bjoffre sits fifth percentile in the tournament and dead last in the Galaga division, and the draft log explains exactly why. The most glaring exhibit is Lamar Jackson, a QB3 projection snagged at 1.04, nearly a full round ahead of consensus, which is the kind of pick that poisons a draft from the opening bell because it collapses the value available everywhere downstream. Then Breece Hall follows at 3.04, almost two rounds early for a RB14, and Jacory Croskey-Merritt materializes at 10.09 for a player the rest of the field had priced as RB40 in round 13. Three major reaches in one draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and the philosophy is wrong. Luther Burden is the one flicker of real upside here, a WR22 projection who spent 2025 slowly earning snaps in Chicago before erupting down the stretch, and Ben Johnson's Amon-Ra St. Brown comparisons in camp suggest the ceiling is genuine. But one live wire does not rescue a roster built on overpaying early and collecting the wreckage late.

JayWoodruff did almost everything right on draft day and has very little to show for it. The value column is legitimately impressive: Bo Nix fell a full round and a half past his ADP, Chris Godwin slid even further, and the back end of the roster is stuffed with late-round names who cost less than they should have. The problem is structural, not procedural. Pulling Garrett Wilson two full rounds early in the second slot burned capital that never got recovered, and the roster's ceiling now depends on a starting lineup where Jakobi Meyers projects as the weakest contributor at WR45. Trey McBride at TE2 and a credible receiver group headlined by Flowers, Wilson, Ladd McConkey, and Mike Evans give this team a real floor, but the 18th percentile projection does not lie. JayWoodruff drafted like someone who understood the market and still ended up in the wrong neighborhood, which is somehow worse than just drafting badly.

TheLawGivers enter 2026 sitting 10th in the Galaga division and in just the 23rd percentile of the field, and the draft did not offer much of a lifeline. The team posted zero steals and leaned heavily on chalk, which is a fine strategy when the picks land, but the two major reaches complicate things considerably. Aaron Jones, projected RB38, was taken nearly two and a half rounds early, which is the kind of investment that needs to pay off in a format this competitive and historically has not with aging backs. Chris Brazzell II came off the board nearly five rounds before his ADP and sits at WR101, a projection that leaves almost no margin for the pick to look smart. Puka Nacua at WR1 is a genuine cornerstone, and the Matthew Stafford and Nacua stack gives the team at least one coherent vision. But a cornerstone surrounded by question marks is still a building that might not stand. Last season's 36 percent win rate suggests the pattern here is not new, and nothing in the draft strongly argues that 2026 breaks it.

srshanno did everything right and still ended up here, sitting ninth in the Galaga division at the 30th percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes a person question the whole enterprise. The draft was a model of patience: 15 chalk picks, only three minor reaches, zero major reaches, and the discipline to let value come to them. It did come, in small doses. Oronde Gadsden and Cade Otton both fell past their ADP, giving the team a respectable tight end depth chart. But patience and value are only virtues if the players you accumulate can carry you, and here the math breaks down. Jaxon Smith-Njigba, A.J. Brown, and Nico Collins form a receiver group that is genuinely elite, WR3, WR8, and WR9 projected respectively. Everything else reads like an apology. The quarterback situation tops out at C.J. Stroud at QB22, the one reach on this roster, and the backfield offers nothing above RB25. srshanno played the draft correctly and built a roster that still does not add up. That is not bad luck. That is just cruelty.

Mayhomes Town enters 2026 ranked 8th in the Galaga division and sitting at just the 33rd percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The receiver corps is genuinely strong on paper, with Drake London, Chris Olave, Tetairoa McMillan, and Jaylen Waddle all projecting as starters, but in a positionless format that firepower only carries you so far when the rest of the roster drags. Harold Fannin projects as a TE6, which helps, but the QB situation is where things get uncomfortable. Drake Maye is a reasonable foundation at QB2, yet the manager spent a third-round premium to take Cam Ward at QB23, then doubled down by reaching three full rounds early on Tua Tagovailoa at QB31. That is two significant draft investments chasing players who project as backups at the position, and with zero steals and two major reaches on the draft sheet, there is no late-round windfall waiting to

bail anyone out. The 2025 squad went 7-29 and landed in the 12th percentile in scoring. This year's version looks like more of the same, just wearing a shinier shirt.

Jody Smith did not build this roster by accident. The architecture here is deliberate correlation: Dak Prescott stacked with CeeDee Lamb, Kyler Murray stacked with Justin Jefferson, two quarterback-receiver pairings that live and die together. When Lamb (WR5) and Jefferson (WR6) are both cooking, this lineup looks like a tournament threat. When they go cold on the same weekend, the floor drops fast, because the rest of the supporting cast does not offer much cushion. Rashee Rice (WR13) and Emeka Egbuka (WR18) add real depth to that receiving corps, and Egbuka in particular was a genuine value, falling nearly a round and a half past his ADP. But the correlation logic extends even to the wilder corners of the roster: Michael Pittman, now in Pittsburgh catching passes from a 43-year-old Aaron Rodgers alongside DK Metcalf on an offense still searching for an identity, is exactly the kind of boom-or-bust piece that fits a stack-heavy philosophy. Smith is not hedging. He is swinging, and in a tournament like the Scott Fish Bowl, that is a reasonable way to play it.

