TheFFSandman did everything a disciplined drafter is supposed to do. Fifteen chalk picks, three minor reaches at worst, and the two genuine values on the board, Cam Ward and Hunter Henry, were taken patiently after ADP. The process was clean. The result is a team sitting in the bottom 10 percent of the field, ranked 12th in the Halo Division, and that gap between method and outcome is where the real cruelty lives. The projected starters are not the problem, De'Von Achane, Derrick Henry, Breece Hall, and CeeDee Lamb give this roster a legitimate backbone. But the depth behind that backbone fades quickly, and in a format where managers field their best players in almost any mix, the distance between Lamb and Josh Downs at WR46 matters enormously when injuries force the hand. Ward projects as QB23 and Michael Penix Jr. sits at QB33, meaning the position offers little upside if the rest of the lineup stumbles. TheFFSandman trusted the process and the process still left them here, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question the process all over again.

Last year's 86th-percentile Muzio squad looks, from this vantage point, like a fond memory that the 2026 roster is not equipped to honor. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, anchored by Justin Jefferson at WR6 and DeVonta Smith at WR14, with Mike Evans, Brian Thomas Jr., and Marvin Harrison Jr. all projecting as starters, so the top of this roster has real teeth. But teeth only matter if the whole jaw works, and the scoring engine here is in trouble. C.J. Stroud projects at QB22, Bryce Young at QB26, and the team reached 1.8 rounds early to secure Young, which is a steep price to pay for a player ranked that low. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 is legitimately elite, but beyond him the backfield thins out quickly, and Mike Gesicki projecting at TE33 means the position contributes almost nothing. The draft sheet shows one value, fourteen chalk, and a major reach on Tre Tucker, taken three-plus rounds early. Sitting 11th in the division, Muzio is carrying last year's reputation like a credential that no longer gets them through the door.

LionheartDad sits 10th in the Halo division and in just the 14th percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to suggest a turnaround is coming. The real wound is at receiver, where Deebo Samuel (WR70), Chris Bell (WR87), and Chris Brazzell II (WR101) form the kind of supporting cast that makes a manager stare at the ceiling at 2 a.m. Those three rank among the weakest projected contributors on any starting roster in the tournament, and in a positionless format where you simply play your best players, there is nowhere to hide them. The draft also featured four major reaches, including Ray Davis (RB62) taken a staggering 5.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, which is the sort of aggressive maneuvering that only pays off if the player dramatically outperforms expectations. Josh Allen (QB1) and Saquon Barkley (RB8) give this roster a legitimate foundation, but the ceiling cracks fast after them, and LionheartDad looks less like a contender building toward something than a team already running out of answers.

notoriouskro is not trying to get lucky. The whole architecture here runs through Dallas, with Dak Prescott stacked against both George Pickens and Jake Ferguson, meaning when that offense clicks, the portfolio clicks with it. Prescott projects as QB7, Pickens as WR10, Ferguson as TE12, and on a good Sunday those three can bury a matchup together in a way that no single elite player can do alone. The problem is that correlation cuts both ways. A cold Prescott, a quiet game script, a blown coverage that never comes, and notoriouskro does not just lose one starter, they lose three at once. The supporting cast does not offer much insurance. Bhayshul Tuten projects as RB25 and carries genuine upside if Jacksonville hands him real work now that Travis Etienne is gone, but "if" is doing heavy lifting in that sentence. The 2025 season ended at the 25th percentile, and sitting ninth in the Halo division, this team needs the Prescott stack to be a plan that actually executes, not a theory that sounds good in March.

MagicSportsGuy drafted with genuine discipline. The values are real: Kyle Monangai fell nearly two rounds, Jalen McMillan fell almost two more, and Colby Parkinson slipped past his ADP as well. Sixteen chalk picks and zero major reaches is about as clean a draft sheet as you will find in this tournament. The problem is that patience and precision are not the same thing as a good roster, and this one lands at 35th percentile with a division rank of eighth to prove it. The receiver group is legitimately strong, with Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Rashee Rice at WR13, and Chris Olave at WR11 all projected to start, but the quarterback situation, fronted by Jordan Love at QB17 and Kyler Murray at QB19, is the quiet weight that keeps the whole thing from rising. MagicSportsGuy won the draft on paper and still wound up with a team that projects to lose. That is not bad luck. That is the draft telling you something the ADP could not.

almendros75 sits at 46th percentile and seventh in the Halo Division, which is exactly the kind of placement that requires everything to go right and nothing to go sideways. The foundation is genuinely interesting: Trey McBride at TE2, A.J. Brown at WR8, and a Caleb Williams / Rome Odunze stack that gives the roster a real ceiling when Chicago is cooking. The problem is the draft showed a manager who trusts his own eyes more than the market, and the market pushed back hard. Jaydon Blue at RB70 cost a pick 8.3 rounds early, Braelon Allen at RB58 went 3.2 rounds ahead of consensus, and neither projection suggests those bets are paying out in 2026. That kind of capital misalignment doesn't sink a team outright, it just quietly tightens every margin. Last season almindros75 went 19-17 and scored at the 57th percentile, a squad that won more than it lost but never quite built separation. That's the template again: not fragile, not dominant, just perpetually one week away from either a run or a collapse.

