As the 2025 fantasy football season looms on the horizon, Shane Hallam (@ShanePHallam) finds itself in a precarious position, teetering on the edge of relevance. Last year's promising 73rd percentile finish has given way to a weary outlook, with the team languishing in 12th place within their division, and a disheartening 3rd percentile overall. Despite boasting a strong group of tight ends—a crucial leverage point in this TE premium setup—with Trey McBride standing out as a shining star, the team struggles with a lackluster wide receiver corps headlined by George Pickens and Ricky Pearsall, neither of whom inspire much confidence. While the running back unit offers a glimmer of hope, thanks to Jonathan Taylor and others, the decision to reach on Isiah Pacheco and

Joe Mixon before their typical draft spots raises questions about the team's strategic foresight. Additionally, taking Jalen Milroe and others well ahead of their ADP may cost dearly in terms of value. As Shane Hallam (@ShanePHallam) prepares for what promises to be a challenging season, the path forward will demand resilience and perhaps a touch of fortune if they're to climb from the depths of the rankings and reclaim the success they tasted not long ago.

As the 2025 fantasy football season looms, the outlook for Shawn Teague (@shawn8386) seems bleak. After a disappointing 2024 campaign where they landed in the bottom fifth of scorers and scraped together wins in less than half of their games, hopes for a turnaround appear slim. A daring draft strategy yielded mixed results, with some late-round steals like Justice Hill and Darren Waller, yet significant reaches on players such as Hunter Henry could haunt them. Jordan Love stands as the shaky cornerstone of their quarterback lineup, ranked 20th and offering little solace. While their wide receiver corps remains the envy of the division, featuring talents like Justin Jefferson and Drake London, the running back situation leaves much to be desired, with Derrick Henry carrying most of the burden. Kyle Pitts' underwhelming projection at tight end further dims any glimmer of optimism.

With a division rank of 11th and an overall standing in the 12th percentile, Shawn Teague faces a daunting climb out of the depths in a season that threatens to mirror last year's struggles.

As the 2025 fantasy football season looms, Alex Rikleen (@rikleen) faces an uphill battle to reclaim past glory. Following a dominant 2024 campaign that saw them finish in the top 10% overall, this year's outlook is far less promising. Currently languishing near the bottom of their division, they find themselves in a disappointing percentile overall, a stark contrast to last season's triumphs. While Lamar Jackson remains a formidable force at quarterback, the team's running game is severely lacking, with Zach Charbonnet leading a lackluster group that includes Tank Bigsby, whose underwhelming performance is compounded by the team's ill-advised early draft pick. Despite boasting a strong receiving corps headlined by Brian Thomas Jr. and Jaxon Smith-Njigba, the

imbalance in other positions, particularly at tight end, poses significant challenges. Reaching for players like Zay Flowers and Michael Penix Jr. further questioned the team's strategic decisions, leading to concerns about depth and consistency. The minor synergy between Lamar Jackson and Zay Flowers offers a glimmer of hope, but it may be too little to elevate this team out of their current predicament. With a roster riddled with weaknesses and questionable draft choices, the prospects for making a meaningful impact this season appear bleak.
