Stumpchamp drafted like someone convinced they had insider information and then proved, pick by pick, that they did not. The most damning evidence is in the reach column: zero steals, zero values, and eight combined reaches, four of them major. Jared Goff came off the board two full rounds before his ADP justified it, MarShawn Lloyd went four-plus rounds early, and Tyquan Thornton, a WR97, somehow got drafted like a commodity at pick 18.04. These were not aggressive swings on upside, they were a manager overpaying for players the market had already priced correctly and then some. Jonathan Taylor is a legitimate RB4 anchor and Drake London projects as a WR7, so there is a floor here, but the supporting cast tells the real story. Wan'Dale Robinson projects as WR47 and is the weakest projected starter on this roster. When your margin-of-the-lineup player is a WR47 you reached to get, the draft has already done most of the damage. Dead last in the Kaboom Division and in the third percentile of the field, Stumpchamp may be the most honest draft receipt in this entire tournament.

FrancoNY sits 11th in the Kaboom division and in the 17th percentile of the field, and the draft did little to change that trajectory. The most damaging chapter of the offseason was a quarterback obsession that consumed three of the first four picks: Jayden Daniels at 2.05, Jaxson Dart at 3.08, and Bo Nix at 4.05, with Dart and Nix each pulled nearly two rounds ahead of their ADPs. Daniels projects as QB5 and anchors the group well enough, but burning those early selections on Dart (QB11) and Nix (QB15) meant the rest of the roster was built on late-round bargains and wishful thinking. Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3) is a genuine asset and the four good-value receivers quietly filled out a serviceable group, yet the floor gets uncomfortable fast once you reach Kenneth Gainwell projecting as the weakest projected starter. There are no obvious levers left to pull. The 2025 squad went 33 percent in wins and ranked in the 38th percentile in scoring, and nothing about this build suggests the arrow is pointing anywhere but sideways.

The 2026 season for iPissExcellence26 has the feel of a team that already knows how this ends. Sitting 10th in the Kaboom division and projecting in just the 22nd percentile of the field, this roster is not hiding a secret weapon, and the draft didn't manufacture one either. Three major reaches highlight a board that leaned on wishful thinking: Baker Mayfield taken 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, Khalil Shakir grabbed 2.4 rounds early, and Elijah Sarratt pulled nearly five rounds before the market agreed. Those are not calculated gambles, those are a manager watching his targets disappear and panic-drafting replacements. The only credible bright spot is the top of the receiver group, where Tetairoa McMillan and Zay Flowers project as WR15 and WR16 respectively, and Trey McBride grades out as a TE2. But those anchors are surrounded by enough fringe contributors, including projected starter KC Concepcion in a Cleveland offense still waiting on a competent quarterback, that depth becomes liability

in a hurry. After an 8-18 disaster in 2025, the levers were already few. Judging by this draft, even those got stripped out.

erictoft played the draft almost exactly right. Christian McCaffrey fell half a round past his ADP and landed at RB3 with starter upside. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Travis Kelce at TE10 give this roster genuine elite footing at the position. And yet, sitting ninth in the Kaboom division and at just the 42nd percentile of the field, the reward for that disciplined approach is a team that still does not clear the bar. The problem is not the process, it is what the process produced: a roster that leans heavily on depth at one position while the starters beyond McCaffrey and Bowers thin out quickly, with Rico Dowdle projected as the weakest starter at RB32. Erictoft reached on two quarterbacks, taking Jordan Love and C.J. Stroud before their ADPs, and neither projects better than QB17 and QB22 respectively, which is a quiet drain on capital. Doing everything correctly and still landing in the middle of the field is not bad luck. It is just the cruelest thing a draft can do to you.

Forte Yard Dash did almost everything right on draft day. Fourteen picks at chalk, three values, zero major reaches, and a backfield headlined by Jahmyr Gibbs (RB1), De'Von Achane (RB6), and Omarion Hampton (RB9) that reads like a coordinator's fever dream. The problem is that in a positionless format where you field your best ten players regardless of position, a roster is only as strong as its weakest projected starters, and Forte Yard Dash's receiver group projects as a collection of WR60s and WR92s. Dallas Goedert (TE15) was a genuine value, sliding a full round and a half past his ADP, and Jerry Jeudy (WR66) arrived late too, but those are the bright spots in a receiving corps where nobody projects inside WR60. Matthew Stafford (QB14) adds a functional floor at quarterback. None of this is irrational drafting, which is exactly what stings. Forte Yard Dash played the board correctly and still landed at 47th percentile, which is the fantasy equivalent of following the recipe exactly and somehow burning the kitchen down.

Bulldog14411 sits at 54th percentile in the field and seventh in the Kaboom division, which is exactly the kind of standing that keeps a manager refreshing the standings all season. The foundation is real: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Caleb Williams at QB6 give this roster a genuine top-end punch, and the draft showed some patience at receiver, landing Chris Olave at WR11 a full round after his ADP and Jameson Williams at WR21 nearly two rounds late. Those are the margins that can quietly decide a season. The concern is that Bulldog leaned hard on tight ends early and often, reaching for Jake Ferguson, Chigoziem Okonkwo, and AJ Barner before their ADPs, and Okonkwo projects as the weakest projected starter on the roster at TE19. Five minor reaches against zero steals means this manager paid full price or above at nearly every position of investment, leaving little room for the draft-day luck that separates middle-of-the-pack finishes from playoff runs. Robinson and Williams are good enough to carry weeks. The question is whether the margins allow it often enough.

