There is no elegant way to dress up a 6th-percentile roster, and FFKasey probably knows it. The foundation is real: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 give this team a pair of genuinely elite projected starters, the kind most managers in Gotham would trade for in a heartbeat. But the floor drops off fast after that, and the draft did nothing to raise it. Not a single steal or value across the entire board, fifteen chalk picks, and a major reach on Jack Bech in the sixteenth round when his ADP sat nearly five rounds later, a luxury pick that contributed nothing to a team that needed answers. The projected quarterback situation, Shough at QB20 and Sam Darnold at QB21, is quietly damaging in a positionless format where weak passers bleed into the overall point total every week. Taylor and Lamb can carry a team for stretches, but they cannot carry one indefinitely when the surrounding cast grades out this thin. FFKasey is not rebuilding. FFKasey is just hoping.

AlexCarusoBets drafted as though someone bet them they couldn't build a team with three major reaches and zero steals, and they accepted. The crowning achievement is Jaydon Blue, snagged nine-plus rounds ahead of his ADP, a pick so aggressive it laps itself and arrives somewhere in the neighborhood of delusional. Meanwhile, Drake Maye cost a first-round pick at 1.06 despite an ADP that said wait, and J.K. Dobbins arrived two rounds early to anchor a starting lineup as the weakest projected starter on the roster. The saving grace is that Ashton Jeanty, Saquon Barkley, and Breece Hall are all projected starters, which means the talent ceiling exists, it's just surrounded by draft-capital wreckage. But sitting 11th in the Gotham division and projected in the 19th percentile of the field, the math is unambiguous. AlexCarusoBets went to a charity tournament and gave generously, mostly to their opponents.

There is no gentle way to say this about mnfats127: sitting 10th in the Gotham division and in just the 22nd percentile of the field, this roster is in genuine trouble with very few places to hide. The receiver group is legitimately strong, anchored by Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3) and Nico Collins (WR9), but the rest of the roster reads like a cautionary tale about draft-day optimism. The single most alarming thread runs through the quarterback situation, where Baker Mayfield (QB18) and C.J. Stroud (QB22) represent a ceiling that most contenders treat as a floor. Meanwhile, mnfats127 burned a 3rd-round pick on Harold Fannin (TE6), a major reach by 1.7 rounds, banking on a player whose upside is real but whose production is anchored to a Browns offense that could be trotting out Deshaun Watson under center. That is a lot of faith to invest in Cleveland. The 2025 campaign ended at the 39th percentile in scoring, and nothing in this draft suggests the trajectory has changed.

AnthonyScrip finished in the 82nd percentile last season, and the 2026 version of this roster is currently projected 36th percentile, which is the kind of drop that demands an explanation. The receiver group is genuinely excellent, with Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Rashee Rice (WR13), Garrett Wilson (WR17), and Luther Burden (WR22) forming a top tier that any manager in the Scott Fish Bowl would envy. But this is a positionless format, and the ceiling of that receiver group only matters if the rest of the roster can carry its weight alongside it. The quarterback situation is where the reputation-versus-projection gap gets uncomfortable. Jayden Daniels (QB5) was the first-round anchor, taken a full round ahead of his ADP, and he is either a bold bet or an expensive mistake depending on your injury anxiety. Kyler Murray (QB19) arrives in Minnesota carrying a lisfranc that reportedly never healed cleanly, stepping into what the Vikings are calling a true competition with JJ McCarthy. Two quarterbacks with real availability questions is not a depth chart, it is a prayer.

Hollywood11 enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Gotham division and projecting at just the 37th percentile of the field, and the draft ledger doesn't offer much optimism about a turnaround. The receiver group is legitimately strong, with Drake London (WR7), Chris Olave (WR11), and DeVonta Smith (WR14) all projected to start, and that trio alone could carry a roster on a different day. The problem is that everything feeding the offense runs through Jordan Love (QB17), who cost a fifth-round pick when his ADP sat comfortably in the seventh, making him the single most expensive decision on the board. The Love/Christian Watson stack gives the team a ceiling to chase, but Watson projects as WR28 and a stack only amplifies what's already there. Bijan Robinson (RB2) is a genuine anchor, but after him the depth thins fast. Hollywood11 is a team built around a beautiful receiving corps and an overpaid quarterback, which is a fine blueprint until you realize it describes half the bad rosters in football history.

Guapokeng is the team that beats you when you're not paying attention and loses to the teams that are. The foundation is genuinely impressive: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Christian McCaffrey at RB3 anchor a starting group with real teeth, and the depth behind McCaffrey, Kenneth Walker III, Josh Jacobs, Quinshon Judkins, and RJ Harvey, means the top of this roster can absorb a bad week without flinching. The problem is that the margins cut both ways. The receiver group thins out fast after Malik Nabers, and the biggest draft gamble, Harvey taken 2.6 rounds ahead of his ADP, is also the projected weakest starter on the team. That's the season in miniature: a ceiling held up by elite talent at the top, a floor that depends on whether the aggressive calls pay off. Guapokeng finished at the 96th percentile in scoring in 2025, so the organization clearly knows how to build. Whether 2026 is a step forward or a slide into the comfortable middle depends almost entirely on how the close ones break.