Team fantasydukes sits at 47th percentile in the Scott Fish Bowl's Halo division, the kind of roster that wins the weeks it's supposed to and drops the ones it shouldn't, right up until the moment those margins add up to something or nothing. The engine here is Christian McCaffrey at RB3, taken a tick early at 1.05 but not the kind of reach that haunts you, and the TE group is genuinely elite, with Colston Loveland, Tyler Warren, Tucker Kraft, and Harold Fannin projected TE3 through TE6. Fannin is the interesting thread: he outplayed David Njoku last season, Njoku is gone, and any offensive improvement in Cleveland could push Fannin into premium territory despite the murky quarterback situation there. The ceiling question lives at the other end of the roster, where the receiver group is projected weak and Matthew Stafford, a solid value at QB14, is carrying the passing game. This team went 10-26 last year and scored in the 11th percentile. The talent is better now. Whether better is enough depends entirely on which version of this roster shows up when it matters.

DGlad didn't win the draft with one splashy pick, just quietly came out ahead on almost every decision. The clearest proof is the receiving group, where Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), Drake London (WR7), and Malik Nabers (WR12) form a projected-starter trio that most managers would trade their first three picks to own. None of them were steals in the traditional sense, but the draft value column tells its own story: George Kittle landed a full round past his ADP, Bo Nix slipped a round and a half, and the roster finished with three values and zero reaches, a ledger that reflects patience and discipline rather than luck. The Purdy-Kittle stack adds a correlated ceiling that could turn a good week into a great one. A 67th-percentile tournament projection and a fifth-place divisional standing suggest the ceiling hasn't fully registered yet, which is exactly what you want heading into a long season. DGlad didn't reinvent anything. The roster just keeps holding up the more you look at it.

After finishing in the bottom 19 percent of the field in 2026 scoring, dustintyler has constructed something that looks less like a roster rebuild and more like a full-scale renovation. The foundation is unmistakable: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 give this team a top-of-the-market core that simply did not exist a year ago, and the fact that Jackson slid to pick 2.12 despite his QB3 projection makes the whole thing feel almost unfair. Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Cam Skattebo at RB20 round out a backfield that projects among the most dangerous in the Halo division, and dustintyler's receiver group, led by Ladd McConkey and Jameson Williams, adds real depth behind those stars. The 71st-percentile tournament projection puts this team solidly above the field's midpoint, which after an 8-28 record is not a minor development, it is a statement. There are question marks, Xavier Worthy's WR49 projection being the most notable, but when your foundation looks like this, you can afford a few rough edges.

bigguys lands at third in the division and the 75th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains why: 14 chalk picks, two genuine values, and nothing that blew up the board in either direction. That kind of consistency is harder to execute than it looks. The headliner is Ja'Marr Chase, a WR2 projection taken at 1.06 when his ADP sat at 1.02, a near-miss on the top pick that still delivered elite production at a slight discount. Pair him with James Cook at RB5 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and the top of this roster is genuinely formidable. Travis Kelce sliding a full round past his ADP to TE10 is the kind of quiet draft-room win that separates good managers from lucky ones. The Baker Mayfield and Emeka Egbuka stack adds a correlated ceiling piece, and Egbuka projects as a WR18. bigguys came out of the draft without a single spectacular headline and somehow built a lineup that belongs in the conversation anyway.

JoeyS87 lands at second in the Halo division and the 86th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why: this roster was built without drama and without mistakes. Zero reaches, sixteen chalk picks, and three genuine values, which is a quiet kind of excellence that tends to get overlooked next to flashier builds. The foundation is Bijan Robinson, projected RB2, paired with a backfield group that runs four deep into startable territory. Up front, Joe Burrow cost JoeyS87 a fifth-round pick less than his ADP suggested, which is a modest discount on a QB4 that compounds nicely when your worst projected starter is Tony Pollard at RB30. Nico Collins and Tetairoa McMillan anchor the receiving corps at WR9 and WR15 respectively, giving this team a ceiling that matches its floor. There is no single moment from this draft that makes for a great story, and that is precisely the point. JoeyS87 came out ahead on pick after pick, and the standings reflect it.

There is not much to argue with here. kcr1900 sits first in the Halo division and checks in at the 92nd percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains why. Drake Maye, a QB2 projection, was still on the board at 2.11 when most managers had him priced a full round earlier, and the Patriots' offseason addition of AJ Brown gives Maye the alpha wideout he never had before, making that value pick look even cleaner in hindsight. The wide receiver group is where this roster really breathes, anchored by Puka Nacua at WR1 and supported by projected starters in Garrett Wilson, Tee Higgins, Christian Watson, and Michael Pittman. Four values and a steal across the draft sheet with zero major reaches is the kind of discipline that does not happen by accident. Jayden Daniels slots in as a QB5 starter alongside Maye, Isaiah Likely projects as a TE13, and the whole thing holds together like a roster built by someone who came with a plan and stuck to it.
