Rashid Shaheed, positioned as WR54 and uncomfortably thrust into a starting role, underscores the team's fragility at wide receiver, despite the presence of more reliable playmakers like CeeDee Lamb and DK Metcalf. The draft strategy was a mixed bag; a shrewd late pick in Michael Penix Jr. contrasts starkly with much earlier selections like Brock Purdy and Dak Prescott, which cost them precious draft value. Yet, where there is hope, there

is a way—especially with strategic stack bonuses from Kittle/Purdy and Prescott/Lamb that could provide unexpected lift. As they gird for the season, chrishelle7 will need a few aces up their sleeve to transform potential into performance and ascend from the depths of their standings.

As we look ahead to the 2025 season for D'Squarius Green Jr., the outlook is less than promising. Despite having arguably the strongest quarterbacks in their division with Josh Allen, Patrick Mahomes, and C.J. Stroud poised to light up the scoreboard, the rest of the roster fails to inspire confidence. The running backs are a glaring weak spot, with TreVeyon Henderson, Brian Robinson, and Najee Harris all underperforming compared to the competition. The tight end position remains a perpetual headache, offering little in terms of consistent production. The wide receiver corps is mixed at best; while Nico Collins and Garrett Wilson offer some hope, relying on a projected starter like Jordan Watkins, who hasn't proven himself, is a risky gamble that likely won't pay off. The team's draft strategy raises questions as well: reaching significantly for players like Keaton Mitchell and Elijah Mitchell has cost them precious value. While they found a couple of bargains in C.J. Stroud and

Najee Harris, these wins are overshadowed by costly decisions elsewhere. With a division rank of 11 and landing in the 9th percentile overall, the team seems destined for another lackluster season unless some major changes occur.

As the angicrombie team reluctantly embarks on the 2025 fantasy football season, the outlook appears daunting. Having finished below average in 2024, with a meager 42% win rate and languishing in the 40th percentile, this season's prospects are equally grim. They find themselves ranking 10th in their division, the Golden State Valkyries, and dwelling within the lower echelons of fantasy teams overall, stuck at the 17th percentile. The team's quarterback situation remains a glaring weakness, with Tua Tagovailoa struggling to rise above QB24 status. Despite a TE Premium setup, where they boast the strongest tight end lineup in the division—highlighted by Trey McBride (TE2) and Tyler Warren (TE10)—the rest of the roster struggles to provide a competitive edge. Issues persist at running back, with Zach Charbonnet providing little hope at RB37, while the wide receiver

corps, headlined by Drake London and Travis Hunter, sits disappointingly at ninth in the division. Although some strategic draft picks offered marginal value, there were costly missteps, particularly reaching on Travis Hunter in the second round. With these challenges, angicrombie faces an uphill battle, yet they cling to a glimmer of optimism that their underdog status will fuel an unexpected resurgence.


