Joey Brown's 2026 campaign begins and essentially ends with the draft, and the draft was a disaster. The most glaring wound is the first pick: Justin Herbert at QB8, hauled off the board nearly two rounds before anyone else was reaching for him, at a position where zero starters are required and surplus value evaporates fast. That reach set the tone for a roster built on paying premium prices for middling returns, six major reaches in total, against zero steals. The Parker Washington situation captures the squeeze perfectly: a WR35 projection on a receiver who led Jacksonville in targets last year despite the franchise clearly preferring almost anyone else, with Travis Hunter and Brian Thomas Jr. waiting to reclaim the work Washington borrowed. Brown needed a roster that could survive misfortune; instead he built one that requires everything to break right. It will not break right. Last year's 24th-percentile finish looks, in retrospect, like a generous preview, and the Journey division drew the short straw.

JoAnn's 2026 campaign looks like what happens when a draft strategy collapses in real time and nobody hits the brakes. The most glaring evidence is Khalil Shakir, a WR51 who cost a sixth-round pick when his actual draft price was a full five rounds later, making him not just the weakest projected starter on the roster but a monument to misplaced conviction. The tight end situation tells the same story twice over: Dalton Schultz, a TE22, was yanked nearly three rounds ahead of schedule, and Theo Johnson, a TE37, followed three rounds early as well, as though JoAnn decided the position needed panic-buying at a premium. Against that backdrop, Carnell Tate's upside, a first-overall pick at receiver tasked with carrying a Titans offense still waiting to see what Cam Ward can become, feels less like a foundation and more like a lottery ticket propping up a crumbling house. The 2025 record was 7-29, a 16th-percentile season, and with zero steals and six reaches spread across this board, the 12th-percentile projection for 2026 is not a surprise. It is a verdict.

Tater of House Tot sits 10th in the Journey Division and projects in just the 27th percentile of the field, and the honest read of this roster is that there is not much of a case to be made otherwise. The engine is Christian McCaffrey, a projected RB3, and Justin Jefferson, a projected WR6, both legitimate stars whose presence keeps this from being a total salvage job. But after that the grades drop sharply, and the supporting cast projects more like a waiting room than a contending roster, with Wan'Dale Robinson, the projected WR47, slotting in as the weakest expected starter. The draft did not manufacture any real help either, logging zero steals against one major reach, the four-round investment in Bo Nix at QB15 that looks costly when Daniel Jones is sitting on the same bench at QB25. Nix does pair with Jaylen Waddle in a stack, which is a functional hedge, but it is a thin thread to pull when your floor is this exposed and your ceiling depends on McCaffrey staying healthy for an entire season.

Schopptalk enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Journey division and projecting at just the 32nd percentile of the field, and the draft did little to inspire confidence that things will improve. Of the 20 picks on record, two were major reaches, including Rachaad White taken more than two rounds early and Jaydon Blue pulled a staggering 5.6 rounds ahead of his ADP, both gambles that look more desperate than visionary in hindsight. The roster does have genuine talent at the top, Brock Bowers projects as TE1, and A.J. Brown, now paired with Drake Maye in New England, slots in at WR8 with legitimate upside if he can avoid the injury history that has shadowed his career. Jayden Daniels stacks nicely with Terry McLaurin, which adds a layer of correlation on good weeks. But beyond that upper crust, the projections fall off quickly, with Chuba Hubbard grading out as the weakest projected starter at RB29. This roster needs everything to go right, and nothing about the draft suggests Schopptalk has earned that kind of luck.

Jmoar704 sits eighth in the Journey division and right at the 46th percentile of the field, which is the fantasy equivalent of a middle seat on a long flight with no window and a broken tray table. The draft did not help matters much: twelve chalk picks, four minor reaches, and two major ones, including Matthew Stafford off the board a full round and a half before his QB14 projection warranted. That early investment in Stafford becomes harder to justify when Sam Darnold and Jacoby Brissett are also on the roster, both reached for, both projecting well outside the top 20. The genuine bright spots are real, George Pickens at WR10, Malik Nabers at WR12, and James Cook at RB5 give this team a legitimate core, but the depth drops off sharply after that, and the projected starters beyond that trio grade out as replacement-level contributors at best. Jmoar704 went 58 percent last year on a middling point total. The 2026 roster does not obviously project to improve on that baseline.

Brian R sits at the 49th percentile in the Journey division, which is exactly as precarious as it sounds: one bad week away from irrelevance, one hot streak away from contention. The backfield is legitimately good, with Chase Brown (RB11), Derrick Henry (RB12), and Breece Hall (RB14) all projecting as starters, and that kind of top-end depth gives Brian a floor that keeps him competitive most weeks. The concern is at receiver, where the group thins out fast after Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31), and Thomas himself is a question mark after a 2025 season derailed by injuries and a quietly deteriorating connection with Trevor Lawrence. If Thomas bounces back, Brian has a real weapon. If he doesn't, the receiver corps leans heavily on Michael Wilson (WR39) and below, which is a shaky proposition. The draft didn't help much, logging 15 chalk picks and two major reaches in J.J. McCarthy and Braelon Allen. There's no catastrophic flaw here, but there's no margin for error either. This team wins or loses on the small stuff.

