Seven major reaches in a single draft is not a strategy, it is a confession, and EliazarY's board tells the whole story. Kaelon Black, a RB71 projection, was yanked off the board 8.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, and Brandon Aiyuk, sitting at WR81, cost a 14th-round pick that belonged somewhere more useful. Those are not calculated gambles on upside, they are the draft equivalent of overpaying for furniture at an airport gift shop. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 gives this roster a legitimate foundation, and the receiver group has real contributors in DeVonta Smith, Rome Odunze, Brian Thomas Jr., and Marvin Harrison Jr., all projected starters. But the draft capital burned chasing Black, Aiyuk, Eli Stowers, and MarShawn Lloyd in rounds that should have deepened the team's reliable core instead left EliazarY thin where it counts. The 2025 record of 36 percent wins with a 43rd-percentile scoring finish already raised questions about roster construction. The 2026 draft answered them badly.

Last year, btill4 was a machine, an 89th-percentile scoring operation that went 29-7 and made the rest of Super Mario Galaxy look like a warm-up act. This year's roster projects 15th percentile, and the distance between those two numbers is almost gravitational. The top end still has some shine, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 are legitimate difference-makers, but the draft process around them is where the trouble lives. Four major reaches across the board, including Brock Purdy burned at pick 4.04 against an ADP of 5.09, Deshaun Watson pulled a full four rounds ahead of consensus, and Carson Beck taken nearly seven rounds early, suggest a manager who drafted with last year's confidence and this year's wishful thinking. The values the team did find were clustered at the bottom of the roster, late-round tight ends like Jake Ferguson and Dalton Schultz who softened the blow but could not fix the foundation. The 2025 version of btill4 earned its ranking. The 2026 version is borrowing it.

toomuchsugar lands 10th in the Super Mario Galaxy division and in the 18th percentile of the field, and the roster construction explains why. The foundational piece is real: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, a genuine elite anchor that most managers would kill for. But the drop-off after that top tier is steep, and the draft didn't do much to paper over it. Three major reaches defined the board, and two of them were at quarterback. Jaxson Dart was drafted nearly three full rounds before his ADP, and the scouting file on him reads like a highlight reel stapled to an injury report, a mobile, tantalizing profile with real questions about whether the passing can sustain a starting job long-term. Shedeur Sanders came off the board four-plus rounds early and projects as QB32. That is a lot of capital chasing a position where the upside is, generously, uncertain. With Courtland Sutton projecting as WR37 as the top receiver option, there is no obvious ceiling game on this roster. Gibbs is a foundation. The problem is there's not much house built on top of it.

Team Star Fox did almost everything right on draft day, and that is precisely what makes this roster so hard to look at. The values are real: Chuba Hubbard at RB29 fell more than a round past his ADP, DK Metcalf at WR36 slipped a similar distance, and the Jared Goff / Amon-Ra St. Brown stack gives the team a genuine WR4 anchor with a compatible quarterback behind him. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 makes this a legitimately elite receiver corps on paper. But the patience exercised across most of the draft evaporates when you see that Fernando Mendoza, projected QB27, was taken nearly five rounds before his ADP in round seven, which is the kind of overcorrection that distorts a whole roster. When your single biggest deviation from market value is an early quarterback who ranks twenty-seventh at his position, the wins column on the rest of the draft loses some of its luster. Sitting ninth in the Super Mario Galaxy division and in just the 19th percentile of the field, Star Fox drafted carefully, bought value wherever it existed, and still arrived somewhere they did not intend to go.

skywalka2000 enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Super Mario Galaxy division and clocking in at just the 38th percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The upside here lives almost entirely on paper. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Jayden Daniels at QB5 are genuinely elite anchors, and Rashee Rice graded out as a WR13 when healthy. That last qualifier is doing a lot of heavy lifting. Rice is reportedly heading to jail for a probation violation, is recovering from a knee procedure, and has now missed significant time in back-to-back seasons before this one even starts. Banking on Rice as a difference maker is the kind of optimism that requires serious faith in a player who has given managers every reason to hedge. Strip Rice out of the picture and the roster slides from thin to worrying, with Jonathon Brooks projecting as the weakest projected starter at RB37. The draft offered no relief, producing zero steals and two major reaches. There is no hidden lever here, no late-round coup quietly waiting to pay off. This is the roster, and the ceiling is probably already visible from the floor.

taylamazing enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Super Mario Galaxy division and hovering around the 40th percentile of the field, and the roster makes it hard to argue with either number. The receiver group is the one genuine bright spot, with Ja'Marr Chase projected as WR2 and Tee Higgins and Ladd McConkey both coming in around WR19 and WR20, giving this team real firepower at the top. The problem is that everything feeding into that promise gets undercut by the quarterback situation. Jalen Hurts, taken a full 1.3 rounds before his ADP at pick 2.08, projects as a QB9, which is fine but not the elite anchor you expect when you burn a second-round pick on the position. Then Sam Darnold, reached 2.5 rounds early at 6.08, projects all the way down at QB21, making him the weakest projected starter on the roster. Two early investments at quarterback and the team lands middling production at both. Chase can only carry so much weight, and right now there is no obvious fix waiting on the bench.

