There is no clean way to dress up a 15th-percentile projection and a division rank of 12, so PatrickClaybon probably should not bother trying. The roster has genuine talent at the top, Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Derrick Henry at RB12 give this team a real pulse, but the draft decisions that surrounded those anchors are already working against them. Kenneth Walker III cost a reach of more than a round, and Geno Smith was taken four and a half rounds ahead of his QB30 projection, which is a steep price for a player who grades out as a fringe streamer. The values that did emerge, George Pickens slipping to WR10 and Josh Downs landing as the steal of the draft, help at the margins but cannot fully compensate for a construction that burned early capital in the wrong places. Last season's 2-34 record and first-percentile scoring are not ancient history, they are context, and nothing about this roster suggests the trajectory has meaningfully changed. PatrickClaybon is not without weapons, but the math is unkind and the margin for error is essentially gone.

Last year, planepats finished in the 90th percentile of scoring and looked like a team that had figured something out. This year's roster lands at 28th percentile and 11th in the division, and the distance between those two versions is not small. The core still has real weight, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give the team a foundation most managers would envy, and Malik Nabers at WR12 and Zay Flowers at WR16 project as legitimate contributors. But the draft tells a story that undercuts the optimism: two major reaches, headlined by Jayden Daniels taken nearly a full round early at pick 2.02 and Cam Ward taken 2.3 rounds before his ADP, with Ward projecting as QB23. In a positionless format where every pick compounds across a full lineup, burning premium draft capital on quarterbacks who don't project as top-tier starters is exactly the kind of structural decision that separates a 90th-percentile roster from the one that's currently staring down 28th. The name is the same. The math is not.

There is no polite way to say this: The G-Man is sitting tenth in Life 2 and projecting out at the 30th percentile of the field, and the draft did not exactly lay the groundwork for a dramatic reversal. The one genuine steal of the offseason was landing Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 nearly a full round past his ADP, which is the kind of win that should have a manager feeling good about themselves. Instead, that goodwill gets swallowed whole by the quarterback situation, where Bo Nix and J.J. McCarthy were taken 1.8 and 5.5 rounds ahead of their ADPs respectively, a pair of reaches that would be easier to forgive if Drake Maye were not already locked in as the clear top option. Maye is a legitimate QB2 coming off an MVP-caliber season, and with AJ Brown now in New England, the arrow is pointing up. But loading up on Nix and McCarthy at those costs, when the starter was already secured, is the kind of draft-room decision that leaves a team spinning its wheels when it needed to be building depth around him. The ceiling is there. The path to it is not.

FeezyCheese enters 2026 sitting ninth in Life 2 and in just the 33rd percentile of the field, and nothing about how this roster was built suggests a dramatic reversal is coming. The draft tells the story plainly: sixteen chalk picks, zero steals, and two major reaches that deserve some scrutiny. Caleb Williams was taken nearly a full round early at QB6, and Trevor Lawrence was grabbed a round and a half before his ADP at QB10, meaning FeezyCheese spent real capital acquiring two quarterbacks in a positionless format where that redundancy costs opportunity elsewhere. The receiver group grades out average, with Tee Higgins at WR19 and Terry McLaurin at WR24 projecting as the headliners, and the projected weakest starter is RJ Harvey at RB28, the one player who actually represented genuine value on draft day. A 42 percent win rate and a 26th-percentile scoring finish in 2025 suggest this is a roster still searching for an identity, and with no obvious lever left to pull, 2026 looks less like a bounce-back season and more like more of the same.

EMacDFS enters 2026 sitting eighth in Life 2 and at the 33rd percentile of the field, and nothing about the draft process suggests the gap is about to close. The roster does have genuine talent at the top: Ja'Marr Chase projects as WR2, Ashton Jeanty as RB7, and both Justin Herbert and Brock Purdy bring real upside as projected starters, each stacked with a pass-catcher on the same offense. But the draft that built this thing leaned heavily on chalk and reaches, producing zero steals and zero values across the entire board. Aaron Rodgers, clocking in at QB29, was pulled four rounds ahead of his market price, Sean Tucker and Chris Brazzell II were similarly yanked well before consensus, and none of them project to meaningfully reward the early investment. What you're left with is a roster where the ceiling depends almost entirely on Chase and Jeanty delivering at their projections while the supporting cast underperforms its draft cost, and that is a thin margin for a team already behind in the standings before the first game kicks off.

Brandon Sanders did almost everything right on draft day, which makes the outcome roughly 36th percentile in the tournament and seventh in Life 2 feel like a prank. He grabbed James Cook at RB5, landed Brock Bowers at TE1, and found genuine value in Javonte Williams and Chris Godwin, both of whom fell more than a round past their ADPs. The board cooperated. Sanders took notes. And yet here we are, staring at a projected lineup whose ceiling keeps getting clipped by Baker Mayfield, reached 1.8 rounds early and projecting as a QB18, and by a receiver group that bottoms out with Jakobi Meyers at WR45. Sixteen chalk picks and three legitimate values should build a contender. Instead they built a team that looks credible until you squint, at which point the seams show. Cook and Bowers are real, the value hunting was sound, and the 2025 squad won 89 percent of its games. The 2026 version drafts like a winner and projects like someone who almost was one.