SalLetoFF did not win the draft with a single thunderbolt moment. They won it the way a good poker player wins a session, picking up small edges until the pile adds up. CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) anchor the starting group as two of the best projected receivers in the field, and the team built real depth behind them with Garrett Wilson (WR17), Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31), and Marvin Harrison Jr. (WR33) all projecting as starters. At tight end, Tyler Warren (TE4) and Harold Fannin (TE6) give this roster a pair of high-end options most managers would envy, and Warren arriving at 3.12 after an ADP of 3.04 is the kind of quiet, low-drama value that separates sharp drafts from lucky ones. The 2025 résumé, 83rd percentile in scoring and a 67 percent win rate, suggests this is not a team learning how to do this. Sitting 6th in the Kaboom division at the 55th percentile, SalLetoFF is closer to competing than those numbers imply.

Big Draft Energy didn't swing for the fences and miss, they just kept making the right call, round after round. The clearest example is Davante Adams, projected WR25, landing at pick 8.06 when his ADP sat at 6.05, a full two rounds of free value that most managers would celebrate as the highlight of their draft. But the Adams haul wasn't even the most consequential move. Nico Collins, projected WR9, slipped to pick 3.07 and gives this team a genuine alpha at the position. Pair those two with Malik Nabers (WR12) and Tee Higgins (WR19) and the top of this roster is legitimate. Then consider that Tee Higgins comes bundled with a Burrow stack, always a welcome bonus. Drake Maye (QB2) cost a slight early reach at 1.07, but the scouting case for him is hard to argue with: he's coming off an MVP-caliber season and now has a true alpha wideout in AJ Brown alongside him in New England. At 58th percentile and fifth in the Kaboom division, Big Draft Energy has real upside if the projections land anywhere close to right.

hallway65 didn't need a blockbuster pick to build something worth watching in the Kaboom division. The draft was a quiet accumulation of edges, and the two clearest examples are Kyle Pitts and Brenton Strange. Pitts, projected TE7, slid a full round and a half past his ADP before hallway65 grabbed him at 6.12, and Strange landed at 11.01 despite an ADP that suggested he'd be gone in the tenth. Those aren't lottery tickets, those are real players at a premium position acquired at a discount. Layer in Josh Allen at QB1 anchoring the top of the lineup, Saquon Barkley projected RB8 and Rashee Rice projected WR13 giving the roster legitimate firepower in the skill positions, and the Brock Purdy and Mike Evans stack adding a correlation bonus, and you have a team built on sound construction rather than one big swing. hallway65 finished at the 73rd percentile in scoring in 2025. Sitting fourth in the division and at the 60th tournament percentile entering 2026, the upside here is real.

Eggboy83 didn't need a miracle pick to build one of the more quietly impressive rosters in the Kaboom division. The foundation is a receiver group that would make most managers envious: Puka Nacua at WR1, A.J. Brown at WR8, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 form a projected starting core that is simply hard to argue with, and Courtland Sutton at WR37 adds real depth behind them. The tight end situation is equally compelling, with Colston Loveland at TE3 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 giving this team a genuine edge at a position where most rosters go thin. Kraft is the name to watch: he was pacing toward 1,000 yards before a November ACL injury derailed his 2025 season, but he came off the preseason PUP list before August and returns to a Packers receiving corps that got thinner, not deeper, in the offseason. The draft itself was clean, nearly all chalk with three values and zero major reaches. Coming off a 97th-percentile scoring season in 2025, Eggboy83 looks like a legitimate threat to go even further in 2026.

zombieGsus didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it with consistency, round after round, and sitting at 85th percentile tournament-wide and second in the Kaboom division, the results bear that out. The foundation is genuinely impressive: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and James Cook at RB5 give this roster two top-of-the-position cornerstones before you even get to the value picks that followed. George Pickens fell more than a full round past his ADP and lands as a projected WR10 starter, and Emeka Egbuka slid even further to become a WR18 contributor, both sitting comfortably in the lineup without costing a premium. Pair Dak Prescott with Pickens in a stack and you have a genuine multiplier baked into the roster architecture. The Kirk Cousins reach and the Jordan James reach are real, and Quentin Johnston projects as the weakest projected starter at WR41, but those blemishes read like footnotes against a draft that built quietly, gathered real value in the middle rounds, and arrived ready.

avm56 didn't need a miracle pick to build one of the Kaboom division's most dangerous rosters, just a relentless habit of coming out slightly ahead on pick after pick. The foundation is genuinely elite: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this team a ceiling that most managers in the field can't match, and the supporting cast holds up. Jaylen Waddle, projected WR23, slid more than a full round past his ADP before avm56 quietly took him at 6.08, a small win that quietly shaped the back half of the roster. Justin Herbert pairs with Ladd McConkey in a stack that ties two projected starters together with shared upside. The one curious footnote is Justin Fields, a QB38 taken six rounds ahead of his ADP, though late-round quarterback speculation rarely costs a team much at this format's scale. Sitting first in the division and in the 88th percentile of the field, this is what sustained drafting discipline looks like when it accumulates into something real.
