Smitty2016 enters 2026 sitting at the bottom of the John Madden Football division, and the draft record explains exactly why: three major reaches and zero steals across the board. The most damaging of those reaches is Hunter Henry, a TE18 projection pulled four full rounds before his average draft position, a move that would be defensible if Henry were a top-five tight end but is simply indefensible when he is not. Then there is Tony Pollard, a RB30 taken nearly four rounds early, burning a mid-round pick on a back whose ceiling is already baked in at that rank. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is a genuine anchor, and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 projects as a real contributor despite being a reach himself, so this roster is not without pulse. But when your clearest good decision is Kenyon Sadiq falling one round past his ADP in the twelfth, and your draft chart otherwise reads like a list of enthusiasm overriding information, the 2nd-percentile projection starts to feel less like bad luck and more like a consequence.

There is no spin available for SwiftieSquad, and honestly, the draft log does not leave much room to try. Seven major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and the results confirm what that philosophy produces. The most damaging pick was Sam Darnold, hauled off the board at 3.12 despite an ADP of 9.02, a five-round premium for a QB21 projection that would embarrass a roster even if it were free. That pick alone cost SwiftieSquad a round of real value at the top of their board, and it shows: Justin Jefferson and Malik Nabers give this team a functional ceiling, but the supporting cast was assembled by ignoring market price at nearly every turn. Rico Dowdle burned a sixth-round pick for an RB32, Cooper Kupp cost a 13th for an WR88, and Kyle Monangai, the projected weakest starter at RB33, arrived two full rounds early anyway. A team that scored in the 26th percentile last year and is currently sitting 11th in the division has not earned the benefit of the doubt. Nothing here changes that math.

Joe920 finished 25th percentile or worse in 2025 and somehow responded by drafting worse, logging three major reaches against zero steals in a draft that reads like a hostage negotiation where the hostage lost. The most damning of those reaches is Bo Nix, taken 2.7 rounds ahead of his QB15 projection at a pick that should have landed a legitimate difference-maker. Instead, Joe920 spent a third-round pick on a quarterback who sits outside the top ten, then doubled down by stacking him with Jaylen Waddle, a WR23 who was himself a reach at pick 4.06. When the most reliable player on a roster is Trey McBride, a TE2, and the projected weakest starter is Michael Pittman at WR44, the math does not flatter the rest of the board. Nothing here was stolen, nothing was found, and the draft capital was distributed with the confidence of someone who knew exactly what they were doing and the results of someone who absolutely did not. A 7th percentile projection and a 10th-place division standing feel like fair witnesses.

stephaniab's 2026 campaign is a case study in what happens when a manager drafts with their heart instead of their head, and the results are sitting right there in the ledger: zero steals, zero values, and four major reaches across a draft that somehow found a way to overpay at every meaningful junction. The most damning entry is George Kittle, a TE9 projection snagged nearly two and a half rounds early, followed immediately by T.J. Hockenson, a TE23 pulled more than three rounds before ADP caught up, all while the top of the roster was already surrendering draft capital to Derrick Henry, a RB12 taken nearly a full round ahead of schedule. Meanwhile, Puka Nacua shines at WR1 and Nico Collins sits comfortably at WR9, so this isn't a roster without talent, it's a roster where the talent that exists was purchased at such a premium that everything beneath it is thin and desperate. stephaniab finished 14th percentile in scoring last season and currently projects 8th percentile in the field. The trend line does not require a translator.

There is no gentle way to say this: Cavs91 is sitting at 9th percentile in the field heading into 2026, and the roster does not offer much reason for optimism. The backfield is genuinely impressive, with De'Von Achane (RB6), Ashton Jeanty (RB7), and Chase Brown (RB11) forming a tier that most managers would envy, but the draft history reveals a problem: Cavs91 paid through the nose to get here, reaching on Jeanty a full round early and pulling Travis Etienne (RB18) more than two rounds before consensus. That is capital spent on players the market would have delivered later, and it left the receiver group threadbare, topped by Emeka Egbuka (WR18) and Parker Washington (WR35), a player whose WR35 projection rests on a single breakout season that the Jaguars may not have particularly wanted from him. At quarterback, Baker Mayfield (QB18) and Tyler Shough (QB20) are the ceiling and the floor, and neither reading is especially comfortable. Cavs91 is not without talent, but the path from here to contention is hard to draw.

There is no gentle way to say this about packersgrl: 2026 looks like a long autumn. The good news is real, just not quite enough. Christian McCaffrey projects as RB3, Saquon Barkley as RB8, and Patrick Mahomes as QB12, a legitimately elite foundation. The problem is everything built on top of it. Mahomes cost a major reach, Barkley cost a major reach, and the roster still grades out seventh in the division and at the 40th percentile of the field, which tells you that overpaying for stars at the top compressed the depth badly enough to matter. The 2025 season posted a 7th-percentile scoring finish and a 22 percent win rate, and the current projected lineup does not represent a dramatic departure from that trajectory. There is no obvious surgery available, no buried George Pickens waiting to be discovered at WR10, because Pickens is already on the roster and already priced in. packersgrl drafted chalk, reached for the marquee names, and is now holding a roster that is harder to fix than it looks.