mgarmo is the team that will win the weeks it's supposed to win and lose the weeks it's supposed to lose, with the season's outcome hinging on a handful of coin-flips in between. The foundation is real: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Tyler Warren slots in at TE4, and the Stafford-Nacua stack adds a correlation bonus that could swing a close week by a margin or two. De'Von Achane at RB6 was a modest draft-day value, and the tight end depth behind Warren, with Sam LaPorta at TE8 and Jake Ferguson at TE12, means the position rarely costs a week. The concern is at the draft's edges. Reaching three-plus rounds early for Geno Smith at QB30 is a dead roster spot in most weeks, and Michael Pittman, the projected weakest starter at WR44, is the kind of name that shows up in the loss column when things go sideways. Sixth in Gotham and 54th percentile overall tells the whole story: mgarmo isn't losing sleep over contenders, and contenders aren't losing sleep over mgarmo. The margins decide this.

GuatemalanChris didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. The work got done quietly, across almost every round, and the results show it. Fourteen chalk selections sound boring until you look at what the chalk was: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, A.J. Brown at WR8, George Pickens at WR10, all projected starters, all taken right where they belonged. That's not a manager who got lucky. That's a manager who knew the board and trusted it. The one clear value, Dak Prescott at QB7, came a full round and change after his ADP suggested he'd be gone, and GuatemalanChris pounced. Prescott also pairs with Pickens in a stack that adds a bonus layer of ceiling to an already sound roster. The overall footprint lands at the 63rd percentile, which puts this team comfortably in the conversation without making any promises. Fifth in Gotham is exactly the kind of spot where a roster this coherent starts climbing once the games actually matter.

AppleKnut drafted like someone who did their homework and then ignored the syllabus. Three major reaches across the board, nothing stolen at fair value, and yet the roster that came out the other side sits at the 65th percentile in the field and projects fourth in Gotham. The clearest exhibit is Rico Dowdle, taken nearly three rounds early and still only projecting as RB32, which sounds like a loss until you stack him behind Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and realize the backfield depth here is genuinely functional rather than accidental. The receiver group is where the conviction argument gets its best evidence: Tee Higgins, Jameson Williams, Terry McLaurin, and D.J. Moore project as four starters clustered between WR19 and WR26, a remarkably tight band of quality that gives this lineup real weekly floor. Colston Loveland at TE3 anchors a Caleb Williams stack that adds upside on top of everything else. The reaches may not have been efficient, but the results are hard to argue with.

Danasty Football sits third in Gotham and in the 82nd percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: four values, thirteen chalk picks, and almost nothing in the reach column. That discipline paid off at the most important moments. Justin Jefferson landed at 2.04 despite an ADP of 1.12, meaning a WR6 essentially slid into this roster at a discount while the rest of the room looked elsewhere. Tucker Kraft fell 1.3 rounds and came in as a TE5, and Mark Andrews fell just as far to give Danasty a pair of tight end starters that most managers would kill for, with Trey McBride at TE2 and George Kittle at TE9 rounding out what the data calls a strong group. Jalen Hurts at QB9 anchors the quarterback room and pairs with Kittle in a Purdy stack that adds a soft floor on weeks Brock Purdy is cooking. This team did not need a miracle pick to be good. It just needed to keep showing up at the draft table and making the right call, and it did that over and over.

Last year azablud finished in the bottom 16 percent of the field in scoring, a number that reads less like a bad season and more like a crime scene. The 2026 roster looks like the cleanup crew. The transformation starts at the top, where Josh Allen, the QB1, anchors everything, taken at 1.01 before his ADP caught up to him at 1.05, a minor reach that looks more like good instincts than impatience. The running game is where this rebuild really announces itself: James Cook at RB5 fell nearly a full round past his ADP, and Derrick Henry at RB12 fell a full round, meaning azablud collected two of the better backs in the field at a discount. Those two alone reframe what this roster is. The receivers are the quieter part of the story, with Davante Adams at WR25 leading a group that thins out quickly, but in a positionless format the backfield depth more than compensates. A 2nd-place division finish and an 84th-percentile projection do not happen by accident. The rebound is real.

Red777 sits atop the Gotham division and in the top 10 percent of the field, and the draft tells you exactly why. This roster was built on discipline: nine values across the board, zero steals needed, because patience was enough. Joe Burrow at QB4 and Brock Bowers at TE1 give the lineup two genuinely elite anchors, and the supporting cast was acquired without overpaying for a single one of them. Zay Flowers fell 1.1 rounds past his ADP. Jordan Addison fell 1.6. Jordyn Tyson fell 1.3. Round after round, the board delivered and Red777 simply collected, like someone who set a grocery list before the store opened and stuck to it. The one blemish is MarShawn Lloyd, reached 3.5 rounds early in Round 18, and honestly, a late-round gamble on a player projected RB66 is the kind of thing that barely registers when your projected weakest starter is Addison at WR43. Coming off a 69 percent win rate in 2025, there is nothing here that looks like an accident.
