There is no elegant way to frame a 3rd-percentile projection, and Sloth55 should not expect anyone to try. The draft tells most of the story: three major reaches, three minor reaches, zero steals, and a weakest projected starter in Daniel Jones at QB25 who arrived as a value pick because nobody else wanted him either. The backfield is genuinely strong, with James Cook at RB5, Saquon Barkley at RB8, and Breece Hall at RB14 all projecting as starters, and Bhayshul Tuten at RB25 carrying real upside if the Jacksonville backfield shakes out in his favor after Travis Etienne's departure. But in a positionless format, elite depth only matters if the players around it can keep pace, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 is doing a lot of heavy lifting beyond the backfield. Coming off a 7-29 season that landed in the 9th percentile of scoring, Sloth55 is not a team awaiting its moment. It is a team that has already spent most of its draft capital betting on the moment and come up short.

DoOrDieNASTY sits 11th in Portal 2 and in just the 17th percentile of the field, and the draft didn't generate the kind of surplus value that might paper over those projections. Twelve chalk picks and a major reach on Patrick Mahomes, taken 3.4 rounds before his QB12 projection warranted it, means the team spent its best capital on a player the market had already priced correctly and then some. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 give the starting lineup two genuinely elite anchors, and that is real, but from there the drop is steep and unforgiving. George Pickens checks in at WR10, Luther Burden at WR22, and then the projected starters thin out fast, bottoming at Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47. No steals anywhere in the draft, no late-round lottery ticket that beat the house, no obvious sleeper poised to flip the script. This is a team that needed everything to break right and instead drafted mostly to expectation at the top and spent down from there.

FantasyFlyover arrives in Portal 2 carrying 2025's optimism like a bag of bricks, and the 2026 roster doesn't offer much relief. The foundation looks promising on paper: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Jayden Daniels slots in as a QB5, and Harold Fannin grades out as TE6. But after that upper tier, the roster thins quickly, and the draft didn't generate the surplus value needed to paper over the gaps. Twelve chalk picks and two major reaches, including Dallas Goedert taken nearly 2.3 rounds ahead of his ADP and Rashee Rice pulled 1.2 rounds early, suggest a manager who paid premium prices when patience might have bought more. The result is a roster that sits 10th in the division and in just the 24th percentile of the field, with Blake Corum projected as the weakest expected starter at RB35. The lever-pulling options are limited, the margin for error is thin, and the path forward looks less like a climb and more like a grind through unfavorable terrain.

BEARTHIS sits ninth in Portal 2 and ranks in just the 37th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason to expect a climb. Of 20 picks, not one qualifies as a steal, and the single genuine value find is T.J. Hockenson, a TE23 projection that hardly moves the needle. Meanwhile, the most aggressive swing of the draft, Tre Harris at WR72, cost three rounds of premium currency to land a player projected near the bottom of the starter pool. The projected weakest starter is Khalil Shakir at WR51, which tells you where the floor sits. Josh Allen as a QB1 is real, and a starting backfield of Chase Brown, Derrick Henry, and Kyren Williams ranked RB11, RB12, and RB15 respectively gives BEARTHIS a credible foundation. But this roster is largely chalk, the upside plays missed, and the margin for error in a field this competitive is essentially zero. When your best argument for optimism is "the studs are real," the studs had better be historic.

WComfort drafted with discipline. Nearly every pick landed at or after ADP, Trey McBride fell into the first round, and the receiver group headlined by Justin Jefferson, Malik Nabers, and Emeka Egbuka is genuinely elite. The problem is that discipline and depth do not automatically produce points, and the rest of this roster is a reminder of that. TreVeyon Henderson projects as RB19 on a team that starts up to ten players, Rachaad White is the only other running back on the board, and the quarterback room features Jaxson Dart stacking with Nabers as the primary option, backed by Geno Smith and Tua Tagovailoa ranked QB30 and QB31 respectively. WComfort did not overpay for a single one of those players. It almost makes it worse. Sitting at 48th percentile, this is the draft equivalent of buying everything on sale and still walking out of the store with nothing you actually needed. The value was real. The roster math, unfortunately, is not.

BigDiesel95 sits at the 51st percentile, which is another way of saying the margins decide everything, and right now those margins cut both ways. The strength of this roster runs through a QB room that most managers would envy: Drake Maye projects as QB2 and was drafted at a modest discount, while Jalen Hurts, despite slipping to QB9, has posted five consecutive top-10 fantasy finishes on the back of his rushing volume. The problem is that Hurts' calculus just got harder. With A.J. Brown dealt away to New England, the Philadelphia passing game enters uncharted territory, and if the offense stalls, those rushing touchdown opportunities that kept Hurts relevant come under serious threat. Meanwhile, the projected starter pool is solid if unspectacular, anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13, but it bottoms out at Quentin Johnston as the weakest projected starter. No catastrophic liabilities, no game-breaking advantages. This is a team that needs Hurts healthy and efficient, Maye to justify his billing, and a few lottery tickets to hit. Perfectly mediocre until it isn't.