Saravvv did not win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by consistently being on the right side of the market, round after round. The centerpiece is Josh Allen at QB1, stacked with D.J. Moore at WR26, a combination that creates a built-in efficiency bonus when Buffalo's offense clicks. But the more telling story is what happened around them. Drake London fell nearly a full round past his ADP before saravvv scooped him up at WR7, and Jayden Daniels slid almost two full rounds to land at QB5, giving this roster a starting-caliber quarterback depth that most managers simply do not have. Add Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 taken over a round late and Xavier Worthy at WR49 taken nearly two rounds late, and a pattern emerges: saravvv did not need a lottery ticket to build value, they just kept showing up at the right price. Sitting at the 84th tournament percentile and coming off a 78th-percentile scoring season, this team belongs in the John Madden Football division conversation.

KJackson96 lands at 87th percentile in the Scott Fish Bowl field, and the draft log tells you exactly why: no home-run swings, just a steady accumulation of value that quietly added up. Drake Maye, projected QB2, slid nearly a full round past his ADP before KJackson96 grabbed him, and pairing him with A.J. Brown, a projected WR8, gives this roster a stack that can move the needle on any given week. Jahmyr Gibbs, projected RB1, anchors the skill players and gives the lineup a weekly floor most managers would envy. Beyond the headliners, D'Andre Swift came in over a round late at a projected RB24, and C.J. Stroud fell more than a round to round ten. The draft featured four values against just one minor reach, and the pattern is less about any single coup and more about a manager who consistently let the board come to him. That 2025 résumé, 96th percentile in scoring, suggests this is not a coincidence.

SOS4MVP didn't make headlines on draft day, and that's exactly the point. While other managers were hunting for the one swing that would define their roster, this team quietly assembled something that lands in the 90th percentile of the field without a single moment that demanded attention. The foundation is legitimate: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Brock Bowers at TE1 are the kind of projections that make opponents do the math twice, and both are penciled in as starters. From there, the roster fills out with Chris Olave, Tee Higgins, Terry McLaurin, Rome Odunze, and Alec Pierce all projected as starters, a group assembled mostly at or near expectation with Pierce sliding in as a genuine value after falling nearly two rounds past his ADP. Quentin Johnston, the draft's clearest value at WR41, drew the most favorable ADP gap on the board and projects as the weakest starter, which tells you something about the floor here. After a 42nd-percentile finish in 2025, SOS4MVP looks like a team that figured out the assignment.

Tylerss99 did not build this roster by swinging for the fences on one transcendent pick. The edge came from accumulating advantages across the board, round after round, until the margin was simply too wide to ignore. The clearest example is Matthew Stafford, a projected QB14 who fell a full two and a half rounds past his ADP and landed quietly at 8.08, the kind of inefficiency that wins leagues before a single game is played. Layer on top of that a receiving corps anchored by Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) and Rashee Rice (WR13), both projected starters, with Jameson Williams (WR21) and Mike Evans (WR27) adding genuine depth behind them, and you have a team that did not need a miracle to be dangerous. A 2025 season that produced an 81 percent win rate and a 98th percentile scoring finish suggests the process is sound. At 91st percentile in projected tournament standing and third in the John Madden Football division, Tylerss99 arrives in 2026 not as a hope, but as a case.

There was no lottery ticket moment in arctichart's draft, no swinging-for-the-fences gamble that either made or broke the room. What happened instead was quieter and, in the end, more damaging to the competition: pick after pick that came out slightly ahead of where it should have. Joe Burrow at QB4 slid nearly a full round past his ADP. Dak Prescott at QB7 fell even further. James Cook came off the board half a round late. DeVonta Smith arrived a round after the market expected him to. None of those are heists, but five values across a draft have a way of compounding into something real, and arctichart now sits at 98th percentile in the field and second in the John Madden Football division. The one genuine uncertainty is how quickly Carnell Tate, who went first among receivers in the real draft, translates that pedigree into fantasy production alongside Cam Ward in Tennessee. If Tate hits, this roster doesn't have a weak link worth discussing. If he's still developing, arctichart's floor is still very high.

BestballJonesy sits atop the John Madden Football division at the 100th tournament percentile, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The value hunting here is relentless: Trevor Lawrence landed at 7.10 despite a QB10 projection, falling nearly three full rounds past his ADP, and Jaxson Dart slid almost as far to give this roster a second high-end quarterback option at QB11. That kind of discipline compounds fast in a positionless format. Layer in CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 as projected starters, add Tyler Warren at TE4 and Kyle Pitts at TE7, and BestballJonesy is running a starting lineup that would make most managers in this field genuinely uncomfortable. The Dart and Isaiah Likely stack gives the team a correlated upside path on top of an already deep floor. Mac Jones going five rounds early in round 18 is the one wrinkle worth noting, though a late-round QB grab barely registers as a complaint when everything upstream looks this clean. This roster was built right.
