consistency. Even the tight ends, while strong, are overshadowed by the glaring deficiencies elsewhere, compounded by Hunter Henry's questionable starting position. This season's drafts, filled with minor victories but overshadowed by costly reaches on key players like Cam Ward and Jerome Ford, have left the team without the crucial depth required for such a large-scale competition. For a team once riding high, the Shadowcat's 2025 season appears bleak, facing an uphill battle against stronger contenders.

As the 2025 fantasy football season looms, Gspot111 finds itself staring down a difficult road ahead. The team faces daunting prospects in their division, sitting near the bottom in 11th place, and their tournament ranking is equally concerning at a lowly 13th percentile. This follows a lackluster 2024 campaign that saw them falter with a 44% win rate and a finish in the 39th percentile. Despite boasting an impressive array of wide receivers, including standout Malik Nabers and promising Tetairoa McMillan, the team's fortunes are overshadowed by glaring weaknesses elsewhere. Pitts was drafted significantly earlier

than his ADP, which compounds the issue. Questionable draft decisions haven't helped, as reaching for players like Dont'e Thornton and making unnecessary early picks have stripped away potential value. With their quarterback Bo Nix also taken earlier than necessary, the team's strategy appears flawed. Even the small stack bonus from rostering Courtland Sutton and Bo Nix seems inadequate to bridge the gap. As they brace for another challenging season, Gspot111 faces an uphill battle to rise through the ranks and reverse their downward trajectory.
