While some draft picks provided value, misguided decisions to reach for players like Quentin Johnston and

George Kittle early have cost them dearly. Plotting a path to improvement in a fiercely competitive landscape is daunting, leaving YesCers to face a likely repeat of past struggles, anchored firmly at the bottom of both their division and overall standings.

As ForTheShoe12 embarks on the 2025 fantasy football season, their prospects seem bleak. With a ranking of 10th in the Indiana Fever division and only the 17th percentile overall, the team faces an uphill battle. Their quarterback situation is particularly concerning, with Anthony Richardson struggling at QB27, offering little hope for consistent production. The running back corps doesn't fare much better, as Breece Hall, though ranked RB13, is expected to shoulder too much of the load amidst a lack of depth. While the wide receiver lineup boasts impressive talent, including CeeDee Lamb and Puka Nacua, the decision to start Brandon Aiyuk WR50 exposes a glaring vulnerability that opponents will look to exploit. Despite strong tight ends in this TE premium setup, the team's draft missteps and reaching for players like Ollie Gordon and Rashod Bateman have left them

overextended and underperforming. With these challenges ahead, ForTheShoe12's chances of rising through the ranks appear slim, casting a shadow over what looks to be another difficult season.

As the season unfolds, "Skyy is the Limit" will rely heavily on its strengths while hoping that strategic gambles and key performances can propel them to greater heights in both their division and beyond.

As OGJMum gears up for the 2025 fantasy football season, their outlook is filled with both promise and potential challenges. However, the wide receiver position presents a concern, with Jayden Reed and Wan'Dale Robinson not quite measuring up to the competition. These weaknesses could pose a risk if

opposing teams manage to exploit them. Running back De'Von Achane offers a beacon of hope with his notable draft value, closely followed by Josh Jacobs and Joe Mixon, who add depth to the backfield. Yet, Rhamondre Stevenson, projected as a starter, seems to be a potential weak link. His performance will undoubtedly be a crucial factor in determining OGJMum's success this season. Despite securing some players after their average draft positions and taking a gamble on Russell Wilson earlier than expected, OGJMum also reached significantly for others, potentially hindering their overall value. As the season unfolds, it will be interesting to see if these decisions pay off or if they become obstacles in OGJMum's quest to climb both the division and overall rankings.