The Land finished last season at 56 percent wins and 61st percentile in scoring, which is the kind of middling resume that usually signals a middling roster. This one is not that. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Lamar Jackson at QB3, and Harold Fannin at TE6 give this team a genuine ceiling, and the manager built that core while the draft board kept flashing red. Three major reaches, three minor reaches, zero steals. The critics writing this off on process alone are not wrong to raise an eyebrow, but the players landed anyway. Malachi Fields at WR90 and Isiah Pacheco at RB52 were taken years early by ADP logic, and they may absolutely vanish, but the starters above them are good enough to absorb that variance. The one legitimate question mark worth circling is C.J. Stroud, a former standout who has been quietly retreating from his early promise and arrives here projected at QB22 after concussions and inconsistency have chipped away at his shine. Whether The Land is a well-disguised contender or just a well-disguised reach machine, the roster itself leans toward the former.

DaBeers didn't win the draft with one flashy swing. They won it pick by pick, and the receipts are clean: zero reaches across the entire board, a Dak Prescott and CeeDee Lamb stack that gives this roster a high-variance ceiling on good weeks, and a receiver corps anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and Lamb (WR5) that would make most managers openly jealous. The QB group is similarly loaded, with Prescott (QB7) and Jalen Hurts (QB9) both projecting as starters. Then there's the back end of the tight end room, where patient drafting paid off: Mark Andrews came off the board at TE14 value well after his ADP suggested he'd be gone, and Brenton Strange landed even later as the steal of the group. Last season's 81st-percentile scoring finish tells you this isn't a roster built on hope, and the 2026 version projects with more polish. The Journey division is about to find out what consistent, disciplined drafting actually looks like.

After finishing in the bottom 6 percent of the field in scoring last season, The Rotobahn White Robes have returned with something to prove, and this roster looks built for exactly the kind of redemption arc that makes the Scott Fish Bowl worth watching. The foundation is staggering: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 form a projected backfield triumvirate that would make most managers weep with envy, and Colston Loveland slotting in at TE3 gives this team an elite anchor at a position where a single top option can quietly win weeks. The draft craft reinforces the optimism. Chigoziem Okonkwo, projected TE19, fell nearly two and a half rounds past his ADP before this manager pounced, and Colby Parkinson came along three-plus rounds late as a genuine windfall. A team that was historically outgunned in 2025 now sits at the 79th percentile of the

field, fourth in the Journey Division, and carries the kind of quiet, loaded confidence that tends to look very loud by October.

David didn't win his draft on one flashy pick. He won it by simply paying the right price, round after round, until the board told a story. Trevor Lawrence, projected at QB10, slid nearly two rounds past his ADP and David was there to collect. Jordyn Tyson, a projected WR34 starter, fell a round and change and landed in the same cart. Neither move looks like a heist on its own, but that steady accumulation of small edges is exactly how rosters quietly outpace expectations. Pair that discipline with Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Drake London at WR7 anchoring the starting lineup, add Tyler Warren at TE4 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 as legitimate contributors, and you have a team that is sitting at 87th percentile in the field and third in the division with a case that it belongs even higher. David did not gamble, did not reach in damaging ways, and did not leave value on the board. That is a harder thing to do than it sounds, and the standings may reward it.

Metula Eggenbreakerz finished 2025 at the 82nd percentile and enter 2026 sitting even higher, projected at the 92nd, and the draft tells you exactly why. This was not a team built on one spectacular swing. It was built on consistently coming out ahead of the board, pick after pick. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 both slipped past their ADPs to land in Metula's lap in the first two rounds, and that kind of early-round surplus creates a foundation most managers spend the rest of the draft trying to manufacture. Brock Purdy and Jordan Love both project as starters, and the Love-Tucker Kraft stack gives the lineup a built-in bonus when Green Bay gets into a rhythm. The draft was heavy on chalk, which sounds boring until you realize chalk at the top of the board is exactly where it matters most. With 15 chalk picks and three genuine values, this roster did not gamble its way to the 92nd percentile. It earned it through execution.

Cage917r didn't need a single lottery ticket to land in the 97th percentile of the Scott Fish Bowl field, sitting atop the Journey division on the back of a draft that simply refused to lose a trade. The receiver group alone tells the story: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Nico Collins as WR9, and Rashee Rice as WR13, and none of them came at full price, with Rice sliding a full round past his ADP into the fifth. De'Von Achane at RB6 arrived similarly discounted, falling nearly a round to pick 3.03. Jaxson Dart at QB11 was a patient bonus, taken seven picks into the seventh round when his ADP suggested he'd be gone in the fifth. What makes this roster quietly dangerous isn't any single coup but the cumulative arithmetic: five values, zero major reaches, and a weakest projected starter in Jordan Addison at WR43. That's not a liability, that's a floor, and this floor is already higher than most teams' ceilings.