ONLYFANTaSyy did not build this roster on one splashy move. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 59th percentile with real upside baked in. The anchor is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, a top-tier projection that gives this roster a high floor before the rest of the lineup even factors in. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 round out a starting core that consistently projects above the middle of the field. What makes the draft impressive is how often the value kept coming late. Dalton Kincaid fell 1.1 rounds to land at TE11, Brenton Strange fell a similar distance to slot in at TE17, and Alvin Kamara dropped nearly three full rounds before ONLYFANTaSyy scooped him at RB50. Three steals and values in a single draft is not luck, it is patience. After a 32nd-percentile finish in 2025, this team has the bones to climb considerably in the Galaga division.

Bijan Of Doom did not build this roster by hunting for lightning in a bottle. They built it by simply not missing, and the draft record backs that up: five values, thirteen chalk picks, and zero major reaches across the board. The foundation is Bijan Robinson, a projected RB2 who slid nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at 1.11, and Saquon Barkley, a projected RB8 grabbed at 3.11 when the board went quiet on him longer than it should have. Those two alone give this team a ceiling most managers in the Galaga division would trade for. The rest of the supporting cast fills in cleanly, with Chase Brown at RB11, Kyren Williams at RB15, and a Jordan Love and Christian Watson stack that adds a connected upside thread running through the lineup. Jordan Addison projects as the weakest projected starter at WR43, which is the only real soft spot worth noting, but at 75th percentile in the field, Bijan Of Doom is not a team hoping for breaks. It is a team that already made them on draft day.

The whole bet here is correlation, and @tyhunterfox leaned into it without apology. The two headline stacks, Jayden Daniels paired with Terry McLaurin and Jaxson Dart paired with Malik Nabers, mean this roster doesn't just hope for a big week, it engineers one. When Daniels and McLaurin are cooking together in Washington, the ceiling on this team jumps in a way that random individual performances simply can't replicate. Daniels at QB5 was the most aggressive call on the board, taken almost a full round ahead of his ADP, but the pairing logic justifies the premium. Nabers at WR12 alongside Dart is the secondary ignition, a failsafe that gives the roster two separate paths to a massive scoring day. Brock Bowers at TE1 and James Cook at RB5 fill out the core with real projected-rank muscle, and Cook arriving as a major value at RB5 is the kind of windfall that turns a good roster into a

dangerous one. Fourth in the Galaga division and 76th percentile overall, this team has the stacked ceiling to run much higher than that.

FantasyPastor didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't gamble on a single name to carry the season. This roster was built pick by pick, quietly coming out ahead at nearly every turn. The clearest example is Josh Jacobs, projected RB16, who slid a full round and a half past his ADP before FantasyPastor scooped him at 7.03. That kind of patience compounds. Jonathan Taylor, projected RB4, was there at 2.10 when his ADP suggested he'd be gone nine spots earlier. De'Von Achane at RB6 and Derrick Henry at RB12 filled out a starting group that wasn't assembled by accident, it was assembled by staying disciplined when other managers blinked. The result is a team landing in the 84th percentile of the field with a projected starting group that includes three of the top 12 running backs and, critically, no major reaches anywhere on the board. Third in the Galaga Division is where FantasyPastor sits heading into 2026, but this roster drafts like a first-place argument waiting to be made.

Steve7294 didn't try to win the Scott Fish Bowl with one pick. This roster was built trade by trade, round by round, with the kind of quiet execution that lands you in the 85th percentile of the field and second in the Galaga division. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors everything, and Steve7294 got him at 1.07 when his ADP sat at 1.03, a small margin that still represents genuine value at the top of a draft. The supporting cast keeps delivering: Caleb Williams fell a full round past his ADP, and RJ Harvey slid more than two rounds before Steve7294 claimed him at 12.06. Harvey carries the most uncertainty on the roster, caught behind JK Dobbins in usage and efficiency last season while Denver added another back in Jonah Coleman, meaning that committee is unlikely to clear up without injuries. But one cloudy outlook at the back of the lineup barely dents a draft that logged four value picks and only one significant reach. This is what consistent execution looks like.

Barmit21 did not win the Scott Fish Bowl draft with one audacious swing. They won it by being right, repeatedly, at almost every turn. The clearest example is Christian McCaffrey, a projected RB3 who slid nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at 2.05, a quiet windfall that set the tone for everything that followed. From there, the draft just kept compounding: Brock Purdy at QB13 fell nearly two rounds into Barmit21's lap, Travis Kelce at TE10 came a round late, and a receiver corps headlined by Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Tee Higgins at WR19 gives this team a top-end that most managers would trade their entire draft for. The Jalen Hurts and Smith stack adds a ceiling that the projections alone do not fully capture. Sitting first in the Galaga division and in the 89th percentile of the field, Barmit21 is not a team that got lucky once. They just kept getting it right.
