As Seneca prepares to face both division rivals and broader competition, the lingering question remains: can their phenomenal wide receivers compensate for the shortcomings that impede them, or will this season be a weary march through unfulfilled expectations?

Even though there are glimpses of potential in the youthful squad, any sense of progress is overshadowed by questionable draft decisions, such as the premature selections of Omarion Hampton and others who were taken well before their expected spots. With an unfavorable ranking

both in their division and overall, SANTOS finds itself in need of more than just a shake-up if they are to avoid being entrenched in the lower echelons yet again.

Braelon Allen offering great value, the overall outlook remains bleak, making any hope of rising through the ranks seem like a tall order. As such, fans and analysts alike might expect a season riddled with frustrations and missed opportunities.
