The most charitable thing you can say about Coltastic is that A.J. Brown is on the roster, and even that came at a cost, reached 1.4 rounds early at pick 1.05. That's the draft in miniature: an aggressive posture that never quite paid off, with four major reaches scattered across the board like evidence at a crime scene. Daniel Jones, a QB25, was taken 2.8 rounds ahead of his market value and projects as the weakest starter on the team. Jameson Williams, a WR21, cost nearly two rounds of premium to acquire. Rashod Bateman, a WR92, was somehow pulled 5.8 rounds early in a late round, which is the kind of decision that makes you wonder what the room was thinking. Brown and Nico Collins project as genuine WR8 and WR9 assets, and the Matthew Stafford-Davante Adams stack offers a real upside path, but the draft capital spent to assemble this group doesn't match the return. Sitting at the bottom of the Grand Theft Auto V division heading into 2026, Coltastic looks like a team that drafted with urgency and forgot to draft with judgment.

Nine major reaches in a single draft is not a strategy, it is a crime scene, and Naughty by Nurture left evidence everywhere. The most damaging testimony comes from the receiver group, where Denzel Boston (WR58) was pulled off the board 4.5 rounds ahead of his ADP and Rashid Shaheed (WR57) went 2.3 rounds early, meaning the team paid first-class prices for a pair of passengers projected to sit outside the WR50. Those reaches cascaded forward, foreclosing the kind of mid-round recalibration that rescues bad early picks. Bijan Robinson (RB2) is a genuine anchor and Lamar Jackson (QB3) arrived at a mild discount, so the bones exist, but the tissue around them is almost entirely reach-priced filler. Brenton Strange (TE17) is a reasonable depth piece on a Jacksonville offense that now leans on him as the primary receiving option at the position, but he was still taken 1.2 rounds

early. The team sits 11th in the Grand Theft Auto V division and in the bottom five percent of the field, which is less a projection than a verdict already rendered.

Espresso Martini sits 10th in the Grand Theft Auto V division and in the 19th percentile of the field, and the draft record does not offer much comfort: 13 chalk picks, two major reaches, and zero steals. The most glaring of those reaches was Justin Herbert at QB8, taken a full round and a half before his ADP, which is a curious spend when Joe Burrow at QB4 was already on the roster and paired with Tee Higgins in a legitimate stack. That is two early picks pointed at quarterback in a positionless format where range matters everywhere. The receiver group looks passable on paper, and Jaylen Waddle moving to Denver, where Bo Nix threw the ball as often as anyone in the league last year, is a genuine reason for optimism. But Waddle at WR23 and Tee Higgins at WR19 are good players on a roster that needed great ones, and with Quentin Johnston projected as the weakest starter at WR41, there is very little margin for injury or disappointment. The lever has already been pulled.

Team 95 did almost everything right at the draft table and arrived at a roster that sits ninth in the Grand Theft Auto V division and at just the 40th percentile of the field, which is the kind of outcome that makes a manager stare at their spreadsheets wondering what they missed. Jayden Daniels fell more than a round past his ADP, a genuine win, and the stack with Terry McLaurin gives the offense a connective tissue that at least makes sense on paper. Bhayshul Tuten is the pivot point the whole roster is leaning on: with Travis Etienne gone to New Orleans and the Jacksonville backfield suddenly unsettled, Tuten has a real path to volume, but "a real path" is not the same as a guarantee, and betting on a backfield competition to resolve in your favor is the kind of optimism that ages badly by Week 3. Jonathan Taylor is projected RB4 and Justin Jefferson is WR6, so the ceiling exists. But with Mark Andrews projected TE14 and Chigoziem Okonkwo as the projected second tight end at TE19, the roster never quite reaches the critical mass those top names deserve. The value was found. The floor just refuses to rise.

Shua44 played the value game almost perfectly, landing CeeDee Lamb at WR5 more than half a round after his ADP and adding Tetairoa McMillan and Chris Godwin at similar discounts, so the draft philosophy was sound every step of the way. The cruelty is that it did not matter. The receiver group is strong, sure, but this is a positionless format, and strength at one position only helps when the rest of the roster pulls its weight. It does not. Saquon Barkley at RB8 is a legitimate anchor, but the supporting cast behind him thins out quickly, and the quarterback situation is a quiet disaster that patience cannot fix. Shua44 reached more than three rounds early for Jadarian Price at RB26 and got nothing back in terms of positional value, and the projected starters at quarterback, Tyler Shough at QB20 and C.J. Stroud at QB22, would test anyone's faith in a format where starting the best players is the only rule. Eighth in the division, 42nd percentile overall, and every receipt from draft night says this should have gone differently.

OrenthalJames11 sits at 46th percentile and seventh in the Grand Theft Auto V division, which is exactly the kind of positioning that makes a season feel like a coin flip dressed up as a schedule. The ceiling is real: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster genuine top-end firepower, and Caleb Williams at QB6 arrived as a value, taken five rounds later than his projection deserved. But the floor has some creaky boards. Deshaun Watson at QB34 was a major reach, drafted 3.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, and Ray Davis at RB62 cost a round and a half more than the market demanded. Neither player projects as a starter, but those picks represent capital that could have shored up the back end. Blake Corum projects as the weakest starter at RB35, and in a format this deep, the difference between a week you win and a week you lose often lives exactly where projections get thin. This roster has the tools to beat anyone. It also has the fragility to lose to anyone.

