Last year's Asteroid Rage finished in the 94th percentile, and whoever is running this team in 2026 is living off that reputation like a restaurant coasting on a Yelp review from three years ago. The gap between what this roster was and what it is projected to be is stark: a 5th percentile scoring outlook and a ranking of 12th in the division tell you everything. The core issue is not one catastrophic failure but a slow bleed of projection. Saquon Barkley at RB8 and Derrick Henry at RB12 are legitimate, and the decision to take Henry a full round early at least signals conviction. But the draft was almost entirely chalk, zero steals, and the decision to burn the first overall pick on Joe Burrow at QB4 in a positionless format, where quarterback value is harder to leverage, is the kind of move that looks bold and plays conservative. The wide receiver group projects as the weakest part of the starting lineup, with Xavier Worthy as the projected fourth starter at WR49. That 94th percentile season feels very far away right now.

There is no generous framing available for what Bayou City Bruisers did in this draft, only an honest accounting of the damage. The WR group is genuinely strong, built around A.J. Brown (WR8), Nico Collins (WR9), and George Pickens (WR10), but that core cost them dearly. Brown came off the board 1.2 rounds early, and then the manager kept reaching, pulling Alec Pierce (WR32) a full 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP and DK Metcalf (WR36) another 2.2 rounds early after that, sacrificing draft capital that could have addressed everything else. What surrounds that receiver group is thin at best. The projected starters at QB are Jordan Love (QB17) and Kyler Murray (QB19), and the best available option at the other positions is Rhamondre Stevenson (RB31), who ranks as the weakest projected starter on the entire roster. This team won 81 percent of its games in 2025 and somehow came back and drafted like it had nothing to prove and nowhere to be. Eleventh in the Asteroids division, 6th percentile in the field. The Bayou City Bruisers reached, and now they will live with it.

The Guardians of the Gridiron enter 2026 sitting 10th in the Asteroids division and at the 27th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly how they got there: zero steals, seven major reaches, and one solitary value to show for a full afternoon of choices. The reaches are not scattered randomly, either. They cluster around a specific, punishing pattern of overpaying for upside players who needed to be bargains to justify the spots spent on them. Tre Tucker, projected WR65, was taken five full rounds ahead of his ADP. Tank Dell at WR74 cost nearly five rounds of premium. These are not aggressive gambles, they are a manager confusing enthusiasm for strategy. The team does have a real foundation in Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6, and the Jaxson Dart and Malik Nabers stack gives this roster a genuine ceiling, but the middle and back of the board reads like a study in paying full price for deeply uncertain contributors. Last year's 75th-percentile scoring finish earned goodwill. This draft spent it.

The Space Cowboys are parked at 9th in the Asteroids division and sitting at just the 46th percentile in the field, and the roster does not offer much reason to argue with either number. The foundation is real: Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and CeeDee Lamb (WR5) are legitimate difference-makers, and the projected starting group is respectable enough on paper. But the draft process left little margin for error and then spent that margin anyway. Five minor reaches and a major reach in Jaydon Blue (RB70), taken more than eight rounds before his ADP, suggest a team that kept betting on upside and kept paying for it. Meanwhile, the back end of the roster grades out thin, with Tony Pollard (RB30) projecting as the weakest projected starter and no obvious depth piece poised to outperform expectations. Last season's 13-23 record and 43rd-percentile scoring already told a version of this story. The 2026 edition has a shinier coat of paint on the top two names, but the structural problems underneath are the same.

Uzi Jesus sits at the 55th percentile, which is exactly as precarious as it sounds. The backfield is genuinely strong, with James Cook (RB5), Omarion Hampton (RB9), Travis Etienne (RB18), and D'Andre Swift (RB24) all projected starters, and that depth gives the manager real flexibility week to week. Josh Allen (QB1) anchors the whole operation. But the receiver group is thin at the top, Terry McLaurin (WR24) and Quentin Johnston (WR41) are serviceable starters, not difference-makers, and Johnston only lands here because he fell two full rounds past his ADP, a value that looks better on a draft recap than it might on a scoreboard. The draft skewed chalk, thirteen picks at or near consensus, which means this roster is mostly what it appears to be, no hidden upside buried in the later rounds. Eighth in the Asteroids division feels about right. The ceiling is real if Cook and Hampton stay healthy and productive. The floor is a quiet, forgettable exit. Most weeks will probably live somewhere in between.

A Cautionary Tale is the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl team that will haunt you with its almost. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Harold Fannin at TE6 give this roster a legitimate positional edge, and the trio of Drake London at WR7, Rashee Rice at WR13, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 means the top of the lineup can genuinely compete on any given week. The problem is that margins punish the middle, and this roster lives there. Sitting 7th in the Asteroids division and hovering at the 57th percentile, A Cautionary Tale drafted almost entirely to consensus, logging 14 chalk picks against zero steals, which means there is no hidden upside baked into the roster, no sleeper quietly waiting to detonate. The one major reach, Jayden Higgins at WR54 taken nearly three rounds early, is either the move that ages brilliantly or the one that defines this team's ceiling. Most weeks, A Cautionary Tale will be right there. Whether right there is enough is the only question that matters.

