirror. Sometimes there is no lever left to pull, and this roster feels uncomfortably close to that place.

CraigFountain lands 10th in the Ghostbusters division and in just the 22nd percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The reach count is staggering: four major reaches against zero steals, with the most damaging ones coming at quarterback. Jaxson Dart, a QB11 projection, was taken 1.7 rounds early in Round 3. Fine, quarterbacks get overdrafted. But then J.J. McCarthy, projected QB37, got taken 5.2 rounds early in Round 15, a pick so aggressively mistimed it borders on performance art. Those are two of the format's most precious late-round picks, both spent on a position that starts zero guaranteed starters, on players ranked QB11 and QB37. The one genuine bright spot, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and James Cook at RB5, gives this roster a legitimate foundation, but everything built on top of it tilts. RJ Harvey checks in as the weakest projected starter at RB28, Hunter Henry was the lone value at TE18, and the receiver group is thin enough to make McCaffrey's legs feel like the only plan CraigFountain ever had.

Who Ya Gonna Draft? finished in the 89th percentile last season, and whoever is handing out reputations around here clearly did not get the memo that this roster is a different animal entirely. The core of this team is genuinely elite at the top: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Justin Jefferson at WR6, and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this manager a receiver group that could carry a squad almost by itself, and Brown arriving as a value after falling a full 1.2 rounds past his ADP is the kind of draft luck that makes other managers quietly furious. But past those stars, the construction gets shakier, and the draft decisions start to raise eyebrows. Baker Mayfield was reached 1.6 rounds early despite a 2025 campaign where he barely scraped into QB1 territory and now faces an offseason that subtracted Mike Evans without an obvious replacement of similar caliber. Meanwhile, five minor or major reaches on a single roster is a lot of optimism to be carrying into a field where this team is currently projected 34th

percentile. The gap between last year's results and this year's projection is not subtle, and it will need Mayfield to prove the skeptics wrong.

DET Stay Puft MC/DC Man ran a disciplined draft, and the ledger shows it: 14 chalk picks, only one major reach, and two genuine steals headlined by Colston Loveland at TE3 taken a round and a half after his ADP and Michael Wilson at WR39 snagged in the eleventh round when ninth-round value was still sitting there. The problem is that buying late and buying right does not automatically mean buying enough. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Malik Nabers at WR12 give this roster a legitimate top end, and Loveland quietly anchors the backend with upside most managers paid a premium to find elsewhere. But the math gets uncomfortable fast: Matthew Stafford projects as QB14 with no clear path to outperforming that ceiling, and Jordan Mason sits as the weakest projected starter at RB41, which is a long way down from Jonathan Taylor at RB4. The result is a team that currently sits eighth in the Ghostbusters division and in the 46th percentile of the field, a roster that did almost everything correctly on draft day and still ended up one tier short of threatening.

doggman12 sits at 47th percentile and seventh in the Ghostbusters division, which is about as middle-of-the-road as a team can get without actually being invisible. The margins here are genuinely thin. On the upside, Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 give this roster a pair of backfield anchors that most teams would envy, and the Justin Herbert and Ladd McConkey stack adds a little connective tissue that could pop on the right week. The draft was largely chalk, eleven players taken right at market price, but Chris Olave falling nearly a full round past his ADP at WR11 is the kind of quiet win that matters when the gaps between teams are this small. The concern is that the projected floor drops off quickly once you get past the top names. Chuba Hubbard is projected as the weakest starter at RB29, and if Robinson or Hampton miss time, this roster leans on him in a meaningful way. Nothing here is broken, nothing is transcendent, and that is exactly what makes doggman12 so dangerous to forecast.

Nacua Business sits at the exact midpoint of the field, 50th percentile, and the roster explains why without much argument. The strength is real: Puka Nacua at WR1, George Pickens at WR10, and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this team a legitimate top end that can carry a week. Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 arriving a round and a half late is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a long season. But the margins cut both ways. Bo Nix, the projected QB15, cost a fourth-round pick when his ADP sat a round and a half later, and Malik Willis at QB24 is the projected weakest starter on the roster, taken nearly two rounds before the market agreed he was worth selecting. When the difference between 53 percent wins and 60 percent wins comes down to a handful of close matchups, leaning on Nix and Willis to carry weeks where Nacua, Pickens, and Warren go cold is a genuinely uncomfortable ask. The pieces for a winning week are here. The pieces for a winning season are just slightly out of reach.

