thurybff arrives in 2026 sitting at the 6th percentile of the field, and the draft did little to change the trajectory. The running back group is genuinely impressive, with Ashton Jeanty, Jeremiyah Love, Kyren Williams, Quinshon Judkins, and Bhayshul Tuten all projecting as starters, and that depth is real. But this is a positionless format, and the players outside that core are where the wheels come off. Sam Darnold projects as QB21 with Fernando Mendoza and Shedeur Sanders behind him, a quarterback room that reads like a support group for cautious optimism. Jaxon Smith-Njigba is a legitimate WR3, but D.J. Moore was taken two full rounds early and Pat Bryant, reached nearly three rounds ahead of ADP, projects all the way down at WR86. When your draft capital is going toward Bryant and Trey Benson at the cost of market efficiency, you are not building depth, you are burning picks. The running backs give thurybff a floor, but this roster has no ceiling to speak of, and none of the obvious levers left to pull.

Last year, Slim Pickens posted an 87th-percentile scoring season and looked like a team that had figured something out. This year, the projections place them 11th in the Inside division and in just the 16th percentile of the field, which is the kind of fall that demands an explanation. The roster has genuine pieces: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and George Pickens at WR10 form a legitimate top-end foundation, and Harold Fannin projects as a TE6. But the draft that assembled this team offers little comfort. Fourteen chalk picks and a major reach on Fannin, pulled nearly two rounds ahead of his average draft position, suggests a manager who paid full price everywhere it hurt most. The supporting cast fades quickly, with Jaylen Warren projected as the weakest starter at RB27 and little behind him that inspires confidence. The gap between what Slim Pickens was in 2025 and what they are projected to be in 2026 is not a slump waiting to self-correct. It looks more like a reputation outlasting the roster that earned it.

There is no sugarcoating the situation in the Inside division for Lewis Oil: sitting 10th in the division and in just the 21st percentile of the field, this roster is in genuine trouble, and the draft did not generate the surplus value needed to escape it. The one area that looks genuinely strong, the backfield, is undercut by the presence of RJ Harvey among the projected starters. Harvey enters 2026 ranked RB28, but Denver's backfield is a committee waiting to happen, with veteran JK Dobbins back and the Broncos having added Jonah Coleman in the spring, which means Harvey's path to the kind of workload that justifies a starting spot is narrow at best. Elsewhere, the team paid early for Garrett Wilson, taking the WR17 a full round and a half before his average draft position, which is the kind of premium that leaves a roster thin on late-round upside. A 16-20 record last year suggested this manager already knows what it feels like to tread water. The 2026 outlook offers little reason to expect anything different.

Last year, CharlieLWHU posted a 26-10 record and scored in the 84th percentile, the kind of season that buys a manager real credibility going into a new draft. The 2026 roster does not look like that team. The receiver room is genuinely elite, with Puka Nacua projecting as WR1, Malik Nabers at WR12, and Chris Olave at WR11 forming a top line that almost any manager in this field would envy. But the draft that built this roster is where the confidence starts to crack: three major reaches, including Travis Kelce burned at pick 5.01 despite an ADP of 7.05 and Juwan Johnson taken two full rounds early, suggest a manager chasing familiarity rather than value. Patrick Mahomes lands at QB12 in a positionless format, which makes the Mahomes-Kelce stack feel more like sentiment than strategy. The 26th percentile projection and a ninth-place division rank tell the story plainly. The reputation from 2025 is real. The roster built to defend it is something else entirely.

For the kids enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Inside division and projecting at just the 35th percentile of the field, and the draft board tells you most of what you need to know about why. The manager leaned hard on receiver upside in the late rounds, reaching an average of four-plus rounds early on Tory Horton (WR93), Malachi Fields (WR90), Denzel Boston (WR58), and Dontayvion Wicks (WR96), a quartet of dart throws that collectively cost the team the kind of proven depth that wins weekly matchups. The top of the roster is genuinely good, A.J. Brown (WR8), DeVonta Smith (WR14), Trey McBride (TE2), and Ladd McConkey (WR20) form a legitimate starting core, but the projected weakest starter is Matthew Golden (WR52), and with Trevor Lawrence (QB10) and Jordan Love (QB17) carrying the quarterback room, the ceiling only stretches so far. Five major reaches and zero steals leave this team with little margin for error and no obvious lever to pull when those late-round fliers inevitably flame out.

jjray1997 enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Inside division and in just the 38th tournament percentile, which is a polite way of saying the floor is visible and the ceiling is not much higher. The draft tells a painful story: three major reaches on Jordyn Tyson, Troy Franklin, and Tyler Warren cost real capital, and while Warren projects as a TE4 starter, Tyson was taken 2.4 rounds before his ADP and Franklin nearly three rounds early, meaning this roster paid a premium for players who grade out in the WR34 and WR80 range respectively. Drake Maye landing as a QB2 value at pick 4.03 is genuinely good news, but one quarterback cannot carry a lineup when the projected floor of the starting group bottoms out at Michael Wilson at WR39. A 9-27 record and 22nd-percentile scoring in 2025 already suggested structural problems, and the 2026 construction does not obviously fix them. There is no clear lever left to pull here, just a long season of hoping the projections are wrong.

