Jason Summers sits dead last in the IceHockey division and in the 1st percentile of the entire tournament, and the draft sheet explains exactly how he got there. The headline offense is Matthew Stafford, a QB14, taken in the first round at pick 1.11, more than four rounds ahead of his ADP, as if Summers needed to guarantee himself a middling quarterback before anyone else could accidentally draft one. That pick set the tone for everything that followed: Juwan Johnson, a TE20, went in the sixth round when his ADP suggested he'd still be available in round eleven, and Courtland Sutton, a WR37, was snatched nearly three rounds early in round five. The cumulative portrait is a manager who spent premium draft capital on players ranked firmly in the middle of their position tiers while the board offered better. Five major reaches across a roster that finished with one steal tells you this was not a draft undone by bad luck. It was a draft undone by impatience, and the projections are ready to make Summers pay for it all season.

Paul Stanosheck's draft reads like a case study in how to turn a high pick into a liability. Taking Joe Burrow at 1.01 when his ADP sat at 2.05 is the kind of move that costs a manager the best non-quarterback on the board, and the ripple effects never stopped. Justin Herbert came off the board nearly a full round early at 2.12, James Conner got grabbed at 13.01 despite an ADP closer to round 18, and Colby Parkinson, a TE31, somehow warranted a 12th-round commitment nearly three rounds before the market said he was worth it. The final tally: zero steals, zero values, five major reaches. Every single pick landed at or above ADP, which is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and the philosophy did not work. The team projects 7th percentile in the tournament and 11th in the division, and with Rhamondre Stevenson penciled in as a projected starter, the floor is very much visible from here.

Jeff Presley is sitting at tenth in the IceHockey division and the 27th percentile of the field, and the roster tells you exactly why. The top of the lineup is genuinely good, Bijan Robinson at RB2, Ashton Jeanty at RB7, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give Presley a foundation most managers would envy, but the receiver group falls off a cliff fast, with Marvin Harrison Jr. checking in at WR33 as the best of a thin bunch. None of those receivers are projected starters, meaning Presley is essentially asking backfield depth to carry the whole operation. The draft did not help matters. Jared Goff was taken nearly a round and a half ahead of his ADP at QB16, and Keenan Allen was snatched seven and a half rounds early at WR99, which is the kind of whiff that echoes all season. There were values found elsewhere, but no single pick is good enough to offset what was surrendered on those two reaches. Presley has real talent at the top and a very long drop-off after it, and that is a hard shape to win with.

Andy Goldstein did almost everything right on draft day. Eight values across the roster, only one major reach, and a receiver corps headlined by Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) that would make most managers jealous. The problem is that good process and good outcomes are not the same thing, and Goldstein's 2026 roster illustrates that gap with uncomfortable precision. His starting backfield, anchored by Breece Hall (RB14) and Quinshon Judkins (RB22), is serviceable but not special, and the projected floor of this lineup, sitting 34th percentile in the tournament, suggests the receiver depth that looked like clever late-round accumulation may simply be a collection of WR48-range players like Jayden Reed waiting their turn. The Fernando Mendoza (QB27) reach in round nine, taken nearly three rounds ahead of schedule, cost him real capital at a position where the return is essentially zero. Goldstein drafted like a man who understood the market. The market still beat him.

Christian Peterson is sitting at 38th percentile and eighth in the IceHockey division, and the roster makes that standing feel about right. The top of the lineup has genuine appeal: Lamar Jackson projects as a QB3, Trey McBride as a TE2, and Jeremiyah Love and Cam Skattebo give Peterson two RBs inside the top 20. That is a respectable foundation. The problem is everything below it. The draft tendencies tell the real story: eight chalk picks, four minor reaches, two major reaches, and not a single steal anywhere on the board. Peterson reached 3.4 rounds early for Cooper Kupp, who projects as WR88, and 3.3 rounds early for Kayshon Boutte, who projects as WR76. Those two picks burned real draft capital on players who project near the bottom of usable fantasy options, and they left Peterson with no late-round upside to bail him out. When your best values are Rome Odunze at WR30 and RJ Harvey at RB28, the ceiling is already visible from the ground floor.

Jody Plante's 2026 roster is the kind that makes bracket-watchers shrug, and that ambiguity cuts both ways. The ceiling is real: Puka Nacua at WR1 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a top-shelf receiving corps that can carry a week when everything clicks, and Patrick Mahomes at QB12 keeps the floor from dropping out entirely. But a 14-14 record and 26th-percentile scoring in 2025 is a reminder that having good players and winning consistently are different problems, and Plante's draft did little to resolve that tension. The strategy leaned chalk, with 10 picks matching consensus and five minor reaches suggesting a manager chasing comfort over upside. The one major reach, Chimere Dike at WR84, is the kind of late-round swing that either looks prophetic or quietly disappears into the waiver wire. Sitting seventh in the IceHockey division at the 45th percentile, Plante is not out of contention and not safely in it. The margins decide this, and right now those margins are genuinely unclear.