RCJHeier3 sits at 52nd percentile heading into 2026, and that number is almost aggressively accurate. This is a roster built on a strong core, solid depth, and just enough question marks to keep it out of the conversation as a genuine contender. Caleb Williams at QB6 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 are the kind of names that make opponents exhale slightly before kickoff, and Trevor Lawrence at QB10 adds legitimate upside after a career year that somehow unfolded without his presumed top weapons producing. The problem is that the margins separating this team from the upper half of Portal 2 are thin, and the draft board did not do much to widen them. The team checked in with three values and no steals, and reached on four players including a major early swing on MarShawn Lloyd at RB66. Lloyd at that cost is a bet on upside, not a sure thing. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 keeps the floor elevated, but in a format decided by small edges, betting on depth pieces to outrun their projections is a shaky foundation.

DeweyKerner did not build this roster by swinging for the fences on a single marquee gamble. They built it by drafting well, pick after pick, until the accumulation became undeniable. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 give the team a backfield foundation that most managers would envy, and Drake London at WR7 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 keep that momentum rolling through the skill positions. The draft board reflects the same discipline: 17 chalk picks and two genuine values, no reaches anywhere on the sheet. One of those values, Oronde Gadsden, arriving as TE16 about a round after his ADP, does carry a small asterisk, and not the good kind. The Chargers signing David Njoku in the offseason clouds Gadsden's path in ways that did not exist when the season was mapped out. That is the one soft spot in an otherwise clean construction. At 60th percentile and fifth in Portal 2, there is room to climb, and a roster this consistently assembled tends to find that room.

kapnted didn't build this roster on a single flashy move. They built it pick by pick, and the results hold up. The foundation is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team two of the most dangerous projected backs in the field, and Achane came at a slight discount, slipping past his ADP at the back of the second round. From there, kapnted layered in Jordan Love at QB17, a full round and a half after his ADP suggested he'd go, and paired him with Tucker Kraft at TE5 for a stack that has real upside. Jared Goff and Jameson Williams add a second stack for good measure. The draft wasn't flawless, Rhamondre Stevenson came off the board more than two rounds early, but that kind of reach tends to get buried when the core is this sound. Sitting 66th percentile in the tournament and fourth in Portal 2, kapnted has the ceiling to move in either direction. The draft gives them reason to expect upward.

StonedSportDude didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by being right over and over again. The receiver corps alone tells the story: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, A.J. Brown at WR8, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 all project as starters, and that trio was assembled without a single dramatic overpay. The tight end group is quietly just as dangerous, headlined by Colston Loveland at TE3, a player StonedSportDude landed at pick 3.05 when his ADP sat closer to the second round. Sixteen chalk picks in the draft might sound boring, but when your chalk is Brown and Smith-Njigba, boring looks a lot like brilliant. The Brock Purdy and Mike Evans stack gives the lineup a ceiling-boosting connection, and a 2025 season that landed in the 82nd percentile of scoring tells you this manager knows how to translate a good roster into actual points. Third in Portal 2 and 69th percentile tournament-wide are the projections to beat, and with this roster, beating them feels entirely realistic.

BourbaBOOS didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by compounding small advantages across 19 rounds until the ledger looked undeniable. The foundation is legitimately elite: Lamar Jackson at QB3 stacked with Zay Flowers at WR16 gives this roster a ceiling that most Portal 2 managers can't match, and Brock Bowers at TE1 and Tyler Warren at TE4 represent the kind of positional dominance that quietly separates contenders from pretenders. Jaylen Waddle at WR23 and Quinshon Judkins at RB22 fill out a starting group with genuine teeth. Where the draft really reveals its character, though, is in the values: Chuba Hubbard fell 1.3 rounds past his ADP and lands as a projected starter, and Dalton Schultz slipped 2.5 rounds before BourbaBOOS snapped him up at pick 14.04. No single transaction made this roster, but the cumulative effect of picking correctly over and over is why this team sits second in the division and in the 81st percentile of the field.

AustinTO1 didn't stumble into correlation, they engineered it. The Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase stack is the spine of this roster, a QB4 and WR2 pairing that lives and dies together, and wrapped around it is a second stack in Justin Herbert and Ladd McConkey that gives the team a genuine hedge if Burrow's well-documented injury history interrupts things again. That health caveat is real, Burrow has burned managers with an ACL tear, a torn wrist ligament, and a grade-3 turf toe that wiped out most of last season, but the flip side is that a healthy Burrow produces at a pace that justifies all of it. The construction here is deliberate and elegant: both quarterbacks were drafted as values, Burrow at QB4 and Herbert at QB8, meaning this team absorbed the risk at a discount. Sitting first in Portal 2 and in the 93rd percentile of the field, AustinTO1 has a ceiling that isn't theoretical. It just requires the stacks to breathe together.