Inglorious Fleabags sits at 43rd percentile and sixth in the Super Mario Galaxy division, which means every week is going to come down to execution rather than talent gap. The receiver group is the engine here: Drake London at WR7, George Pickens at WR10, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 give this team a legitimate top-end that can win matchups outright. The problem is that the quarterback situation behind those weapons is genuinely shaky, and shaky quarterbacks have a way of making good receivers look ordinary. Kyler Murray at QB19 was reached for 1.3 rounds early, Kirk Cousins at QB35 was pulled nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP, and the draft capital spent chasing passers who probably did not deserve it represents exactly the kind of inefficiency that bites a middle-of-the-pack team in a long tournament. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is a stabilizing force, and Jauan Jennings falling to 2.7 rounds past his ADP qualifies as a legitimate late-round gift. But in a season defined by margins, the quarterback spending may be the margin that matters most.

Houston Heights FC didn't build this roster with one flashy move. They built it pick by pick, coming out ahead more often than not, and the cumulative effect is a team that belongs in the Super Mario Galaxy division conversation. The foundation starts at the top: Josh Allen, projected QB1, was still on the board at 1.10 when Houston pounced, a modest slip that paid dividends immediately. The running game piles up depth through Jeremiyah Love (RB13), Javonte Williams (RB17), and TreVeyon Henderson (RB19), with Henderson himself arriving two rounds later than his ADP suggested he would. Then there's Michael Pittman, the draft's clearest win for this squad, sliding more than two full rounds past his ADP before Houston grabbed him at 12.03 as a WR44 with real upside. Lamar Jackson (QB3) and Kyle Pitts (TE7) round out a core that doesn't have a soft spot at the top. Last year's 94th percentile scoring output confirmed this front office knows how to translate draft efficiency into points, and the 2026 construction suggests they haven't forgotten.

My Little Tonys didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it on accumulation. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a ceiling most managers can only project onto a spreadsheet, and Kenneth Walker III landing at RB10 after sliding a full round past his ADP turned a strong group into a genuinely elite one. Luther Burden at WR22 arrived in similar fashion, falling more than a round past his ADP before My Little Tonys scooped him up, and the Caleb Williams stack gives that connection extra upside when things click. Williams himself projects as QB6, and while Malik Willis was taken about two rounds earlier than his ADP warranted, that is a minor blemish on a draft that otherwise kept coming out ahead of the market. Sitting 67th percentile in the field and fourth in the Super Mario Galaxy division, this team looks quietly dangerous, not because of one knockout blow, just consistent execution.

CableBoxScore didn't win the draft in one dramatic moment, they won it across nineteen rounds of consistent, disciplined decision-making, and the roster shows it. The top of the lineup is genuinely hard to argue with: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, A.J. Brown sits at WR8, and the Matthew Stafford / Nacua stack adds a layer of connective upside that tightens the whole thing together. Jameson Williams at WR21 gives the group a third projected starter with real ceiling, and Colston Loveland at TE3 is the kind of anchor most managers are scrambling to find by round eight. What makes the draft grade especially clean is that CableBoxScore got there without overpaying. Dalton Kincaid, Brenton Strange, and Pat Freiermuth all came in a round or more after their ADP, adding legitimate depth at a position where late-round value rarely lasts. The result is a team sitting third in the division and in the 76th percentile of the field, built not on one inspired gamble but on a draft that kept coming out ahead.

KingDubz91 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick, they won it pick by pick, and the ledger reflects it. Four values across the roster, thirteen chalk selections, and only one major reach tell the story of a manager who stayed disciplined and let the board come to them. Chase Brown, projected at RB11, slid nearly a full round past his ADP at 4.06, and D.J. Moore, projected at WR26, fell almost two rounds before KingDubz91 scooped him at 8.06. Those aren't lottery tickets, they're the kind of quiet wins that compound into a legitimate roster. Add a projected TE2 in Trey McBride anchoring the tight end spot, a top-five signal caller in Joe Burrow leading the way at QB4, and a supporting cast that includes Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18, and this team isn't hoping to be competitive, it's built to be. A 75 percent win rate and a 93rd-percentile scoring finish in 2025 suggest KingDubz91 knows how to do this. The Super Mario Galaxy division should be worried.

DaBeervangelist sits at the top of the Super Mario Galaxy division and in the 98th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains exactly why: five values, one outright steal, and only one major reach across the whole board. This is a roster built with discipline and rewarded with talent. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Nico Collins at WR9 give this team a pair of projected elite-tier weapons, while James Cook at RB5 and Derrick Henry at RB12 anchor the backfield with legitimate star power. The real craftsmanship shows in the depth: Tucker Kraft lands as a TE5 projection after a serious ACL injury, but he came off the preseason PUP list before August and returns to a Packers receiving corps that shed more talent than it added, setting the table for him to reclaim the starring role he was building before the injury. George Kittle at TE9 slid two rounds past his ADP as a bonus. There is very little to pick apart here. DaBeervangelist drafted like someone who came prepared, and the standings reflect it.