I B. Robin' Son didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it by consistently getting more than they paid for, round after round. Bucky Irving lands as a projected RB21 starter despite slipping nearly two rounds past his ADP, and Stefon Diggs arrived two full rounds late as well, giving this roster a pair of contributors who cost less than the market said they should. Meanwhile the quarterback room is legitimately elite, with Jayden Daniels projected at QB5 and Jalen Hurts at QB9 anchoring a group that most managers in the Asteroids division would trade for straight up. Four values against zero major reaches is the kind of draft ledger that doesn't make for great storytelling but absolutely makes for a competitive team. Sitting at the 58th percentile feels like the floor here, not the ceiling. The picks were steady, the value was real, and I B. Robin' Son enters 2026 as a squad built on discipline rather than drama, which tends to age well once the season actually starts.

Mild Head Trauma didn't swing for the fences and miss, they just kept hitting singles that turned into doubles. The clearest example is the quarterback room: Drake Maye, a QB2, fell nearly a full round past his ADP at 2.09, and Fernando Mendoza landed almost two rounds late in the 14th. Getting above-market value twice at the same position, without sacrificing anything elsewhere, is the kind of quiet competence that separates tidy drafts from memorable ones. The running back group anchors the whole thing, with Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Breece Hall at RB14 projecting as legitimate difference-makers alongside Cam Skattebo and Quinshon Judkins. The one blemish is Jonathon Brooks, taken 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, though a projected RB37 is hardly a roster-wrecking gamble. At 66th percentile in the field, this team sits in an interesting middle ground, not a favorite to run the Asteroids division, but the kind of roster that ages well, accumulating advantages that become obvious only in retrospect.

There was no single home-run swing that defines alpaca16's 2026 Scott Fish Bowl roster, just pick after pick that quietly came out ahead. The draft went chalk 14 times, which sounds unspectacular until you look at what slipped through, because Colston Loveland at TE3 falling a full round and a half to the 4.01 pick is the kind of surplus value that makes a draft sheet look like someone else's misfortune. Trey McBride at TE2 came a few spots late as well, and when you add Patrick Mahomes stacked with Travis Kelce, alpaca16 built a foundation that is genuinely hard to pick apart. The one blemish is Mahomes himself, reached at nearly two rounds early, but when a QB12 is your weakest argument against the roster, that is a fine problem to have. Sitting at the 74th percentile and fourth in the Asteroids Division, this team did not force anything. It just kept winning the transaction.

Last year Sons of Anarchy finished in the 16th percentile with a record that read more like a weather forecast for misery than a fantasy scoreboard. The 2026 version looks genuinely different. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is the kind of foundational piece that changes a team's ceiling overnight, and De'Von Achane at RB6 gives this roster a second projected starter who could carry a week by himself. The draft work sharpens the story further: Tyler Warren fell a full round and a half past his ADP to land at TE4, the sort of gift that rewards patience and punishes inattention in equal measure. Matthew Stafford, coming off an MVP season at 37 years old with the Rams now grooming his eventual replacement, has every reason to treat 2026 as a statement year, and this roster will take every touchdown he can give. The result is a team sitting third in the Asteroids division at the 77th percentile, a genuine rebound from a season that deserved to be forgotten and very nearly has been.

Fourth & Infinite looks like someone handed a spreadsheet to a surgeon and said go win a charity tournament. Sitting second in the Asteroids Division and in the 77th percentile of the field, this roster is built on conviction and patience, not desperation. The clearest proof is at the top: Lamar Jackson at QB3 anchors the whole operation, and the staff doubled down by landing Zay Flowers at WR16 and Mark Andrews at TE14 to stack around him, with Andrews arriving nearly three rounds after his ADP. That is not luck, that is target acquisition. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 gives this team a legitimate alpha, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 came at a round-and-a-half discount to sweeten it further. Even the depth holds up: David Montgomery, now competing for carries in Houston after a diminished role in Detroit, offers real upside if he wrestles the backfield away from Woody Marks. Two steals, two values, zero major reaches. Fourth & Infinite drafted like they had already done the homework, because they had.

Bumrush Brothers did not build this roster by swinging for the fences on one big bet. They built it by consistently coming out ahead, pick after pick, and the results speak for themselves: a division-leading squad sitting at the 82nd percentile entering 2026, following an 81st-percentile scoring season a year ago. The foundation is genuine. Puka Nacua lands as WR1 and was taken at 1.06, a full half-round after his ADP, which is the kind of quiet win that separates good drafters from great ones. Chris Olave at WR11 came nearly a round late. Jake Ferguson slid more than two rounds past his ADP and still projects as a starter at TE12. Cam Ward at QB23 carries the most question marks, though Tennessee's offseason investment in weapons around him gives that projection real upside. The one blemish, Kenneth Gainwell taken nearly three rounds early, is a minor asterisk on an otherwise disciplined draft. This is a team that did not need a miracle on draft day. It just needed to keep making the right call, and it mostly did.