James Hartzfeld drafted like someone who knew something the board didn't, and the resulting roster makes a reasonable case that he was right. Four major reaches in a single draft is the kind of thing that gets you roasted in a recap, and three of them, Deshaun Watson at QB34, Jerry Jeudy at WR66, and Malik Washington at WR71, are tough to defend on paper. But while Hartzfeld was busy gambling in the late rounds, his early board was quietly excellent: De'Von Achane at RB6, Garrett Wilson at WR17, and Zay Flowers at WR16 form a projected starting core that holds up under scrutiny, and a Josh Allen/D.J. Moore stack gives the roster a ceiling most managers in the IceHockey division would envy. Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 is the interesting wildcard, a player whose 2025 raised real questions about his connection with Trevor Lawrence after a dazzling year prior. If Thomas bounces back, Hartzfeld looks like a genius. If the reaches and the Thomas regression all land at once, this 67th-percentile projection feels about right.

Tod Burros didn't swing for the fences and whiff, he just kept making the right call again and again. The receiver group is where that discipline shows most clearly: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the whole operation, and Malik Nabers landed at WR12 despite being available nearly a full round past his ADP, the kind of quiet gift that separates good drafters from lucky ones. George Pickens at WR10 rounds out a top tier that most managers in this field would envy. The Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack adds a layer of upside that doesn't require everything to break right, just one big Daniels game to pay dividends across the lineup. The draft chart leans heavy on chalk, which isn't a knock, it means Burros identified his targets and didn't panic off them. Sitting fifth in the IceHockey division and at the 68th percentile of the field, this is a team that probably outperforms its seed once the weeks start stacking up.

Matt Bruns did not land here by accident. Sitting at 76th percentile and fourth in the IceHockey Division, this roster reads like a draft built on patience and positioning rather than any single moment of brilliance. The foundation is exactly what you want: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give Bruns a top-of-market core that most managers would envy, while Caleb Williams at QB6 came four picks later than his ADP suggested he would, a quiet gift Bruns accepted without making a fuss. The tight end depth is where the draft really separates itself, with five values landing across that position group, including Jake Ferguson and Dalton Kincaid both slipping nearly two rounds past their ADPs. The weakest projected starter on this roster is Isaiah Likely at TE13, which tells you something about the overall floor here, and Likely himself heads to the New York Giants with a light tight end room and a familiar voice in John Harbaugh calling the shots. Round after round, Bruns came out ahead. That adds up.

Jay Sjovall didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't mortgage future picks for a single star, just drafted smartly and repeatedly came out ahead of the board. The proof is in the values: Mike Evans, projected WR27 and a legitimate starter, slid nearly two rounds past his ADP before Sjovall scooped him up in round eight. Tucker Kraft, projected TE5, fell a round and a half before landing at pick 6.06. Add Brock Bowers at TE1 and Colston Loveland at TE3 as projected starters, and Sjovall has assembled one of the more quietly devastating groups of pass-catchers in the field. Omarion Hampton projects at RB9 to anchor the backfield, and Rashee Rice at WR13 gives the team another genuine difference-maker. The Purdy-Evans stack adds a ceiling that the overall draft profile, heavy on value and almost entirely free of major reaches, does nothing to undercut. Third in the division and 79th percentile in the tournament, this roster belongs in the conversation because Sjovall earned it pick by pick.

Mike Clay didn't swing for fences in the Scott Fish Bowl so much as he kept hitting the ball squarely, and the cumulative effect is a roster sitting at the 100th percentile in the tournament. The draft tells the story: one steal, four values, and only three minor reaches against zero major ones. Christian McCaffrey sliding to 2.05 when his ADP sat at 1.09 is the headliner, landing a projected RB3 at a meaningful discount. But the quieter wins matter just as much. Josh Jacobs fell nearly two rounds to pick 7.08, and Harold Fannin, a projected TE6 who essentially outproduced his veteran teammate last year before Cleveland let that teammate walk entirely, came at 6.05 against an ADP of 5.04. Yes, the Browns' quarterback room is a genuine concern for Fannin's ceiling, but any offensive improvement there turns him into a genuine difference-maker. Jaxon Smith-Njigba rounds out the top of the lineup at a projected WR3. Clay didn't need a single dramatic moment. He just kept winning the exchange, and now he's second in the IceHockey division with a roster built to stay there.

Mike Krueger sits atop the IceHockey division and in the 100th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster was not built on luck, it was built on discipline. Krueger landed CeeDee Lamb, a projected WR5, nearly a full round after consensus said he should have been gone, then turned around and did the same thing with Drake London (WR7) and Chris Olave (WR11), both slipping past their ADPs by significant margins. Across the full draft, nine players qualified as clear values and not a single reach appears on the board. The starting lineup is equally clean: Lamb and London headline a receiver corps that also features Luther Burden (WR22) and Jordyn Tyson (WR34) as projected starters, while Jahmyr Gibbs (RB1) anchors the backfield at the very top of his position. Jalen Hurts (QB9) runs the offense and pairs with a Shough-Olave stack for tournament upside. The weakest projected starter is Tyler Shough at QB20, which is about as comfortable a floor as this format allows. This is what it looks like when someone actually does their homework.