FFesq didn't swing for the fences and miss, or sell out for one elite option and pray. They just kept winning exchanges. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, Saquon Barkley at RB8, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 form a backfield group that would make any manager in the Ghostbusters division uncomfortable, and none of them cost a premium beyond expectation. The receiver corps quietly reinforced the same pattern: Marvin Harrison Jr. fell a full round past his ADP to Round 8, Jordan Addison did the same at Round 10, and Sam LaPorta slid a round to give FFesq a TE8 they arguably shouldn't have gotten at that price. Thirteen chalk picks and only zero major reaches tells you this wasn't a draft built on hunches. It was built on discipline, on taking what the board gave and never panicking. The 59th percentile projection is a touch conservative for a roster this consistent in the top half. FFesq came to the table ready, and the board largely cooperated.

After finishing in the 18th percentile last season, fhnixon needed more than a tune-up, and this roster looks like a genuine overhaul. The foundation starts at tight end, where Brock Bowers and Trey McBride project as TE1 and TE2 respectively, and McBride arriving at pick 2.05 after an ADP of 1.08 is the kind of draft-day gift that changes a season before it starts. Above that, Jalen Hurts projects as a QB9 starter, and the receiving corps features Luther Burden and Jaylen Waddle projecting at WR22 and WR23, with Waddle himself sliding a full round past his ADP before fhnixon snapped him up. This is a team that sat in the bottom fifth of the field in scoring last year and has quietly rebuilt into a 76th-percentile outfit, sitting fourth in the Ghostbusters division. The 2025 version was treading water. This version looks like it finally learned to swim.

DeezKn0ts didn't win the draft with one flashy pick, they won it by consistently being on the right side of the deal. De'Von Achane at RB6 slid nearly a full round past his ADP, and Drake London at WR7 followed him out of the second round at a similar discount, giving this roster two projected top-ten players at real value before the calendar turned to round three. The anchor holding it all together is Josh Allen at QB1, the kind of foundational piece that lets a manager take small swings everywhere else without sweating it. Travis Kelce came at a discount too, landing as TE10 more than a round late. The one genuine concern is the Brock Purdy situation, where injury clouds around Mike Evans and essentially the entire San Francisco receiver room make that stack feel more fragile than the positional rank suggests. Still, a team sitting at 79th percentile in a field this competitive, with no catastrophic misses and four picks that beat the market, is a team that drafted with its eyes open. Third in the Ghostbusters division feels like an understatement waiting to be corrected.

CaseyFF (EDT) sits second in the Ghostbusters division and in the 88th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. Seven values across the roster, just one minor reach, and not a single pick that blew past ADP in the wrong direction. The process was clean throughout. The standouts are obvious: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Nico Collins at WR9 headline a receiving group that would make most managers envious, and Collins himself was a genuine value, sliding nearly a full round past his ADP before CaseyFF stepped up. Garrett Wilson at WR17 came the same way, falling over a round before getting scooped. On the back end, George Kittle at TE9 and Isaiah Likely at TE13 both landed later than the market expected, which means CaseyFF was essentially collecting discounts while the rest of the draft board was busy elsewhere. The one reach, Breece Hall at RB14, was less than a round early and barely worth mentioning. This is what disciplined drafting looks like when it actually works.

Ain't Afraid of No Points lands in the 89th percentile of the field and sits first in the Ghostbusters division, and the draft record explains exactly why: eight values, eleven chalk, one minor reach, zero major reaches. That is a disciplined manager who knows what things cost and waits for the market to come to them. The headliners are legitimate, Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 was already the pick of the board at 1.06 and still fell past his ADP, while Harold Fannin at TE6 slipped a full round and a quarter to land at 6.07. Ashton Jeanty and Derrick Henry give this team two projected starting backs with real upside, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 quietly arrived a round late as well. The one wrinkle is Kyler Murray, taken about a round ahead of schedule, but a minor reach on a QB19 projection is the kind of problem that does not keep managers up at night. This roster was built the right way: patient, accurate, and almost entirely free of draft-night mistakes.
