As the 2025 fantasy football season approaches, Laces Out appears to be in for a challenging year. With a division rank of 10 and sitting in the lower 27th percentile overall, optimism is in short supply. The team's glaring weaknesses start at the quarterback position, where Trevor Lawrence, reaching QB19 status, might not be enough to carry the load. Despite a formidable wide receiver corps, featuring standout Malik Nabers at WR4 and reliable options like Brian Thomas Jr. and Davante Adams, the team struggles with depth at running back. Rhamondre Stevenson, inexplicably taken earlier than his ADP suggested, leads a group that barely scrapes together a ranking of 7 in the division. Meanwhile, the team gambled on Russell Wilson and Shedeur Sanders, taking them both earlier than necessary, but it's unlikely these investments will pay off against stiffer competition.

Even Travis Kelce, a once-reliable tight end, was picked much too soon, costing Laces Out valuable draft capital. With such missteps and questionable decisions, this team faces an uphill battle to improve their standing, both in their division and overall.