adubtreylaw sits at 48th percentile entering 2026, and that number tells the whole story: good enough to be dangerous on the right week, fragile enough to collapse on the wrong one. The top of the roster is genuinely appealing, Lamar Jackson at QB3 landed in round four when his ADP sat in round two, and Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give the lineup a legitimate ceiling. But this team lives and dies by what the middle of the roster produces, and that is where the questions pile up. Parker Washington had a surprising breakout to earn a WR35 projection, but whether Jacksonville actually wants him as their lead receiver or whether Travis Hunter or Brian Thomas Jr. eventually reclaims that role is unresolved, and unresolved is a rough word for a team that cannot afford many slippage points. Kenneth Gainwell projects as the weakest projected starter at RB34, and in a format where margins decide seasons, leaning on Gainwell in a meaningful week feels like a bet you did not exactly plan to make.

tobinp99 didn't win the draft on one flashy pick, they won it in the margins, round after round. The headliner is Joe Burrow at QB4, taken nearly two rounds after his ADP, which is the kind of thing that looks obvious in hindsight and almost never happens in practice. Stack Burrow with projected starter Tee Higgins at WR19 and you have a high-floor connection already baked in. Beyond that, the receiver group is genuinely deep at the top, with Drake London projecting as WR7 and a supporting cast that includes Davante Adams, Mike Evans, and Marvin Harrison Jr. all as projected starters. Then there's Brock Bowers at TE1, which quietly functions as a weekly advantage in a format where tight end separates rosters. Mark Andrews at TE14 came as good value too, taken over a round past his ADP. The 2025 result, 32nd percentile in scoring, is worth noting, but this roster is built differently. Fifth in the division and 66th percentile tournament-wide reads as conservative for a team that consistently came out ahead at the draft table.

Inside Zone didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by coming out ahead on deal after deal, and the roster reflects that kind of disciplined patience. Jalen Hurts landed nearly two rounds past his expected slot, and a QB9 projection at that price is the kind of quiet advantage that compounds over a long season. The backfield is where this team really makes its case, with James Cook at RB5, Chase Brown at RB11, and Josh Jacobs at RB16 all projecting as starters, giving Inside Zone a depth of top-end talent that most managers would envy. Josh Allen at QB1 anchors the whole thing with the kind of ceiling that makes a roster hard to beat on any given week. The receiver group projects a little lighter, with Jayden Reed as the weakest projected starter at WR48, but in a positionless format the strength elsewhere more than compensates. Sitting fourth in the division and 70th percentile in the field after a 61 percent win rate in 2025, Inside Zone looks like a team that knows exactly what it's doing.

BigfootBrawlers did not build this roster with one splashy move. They built it pick by pick, and the receipts are clean: Dak Prescott at QB7 slid nearly three rounds past his ADP before this team scooped him at 6.02, and Dalton Kincaid at TE11 fell two full rounds before landing here at 9.11. Those are not flukes, that is a manager who sat still and let the board come to them. The foundation underneath those values is just as steady: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Colston Loveland at TE3 anchor the starting lineup, Matthew Stafford at QB14 adds genuine depth at a position most managers treat as an afterthought, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Jaylen Waddle at WR23 give this team legitimate production in the passing game. The 2025 campaign finished near the median at 49th percentile, but this roster projects as a clear step forward, and a third-place division standing at the 71st tournament percentile suggests the step is already showing up where it counts.

Music City Miracles sits at 94th percentile in the field and second in the Inside Division, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. The value hunting here was relentless: Jayden Daniels landed four rounds past his ADP, Justin Herbert fell three full rounds, and both are projected starters. That kind of discipline at the top of the board sets a team apart. The receiver corps is where this roster turns genuinely dangerous, with Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, Nico Collins at WR9, and Jameson Williams at WR21 all projecting into the starting lineup. Rashee Rice at WR13 is the one variable worth watching closely, a gifted starter who has spent more time in medical reports and court filings than on the field lately, but if he suits up healthy, that group becomes almost unfair. The minor reach on Rice makes sense given the ceiling. With only two minor reaches against three outright steals and fourteen chalk picks, this is a roster built on patience and process. Music City Miracles did not get lucky. They got disciplined.

The Dude sits first in the Inside Division and at the 96th percentile tournament-wide, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The backbone of this roster is genuinely elite: Bijan Robinson at RB2, De'Von Achane at RB6, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this team a top-end that most managers would dismantle their rosters to acquire. Yes, Barkley comes with real questions, a step back in 2025 amid Philadelphia's offensive line chaos, and at 29 there are credible whispers about a reduced workload going forward, but pairing him alongside Robinson and Achane means The Dude absorbs that uncertainty without flinching. Then there is the draft discipline. Caleb Williams fell to 4.11 despite projecting as QB6. Jadarian Price, a projected RB26 starter, came at 10.11 against a 9.09 ADP. The team logged nine values or better against only two major reaches, and those reaches landed deep in the draft where the cost is manageable. This is a roster built without panic, without overpaying, and without apology.