Jaylion is parked right at the tournament median, 48th percentile, and that positioning tells the whole story: this roster lives and dies by small edges rather than overwhelming talent. The strength is real, Puka Nacua at WR1 and Drake London at WR7 give the lineup a legitimate top-end punch, and London arriving two rounds past his ADP means Jaylion squeezed genuine value out of that pick. The concern is in the margins. Xavier Worthy, projected WR49, is the weakest projected starter and was drafted 2.4 rounds ahead of consensus, which means Jaylion paid a premium for a player who may not even deliver starter-quality production. Baker Mayfield adds another layer of uncertainty: after a strong 2024 he stumbled to a modest QB1 finish in 2025, Mike Evans is gone, and there is no clear reason to expect a full rebound this season. Nacua and London can carry weeks, but a roster this close to the middle cannot afford to have its swing pieces both miss.

Windward Ninjas didn't need a single lightning-bolt moment to build something worth watching in the Grand Theft Auto V division. The secret is in the consistency of the draft hits: Garrett Wilson, a projected WR17, slid more than a round past his ADP before the Ninjas grabbed him, and Harold Fannin came off the board a full round late for a manager who clearly had a plan. Throw in TreVeyon Henderson landing as a projected RB19 after slipping past his number, and you've got a roster constructed the quiet, grinding way that actually holds up across a long tournament. The projected starters carry real weight, from Ashton Jeanty at RB7 to Drake Maye at QB2, and the depth behind them is serviceable rather than decorative. Sitting at 49th percentile and fifth in the division, the Ninjas aren't a trendy pick, but this is a team that earned its spot through process. Sometimes steady craftsmanship beats the flashy gamble, and this roster makes a reasonable case for that every time you look at it.

IanPBrooks did not come to the Scott Fish Bowl to make friends with mediocrity. Landing Christian McCaffrey at 2.05 when the board had him priced a full round earlier is the kind of quiet discipline that separates competent drafters from dangerous ones, and pairing that with Josh Allen as a projected starter gives this roster a floor that most managers in Grand Theft Auto V simply cannot match. The steals do not stop there: Kenneth Walker III fell a full round into the fourth, and Bryce Young slipped nearly three rounds before IanPBrooks calmly collected him. The one genuine wildcard is Malik Nabers, a WR12 projection who looked every bit his spectacular self in training camp after a torn ACL cut his last season short, and whose value has been quietly creeping back up with each highlight. If Nabers is a full-go, this lineup has a high-end playmaker at nearly every tier. Five projected starters ranked inside the top 31 at their respective positions, only two minor reaches across the entire draft, and real upside waiting on the recovery. This is what a clean build looks like.

The Menehunes Tricksters land at 89th percentile and third in the division not because of one flashy swing but because they kept coming out ahead on value, pick after pick. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 anchors the whole operation, and the manager filled in around him quietly and effectively: Colston Loveland, a TE3, slipped nearly a full round past his ADP and walked right into a starting role, while DK Metcalf came off the board at 11.06 despite an ADP of 8.08, a gap of nearly three rounds that turned a late pick into a WR36 with upside. James Cook at RB5 and Dak Prescott at QB7 round out a starting core that was assembled without overpaying at any of those spots. The two major reaches, Michael Penix Jr. and Dontayvion Wicks, are real, but they land deep enough in the draft that the damage is limited. This roster did not get built on one great moment. It got built on a manager who kept finding the right price.

Lawrence & Order:BTJ didn't build this roster on one flashy swing. They built it by consistently winning the exchange, and the board reflects it. Seven of their picks landed as good value or better against ADP, headlined by Brock Purdy at QB13 taken nearly a round and a half late, and RJ Harvey at RB28 snagged more than two and a half rounds past his going price. Those are not lucky finds. That is a manager who showed up with a plan and executed it. At the foundation sits Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, surrounded by projected starters George Pickens (WR10), Emeka Egbuka (WR18), Tyler Warren (TE4), and Carnell Tate, who heads to Tennessee to link up with Cam Ward in what could be one of the more important offensive partnerships in the field. The depth holds up too, with Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 adding genuine upside beyond the projected starters. A 97th-percentile scoring finish in 2025 and a second-place division standing in 2026 suggests Lawrence & Order:BTJ is not a team chasing the conversation. They are the conversation.

TheWinchellFactor sits atop the Grand Theft Auto V division at the 99th tournament percentile, and the draft record explains why: 2 steals, 5 values, and zero reaches across the entire board. The foundation is the tight end group, where Brock Bowers (TE1) and Trey McBride (TE2) were both landed ahead of their ADPs, giving this roster a ceiling at the position most managers scramble to solve. Then the patience at quarterback tells you everything about how this draft was run, Jordan Love fell 2.5 rounds past his ADP to land at pick 9.12, and Kyler Murray slid another 1.5 rounds to follow him at 10.01, meaning TheWinchellFactor collected QB17 and QB19 for pennies on the dollar while the rest of the field overpaid elsewhere. Chase Brown (RB11) and Breece Hall (RB14) anchor the skill positions, DeVonta Smith (WR14) provides a reliable top receiver, and the depth keeps delivering value all the way down to Travis Hunter at WR62. After a 23rd-percentile finish in 2025, this looks like a roster built specifically to correct course.