Jeem213 sits at 54th percentile in the field, sixth in Life 2, and that comfortable mediocrity is the whole story. The margins here are real and they cut both ways. On the upside, the draft board shows six legitimate values, headlined by Jonathan Taylor at RB4 snagged a few spots past his ADP and Travis Kelce at TE10 slipping a full round before Jeem213 pounced. Those two alone give this roster a credible floor. But the draft also includes two major reaches, most notably Joe Burrow at QB4 taken nearly a round before the market agreed, which means the top of this roster cost more than it should have. The projected starters are real, Kyle Pitts at TE7 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 among them, but Michael Wilson projects as the weakest of the bunch at WR39, and after a 2025 campaign that landed in the 15th percentile of scoring, there is no margin for a cold stretch. Jeem213 does not lose the division on paper. It wins or loses it on execution.

Geigermatt's draft reads like a contradiction: four reaches, one of them a major, and yet the finished roster is legitimately good. The key is where those reaches landed. Pulling Jacoby Brissett 2.8 rounds before consensus looks like a panic move, and Brissett's QB28 projection suggests the market was more right than Geigermatt was. But that miss gets buried under a receiver corps headlined by Puka Nacua at WR1, Nico Collins at WR9, and Garrett Wilson at WR17, all projected starters, all acquired through a draft that shows no steals and only two values. Geigermatt did not find bargains to build this, they just took who they wanted and dared the results to prove them wrong. So far they have. Colston Loveland slots in at TE3, and Marvin Harrison Jr. and Jordyn Tyson round out a starting group with real depth. The ceiling here is genuine. The question the division rank of fifth keeps asking is whether conviction and luck are actually the same thing when the scoreboard eventually settles the argument.

Gordon Freeman did not build this roster on one big swing. He built it the way a good poker player builds a stack, winning small pots consistently until the math is undeniable. The clearest example is the tight end group, where Harold Fannin at TE6 and Sam LaPorta at TE8 both landed as projected starters, with LaPorta arriving a full round after his ADP suggested he should have been gone. De'Von Achane at RB6 and Kyren Williams at RB15 anchor what projects as a productive backfield, and both slipped past their ADPs as well, small margins that accumulate into a real edge. Josh Allen at QB1 was taken first overall and counts as a minor reach in the technical sense, but betting on the best quarterback in the format is hardly a gamble worth losing sleep over. The one legitimate question mark is Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31, the weakest projected starter on the board. Freeman sits fourth in Life 2 and at the 60th percentile tournament-wide, which is not a crown, but it is a foundation that quietly earns respect.

Kyle James didn't need a signature moment to build something worth watching in Life 2. The foundation is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, a borderline-unassailable anchor who gives this roster a ceiling others have to scheme around, and the receiver group layered behind him reads like a draft that kept winning small arguments all afternoon: Drake London at WR7, Rashee Rice at WR13, Jaylen Waddle at WR23, and Carnell Tate at WR29, all projected starters, all acquired without a hint of panic. The one blemish worth noting is Jaydon Blue, a reach of nearly six rounds that stands out precisely because the rest of the board was so disciplined, though late-round swings on upside are a reasonable price for an otherwise chalk-heavy approach. Dak Prescott slots in at QB7 when healthy, and Parker Washington at WR35 gives James a projected starter who would headline weaker rosters. Third in the division and 78th percentile tournament-wide, this team didn't luck into that standing. It earned it pick by pick.

Texas Chilibowls didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by consistently coming out ahead, and the cumulative effect lands them at second in Life 2 and the 79th percentile of the field. The foundation is at tight end, where Trey McBride (TE2) and Tyler Warren (TE4) give this roster a projected advantage at the position that compounds week after week, and both were acquired at slight value relative to their ADP. Justin Jefferson (WR6) anchors the skill positions, and the Jared Goff and Jameson Williams stack gives the team a built-in multiplier on those two. The one genuine overpay was Kyle Monangai, taken two rounds ahead of his ADP, and David Montgomery carries some risk after a quiet year in Detroit led him to sign with Houston, where he's expected to battle for the lead role. Neither concern unravels what was built. This is a roster assembled through discipline and patience, and the standings so far suggest that approach is working.

BaldNorth didn't win the draft with one knockout punch. They won it by consistently being on the right side of the market, round after round. The headliner is Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5, with Lamb sliding nearly a full round past his ADP to land at 2.07, a quiet windfall that would have quietly broken most managers' boards. Add A.J. Brown at WR8 and BaldNorth is carrying three projected top-ten receivers at the same time, each one a legitimate weekly difference-maker. Tucker Kraft at TE5 fell 1.6 rounds and fits neatly into a stack with Jordan Love, giving the roster a built-in bonus. The Love investment was the one real swing BaldNorth took ahead of market, a two-round reach, but the Love-Kraft connection at least gives that gamble a structural rationale. Alec Pierce rounds out a starting corps that could absorb a blow or two and barely notice. Division-leading and sitting at the 85th percentile, BaldNorth looks like a team that simply drafted well, which is usually enough.
